For some years I have been searching for the Christian forebears of my late wife. The saga begins with her great grandfather, Barnard CHRISTIAN a blacksmith who lived most of his adult life in Stanfordville, Dutchess Co., and all of his descendents have moved away, some to Conn.

Barnard Christian married Maria Lemons Gildersleeve (widow of James Gentleman of Washington, D. C.), daughter of Joseph Gildersleeve and Mary Mosher of Stanfordville, N. Y. They had children: Remington Palmer Christian, b. 1862, d. 1945, who married Sarah Ann Woodin in Seymour, Conn.; John Christian, who married Sarah Hegeman and had four children, place of residence unknown; and Sarah Emma Christian, b. 1864 and died as an infant.

Remington Palmer Christian became a passenger conductor on the N. Y., N. H., & H. Railroad, and resided in Hartford and New Haven, Conn. He had five children, among whom was Esther Charlotte, b. 1891 in Hartford, Conn., who married Leslie Borden Ulrich. They became the parents of Barbara Imogene Ulrich, b. 1915, who was destined to become my wife.

His brother Elijah Willis was also in Troup Co. in 1830's I think possibly my Elijah W. was named for him and his (supposed) grandfather. The earliest known ancestor Thomas Christian (m. Sarah Drane) was dead by 1829 Wash. Co., Ky. and his son John Christian was to adm. the estate; but John d. 1833 leaving the two widows to adm. the combined estate in Wash. Co. Ky. This estate was settled 4 March 1837; and John's widow Catharine Mary (Wathen) Christian married Wm. McElroy and moved to Warren, Marion Co., Mo. in 1837 where their daughter Marie J. McElroy was born in 1837; a son Robert W. McElroy was born 1839.

S. about 1840. His homes were in Ark., Miss., and Cass Co., Texas areas. I have quite a bit of info. on Peter, his children, and their families beginning with the 1850 Chickasha Co., Miss. Census.

I am interested in trying to link Peter to unknown aunts and uncles, one of whom lived in New York City or vicinity in the early 1800's and is believed to have owned a ship or ships operating between our east coast and England — probably Liverpool. Supposedly Peter had an Uncle lost at sea in a ship's fire. In addition Peter is believed to have served on an uncle's ship for several years as a young boy before coming to the U. S.

In addition to U. S. Census info. of Christian's in Va., S. C., Ga., Ala., Miss., Ark., and Texas I have quite a few names associated with locations in England and on the Isle of Man. I will start with census listings I have in Miss. for your use in the bulletin and will send names from other locations for later bulletins as time permits.

I am seeking info. which would lead to the identity of the parents of the Thomas Christian, born in Va., about 1776-1780, who married Margaret "Rebecca" Pine? He is listed with his family in the 1820 U. S. Census of Giles Co., Va. Although a son, James Pine Christian, settled in what later became Logan Co., W. Va., and married Anne Moore, the rest of the family apparently moved to Perry Co., Ky. This Thomas Christian was listed as head of his family in Perry Co., Ky., in 1830; but in 1840 "Becky" Christian headed the same family; so he must have died between 1830 and 1840. They are known to have had several daughters and at least two other sons besides James P. One was named Allen and the other, Thomas, who married Mary "Polly" Amburgy.

For some years I have been searching for the Christian forbears of my late wife. The saga beginw with her great grandfather, Barnard Christian, a blackswith who lived most of his adult life in Stanfordville, Dutchess Co., N. Y. He is listed on the 1860 and 1870 censuses as having been born in Pa., though I have never been able to pick up the trail in that state. No others of this surname are found in Dutchess county, and all of his descendants moved away, mostly to Conn.

Barnard Christian married Maria Lemons Gildersleeve (widow) of James Gentleman; dau. of Joseph and Mary (Mosher) Gildersleeve. Among their children was Remington Palmer Christian, b. July 28, 1862, Stanfordville, N. Y. In early adulthood he migrated to Conn. and in 1883 married Sarah Ann Woodlin in Seymour, Conn. Remington became a passenger conductor on the N. Y., N. Y. and H. Railroad, and resided first in Hartford and later until his death in 1945 in New Haven, Conn.

Among the children of Remington and Sarah Christian was Esther Charlotte born 1891 in Hartford. She married Leslie Borden Ulrich and among their children was Barbara Imogene, born in New Haven in 1915 and destined eventually to marry me.

The birth year of Barnard Christian is uncertain. The 1860 census lists him as 43 (1817); the 1870 shows 50 (1820). There is an intriguing possible clue on the 1850 census for Groton, New London Co., Conn. When the census was taken, "The Bask Shepherdess" (their spelling) was in port, H. W. P. Randall, Naster. Among the personnel was a sailor named Brainerd Christian, age 18 (1832) and born in Pa. The age seems a way off, but the censuses are not noted for strict accuracy of detail and he would still be old enough to be the father of Remington.

I should be ever so grateful to you, if you could furnish me with any clues as to where to pick the trail of Barnard Christian in Pa., and as to who his parents might be. Family tradition, not always reliable, believed the family to be of Swedish origin. If you want fuller details of the descendants of Barnard, I should be glad to furnish them. (WE DO)

As you may be interested in the origins and history of the Manx CHRISTIANS, I'll jot down a few notes on them before going on to their movements in America.

The first CHRISTIANS on record seem to have been Icelandic Norse; name then was Kristin. The Norse invaded the Isle of Man at about the same time that they were settling the coastal fringes of Northern England and Scotland. In Manx, the name became "McCrystyn", "MacChristene", etc., but it became Christian under the later English influence. The Christians seem always to have been prominent in Manx affairs, but the most famous is William Christian (1608-1663), receiver-general of the Isle of Man, third son of Ewen Christian, who was one of the deemsters (judges) of the Isle. Almost certainly the change in the family's fortune, coming as a result of William's fate, was the reason for the emigration of some of its members. William's history is a complex one. In 1643 his father made over to him the estate of Ronaldsway. At that time the Lord of Man was James, Seventh Earl of Derby, who appears to have seen in the feudal powers and privileges enjoyed by the Christians a threat to his own Lordship of the island; the Earl had imposed certain restrictions on the Christian property transactions, and William acquired the particular estate only because the two older brothers refused to accept Derby's conditions. Soon after the English Civil War broke our, in the Isle of Man most of the people were Rayalists, and in 1651 the Earl went to England with a body of Manx volunteers, leaving William Christian in command of the insular troops. What happened next is very complicated and sometimes not very clear. The Earl was taken prisoner by the Parliamentarians, and the Countess, hearing of this, tried to bargain for her husband's life by arranging the surrender of the island. Christian immediately organized an insurrection to defeat the scheme. The Earl of Derby was executed in England. Ten. years later, after the restoration of the Monarchy, the eighth earl sought revenge on Christian, whom he blamed for the Execution of his father and accused him of having been in collusion with the Parliamentarians. In January 1663 the new Earl exceeded his authority by having Christian tried and Executed for treason. Christian had written to the King for a pardon, and the King signed the document, not realizing that the execution had already been carried out. Later, I'm glad to say, the King punished Derby for his actions.

One of William's brothers was John Christian, about whom I know nothing. William himself was described as "a young man of slight figure, dark complexion, closecut hair, and a melancholy expression".

William had eight sons and one daughter. The eldest son was George. the second son, Ewan, and the seventh Thomas, came to England where there were relatives and estates in Cumberland and Lancashire. Ewan eventually regained the Ronaldsway estate, also. It is clear that Thomas Christian, who settled in Virginia, must have been a close relative.

CHRISTIAN Family Information continued:

The Thomas Christian who came to Lancashire and Cumberland was the grandfather of Fletcher Christian. Fletcher and his brother, Edward, were the sons of Charles Christian, who lived at Mairlandclere, Cumberland. Fletcher's brother, Edward, was the Professor of Laws at Downing College, Oxford and a well known judge. As a young man he attained a brilliant scholastic record, but later he sank into utter dissipation. He died in 1823. Fletcher's colorful story is well known, though it remains controversial whether he was murdered in Pitcairn or whether he somehow returned to England.

Rear Admiral Sir Hugh Christian (1747-1798) was descended from a branch of the family who had remained in Milntown, Isle of Man. He had a distinguished and eventful career in the navy, and in 1795 became commander-in-chief of the West Indies. Soon he was sent out to the Cape of Good Hope. Curiously enough, the father of this admiral was the Captain of A privateer; a pirage in short. He was Thomas Christian and in 1753 he was killed in London during a brawl in a gambling house.

