Enlisted in 35th Missouri Infantry 12 August 1862 at St. Joseph, Missouri, mustered out December 1862. Mustered in 2nd Arkansas Colored Infantry 8 June 1863 at Helena, Arkansas and promoted to 1st Sergeant (the 2nd Arkansas Colored Infantry became the 54th U.S. Colored Infantry 11 March 1864), appointed to 2nd Lieutenant 11 April 1864. Transferred Company E 14 September 1865. Transferred to Company F 2 September 1866. Mustered out as late as 31 December 1866, appointed Brevet 1st Lieutenant 9 October 1867

Brother of Benjamin Trickey a Civil War Veteran buried in Orange County.

Thomas Trickey's son, Fred Logan Trickey, was a Captain in the Quarter Master Corps during World War I. In 1906 he became associated with the J. P. Luther Company established in 1888 as a glove manufacturer in Berlin, Wisconsin. Trickey helped expand the business to include the manufacturing and distribution of lambskin aprons and other supplies for Masonic Lodges. Trickey was also responsible for developing a line of adhesives used in many fields. Nitroloid, Chinaloid, Nitrolene and Necromic Cement were registered trademarks.

Thomas Trickey's grandson, Fred Logan Trickey, Jr, was a World War II veteran. He participated in the second big raid over Tokyo in December 1944 when he was a Major in command of "The Ponderus Peg" a B-29 Super Fortresses. He was a Lt. Colonel out of MacDill Airfield in Florida when he and his crew were killed 13 September 1946 when their B-25 bomber went down near Cold Mountain, Hancock County, North Carolina.

Thomas Trickey and his brother Jasper Newton Trickey started a grocery business in Wichita, Sedgwick County, Kansas in the 1870's. It was eventually called Trickey Bros. & Co.
