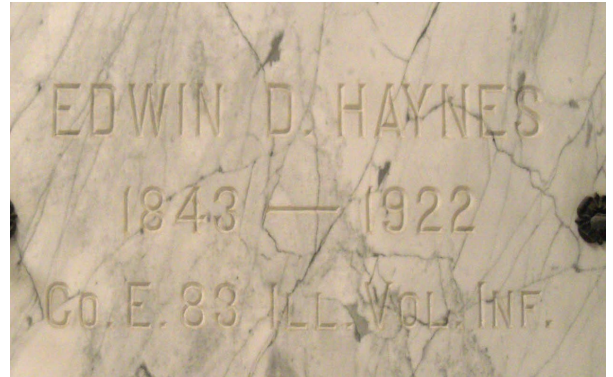

Illinois Civil War Detail Report

"Edward" Haynes, age 19 enlisted as a Private in Co E, 83 Illinois US Infantry for a period of 3 years at Knoxville, Illinois. He was single, a farmer, born in Knox County, Illinois and residing in Orange, Knox County, Illinois at the time of his enlistment. He was 5' 9" tall with gray eyes and dark hair. He mustered in 21 August 1862 at Monmouth, Illinois and mustered out 26 June 1865 at Nashville, Tennessee.