Another seagoing Christian was one Edward Christian who is known to have been serving in the East Indies, 1744-1749 with the rank of Captain. Even today, I believe, the maritime tradion persists in the family.

Another interesting member of the Manx line was Thomas Christian, who died in 1799. He was the son of the Reverend John Christian of Kirk Marown, I.M. Thomas succeeded his father as Vicar or Rector in 1779. It is said of Thomas that he was chiefly distinguished for his utter unfitness for the clerical office in every respect; but the same could truthfully be said of most rural clergy-men of those days. They were squires and landowners who, for the most part, knew little about religion and cared less. It just so happened that vy getting themselves ordained they could acquire the living of a rich parish through family influence. Thomas did a very remarkable thing, he translated about four thousand lines of "Paradise Lost" from English to Manx.

I wonder whether you have looked into the question of Fletcher Christian (the famous mutineer who gave Capt. Bligh his comeuppance and took the "Bounty" to Pitcairn) being related to the descendants of the Christians that emigrated to America. Of Course, Fletcher Christian was born about 100 years after the emigration, and the connection must have been rather distant. I do know that Fletcher Christian's family had estates in both Cumberland and the Isle of Man. Whether it would be possible to prove the relationship beyond all doubt is questionable, though common sense tells me that it must have existed. The surname Christian is certainly not a common one, and it is difficult to believe that two or more entirely unconnected families by the name of Christian dwelt in two such thinly populated areas as the Isle of Man and the county of Cumberland then were. The fact that Fletcher Christian's family belonged to the "landed gentry" should render, of possible, to trace Fletcher's antecedentsfrom the expensive brass-fronted tombstones which the gentry erested for their dead; and from other sources. I intend to do this when I can. I know of no historical society in either place.

May 20, 1964, by Mattie Lou Christian (Chris) Gelin of Lubbock, Tex.:

Ad from the Virginia Gazette (newspaper) of August 19, 1773.
"To be rented by the year or for a Term of years A Tavern on the River Road from Richmond to Williamsburg which was formerly occupied by Daniel Stone, and late in the Tenure of John Christian. The Dwelling house is commodious, having four rooms below and two above stairs. There are outhouses, Garden, Pasture, and land also if required, sufficient to work two or three Hands. This place would suit a Tradesman, partibularly a Tailor, which is much wanted in the neighborhood provided he could Keep a good House. For Terms apply to the Subscriber. J. Pleasants. Va. Gazette. Aug. 19, 1773".

* Mr. Edward Pleasants Valentine was a Descendent of the J. Pleasants who placed the above ad in the August 19, 1773 issue of the Virginia Gazette. Edward Pleasants Valentine had spent a lifetime gathering early Virginia records which he bequeathed to the Valentine Museum established in honor of his family in Richmond, Virginia. Edward Pleasants Valentine died in 1908 and the Museum was established either before or soon after this date. I will try to find more information on this Museum (whether or not it still exists) and more on the Pleasants family; since a Mr. J. Pleasants placed the above ad, he was evidentally the owner of the Tavern on Aug. 19, 1773.

The August 19, 1773 ad on the preceeding page shows that a John Christian occupied a Tavern just prior to this 1773 date. This tavern was in the vicinity of Richmond, Va. and so was Hanover where our John lived, according to the dates in this old ledger. Also, according to entries in the old ledger, our John sold rum, whiskey, linen by the yard, sleeve buttons, silver buckles, etc. Although most of the entries indicate that he sold more lumber than anything else and did more carpentering and building than most everything else, he also kept cattle and horses and did some kind of farming. All of which could fit in with this ad. Also, there are some entries where he (or someone in his family) did some tailoring of "breaches", but these entries are not made until 1779, six years after this ad was placed, so he evidentally had moved from this tavern location by that time, providing this was our John.

A tavern in those days was not the same thing as a cocktail lounge is today. In that era, a tavern was the community center. It could also be called an "Inn", a "Public House" or other terms I can't recall at the moment, and it could have a store, saw mill, grist mill, livery stable or other businesses in connection with it. I remember your telling me that some woman wrote you that she thought your John Christian ran a tavern, and you were not too complimentary toward her suggestion! But if this proved so, we could always call it an "inn" or something.

I'm not saying this is our John in this ad. After all, I have found 18 different John Christians listed as having been in the Revolution from Virginia. I was just interested in the fact that the entries in the old ledger show that our John did sell liquor (which was perfectly honorable in those days); he did farm and pay wages to various "hands"; he was a "tradesman" in that he sold all sorts of merchandise, and he did do some sewing (or "tailoring"), though after 1773. And according to the old ledger, he was living in the vicinity of Richmond, which is not far from Hanover, Va., from July, 1770 (the earliest entry in the ledger) to November, 1787. After this last date, the entries are labeled "Lexington", which means Kentucky, I presume, as the note in the back of the ledger says that Paul Christian moved to Kentucky with his father in the fall of 1787.

Now this ledger indicates that there was an even earlier ledger, for it says "transferred from old ledger", in one place I noticed. So this could mean that John Christian resided in the vicinity of Hanover, and therefore Richmond, before July 1770, and ran his business even then. But anyway, we are fairly positive that John lived in this vicinity from at least July 1770 to November 1787 (According to the last 1787 entry in the ledger. John Christian settled all of his accounts with Peter Christian in Spotsylvania Co., Va. on November 5, 1787. He must have moved to Lexington soon after this date.)

Anyway, if we could find out the names of various taverns along the River Road between Richmond and Williamsburg in 1773, we might have a clue! When I write this Mr. Charles Hamlin in Richmond, I'll ask him to look into this bit of history.

WILLIAM CHRISTIAN, IMMIGRANT TO VIRGINIA, AND SOME OF HIS DESCENDENTS From Data of Marshall L. McClanahan William Christian appears to be the progenitor of the early arriving Christians of Charles City County (Va.) and vicinity, not Thomas Christian of The 1657 land grant. For Authority, see page 304 of the "register, Kentucky Historical Society, Frankfort, Ky., Vol 47, dated 1949", entitled "Christians of Virginia and Kentucky," by Ruth N. Hooker, wherein she states; "B. R. S. Megaw, B. A., E. S. A., Director and Librarian of The Manx Museum, Library and Art Gallery, Douglas, Isle of Man, considers Mrs. Rita Browne of Somerset, England, the best authority on the Christian family of Milntown, Isle of Man." The Christians were established there as early as 1422, having come there from Wigtonshire, Scotland. They ranked as Gentlemen, but were under the feudal control of the Earls of Derby, etc. (See F. Johnston, Esq. in his Local History, Fincastle Herald, Fincastle, Va., Thursday, June 16, 1874) But earlier reasearch shows that they were Norsemen from what is now Denmark, where the name is spelled Christin, and Christiern. The Mc or Mac prefixing the name is the Gaelic "son of" which the Isle of Man Christians appear to have dropped ca. 1600 A. D.

Going back to Miss Rita Browne, she stated that the descendents of the william Christian who md. Elizabeth Collier, (not Cottier as is given in A. W. Moore's "Manx Worthies") and settled in Virginia in 1655 have done much research on the family. This William Christian's son, Thomas Christian, pat. land in 1657 for "headrights" meaning that the passage of each immigrant paid for entitled the sponsor to, usually, one hundred acres of land. This is on the north side of the James River and east side of the Chichahominy River along trees of Capt. Bridges Freeman, southwest of trees of Thomas Young and northwest on Island Creek, for the transportation of two persons, Thomas Christian and John Wilkinson. (See page 364 of Mrs. Nugent's Virginia Land Grants,

showing 100 acres, James City County, Jan. 15, 1657; page 167 (249) of original idem; page 77 (549) 100 acres, dated March 18, 1662, same location, on trees of Thomas Young and Island Creek. Page 144: Capt. Samuel Mathews, 4000 acres, a neck of land on north side of Rappahannock River bounded on west by Cassotowoman Creek, etc., dated Aug. 1, 1643, old page 882. Transported fourscore persons, including one Richard Christian.) Also, Mr. Thos. Christian received a patent for 1080 acres of land on Oct. 21, 1687 and 193 acres situated south of the Chickahominy Swamp, Oct. 26, 1694. He was then called Sr., indicating that another adult Thomas Christian resided nearby. Another patent was dated Dec. 9, 1662.

