

BARDEN GENEALOGY

1935

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Isaac Barden was probably the son of Thomas and Eunice (Booth) Barden of Hanover, Mass., although there is a possibility that he was the son of Isaac and Deborah (Tobzy) Barden of Hanover, the brother of Thomas. The tradition handed down in the family is that the three brothers, Samuel, Isaac and Thomas Barden of Attleboro were the children of Thomas Barden. No record of the births of children to either Thomas or his brother Isaac of Hanover has been found, but we know that Thomas had children for he sold land to his granddaughter. As we know that Isaac of Hanover was the son of Abraham and Mary (Booth) Barden of Middleborough, for his birth is on record in that town, we are safe in stating that the three Attleborough brothers are grandchildren of Abraham and Mary (Booth) Barden of Middleborough.

The Weld Genealogy of the Borden Family and the Barden Blue Book give as the parents of the three Attleborough brothers, Samuel, Thomas and Isaac, the Thomas Borden of Portsmouth, R. I., whose marriage is recorded in that town to Mary Briggs on October 4, 1727. There are several arguments against this parentage. First of all is the one that Isaac Barden is recorded as an inhabitant of Middleborough on the day of his marriage to Experience Miller, also of Middleborough. At the time of his marriage Thomas also gives his residence as Middleborough. These two records would naturally connect the brothers with the Middleborough family of Bardens rather than with the Portsmouth family of Bordens. Descendants of the Attleborough family spelled their name Barden, sometimes Burden, or Burdin, very, very seldom Borden, while the Portsmouth group kept almost wholly to the spelling Borden. The few times that variations occurred could probably be traced to a town clerk who knew not the customary spelling of the name in his section.

One argument in favor of Thomas Barden of Hanover as the parent of the three Attleborough brothers in preference to Isaac Barden of Hanover is that Thomas Barden of Attleborough named a daughter Eunice and that name occurs among his descendants several times. Eunice Booth was the wife of Thomas Barden of Hanover. The name Deborah does not occur among the descendants of any of the three brothers, as it would be likely to occur if Isaac and Deborah (Tobey) were the parents.

One other point might be mentioned. Isaac and Thomas of Hanover were workers in iron and owned the ironworks first in the town of Scituate, Mass. and later in Hanover, when the section of Scituate where they were located was set off as part of the new town of Hanover. Isaac Barden and his brother Thomas of Attleborough were refiners or forgemen or workers in iron, for so they described themselves on several deeds. So it seems probable that they were brought up in that trade and learned it by working in the business with their father and later moved to a new town to set up for themselves. Most of the Borden family of Portsmouth and Tiverton were farmers or husbandmen.

To sum up, we find in Hanover ironworks carried on, according to the historian of Hanover, by two brothers, Thomas and Isaac Barden, who are the descendants of Abraham and Mary (Booth) Barden. We find Abraham and Mary Barden in Middleborough where the son Isaac is born. Later we find in Middleborough another Thomas and another Isaac who are workers in iron or refiners, and who leave and settle in Attleborough. Our conclusion is that they belong to the Middleborough Bardens and not to the Portsmouth Bardens.

This introduction has been deemed necessary because it is a statement concerning the parentage of the Attleboro Bardens wholly at variance with anything which has hitherto been published.

Because of the occurrence of the name Eunice among the descendants and because of the tradition that a Thomas Barden was the parent of the Attleborough group, preference is given to Thomas Barden and his wife Eunice Booth for the parentage of Isaac Barden of Middleborough and Attleborough over Isaac Barden and his wife Deborah Tobey.

Isaac Barden (probably the son of Thomas and Eunice (Booth) Barden of Hanover, Mass.) was married at Middleborough, Mass. on July 10, 1755, (Vital Records) to Experience Miller, the daughter of John and Waitstill (Clapp) Miller, who was born in Middleborough June 1, 1736 (V. R.).

