### **Additional Information**

In April 1868 the Cheyenne Indians entered Kansas and reached as far as Council Grove. In August 1868 settlers were raided in Solomon and Saline Valleys resulting in several civilian deaths. The 19<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Kansas Volunteer Cavalry was mustered in 19 October 1868 for a period of six months to address the Indian issue. Solomon Sweany volunteered at Manhattan, Riley County, Kansas on 24 October 1868. The 19<sup>th</sup> was mustered out at Fort Hays on 18<sup>th</sup> April 1869. While the unit did not have any major fighting with the Cheyennes they were persistent in giving the Indians no rest and with the severe winter conditions were able to force them out of Kansas.

Solomon Sweany was born in 1847 to William and Eliza Stephens Sweany. His mother passed away in 1852. His father then married Alice Elsie Cox. In 1850 the family was living in Jackson County, Indiana. Solomon had 3 brothers (Lafayette, Andrew and Joshua) and 3 sisters (Nancy, Lydia and Emily). The family is still in Jackson County at the time of the 1860 Census. By the 1870 Census another sister Adaline had been born. The family remained in Jackson County, Indiana. In 1860 Solomon and his sisters, Nancy and Emily, were living with their brother James Sweany and family in Grant, Riley County, Kansas in 1860.

By 1880 Solomon Sweany had moved to Jasper County, Missouri and marred Emma Stephens. Solomon, Emma and their two children, Willy and Katy, are living in Marion. By 1900 they had moved to Mineral, Jasper County, Missouri and had two more children, Alice and Lena, and had adopted a boy named Oliver. In 1910 Solomon and Emma were living in Fullerton, California. In the 1911 Thurston's Business Directory they are listed as living in La Habra 6 miles west of Fullerton.

Solomon Sweany's brother Joshua fought in the Civil War. He was a Wagon Master with Co G, 24<sup>th</sup> Indiana Infantry
