THE MORMON BATTALION

Captain James Allen of the United States Army came to President Brigham Young seeking to enlist four or five companies of infantry to participate in the War with Mexico which began in May of 1846. They called them The Mormon Battalion because they were recruited from among the members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Their assignment was to march to San Diego and make sure it remained in the hands of the United States.

Forming the Battalion was a severe test of national loyalty for the harried pioneers who had just been driven out of the United States. They were camped in Indian Territory on the east and west banks of the Missouri River. The nondescript looking group marched out of Council Bluffs, Iowa on 20 July 1846. The group consisted of 500 volunteers, 84 women and children. Twenty women were official laundresses at the rate of \$7.00 per month. This article, the first in a series, will attempt to identify as many of these people as possible.

MORMON BATTALION COMPANY B

This is the second article in a series on the members of the Mormon Battalion. Upon arrival in San Diego, California, Company B took command of the fort on the bluff 17 March 1847 with Captain Jesse D. Hunter as the ranking military authority. The remainder of the troops traveled on to Los Angeles. San Diego, the only port south of San Francisco, was just a small town with a plaza surrounded by a church and a few small buildings. The men were dehydrated and near starvation upon their arrival in San Diego. They also suffered from lack of clothing and many had no shoes.

In this sad condition the men of Company B began to clean and restore the community. They built new buildings and gave much service to the local people there. They soon ran out of things to do so were given permission to obtain work from the citizens of San Diego. The work they completed brought them great respect from the citizens of the community.

THE MORMON BATTALION Company C

by Helen T. Clegg*

The calling of the Mormon Battalion was not an unfriendly act by the government of the United States. The church had asked the government for help in its migration westward, but it was definitely a sacrifice by the Latter-day Saints. When the call came it was without warning or sufficient notice to recall many young men of the church who were away working to earn money for the trip west; therefore, most of the members of the battalion were heads of families. As B. H. Roberts, apostle and historian of the LDS Church says, there were certain advantages involved in complying with the formation of the Battalion as follows: (1) Service in the Battalion was evidence of loyalty to the United States that would stand forever. (2) The remaining Mormons had the right to camp in peace on Indian Lands for another year, as they prepared to travel. (3) Battalion men sent their clothing allowance and wages, amounting to more than \$21,000, to their families in Iowa. (4) Arms and camp equipment became the personal property of each soldier upon discharge. (5) Seasoned soldiers made good advisers and leaders of future expeditions to the Salt Lake Valley.

Besides being the sesquicentennial time for the Mormon pioneers entering the Salt Lake Valley, 1996 and 1997 are also the sesquicentennial years for the Mormon Battalion. Little known in American military historical annals, this group of 500 men, organized into five companies, enlisted in Council Bluffs, Iowa, marched to Fort Leavenworth, Kansas (supplies and equipment were issued here), and then "began one of the longest infantry marches in United States history"¹ going as far as San Diego and Los Angeles, California.

This article constitutes the fifth in this series. The basic company list found here was commenced with the list in *Our Pioneer Heritage*, then modified based on additional information found in *A Data Base of the Mormon Battalion* and *The Mormon Battalion—U.S. Army of the West*. Some further research was conducted trying to make the details of the list as complete as possible. It seems that after 150 years, a fitting tribute should be made to all those who served. Unfortunately, there are still far too many unknowns—blanks for birth and death data.

Two distinctions belong to Company E. First, though not an exclusive distinction, but certainly worth noting, one child was born—Malinda Kelley gave birth to a daughter, Malinda Catherine, February 7, 1847 at Pueblo. Malinda Catherine's father was Milton Kelley, Co. E. The other distinction relates to longevity. The last recorded death of the men of the Battalion was that of William Beddome, Co. E. William died December 4, 1920 at Los Angeles, California.

*** There has been much confusion whether there was a James A. Scott and a James R. Scott in this company—one being a corporal and the other a private. Even Ricketts has continued this confusion by listing James R. Scott, Co. E in the Brown Sick Detachment (p. 239). His name is also listed on page 280, yet there is no James R. Scott listed in the index (p. 371). And she fails to ever make any distinction between the two or clarify the situation. The compiler's research confirms that James A. is correct. His service record shows him both as private and as corporal. There just never was a James R. Scott. The confusion undoubtedly came from someone mistaking the letter "A" for the letter "R."

The Last Trapper: An American Saga. By Erma Armstrong. Dallas, Oregon: Tanglewood Hill Press, 1997. References, Appendix, Index, 456 pp. [not stated]

The single thing that I have learned about writing a family history is that there aren't any rules. There are, in fact, as many ways to create a family history as there are families to write about. Therefore, the family historian is featured more prominently than any other historian as (he or she) is able to proceed with whatever information he (or she) personally selects.