(Note - Waitstill Clapp was the daughter of Ezra and Waitstill (Tucker) Clapp. Ezra Clapp was the son of Ezra and Experience (Houghton) Clapp and grandson of Edward and Prudence (Clapp) Clapp. Waitstill Tucker was the daughter of Manasseh and Waitstill (Sumner) Tucker of Milton, Mass. Experience Houghton was the daughter of Ralph and Jane Houghton. Manasseh Tucker was the son of Robert Tucker. Waitstill Sumner was the daughter of Roger and Mary (Josselyn) Sumner. Roger Sumner was the son of William and Mary (West) Sumner of Dorchester, Mass. Mary Josselyn was the daughter of Thomas and Rebecca Josselyn of Hingham and Lancaster, Mass.)

The marriage of Isaac Barden is thus recorded. "This certifies that Mr. Isaac Barden and Mrs. Experience Miller Jr. both of Middleborough were this day joined in marriage by me Peter Oliver Justis ad pac<sup>e</sup> middle. July 10, 1755." (Note, The term Mrs. was ascribed to a woman of good family irrespective of whether she

was married or not. When either the Mr. or Mrs. were used as titles it denoted that the persons were looked up to with respect. Only a very few in any town were thus addressed. At this period marriages were performed by a justice of the peace fully as often as by a clergyman.)

Experience Barden is mentioned in the will of her father, John Miller, dated May 16, 1759, in these words,- " I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Experience, the wife of Isaac Barden, eight pounds to be paid her by my son John when he comes to the age of 21 years as also one third of my moveable estate after my debts are paid." (Plymouth Probate 15.286).

Somewhere about 1761 Isaac Barden left Middleborough and settled in Attleborough. His son John was born in Middleborough in 1759 on the 20th of June. His daughter Anne was born in Attleborough on January 19, 1762.

On October 25, 1762 Isaac Barden of Attleborough, refiner, purchased of Joseph Wellman of Wrentham land near Ebeneser Richinon, Robert Martin and Thomas Sweet. (Taunton Deeds 48.453. Bristol County) and again on January 7, 1763 he purchased of Robert Martin of Attleborough land with a house, bordering on said Isaac Barden's land, Thomas Sweet's land, and "everend Peter Thacher's house. This deed was witnessed by Nathan Cobb and Samuel Barden and Job and John Martin. As the site of Rev. Peter Thacher's house is known, we can tell about where Isaac Barden first made his home in Attleborough.

Sometime previous to 1773 Isaac Barden left Attleborough and settled in Scituate, R. I., for a study of the deeds recorded in that town (Bk.8, p.395) reveals the fact that Job Randall, Esq., Isaac Borden, Joseph Carver and Oliver Carver made an indenture agreeing to build in partnership a forge or refinery in Scituate which was called and known by the name of Hopewell.

In 1777 he was still in Scituate, R. I. for on November 11, 1777 Israel Bates and his wife Mary sold land to him in a deed witnessed by Peter Thacher, Samuel Fuller, Jr., Comfort Fuller and John Doggett. (Bristol County Deeds 58.78). On April 15, 1782 Isaac Barden of Scituate, R. I., refiner, sold to Level Maxwell of Warren 20 acres bordering on Robert Martin, Thomas Sweet, Ebenezer Richardson and Henry Tolman. This deed was witnessed by William T. Miller and Lydia Miller (Bristol County Deeds, 60.527). On the following May 1, 1782 John Tyler of Attleborough sold to Isaac Barden of Scituate, R. I., refiner,  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre next to land of Isaac Barden and on the west side of the road leading by my house to Oak Hill and bounded thus, - the first corner is a large rock, being a bound of said road, then runs north 26 degrees west by said road about 26 rods to a corner on south side of the road leading from the Meetinghouse of the Second Precinct in said Attleborough to Providence, then runs west by said road about 4 rods to the northeast corner of said Barden's land in Attleborough, where his house standeth. Witnessed by John Daggett and Othniel Tyler (Bristol County Deeds 62.10). On June 1, 1782 Isaac sold a large part of his Attleborough property for we find the following deed recorded (Bristol County Deeds 62.11). "Isaac Barden of Scituate, Providence County, refiner, for \$840 sold to Elisha Carpenter of Attleborough, yeoman, - - - a farm, a dwellinghouse, barn, corn barn and shop and 70 acres on the southwest side of the Road from ye East Precinct in Attleborough leading to Providence on the road leading from Oak Hill ---- comes to road that leads to Providence, then on the Providence Road --- near Benjamin Freeman's land and Alexander Moore's land --- William Starkey's Corner."