It will be noted that the title "Mr." in the latter two patents indicated social standing. For in those days only those of "gentle" birth, including officers of the Government (civil and military), ministers, teachers, and persons of similiar standing were honored by the title of "Mr". The ordinary man was addressed as "goodman" and his wife, "goodwife".

Hutchinson's "History of Cumberland Co., England", book 2, page 148, gives the genealogy of Christians from the year 900, inhabiting Westmoreland and Cumberland Counties, including the Isle of Man. William Christian, Judge, writing in 1630, first used the spelling without the "Mc" prefix. Seats, Uncrigg or Ownerigg Castle, and Ronaldsway. See Sir Walter Scott's "Perveril of the Peak"; has an appendix with some additions and gives a history of the family. (See Isle of Man data in the William and Mary College Quarterly, series 1, Vol. 5.)

Capt. William Christian (10) b. April 14, 1608, Ronaldsway, Isle of Man, called "Illiam Dhone" or "Fair Haried William", sometime receiver General of the Isle of Man, Governor of the Isle in 1656/9, was executed by order of Charlotte, Countess of Derby, Jan. 2, 1662, being shot. (See History of Isle of Man by Dr. Joseph George Cummings, etc., including "Perveril of the Peak").

John Christian (11) m. probably Isabella Percy, dau. of Henry Lord Percy Earl of Northumberland (where many Christians lived); removed from Isle of Man to probably Scotland and had Gilbert Christian (12) who was born in Scotland about 1680 or before. Gilbert moved to Londonderry, Ireland in 1702 and then to Newcastle (now in Delaware) in 1722. Gilbert m. Mary, or Margaret Richardson; their dau. Mary m. John Moffett.

From the "Manx Notebook" by Moore: the first Christian of whom there is a record here (Isle of Man) was John Christian, a deemster (judge) in 1406 and a member of the Tynwald Court in 1422. Of his three successors, who also bore the name of John, the first was seated in Altadate, Parish of Lezayre;

the second was deemster from 1511 to 1535; and the third acquired the property adjoining Altadale and named the whole thing"Milntown". He was the first to put the Manx Laws into writing. Daniel, his brother, was ancestor of the Christians of Baldroma in Manghold. Mrs. Rita Browne firmly believed that Daniel was the grandfather of the William Christian who married Elizabeth Collier (date unfortunately not given). She goes on to cite that the gr. gr. daughter of Thomas Christian (2) (Wm. 1) who had married her cousin, Capt. Thomas Llwellyn Christian, and lived on the original grant to Thos. Christian (2), was having her home repaired one time, when in a rat's nest a a silver teaspoon engraved with the Milntown crest was found.

Judge George L. Christian also stated in The History of the Eastern Shore of Va. by Wise, that around 1900 there was still a large mahogony tree on the original Thomas Christian estate, which planted by a Bailey who m. a Christian.

In the Lincolnshire, Eng. Parish Register, Vol. IV, Congressional Library, by Philomore and Cole (Call #Cs 435) page 70; Thos. Christian of Burton and Jane Byrdhead, widow, m. 11-27-1609. Could he have been the father of the William who m. Elizabeth Collier?

Mrs. Nell Nugent, Vol. 1, page 275; note that in patent blk. 3, that a Mrs. Jane Harmer was granted 2000 acres in Northampton Co., Va. in 1652 (Page 184) for the transportation of 40 persons, among them a William Christian. A Mr. Henry Corbin and Mr. Gerrard Fowke were granted 3000 acres in Patomeck Freshes between the two main branches, March 15, 1656 for transporting a number a persons, among them was Anne Christian (7).

The county Court Notebook of Va., and some Maryland Gleanings, Vol 1-3; William Christian of the "City of Bristol", Northumberland Co., Sept. 27, 1667 (Records VII 22. English Quakers banished between 1660-66; John Christian heads the list. Ship "Ann & Taylor", Cavaliero Christian, Master, at Accomac, Va., 1701 (VII 276).

In Hotten's Persons, page 424; from Barbados (where ships stopped before continuing to American Southern Colonies), Parish of St. Michaels, baptized Mathew, son of Francis and Thomasine Christian, June 16, 1759. In Williams-burg, Va. Wills by Grozier, Vol. 3, page 25, a Simon Farley, Isle of Antigua, June 13, 1756, mentions his uncles Robert and Mathew Christian in his will.

CHRISTIANS OF VIRGINIA AND KENTUCKY

MARTHA CHRISTIAN RICHARDS

By Ruth Nelms Hooker

Memphis, Tennessee

My great-aunt's name, Martha Christian (Richards) Mosby, intrigued me even as a child. I thought that her parents, Benjamin Fraklin and Louisa Sylvester (Fort) Richards, must have been deeply religious people, but it never occurred to me that the name, Christian, may have been a family name. The large old family Bible, which had belonged to her parents, also held great fascination as did all things old—even from my earliest memory. Cenealogy interested me at an earlier age than most, but it was not until I was introduced to Chalkley's Augusta County Records that I accidentally came upon a clue to "Aunt Mattie's" name (Philemon Richards' marriage to Martha Christian).

In telling my story of the Christians of Virginia and Kentucky, I shall follow the course of similar chronicles, and give something of the European background of this family.

Mrs. E. J. Darnell, in her "Forks of Elkhorn Church," 1946, p. 100, says that "Gilbert Christian went from Scotland to Ireland in 1702. He married Margaret Richardson, and they came in 1726 to Pennsylvania, and in 1732 to Augusta County, Virginia."

B. R. S. Megaw, B.A., F.S.A., Director & Librarian of The Manx Museum, Library and Art Gallery, Douglass, Isle of Man, considers Mrs. Rita Browne of Somerset, England, the best authority on the Christian family of Milntown, Isle of Man. Mrs. Browne has a theory that Gilbert Christian, who m. Margaret Richardson, was the son of Patricius Christian (1649-1687) and Mary, dau. of John Nettles, High Sheriff of Toureen County, Waterford, Ire.and. Patricius Christian of Old Grange, Waterford, Ireland, was the son of William Christian (Illiam Dhone, William Fair-hair) of Ronaldsway, Isle of Man (1608-1662/3), of the Manx ballard "On The Death and Murder of Receiver-General William Christian of Ronaldsway, Who Was Shot Near Hango Hill, Jan. 2, 1662" (see Sir Walter Scott's Appendix to Introductory Epistle to his Novel, "Peveril of the Peak" -- Historical Notices of Edward and William Christian; Two Characters in "Peveril of the Peak"). Scott refers to Rolt's History of the Isle of Man, pub. in 1773, p. 89, Sacheverill's Account of the Isle of Man, pub. in 1702, p. 100, and to Hutchinson's History of Cumberland, Vol. iii, p. 146 (the later giving a history of the Christian family in Isle of Man "so early as 1422," "the family having previously been established in Wigtonshire, Scotland").

F. Johnston, Esq., in his column, "Local History," Fincastle Herald, Fincastle, Va., Thursday, June 18, 1874, says: "The Christians were established in the Isle of Man as early as the year 1422, having come there from Wigtonshire in Scotland. They were of the rank of Gentlemen, but were under the feudal control of the Earls of Derby, etc., etc. There is a tradition in the family of Israel Christian, that his immediate ancestors passed from the Isle of Man to Dublin (Ireland)"; From "Tennessee the Volunteer State," Moore, Vol. IV, p. 842, we find that Gilbert Christian, his wife, three sons and one daughter, and his nephew, Israel Christian and Israel's wife, "landed at New Castle,

Pennsylvania in 1726, spent six years at Derry in Lancaster Co., then in 1732 came down into the Valley of Virginia, locating at a point near the present town of Staunton, on a creek to which he gave his name and which is known to this day as Christian's Creek."

"Twelve Virginia Counties," Gwathmey, 1937, p. 393, states: "Four children of Gilbert Christian of Ireland, came to America about 1733 and settled in Beverley Manor, on Christian's Creek. Most of the family moved to Kentucky and Tennessee. Among the descendents was Gov. Allen Trimble, of Ohio."

Ibid., p. 41: "Among these first settlers in Beverley Manor whose title deads were recorded in Orange are found many who appear again as the frentier advances. John, Robert, and William Christian took 1614 acres."

Capt. Gilbert (1) Christian, b. ca. 1677 in Ireland, came with his wife, Margaret Richardson, his three sons John, Robert and William, and one daughter Mary, to New Castle, Pa., in 1726; lived six years in Derry, Lancaster Co., Pa., and in 1732 came to what is now Augusta Co., Va. With him were his nephey, Israel, and Israel's wife Elizabeth Starke. Gilbert (1) Christian d. after 1756/7 in Augusta Co., Va. (Moore, Vol. IV, pp 844,845).

