#### **Civil War Disability paper dated 1 September 1870**

Newton received an artificial leg in 1868 after losing his left leg below the knee in the Battle at Gettysburg, from a gunshot wound. He was hit in the leg with a minnie musket ball fired from the enemy on 2 July 1863.

#### **New York Civil War Muster Rolls**

Enlisted 21 October 1861, transferred to Company E 1 November 1861, mustered in 23 October 1861, disability discharge 2 March 1864 at New York, New York

William was shot in the neck at the battle of Fair Oaks on 1 June 1862 and was sent to Cedar Hospital in New Haven, Conn. for 5 months.

Born in Greene, Chenango County, New York, 21 May 1843

**Newton's son Deville B. Deyoe** was a Corporal in Co E, 6<sup>th</sup> Illinois Infantry from May 11, 1898 to November 26, 1898 and is buried at Los Angeles National Cemetery.