Oak Hill Road is a corner. This deed was signed by Isaac Barden and his wife Experience and was witnessed by John Hill and Priscilla Hill, who were the parents of his son John Barden's wife. (He was not yet married to her.) The deed was acknowledged in Scituate at the same date but was not recorded in Bristol County until August 14, 1783 (B. C. D. 62.11). Soon after this "Isaac Borden" of Scituate forgerman lalias worker in iron, purchased of Stephen Harrington Of Foster, R. I. land in Foster on the north side of Killingly Road, westwadr from the dwellinghouse near Daniel Bennett's land --- Noah Seamans --- James Dyer. It includes 60 acres and a dwellinghouse. The deed was dated Dec. 31, 1782 and signed by Patience Harrington, wife of Stephen and witnessed by John Westcott and Micajah Bennett (Foster Deeds, Bk.1,p.7).

In May of 1783 Isaac Barden was a witness of the will of Jonathan Fuller, together with Asher Bennett and John Westcott, all of Foster.

On May 22, 1784 Isaac Borden of Foster sold to Elisha Carpenter of Attleborough, yeoman, 40 acres, being the easterly part of the farm where I now dwell, bounding east on land of James Dyer, --- Daniel Bennett --- Killingly Road. This was a mortgage ~~deed~~ deed. On Jan. 25, 1785 Isaac Borden of Foster forgerman al worker in iron for 1840 silver dollars --to John Hamman of Foster --land and farm that I bought of Stephen Harrington on north side of Killingly Road westward from the dwellinghoise in the range of Asher Bennett's land --- Daniel Bennett, John Westcott and James Dyer. There were 60 acres. The deed was signed also by wife Experience and witnessed by Francis Fuller, William Blanchard, Jr. and Martin Luther. (Foster Deeds, Bk. 1, p.69). There are one or two other mortgage deeds.

The tradition is that Isaac had Experience went back to Attleboro and died there and that he is buried in a cemetery in the forks of a road, one branch of which leads to Providence.

2 Thomas Barden brother of Isaac Barden of Attleborough, at the time of his marriage gave as his residence the town of Middleborough. He married Susanna Riggs, the daughter of Jonathan and Sarah Riggs of Attleborough on the 11th of February 1763. She was born July 7,1746.

He enlisted from Attleborough on Sept.1,1779 as private in Capt. Joseph Franklin's Co., Col. Nathan Wyler's Reg't. and served four months and was discharged Dec.31,1779. He re-enlisted July 28,1780 in Capt. Caleb Richardson's Co., Col. Abial Mithhell's Reg't., which was raised to reinforce the Continental Army and was discharged Oct. 31,1780. He was also a member of Capt. Moses Wilmarth's Co. which marched on the alarm to Rhode Island as a section of Col. Isaac Deane's Regt. They seem to have been in service from March to July or August of 1781/ It is stated also that he was one of the 5 months men that went from Attleborough to serve in the "Sixth Campaign" that "went to Yorke in 1776".

On July 12,1777 Thomas Barden, cordwainer, purchased from Daniel Richardson near Comfort Riggs and bordering on Thomas Wilmarth's land



land. (B.C.D. 72.104). On Nov. 4, 1786 Thomas Barden of Attleborough purchased of Asa Hopkins and his wife Comfort and Abimelech Riggs a portion of the estate of their "honored father Jonathan Riggs, late of Attleborough deceased"  $2/9$  parts of  $2/3$  of the real estate. Mother Sarah Riggs also signed off her dower rights. (B.C.D.72.104). Other purchases were made of Hosea Tiffany, and Amos Wilmarth.

On May 7, 1793 Thomas Barden of Attleborough, cordwainer and Susanna Barden ye wife of said Thomas sold to Ebenezer Robinson of Attleborough, cordwainer --- all lands and buildings we own in Attleborough containing our homestead farm and two wood lots -- farm bounded south by Eliphalet Wilmarth's land -- west on Daniel Richardson's -- north on Vinton Richardson's -- east to Lieut. Daggett, Capt. Henry Sweet, and ye heirs of Thomas Sweet, -- 35 acres and the wood-lot Thomas Barden bought of Hosea Tiffany etc. This deed was witnessed by Eleanor Barden and Stephen Richardson.(B.C.D.72.106). The records of the births of nine children of Thomas and Susanna Barden are found in Attleboro. One descendant says that there was another child born after the death of the first George and called George. No attempt has been made to verify this statement nor have I tried up to the present (1935) to trace farther the descendants of this Thomas. It is known that some of them remained in Attleborough, and their descendants are found in neighboring towns. One branch went to western Massachusetts and on into New York State.