From Gov. David Campbell's letter to Lyman C. Draper, Apr. 2, 1840: "My father, John Campbell, served at the age of eighteen, under the celebrated Indian fighter, Capt. Gilbert Christian, of Augusta County." In a letter of Dec. 29, 1842, David Campbell tells Mr. Draper that he remembers his father's account of an Indian battle in Augusta Co. in which Capt. Christian, then about eighty years old, commanded. (According to Moore, this Indian battle took place in 1756.)

Little is known of John (2) Christian (Gil. 1), except that he married and had a son, Gilbert, and perhaps others.

Robert (2) Christian (Gil. 1) married Isabella Tiffins and d. prior to Dec. 16. 1794, on which date his will was probated in Augusta Co. He left seven children: 1. John; 2. Robert; 3. Jacob, d. young, unm.; 4. Mary, m. Robert Patterson; 5. Margaret, m. Mm. Anderson (bro. of Marg. Anderson); 6. Gilbert, b. in Va. 1723/4, m. & had a son, George; 7. Israel, d. young, unm.

Mary (2) Christian (Gil. 1), m. (1) John Moffet in 1724 (he d. in 1746); m. (2) John Trimble in 1755. She had eight children; George, Robert, Wm., John, Mary, Kitty, and Hannah Moffet, and James Trimble. James Trimble moved to Kentrucky, and his children went to Ohio where his son, Allen, became Governor.

Maj. Wm. (2) Christian (Gil. 1) (better known as Capt. Wm. Christian) was b. in 1725 in Ireland, and d. bef. Aug. 17, 1779, the date his will was proven in Augusta Co. (Chalkley, Vol. iii, p. 154). He m. Mary Campbell, dau. of Patrick and Delilah (Thompson) Campbell (Delilah was dau. of Capt. Wm. Thompson), who was b. 1727/8 in Sweet Ara, Donegal Twsp., Pa. Wm. (2) and Mary (Campbell) Christian left the following children; 1. Margaret Campbell Christian (1745-1790), m. Capt. Andrew

Russell and had issue; 2. Gilbert Christian (1745-1796), m. and had: a. John, b. 1779, m. Nancy Shelton, b. Col. George (War 1812), c. Lewis m. Polly Skelton, d. James m. Mary Staples; 3. Elizabeth Christian; 4. Mary Christian; 5. Patrick Christian.

Maj. Wm. (2) Christian (Gil. 1) was a member of The Augusts County "Council of War" July 27, 1756, at which time he was appointed Captain. He served under his cousin, Col. Wm. Christian (son of Israel (1) in 1776; commanded a company from Augusta Co. in 1776 at the Battle of Long Island Flats; and was with Col. Wm. Christian at Ft. Patrick Henry (Waddell's Annals of Aug. Co., pp. 136,250; Heywood's Hist of Tenn.). He led a company at the Battle of Little Meadows, where Washington commanded, and performed his last campaign as a Major under Col. Wm. Christian against the Cherokees (King's Mountain Men, White, pp 79-96).

Charge (4) Christian (Gil. 3, Robt. 2, Gil. 1) wrote a letter to Draper on Dec. 4, 1842, in which he said; "I will here relate another adventure of Old Capt. Christian (wm. 2) for which he was much applauded. It was probably in the year preceding Braddock's campaign-the Indians had become so troublesome on the frontiers that Militia Companies were kept on duty constantly. At this time Capt. George Moffit of Augusta County (a cousin of father's) who commanded a company on duty, being informed of a large body of the enemy near at hand marched at the head of his company against them. The two companies met being nearly equal strength, some 65 strong on either side. But after a severe fight and after losing a number of his men, Moffit was completely defeated, himself narrowly escaping by sinking himself in a creek. This victory served to inspire the savages with fresh courage, while they were disposing of their wounded and collecting their scattered warriors--old Cap. Christian on hearing of the defeat of Moffit lost no time collecting together his company of picked warriors---the Indians had time to retreat after their fight with Moffit, but seemed in no hurry to retreat further than to procure more provisions. But before they were apprized of their danger, old Christian was on them with his warriors. As it was intended, one of the lines discharged their guns upon the enemy, on which they flew to their guns, taking trees on the opposite side, when the men in the rear gave them a deadly fire. This threw them in some confusion, though they fought like tigers, but so completely were they surrounded and so dedaly was our fire that in a few minutes they were almost entirely cut down. So complete was their defeat that only two or three reached their homes."

Patrick (3) Christian (Wm. 2, Gil. 1) was b. ea. 1745/6 in Augusta Co., Va. and d. (June 21, 1808& March 25, 1811) according to the dates of his will in Book 11, p. 8, Aug. Co. He was first married to Elizabeth, dau. of Mathew and Martha Robertson after June 20, 1766 (date of his marriage license, Chalkley). His wife, Elizabeth, d. After 1776 (birth of her child, Mathew), and Patrick m. second Mrs. Elizabeth (Bradford) Hays (Chalkley, Vol. ii, p. 277 & Vol. iii, p. 176; also D.A.R. Nat. Nos. 319971 & 349471). His children by his first wife were: 1. Wm. (named in will of his gr-fa. Wm. (2) Christian); 2. Martha, b. ca. 1770, m. Philemon Richards, Jr. (ca. 1770-bef. 3-21-1793, see Ky. Wills by King) on Mar. 21, 1793, in Aug. Co. (see Chalkley); 3. Mathew Christian

(1776-) who m. Jane Black in Aug. Co., Va., and who d. in Union Co., Ky.; L. John Christian; 5. Mary Christian who m. David Bell on Feb. 18, 1796 (see Chalkley). By his second wife, Patrick (3) Christian had; 6. James Christian; 7. Elizabeth Christian; 8. Nancy Christian. Patrick (3) Christian was a Sergeant at the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown, and had served through the entire Revolutionary War (History of Union County, Ky., 1886.)

Martha (4) Christian who m. Filemon Richards, Jr., d. in Hopkins Co., Ky., before 1829 (estate records, Hopkins Co., Ky.) and left the following children; 1. Lewis Roberts Richards, b. 9-4-1798 in Henderson Co., Ky., m. 1834 to Mary Menegee Weir Russell, and d. 1873 in Memphis, Tenn. (many descendants in Union Co., Ky.); 2. Fountain M. Richards, c. 1800-1810 (census records) in Henderson Co., Ky., m. 9-8-1825 Mary A. Givens in Hopkins Go., Ky., and had issue according to 1830-40 Union Co. census; betsey Richards, b. ca. 1807, m. 7-11-1827 Hudson Martin in Hopkins Co., Ky. (many descendants in Union Co., Ky.); 4. Benjamin Franklin Richards, b. 12-28-1813 in Hopkins Co., Ky., d. 11-15-1870 in Crittenden Co., Ark., m. 10-3-1836 Louisa Sylvester Fort, dau. of Elias and Elizabeth (Morris) Fort.

Matthew (4) Christian (Pat. 3, Wm. 2, Gil. 1) and his wife, Jane Black, had; 1. Mathew; 2. Gilbert, m. Elizabeth Givens; 3. Betsey, m. James Kerr Givens; 6. Peggy, m. David Potts; 7. Nancy, m. James Markham; 8. Prudence, unm. (see Hist. of Union Co., Ky., 1886).

Capt. Israel (1) Christian, nephew of Capt. Gilbert (1) Christian, was said to have been a Dublin merchant. After coming to Virginia, he became a large landowner, and gave the land on which Fincastle was built. Christiansburg, Va. was named for him. Between 1765 and 1770 he moved to Dunkard's Bottom in what is now Pulaski County, and d. there in 1784 when about seventy years old. Capt. Israel Christian and his family lived in great affluance, and were people of means and culture. His wife's letters and books indicate her to have been a woman of uncommon education. He and his wife, Elizabeth Starke, had only one son, Col. Wm. Christian, who commanded at Point Pleasant in Oct., 1774, against Cornstalk and his warriors. In 1785, Col. Wm. (2) Christian (Israel 1) settled near Louisville, Ky., having gone there from Augusta County, Va. He married Anne, sister of Patrick Henry, and had one son, John, who d. when about 17 or 18 years old; there were five daughters, all of whom lived and died in Kentrucky; a. Priscilla m. Col. Alex's. Bullitt of Kentucky; b. Sallie m. Dr. Walter Warfield and had two sons, c. Elizabeth m. a Mr. Dickinson, d. Annie m. Gov. Pope, e. Dorothea m. Dr. Fishback (for data on Israel (1) Christian and descendants, see Fincastle Herald, 6-18-1874, "Local History.")