The Last Trapper: An American Saga is an oversize memoir that manages to skillfully introduce most of the facets of what is considered appropriate and necessary for the complete family history, i.e., history, genealogy, and folklore. It is divided into three basic sections. Part one includes family group information and the vivid life stories of the author's trapper father, Leonard Slaugh, and her mother, Jenny Postma, in eastern Utah and Colorado. It also includes stories of members of their nuclear families and the pioneer grandparents who led them west following conversion to the Mormon religion. Part two includes "micro-histories" of ancestral families primarily in the Eastern United States colonies, and their effect on the communities in which they resided. An informal third part allows for the author to make conclusions and introduce pedigree charts. The author has obviously done much research into some primary and many secondary sources, and she has included previous family histories by relatives. The book also features interviews with living family members. There is no doubt that *The Trapper* will be a useful resource for Slaugh/Goodrich/Postma families for many generations.

I really admire the appropriate inclusion of poetry, folktales, and letters written by various members of the family. This is obviously a multi-talented family with significant literary and musical skills even among the members who were without obvious educational opportunities.

George W. Ross, 2nd Lieutenant, 113th OVI
(Columbus) *Ohio State Journal*, Monday morning, September 29, 1862, p. 2

[Report from the *Washington Register*] – On Friday night last Lieut. H. VICKERS, of the 113th Ohio Regiment, now at Camp Chase, Columbus, arrived here with an order for the arrest of George W. ROSS, who was 2d Lieut. In Capt. ADAMS' company, same regiment, on a charge of having broken into the Sutler's quarters, and stolen there from \$200 in money, on Sunday night, the 14th inst. Lieut. ROSS, it seems, wormed himself into the position of 2d Lieut. of Capt. ADAMS' company, 113th Ohio Regiment, having first enlisted at Waterloo, in Fayette county. He went into the edge of Madison county and got in with Capt. ADAMS. Lieut. VICKERS informed us that he broke guard at Camp Chase on Tuesday of last week, and skedaddled, having some time previous thereto borrowed some \$50 of different volunteers in the company. The name of the Sutler from whom the \$200 was taken is MARPEL. An investigation of the theft was had, and it was proven upon ROSS. It was reported that Lieut. VICKERS had captured ROSS in Bloomingburg on Saturday last, but we presume this to be unfounded. Nothing since has been heard of him.

Interesting Sketch of Two Ex-Slaves
How Dick Became a Member of Co. E, 10th Ohio Cavalry--
War Times Reminiscences

Did you ever, Mr. Editor, think when writing up some hero of the hour, who began life as a rail splitter, stone mason or tanner, and got to be a county officer, judge, general or president, that there are other thousands about you in the humbler walks of life, whose story, if put on the stage behind the glare of the printer's art would glow with dramatic interest? Strong in all the best attributes of the human character, and again weak, at times, to the very limit of human depravity.

Of such stuff are heroes made, humble or great. With such characteristics does the press and stage have to deal in painting real life.

But the story of the great throng of heroes and heroines and their part in the drama is lost in obscurity. Only the deeds of those who rise to distinction do we have time to sing in prose and song, as the hurrying procession passes by. That other great multitude are unhonored and unsung.

"The dark unfathomed caves of Ocean bear
Full many a gem of purest ray serene, etc."

But why am I off into this innocuous desuetude of metaphysics, or whatever you please call it--side-tracked is better. I started out to speak of Richard JONES. "Nigger Dick," you all call him, and his lately deceased wife--Eliza--both of whom were plantation slaves prior to their coming to Wood county in 1865. There is nothing tragic or startling to tell only the simple story of two black people and how they came into the Union. I have always found a peculiar interest in the story of this, now numerous class of our American citizens of African descent--the ex-slaves. Not so much their bondage as the different phases of character displayed in their efforts to make the most of their suddenly acquired freedom--the difference between the highly wrought anticipations and the later sober reality.

I never see an old slave but the desire to hear his story fastens on me; and the tale is almost invariably one both grotesque and pathetic.

Dick's master, Dr. John R. JONES, from whom Dick takes his name, owned a plantation and sixty or seventy slaves, between Columbia and Shelbyville, Tennessee, Marshall county. Both Dick and his wife were fortunate in two things--having humane masters and in never being sold from the home plantation. Both were of large stature, and good intelligence, and before the war would have been valued at \$1,000 each.