3 Samuel Barden, brother of Isaac and Thomas Barden, at the time of his marriage to Elizabeth Fuller gave as his residence Attleborough. They published their intentions of marriage Oct.15,1763. No attempt to follow his descendants has been made to date (1935) except to record the births of the children listed in the Attleborough records.

6 John Barden (Isaac) b. June 20,1759 at Middleborough, Mass.(V.R.) d.Oct.14,1819; (gravestone at Colwell Cemetery, Scituate,R.I., "aged 60 years"); m. Aug.20,1780 at Scituate,R.I.,(V.R.) Elizabeth Colwell, daughter of Richard and Mary (Randall)Colwell. She died Aug.11,1828, aged 73 years (gravestone at Colwell Cemetery).

John Barden accompanied his father Isaac from Attleborough, where he spent his boyhood days, to Scituate, R.I. On Dec.1,1788 he and Lewis Miller purchased from Oliver Carver his half share in the Hopewell Forge, in which his father Isaac was a partner. It is not known whether at this time Isaac was still living, or whether John had inherited his share of the forge and by the deed from Oliver Carver purchased with Lewis Miller another portion of the partnership.

Oliver Carver of Foster, worker in iron, sold to John Borden of Scituate, forgesman or worker in iron, and Lewis Miller of Smithfield, blacksmith,  $\frac{1}{2}$  part of a certain forge or refinery in Scituate called and known by the name Hopewell, being the same that was built in

partnership by Job Randall, Esq., Isaac Borden, Joseph Carver, and the Grantor as may appear by one certain indenture made and bearing date March 2, 1773 and recorded in said Scituate records (Scituate Deeds Bk. 8, p. 395).

By 1792 John had come into possession of his father's share for on July 17, 1792 he mortgaged to Benedict Whipple  $\frac{1}{2}$  (that would be his father's share) and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of  $\frac{1}{2}$  share (Scituate Deeds Bk. 8, p. 178). After his death his widow Elizabeth (known as Betty Barden) carried on a small store and furnished supplies to the surrounding district. The village now called Ponagansett was then called Bettyville, thus honoring this capable widow. (Note: Great care must be observed not to confuse John Barden (name also spelled Borden, Burden and Burdin, son of Isaac Barden of Middleborough, with the John Borden who came from Swansea to Scituate about 1738 and purchased land on Huntinghouse Hill and brought up a family. His wife was Mary and his children were Samuel Asa, b. July 12, 1738, a physician at Gloucester and Providence, who married a daughter of Ezekiel Hopkins and had a son Samuel; John, b. Mar. 30, 1740; Nathaniel, b. Oct. 10, 1743; Gail, b. Sept. 9, 1745, who married Mary Knowlton; Abigail, b. Feb. 3, 1747; Ebenezer, who married Lydia Knowlton; and Rebecca, who married Thomas Hopkins. She was born April 10, 1755. This is the Borden family which is so well known in connection with condensed milk.)

(Note: The record of the marriage of John and Elizabeth on the town books of Scituate, R.I. is as follows, "I hereby certify that John Burden now resident in Scituate, son of Isaac Burden residing in said Scituate and Elizabeth Colwell, daughter of Richard Colwell of said Scituate, both in the county of Providence was lawfully joined together in Marriage on the Twentieth Day of August A.D.1780. Rec. Aug.30,1780 Jeremiah Angell, J.P."

23 Rhoda Barden (John, Isaac), b. about 1784; d. Feb. 18,1868 at the age of 83 years, 11 months, 17 days; m. Feb.22,1809 in Scituate, (V.R.), Joshua Smith, who died Apr.23,1862 at the age of 76 years, 10 m.,24 d. He was the son of Thomas and Sarah (Crowninshield) Smith.