Israel (1) Christian and his wife had four daughters: 1. Anne (Nancy) who m. Col. (Dr.) Wm. Fleming and had a. Leonard Fleming of Woodford, Ky.; b. Maj. Wm. Fleming of Huntsville, Ala., c. a daughter who m. Rev. Saml. Ramsay of Knoxville, Tenn. d. Dorothea m. James Bratton in Montgomery County, Va. e. a daughter who m. Samuel Wilson of Florence, Ala., f. a daughter who m. Rev. Geo. Baxter of Lexington, Va., 2. Elizabeth m. Col. Wm. Bowyer of Aug. Co., and had a. a daughter who m. her cousin Leonard Fleming, b. a daughter who m. Capt. Miller of Fincastle;

3. a daughter who m. Col. Stephen Trigg who was killed in the Battle of the Blue Licks, and had a. Wm. Trigg, b. Stephen Trigg, c. Fleming Trigg, d. a daughter who m. Preston Breckenridge, and who d. in Ky., e. a daughter who m. Gen. Logan and who d. in Ky.; 4. a daughter who m. Judge Cobt Mallace of Ky. and had six children among whom was a daughter who m. Judge Logan of Ky. and had five sons. (Fincastle herald, 6-18-1874, "Local Hist.")

There were earlier Christians in Virginia than Gilbert (1) Christian and Israel (1) Christian. Mrs. Rita Browne of Somerset, England, says that descendants of William (1) Christian, who m. Elizabeth Collier (not Cottier as stated in A. W. Moore's "Manx Worthies") and who settled in Virgin a in 1650, have done much research on this family. This Wm. (1) Christian's Son, Thos. (2) Christian, was patenting land in Virginia in 1657. Mrs. Browne believes Wm. (1) Christian to have been the grant-son of Daniel Christian of Baldroma, Isle of Man, sho was son of Demster John McCrystyn IV of Milntown, living 1498-1511. She further states that in 1913 Nuisa Christian, gr-gr-gr-dau. of Thos. (2) Christian (Wass 1), who had m. her cousin Capt. Thos. Llewellyn Christian, and lived on part of the original grant to Thos. (2) Christian (Wm. 1), was having her house repaired, when in a rat's nest a silver teaspoon engraved with the Milntown Crest was found. This would seem to indicate a connection between the family of Wm. (1) Christian and the Christians of the Isle of Man.

Although I now know that Martha Christian Richards was not given her middle name through any religious feeling on the part of parents, I am convinced that those who call themselves Christian have much to live up to and owe a great debt to the past as well as the future.

He m. Elizabeth Christian. Since he was b. in 1753, the probatilities are that he m. in Va., in Hampshire or Montgomery co,s, although mar. may not have occurred until after his removal to what is now Tenn. in 1780, at which time he would have been 27. Same author states that in 1752, Gilbert removed with his fam. to near Staunton, Augusta Co., Va., and settled on Christian's Creek, which took its name from him. Gilbert is believed to have been an uncle of Capt. Israel Christian, who settled in Middle New River, (W.) Va., 1740, and who m. Elizabeth Starke and was a prosperous merchant of Staunton, Va. Israel is said to have come from north of Ireland. Israel also had a son William, who was known as Col. Wm., and who m. Anne, sis. of Patrick Henry: son Israel and 4 days.

A copy of the diary of Dr. Graig (in which is recorded names of Ch'n bp. by him as paster of Old Stene Church, S miles N. of Staunton, though Dr. Graig went far and wife in his ministry) contains record of bp. 10 April, 1748, of Elizabeth, dau. of William Christian. In all my searches, this is the only Elizabeth Christian who it seems could have possibly been m. to William Boydston, and it would seem that she would be too old, though not impossibly.

Gilbert Christian was b. 1754, not "1723/4" as given on p. 74 et seq, "Kings Mountain MEn," by Katherine K. White.

Excerpt from her letter — Would like to Corresp. with queriest did not know where in Ky. this fam. was until I read the query — have some allied fam. histories also I will be glad to send on if querist is interested.....

Hutchinson's History of Cumberland Co., England, Vo.. II, p. 148, gives a table of Christians from 900 A.D. They inhabited Cumberland and Westmoreland Co's, Eng., and for centuries lived in the Isle of Man, where they were the Dempsters (judges) on the island. The name was originally MacChristian. It was first written simply Christian by Judge William Christian in 1630. One fam. seat was Uncregg Castle, another Ronoldsway.

Scott's Peverill of the Peak has a note in the index on the Christian fam.: Col. William Christian was governor of the Isle of Man at the time of Cromwell and surrendered to Cromwell. He was executed when Charles II came to the throne and his property confiscated. But his property was restored to his heirs and the ones who were responsible for his execution were punished, as Charles II had promised amnesty to all.

After the execution of William, three of his sons went to Ireland and my line is descended from one of these.

Gilbert Christian m. Margaret Richardson, in Ulster, Ireland, and they came to Lancaster, Penna., 1726. They brought their dau., Mary, and three sons, John, William and Robert. They settled on Christian's Creek in the Valley of Virginia ca 1733. When Augusta Co., was organized in 1745, John Christian became one of the first judges. He served until his death and his place was taken by William, his brother. Capt. William had won such distinction in the French and Indian Wars that he was given 8,000 acres of land in Ky. by the Proclamation of 1763. He left his land in his will to his son, Gilbert, who m. Lucy Richards and went to Ky. ca 1789. Each of the sons of the original Gilbert had a son named Gilbert, which makes it very hard to get their history straight. All of them were in the Rev. William's Gilbert and John's Gilbert (who took a degree in law) were privates, but

It Indicates Persuasion, Virture, Strength and Courage.

The blazon of the Christian arms accords well with the anem. It is:

Arms: Azure, a demimascle between three covered cups or.

Crest: A unicorn's head ereased, ar gent, armed or Motto: Sains per Christum-Salvation through Christ.

CHRISTIAN ARMOR CYMBOLIZES NAME COPTINUED:

The mascle is the mesh of a net which in Holy Writ is the symbol for persuasion whereby men are induced to virtue and guilty living and so may seem, after some sort to be caught. The unicorn is the symbol of virtue, strength and extreme courage.

This armorial is used by the Christian family descendants of the Virginia pioneers, William, Isador, and James, brothers and probably from the Isle of Man where the Christian family flourish like a green bay tree.

Another pioneer is Thomas Christian of Charles City County, Va., 1687. He is known to have been born on the Isle of Man. He had many broad acres in Virginia and prospered all along the line. Descendants now living in Richamond, Va., have some valuable relics of his day and time including some of his silver, which is reproduced.

Thomas, son on Thomas Christian, the pioneer, married Rebecca, daughter of Druly Stith. Charles, another son, owned plantation in Westover parish and in other parts in Virginia. The branch of the Christian family is related to the Hunters, Paynes, Graysons, and Lacys.

A Revolutionary Soldier

One soldier of the Continental army was John Christian of Hanover County, Va. His spouse was Judith Pate and they had two sons and sic daughters. One of the sons, Paul Christian married Mary Sutten, or Sutton, and according to the record. "They had lots"——perhaps lots of land, lots of money, lots of children. It's childrens and are they not worth more than land and cash? Their lineage looked to the Yates, Terrill and Hunts for husbands and wives.

Another boy of '76 was Lieut. Col. William Christian of Virginia and another William has the rank of lieutenant, It was Gen. William Christian whom Anna, sister of Patrick Henry, married. Her sister, Elizabeth had the grand good luck to marry two heroes of the Revolution. First Gen. Campbell Second General Russell. Why are there no chances for the girls like these now? He was the envy of all the girls!

Records of the Christian family are found in "History of Virginia County" and "History of Augusta County;" William and Mary College "Quarterly," Meade's "Old Churches of Virginia;" "Prominent Families of Virginia," by Dr. Beller. Also records of the Christians are in historics of the Lewis, Seldan and Evans families.

It is the Evans family of Pennsylvania that is kin to the Christians. Gilbert Christian was first in Pennsylvanis in 1720. A few years later he went to Augusta County, Virginia. He was of Scotch-Irish ancestry and married into the Scotish family of Richardson.

