Additional Information

Richard B. Barnes was the fifth of 11 children (6 girls and 5 boys) born to Thomas Barnes and Louisa Ann Pool. Both Thomas and Louisa were born in Maryland and were married in Baltimore, Maryland 31 October 1828. Their children were all born in the state of Maryland. The family moved to Mercer County, Illinois sometime between 1855 and 1860. Thomas Barnes made his living as a farmer. Thomas and Louisa Barnes appear in the 1880 census for Jasper County, Iowa. Louisa is buried in Newton Union Cemetery, Newton, Jasper County, Iowa. Thomas Barnes possibly died in 1893 in Nebraska and may be buried in Hamilton County.

Richard's brother William was also in the 102nd Infantry Regiment during the Civil War enlisting at the same time as his brother. William was discharged Aug 10, 1863 for a disability. During Richard's enlistment the 102nd Infantry saw action in Tennessee and Georgia, and the unit was involved in the siege and occupation of Atlanta from July to November 1864 and the March to the Sea that occurred In November and December of 1864.

Richard Barnes married his first wife Jane Hill in Henry County, Illinois in 1867. They appear to have had one child, Minnie, in 1871 while living in Jasper County, Iowa where Richard made his living as a farmer. Jane does not appear in the 1880 in the Jasper County, Iowa census. Richard's wife is listed as Losina. A marriage record for 1876 in Jasper County, Iowa can be found for a Richard Barnes and Losina Feathers. In the 1900 Census Richard and Losina are living in Boston, Massachusetts with five

children including Minnie, Florence, Blanche and twin boys Rahlford and Raymond, with Raymond being born April 30 and Rahlford May 1,1885. In the 1900 Census Florence is listed as an invalid.

Richard and Losina are still living in Boston, Massachusetts in 1910. Florence is not listed with the family and Minnie has married Albert Haraden. During their time in Boston Richard made his living as a machinist/tool grinder and foreman possibly in the Navy yard. In 1920 they appear in the Census for Santa Ana, Orange County, California. One of the first references to their arrival in California is the Voter Records for Santa Ana Precinct No. 24 for 1918. At that time they are living at 116 W. Santa Clara Street, Santa Ana, California. Their daughter Blanche is still in Massachusetts married to Claude Hackleton. Raymond and Rahlford are also found in census records for Massachusetts.

Richard passed away in June of 1920 and Losina passed away in 1939. Before her death she and her twin sister Lovina were recognized as being the oldest set of twins still living. Both were living in Orange County at the time and the story appeared in the Santa Ana Register July 26, 1935 and their hometown paper in Warrensburg, New York.

Richard Barnes was a member of the GAR in Sedgwick Post 17, Santa Ana, California.