Rhoda inherited rights in the land and dwelling house of her father in Ponagansett, which she and her husband deeded to John Barden On July 9,1830.(Scit. Deeds, 14.211).

I Joshua Smith to John Bardin --- all right --- that I now have in and unto one certain Lot of Land with a dwelling house thereon

standing and is bounded. --- northerly on land of Joshua Herington and Thomas Hill; westerly on land of Thomas Hill and southerly on land of Joshua Herington and easterly on land of said Herington -- meaning by this deed to convey all the remainder of the land that was conveyed to me by John Barden deceased --- containing about an acre and three quarters. Wife Rhoda Smith signed off her rights.

John Barden is spoken of in the records as yeoman, so it seems probable that the use of the forge which was on his father's land was discontinued, for about where that stood the records speak of a grist mill and a saw mill. In 1825 John Barden and his wife Priscilla gave to Joshua Harrington in a deed dated October 6th "one certain tract of land -- in Scituate with a dwelling house, gristmill and sawmill thereon standing -- with all the tools used at and in said gristmill and sawmill," said land lies on both sides of the Ponagansett River -- and bounds on land of the heirs of Job Randall,

deceased, Thomas Hill's land, Joshua Smith's land and land of the grantor. One bound was near the north side of a spring near the grist mill. The tract included about 11 acres. And the "said Joshua Harrington for the consideration above mentioned to have the privilege to build a dam or dams across said Ponagansett River at any place within his purchase described above to any height not exceeding fifty feet and neither said grantor nor his heirs -- to claim any damages for flowage or water above said dam upon land now owned by said grantor". (Scit. Deeds 12.523). On April 19, 1826 Joshua Harrington purchased from John and Priscilla Barden another small piece of land adjoining this on the south, (Deeds, 12.577.) On the 8th of June 1827 (Deeds, 13.350) Joshua Smith and John Burdin make an agreement with Joshua Harrington that the said "Joshua Harrington shall have the right --- and authority to cut, dig, build, construct, and make over and across the lot of land owned by said Smith, near what is commonly called the Burden Mills, lying in said Scituate and the same keep in repair: a certain canal or trench, said canal or trench to be made and located at least 6 feet east of the house where widow Elizabeth Burden now lives and said ~~canal~~ <sup>land</sup> or trench not to exceed ten feet in width between the walls -- said Harrington to have liberty to take labourers, teams of cattle, oxen and horses on said lot of land and the same there continue for the purpose aforesaid -- doing as little damage as conveniently may be --- said trench or canal to go about 8 rods on the land aforesaid through the said Smith and Burden --- and the said Harrington covenants with the said Smith and Barden that he will immediatley after said canal or trench shall be dug and made in the manner aforesaid cover the same over for the whole length of said lot and the same keep covered over forever thereafter and that he will dig or cause to be dug, a well

a little easterly of the gate which leads to said Harrington's house, and open a gate to the same, so that the said Elizabeth may take water therefrom for her use as long as she shall live, said well to be dug at any time when the said Elizabeth shall order it -- and in case the said digging of the trench or canal should cause any injury to the house or the walls thereof, whete the said Elizabeth now lives, he, the said Harrington, -- to pay all damages and injury arising therefrom. N.B. Said Harrington to cover over said canal or trench so that the same may be passable with teams, and make the dirt over the timbers in the thinnest place at least 6 inches."

This agreement gives the exact location of the home of John and Elizabeth Barden. It must have been upon almost the exact spot where John H. Barden later built his house.

(Note - Joshua Harrington sold his rights acquired from Smith and Barden to William Richmond 2nd, Richmond Bullock and John Andrews of Providence on April 2, 1827. Scituate Deeds 14.124 )

The Scituate records contain many other records in which John Barden appears as both grantor and grantee. One deed he made to his son John H. Barden on July 29, 1837 in which he sold land bounded by Henby Yeaw, Phebe Corp and Knight Hill. It included about six acres. (Scit. Deeds 15.545)

25 Robert Barden (John, Isaac) b. Feb. 6, 1789; d. Oct. 1, 1863. He never married. He was one of those unfortunates who never grow up, but retain the simple ideas and characteristics of childhood. He was cared for by his brothers as long as they lived, but as he outlived them, the town took care of him in his old age.