Mary daughter of Gilbert, and Margaret (Richardson) Christian married John Moffett of Augusta County and the roster of their kids includes; John, William, Colonel George, Robert, Katherine, Robert, born in 1743, died in Kentucky were he married Mary McDowell. She was of the Virginia family of McDowell.

The Stith Family

Inquiry is made of the Stith family and as it is near kin to the Christians this seems to be the place to speak a good word for the lineage, a good old Virginia one.

Captain Buckner Stith of Rock Springs. Va., was a decendant of the Buckner, Pale. Drury Townshend, Langborne, Bathurst and Meade families. His daugnter, Sophia Stith, married in 1805. Ponjamin Poythress Yates of Virginia.

Then there are the Herberts of Virginia, Bulwer Herbert, son of Lord John Herbert, descendant of the first carl of Pembroke, married Mary Stith, maid of bonor to Queen Anne, Buiwor and Mary (Stith) Herbert were living in Virginia when their daughter Mary married Colonel Augustine Claiberne of King Williams County, Va., and their daughter, Mary Herbert Claburne, became the wife of General Charles Harrison of the revolution, brother of former Benjamin Harrison of the famous Harrison family of Virginia which is also allied with the Christians.

Dr. William Christian of Richmond married Anna Harrison of the eighty genneration from Benjamin Harrison, colonist of the Old Donimion.

Christian is a name found in Domesday Book. Other names akin to it are those of Christian, Christen, Christina, Christerson, and so on. Chrestien is the true? form of the name in France, particularly in Normandy, and it was borne by many Hagernots. Another form is McChristen.

Gilbert Christian landed at Newcastle, Pa., in 1726 with his four children, named below and removed to Augusta County, Va., where he purchased a large tract of land a few miles south of Staunton on Christian's Creek of William Beverly, in Beverly Grant, by deed recorded in Orange County. His four children were:

John Christian, born before 1726; married Margaret Wilson and left a will dated Jan. 7, 1754, presented for probate May 20, 1783, in Augusta Co., Va., and refused - recorded in Will Book 6, page 294. In will is named sons Robert called "the eldest" and William and also states that his wife "is bearing a child".

Robert Christian born before 1726; married Isabella Tiffins "of the lower valley" while he was at Winchester recruiting for the Indian service. He left a will dated June 2, 1789, probated Dec. 16, 1794, recorded in Will Book 8, p. 137, in which he mentions sons John, Robert, Jacob, daughters Mary Patterson, Margaret Anderson, "grand-daughter Isabellay Christian, daughter to John", granddaughter Isabella Bratton, also daughter-in-law Rachel Christian and Isabellow, daughter of Mary Patterson.

<u>William Christian</u> born before 1726; married Mary Campbell, probably a sister of Arthur Campbell, and left a will dated Sept. 25, 1776, probated Aug. 17, 1779, recorded in Will Book 6, page 75, in which he mentions his wife, Mary, and sons Patrick and Gilbert and daughters
Margaret, Elizabeth and Mary; also William Christian, son of Patrick.

Mary Christian b. before Mar. 1, John Moffett, who died prior to Feb. 28, 1749, and 2nd, John Trimble prior to Mar. 19, 1754. By John Moffett she had: Mary, Robert, Catherine, William, Hannah, George and John. She had by John Trimble, Captain James Trimble.

In April 1856 the entire population of Pitcairn Island was transfered by the British government to Norfolk Island, 187 people in all, too many to be sustained on Pitcairn. From 1858 to 1863 about 30 of the homesick Pitcairners returned to Pitcairn.

Nine of these bore the name of Christian, all of these were children of Thursday October Christian II (Fam. 5, above), though most of the others had Christian ancestry. The present day members of the Christian family on Pitcairn are descendents of these nine returnees. At least two of the recent Magistrates of the island, the leading political office, have been of the Christian family.

The authority for much of the genealogical data give here has been drawn from a published version of "The Pitcairn Island Register Book", supplemented by other standard reference works on the descendents of the Bounty mutineers.

The surprise returns on genealogy work can sometimes be amazing. I came onto a French secretary the past year that was made for my Great-grandfather, Paul Christian, in 1825, by his son, Robert S.(Sutton) Christian of Fayette County, Ky. The secretary is four feet high, four feet wide, two feet deep and weighs 200 pounds; is made of Cherry wood, trimmed in Oak and Burl wood. It was hauled overland from Scott County, Kentucky, in 1830 to Randolph County, Missouri with the immigration of the CHRISTIAN family.

My grandfather, Geo Richard (Rit) Christian, youngest of Paul and Mary King Sutton Christian _____ inherited the home place in Missouri for taking care of his mother. After the Civil War, Geo Richard and wife, Louisa Terrill Christian, moved their family of eight children to Denton County, Texas, on to Jack County, where they settled permanently. The secretary was too big and heavy to be spared woom in a covered wagon. So "Rit" emptied the drawers of the family records and left the secretary with his brother.

We, of the third generation, have poured over the letters, legal notes, diaries, tavern registors and even a day book of Paul's father, John Christian, which began 1770, Hanover, County, Virginia. These things, I have had the privelege of photostating as they belonged to cousins in Jack County, and had them bound in their order - to me a prized collection - never thinking for a moment that I could ever return them to their former home - "The Paul Christian Desk."

My possession of the desk (or Secretary) came about very unexpected . A distant cousin, Marie Christian, of Moberly, Mo., knowing of my interest in genealogy, my extensive work on the Christian family and having been hostess to me on a family research trip to Moberly, bought the desk for me at an auction sale, and notified me that she had done so. The price was a paultry \$5.00 because of its terrible condition. It had sat for years in a basement where coal was stored. The truckers who hauled it to Claude, Texas, where J. C. Yeoman was to refinish it, called it a "pile of junk." People who saw it thought the same but were not quite so blunt, but with the skilled workmanship of Mr. Yeoman, it was no longer an ugly duckling, but a beautiful, coveted peice of antique furniture.. People looking upon it often remark "how lucky you are" and I reply, "no, there was no luck to it; It would have likely wound up in a dump ground, had people not known about me through my extensive work on family history."

On a little drawer in the writing compart is written the early history - who made it, for whom, when, and dates that it was passed on down the generations.

Several months later I came into a small three drawer chest that came through my maternal great great. It is almost the secretary in minature, as far as style and lines and was hand made in Kentucky, also. Both peices of furniture are about 145 years old. Refinished it was as pretty as the big peice and again people exclaimed "how lucky you are."

The elderly 83 year old cousin of my mother's would never have passed it on to me had I not contacted her several times in my searching for family data.

My genealogy is responsible for the preservation of these two articles from paternal and maternal lives which will be cherished through future generations.

Note by Mary Bealmer: This clipping was sent in by Inez (Christian) Doshier of Amarillo, Texas, who is working on our Christian history. We do not know at present (1967) whether or not Fletcher was connected with our Christians who came from the Isle of Man to Va. semetime before 1658. Grapevine, Texas is of interest also because my great—aunt, Nancy (Beale) Goodfellow and her husband Moses settled there after leaving Randolph Co., Mo. And my fahter's brother, John Thomas McKinsey, died at Grapevine in 1881, apparently while visiting, or living with, his aunt and uncle. He was age 18; threw an armful of wood into a box against which a shotgun was leaning; the blast mangled his leg, which was amputated, and he died soon afterward.

come to Texas from Ala. a short time before. She had lost her hus. and small son in San Augustine where they had stopped after the illness of her hus, and son. Nancy went on to Montgomery Co., where she was living and baking bread for a living when George Anderson Christian met and married her, which was possibly around 1841. They moved to Nacogdoches a short time later, where many of their descendants still live. (I have much of their history) Which I hope SOMEDAY to put into a book.

