Died, on Wednesday morning, March 5th, 1873, after a long and fatal illness, Mrs. Susan A., wife of Nathan C. Gilmore, aged 22 years, 3 months and 28 days.

Numerous friends sympathize with the relatives of the deceased, who mourn the loss of the loved one. Her quiet and unassuming demeanor, patient and retiring disposition, were the rare charms that made her presence at home, or among her circle of acquaintances, ever pleasant and agreeable to all.—"The Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

Nathan's son James T. Gilmore fought in World War I. He was a Mechanic, Hq Det, 48th Machine Gun Battallion, 16th Division from 19 February 1918 to 13 February 1919. He is buried at Greenwood Memorial Park, Phoenix, Maricopa County, Arizona.
