Additional Information

Enoch Platt was sworn in 19 September 1863 at Wabaunsee, Kansas. He Mustered In as a First Sergeant in Co C, 14th Regilment State Militia on 19 October 1863 at Manhattan Kansas and Mustered Out 31 October 1864.

Enoch Platt was mustered in as part of a large Kansas Militia group who joined with Missouri State Militia to help repel the raids of Confederate Major General Sterling Price. Price was determined to recover Missouri for the Confederacy. In September and October 1864 Price attempted to capture St. Louis, Missouri.

Enoch Platt's parents were Congregationalists and at the urging of the Church moved to Illinois about 1833 to work against the spread of slavery. Enoch and his brother's Luther and Jeremiah were active in the Underground Railroad along with their father. In 1856 Enoch and some family members moved to Wabaunsee, Kansas which was founded by the New Haven Abolitionists and again were active in the underground railroad.