The mother of Isabella, Pierre, Ceorge A., and William was Elizabeth (Moffett or Maffatt) Christian, possibly born about 1780 or in the early 1780's. And in the 1880 census record, George gave the birth place of his father as Va. and his mother as N. C. My great grandmother, Isabella Couch, gave England. But I am inclined to take Georges' data as have found several indications that point to the effect that she might (Isabella) might have fixed just a little occasionally. It is possibly so, that Isabella's and Pierre, William, and George's grandparents came from England. Elizabeth Christian was living with George in 1858 or 1860 as indicated in a letter from one of George's daughters to my grandmother, Margaret Ann Couch, dau. of Isabella and Chancy Couch. Nancy had no parents, so the only grandmother would have been Elizabeth. (Nancy was raised by Indians, after death of her tarents; have story.) I was thinking that had seen either in 1850 or 1860 census records under household of George, a ref. to one non-citizen (no name given) but re-checked the census records this past week and could not find this notation. But, anyway, Isabella went sometime after the above letter and brought Elizabeth to San Saba Co., Texas to live, as she is buried in a family cemetery along with the grave of Chaney Couch who was killed by the Indians in 1864. Elizabeth Christian died in the spring of 1868. Isabella Couch died in 1887. This and one small grave of George Lathum completes this small family cemetery, which is only $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from where I live.

I NEED the date of death and where died, and name of the great grand-father Christian, hus. to Elizabeth. He was supposedly born in Virginia, possibly died in Tennessee. I am guessing that his name was either, George, William, or John

William Christian, b. ca 1772 possibly in Va., the son of Gilbert and Margaret (Anderson) Christian? Believo William's wife was Elizabeth Anderson, possibly the daughter of John Anderson of Rock House. I have 7 ch. listed for above William and Elizabeth but failed to put down my source of information: William or William Henry; Rebecca, Harriet, John, Johanna, Gilbert, and Isabella. Does anyone know birth dates or whom they married or any info. on this family?

Does anyone have any info. on the children of James McDowell Moffett who was beca 1763 the son of Col. Gec. Moffett, b. 1735 in Augusta Co., Va. and Sarah McDowell. George and Sarah were m. ca 1761. James McDowell Moffett m. Dec. 29, 1789 Mary Stuart, b. ca 1757. Children were: John, William; Detsy or Elizabeth m. John McClanahan; Robert S.; Jane m. Dr. John K. Moore; Mary m. Alexander T. Barclay; Thomas; and Julia m. Wm. Paxton.

WILL OF ROBERT TERRILL, OF ORANGE COUNTY, VIRGINIA - In the name of God amen, I Robert Terrill, of the County of Orange and parish of St. Thomas being sick and weak in Body but of sound mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same, do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament in manner and for following.

First after I shall quit this mortal Body I desire that I may be decently buried at the discretion and with the Solemnity that my Executors hereafter may think fit and proper.

Item. I give to my son Robert Terrill the land I purchased of Spencer Bobo in the County of Culpeper containing four hundred acres more or less to him and his heirs or Assigns forever.

Item. I desire that the land I now live on Containing Two hundred and Thirty one acres also the land I hold in Culpeper which I purchased of Charles Grymes Containing by Estimation five hundred acres after my Decease may be sold by my Executors and the money Arising from the sale thereof pay such Legacies and be divided as I shall hereafter mention.

Item: I give and bequeathe unto Robert Moore, Francis Moore, Bernard

Moore and Alexander Moore, children of my daughter Ann Moore decd, one hundred pounds Current money to be equally divided Fbetween them.

Item. I give and bequeathe unto Lyda Murray and Elizabeth Murray, children of my daughter Sarah Murray Decd ., one negro girl named Lara to be equally divided between them or their heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeathe to my grandchild William Moore, Son of my daughter Ann Moore, decd., one negro Boy named George and five pounts Current money to him his heirs or assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeathe unto my sons Robert Terrill, John Terrill, William Terrill and my daughter Mary Hudson remainder of my slaves to be equally divided between them to them their heirs or assigns forever.

Item. I give and Bequeathe unto Mary Towles, Ann Towles, Joseph Towles, Jane Towles, Fanny Towles, Children of my daughter Sarah, Decd., which she had by Joseph Towles, Decd. Two hundred and twenty poiunds Current money to be equally Divided between them or their assigns forever and to remain in the hands of my Executors till they come of age or Marry, and if either of them should die before that time then to be equally divided between the surviving Children above named.

Item. I give and bequeathe to the surviving Children of my son Edmund Terrill, Decd. Two hundred and Twenty pounds Current money to be equally divided between them, their heirs or assigns forever, and the sd. money to remain in the hands of my Executors till they come of age or marry and if any of them should die before that time their part to be equally divided between the surviving ones.

Item. I give unto Ephraim Rucker, Reuben Rucker, Mary Creed, and Elizabeth Herring, children of my deceased Daughter, Elizabeth Two hundred and Twenty pounds Current money to be equally divided between them and their heirs and assigns forever, (Except Mary Creed who I here has disposed of her part expected of my Estate, now if that should be the case then her part I give to be equally divided between her children that she may have of her Body Lawfully begotten).

Item. It is my will and desire that the residue of my estate what kind soever be divided into several equal Divisions and I do give and dispose of Each Division as follows, one of the said divisions I give to my son Robert Terrill to him his heirs or assigns forever. One other division I give to my son John Terrill to his heirs or assigns forever. Also another of the said divisions to be equally divided between the surviving children of my son Edmund Terrill, deceased, or their heirs or assigns forever. Also, another of

the said divisions I give to be equally divided between Ephraim Rucker, Reuben Rucker, Mary Creed, and Elizabeth Herring, children of my daughter, Elizabeth Rucker, Decd., to their heirs or Assigns forever. Also, one other division I give to be equally divided between Mary Towles, Ann Towles, Joseph Towles, Jane Towles, Fanny Towles, children of my daughter Sarah that she had by Joseph Towles, Deceased and remain and go in the same manner as mentioned in the Clause where I left the money.

Item. I have partly agreed with my Grandson, Rush Hudson, for the Tract of land I have in Pamunkey containing five hundred acres for which he was to give me the sum of one hundred and ten pounds current money, now if he complies with the bargain I then desire that my Executors may execute deeds to him for the said land and the money arising from the sale therof to be divided after the Legacies are satisfied into seven Equal divisions and disposed of as above mentioned and Lastly I do nominate and appoint my two sons John Terrill and William Terrill Executors of this my Last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made. In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of February 1786. Robert Terrill (Seal) Nath'l Welch and James Taylor.

At a court held for Orange County on Thursday 23rd March 1786. This last Will of and Testament of Robert Terrill, deceased, Being presented into Court by John Terrill, one of the Executors therein named and proved by the oaths of James Taylor and Nathaniel Welch witnesses thereunto, and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Executor, who made oath according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form, whereupon he, with James Taylor and Benjamin Porter, his Securities, entered into and acknowledged their Bond for the same in the sum of four thousand pounds Currency. Teste, James Taylor, C. O. C. A copy Teste (signed by C. W. Woolfolk) certified copy.

TERRILL NOTES (from same source) Robert Terrill, of the Will, was the son of Timothy Terrill and his wife, Elizabeth Foster. He was born in New Kent Co., Va., and baptized on the 25th of December 1697 in St. Peter's Parish Church in which his father was a vestryman. See St. Peter's parish Register, p. 38. There is, also, on same page, record of a son Joseph born to Timothy and Elizabeth Terrill.

Robert Terrill married first, Mary Foster, daughter of John Foster, whose wife, it is supposed was Ann Moore, daughter of Captain Augustine Moore, of Elizabeth City Co., Va.

When the writer of this sketch was apprised of the existence of Robert Terrill's Will by an elderly correspondent, who for a term of years-almost forty-had been a faithful delver in the original records, he remarked in his letter: "Ann Terrill married her cousin." This statement seemed significant; and together with the names of Ann Terrill Moore's sons (distinctive of the Moore family of Chelsea) as given in her father's will, and indicates a clue to Ann Foster's family setting. [The name Augustine frequently appeared in the family of Moore, of "Chelsea," of King William Co., and in that of Elizabeth City and York, but there was certainly no relationship, in Virginia at least, between the two families.—Editor.]

This deducation is given in the spirit of investigation, in the hope that it may meet the eye of a reader personally interested and who may be in possession of documentary evidence and, through it, be able to authenticate this tracing.

There was such a tendency in early times toward consanguineous marriage that the same patronymic in close generations implies relationship, consequently it is supposed that Robert Terrill's wife was his own cousin; his mother, likewise, being a Foster.

There are indications, too, that John and Elizabeth Foster were brother and sister to Joseph Foster (a vestryman in St. Peter's parish Church) and that they were born after 1671, the date of the Will of William Bassett, in which mention is made of "Nephew Joseph Foster and his two sisters, Ann and Mary Foster," each under age at date of Will.

