Algaius Cave enlisted in the Confederate Army in August 1862, Shelby's Brigade, Missouri Cavalry. After a year he transferred to an Engineering Company commanded by Capt. Moohr. He was discharged at Jefferson, Texas on 31 July 1865

Excerpt regarding the Cave Family

Algaius Cave's family was living in Jackson County, Missouri at the outbreak of the Civil War. This was an area frequented by Quantrill's raiders. In an effort to eliminate resources and shelter to Quantrill the Union Army forcibly relocated families out of Jackson County. The Cave family was preparing to follow these orders. On the morning of September 6, 1863, Algaius's father was at his father-in-law's, John Hunter, farm loading the wagons when Federal troops arrived. The troops were under the command of Colburn and Clark. They arrested John Cave, John Hunter, two of Hunter's sons, John and William, and a nephew and a cousin. The Federal Troops were acting on reports that Quantrill on his way to Kansas had stopped for dinner at the farm of one of the men arrested and the others joined them for dinner. The prisoners were taken a short way down the road and shot, their bodies left on the ground.
