Charles P. Hough, a large and prominent farmer, resides on section 28, where he located in 1870. He owns 348 acres of land, and has the same well improved. Mr. Hough is a native of Germany, and was born October 6, 1832. He came to the United States, landing the city of New York, January 19, 1854. He spent the first summer in Pennsylvania, working at his trade -- stone-cutter. He then went to New York State, next to Ohio, and subsequently to Wisconsin. In 1856 he settled at Prairie du Chien, where he continued his trade until 1870. He was married in 1856 to Miss Theresa Faber. They have four children -- Charles, Ida, Amelia and William. Mr. Hough was a member of the committee who revised the history of Sherman township. February 10, 1865, Mr. Hough enlisted in Company C, 48th Wisconsin, and served thirteen months, the field of operation in the West.