I have been so impressed with the frequency with which the name "Mary Foster" met the eye on records of her descendants that my curiosity is keen regarding this elect lady of so many namesakes. I find the name on page 54-second part of Green's St. Mark's Parish under the head of the Will of Richard Sims-April 16, 1809: "Wife Mary; Children, Robert Terrill Sims; Richard Michlin; Edmond; Joseph T.; Henry; Sallie Butler, Avel Collons, Nancy Tucker; and Mary Foster Sims." This line is obviously that of the offspring of Robert Terrill, Jr., son of the Testator mentioned above.

Of the posterity of Robert Terrill and wife Mary Foster, my investigations have been mainly in the line of their son Edmund Terrill. From an old Bible, now in possession of a descendant of the late Mr. Edward G. Cornelius of Indianapolis, Indiana, I have copied the following table: "Edmund Terrill b. March 21st, 1740; Peggy Willis, b. February 25th 1741. Married November 26th, 1760.

Issue: Elizabeth Plunkett Terrill; born April 4th, 1762; Mary Foster Terrill b. June 12th, 1766; John Terrill b. Aug. 13th, 1768; Edmund b. Feb. 9th, 1770; Sarah Terrill b. January 4th, 1772; Jane, b. April 4th, 1774; Robert, b. April 3rd, 1777; James b. June 22nd 1779; Nancy b. June 22nd 1781; Frances and Lucy (twins) b. Aug. 6th, 1783.

As there has been some speculation as to the parentage of Mrs. Peggy Willis Terrill and a jump at conclusion accepted by certain of her descendants. I take this opportunity of proving its fallacy. The tradition alluded to has been given a wide circulation and is to the effect that Peggy Willis, wife of Edmund Terrill, was the daughter of Col. Henry Willis, founder of Fredericksburg. In such statements there is no argument so strong as precise dates for the knocking down of a tradition. Col. Henry Willis died on September 14th, 1740 O. S. and Peggy Willis was born February 25th, 1741, O. S. making her birth just seventeen months after Col. Henry Willis's death.

In Orange County, Va. there is a Will on file of one John Willis dated 1762; in which mention is made of Wife, Elizabeth; Executors, son William Willis and Edmund Terrill. To the latter he left two slaves. Following, is mention of "Walter Shropshire & the others" (of this, later) then the names of nine children all under age. John, Benjamin, Joshua, Reuben, James, Frances, Moses, Lewis, and Mary.

To those familiar with a custom of early times (which entitled the husband to be the recipient of his wife's patromony, as in the present instance and where the name of the wife is not mentioned in her fathers Will, but her husband is), there is no question as to the existence of such daughter. But I have been told that this circumstance with certain descendants has ruled Peggy out as a daughter. I recall a case in the enlightened age of the "Seventies" of a highly intellectuarl clergyman in a western city, who, apparently, was so used to the ancient custom that when it transpired that the expected legacy through his father in law's Will was left to his wife instead, he was greatly agitated.

The reader who is interested will note that Peggy Terrill's eldest daughter is recorded in the family Bible as "Elizabeth Plunkett' which would signify that she had given her mother's full name to her first born. Thus we infer that John Willis married Elizabeth Plunkett.

Returning to the Will and its opening clause, "Walter Shropshire & Others," who were left a trifling amount: The conclusion as to the place in the family of those mentioned is confusing, and can only be explained on the

conjecture that the Shropshires were step children of John Willis who perhaps married Elizabeth as the widow Shropshire. There is a deed of record dated 1750 in Orange County showing that John Willis and Walter Shropshire are joint guardians of John and Ann Shropshire, children of the late John Shropshire, which encourages the theory advanced.

There is a Will extant in Orange County dated 1760, of Mrs. Sarah Turber-ville, widow of Edward Turberville, which contains mention of Sons John Willis and William Willis; showing that her first husband was a Willis. There was no Turberville issue, but there were several children, evidently by intermediate husbands two in number.

In the beginning of my Willis quest, I corresponded with the late Col. Thomas M. Green, of Kentucky, who was a recognized expert in the genealogy of the Willis family. It was his opinion that Peggy Willis Terrill descended from William Willis of Craney Creek, Gloucester County. Middlesex county records show that William Willis and Bridget Robinson were married the 23rd of June, 1685, and William Willis, son of William and Bridget Willis, was baptized on the (article ends here)

FIERCE STORM BATTERS PITCAIRN ISLAND

(AP) Tiny Pitcairn Island in the South Pacific has been severly battered by the worst storm in 10 years a radio report said today. The storm with winds gusting to 75 miles an hour hit Tuesday night and continued 14 hours, Pitcairn radio officer TOM CHRISTIAN advised the VOICE OF PROP-HECY, International Radio Broadcast Center of the Seventh-day Adventist Faith here. "Roofs were blown from a number of homes, windows were blown in, a large concrete water tank was broken and more than a third of our fruits, oranges, bananas, payas, lemons, coconuts, etc. have been damaged or trees completely uprooted," Christian said, "All the beans in my cwn garden were just blown right out of the ground." Pitcarin, about midway between Panama and New Zealand, has a population of 90, mostly descendants of mutineers from the "H. M. S. Bounty". Thirty houses are on the island. Most of the islanders are members of the Seventh-day Adventist faith, a once-a-week shortwave radio contact is maintained with the VOICE OF PROPHECY. This was an article from Glendale, Calif. reprinted in Wichita Falls, Texas, paper this past week about June 13, 1972, sent to me by my aunt, Mrs. Charles Posey. Charles is a son of my grandmother, Francis Elizabeth Christian Posey, dau. of Joseph Benjamin Christian and Louisa Elizabeth _____. I am still looking for his parents in Tenn. and Louisa's maiden name.

Thomas Jefferson Christian was born July 23, 1836 in King and Queen County, Va. He was a student at the University of Va. in 1856, served as Second Lt. in Co. H, Lee Rangers, Ninth Va. Cavalry, throughout the War, was a lawyer, and later a county judge. A member of the Va. General Assembly, he served in the House of Delegates for Mathews Co. for the sessions, 1871/1872, 1872, and 1872/1873 and in the Senate for King and Queen, Middlesex, Gloucester, Essex and Mathews counties for sessions 1881/1882, 1882, 1833/1884, and 1884. Thomas Jefferson Christian was a cousin of Letitia Christian, first wife of President John Tyler.

Mary George Hudgins Christian and Judge Thomas Jefferson Christian had one daughter and three sons.

- 1. Kate Sullivan Christian, named for her paternal grandmother was born Feb. 23, 1867 at Clifton, Mathews Co., Va. and died April 24, 1898 in N. C. Like many others of the Hudgins family, she was buried at Clifton. On Oct. 29, 1894 she became the second wife of George R. Quincy of Mt. Airy, N. C., a widower with two partly grown daughters. One of the daughters, Eva Quincy, born circa 1881 was later Mrs. Walter Scott, Sr. of Charlotte, N. C. Kate Christian Quincy and George R. Quincy had no children.

This is an abstract of some Missouri Pension Records that I ordered, trying to clarify details of the death of Wm. B. S. Christian, b. 1832 Ralls Co.,
Mo. above. The Stadham Bible states: William B. Christian died _____ March,
1862 at 5 p. m. ink does not match previous entries, leading me to believe
his daughter added this at a later date. There were several William Christian
papers from Missouri and so far, I have not been able to sort them out to my
satisfaction. But I think I have sorted out these that belong to this Wm.
Christian - perhaps someone researching on Tenn. born Christians can use this
or might shed some light on it. I think mine was never sworn into the union
army, by reading one old letter we have.

My great grandmother is quoted as saying, with reference to her widow's pension application (they don't seem to have the relating papers on file in Mo. or Washington, D. C. They said he died of pneumonia, but it was really the gunshot that killed him. This causes us to think that when she applied, they had this older Wm. B.'s record confused with her husband who also is listed as "Wm. B." A letter from her sister, regarding pensions, says "and Antionette denied her widow's pension, because he had not reaced the place to sign his name altho Wm. was surely a casualty of war" - perhaps a casuality of guerilla warfare, etc. All of his brothers save one, James Wylie Christian, were union soldiers. James W. was with CSA, ___ Capt Tom Porter at Kirksville according to Mo. history, was one of the CSA soldiers, prisoners of war shot afterward for having having broken the oath formerly taken not to again bear arms against the union. He is buried with the rest of the family at Bacon's Chapel, Lentner Township, Shelby Co., Mo. I have this inf., thanks to Mr. Ray Neff and his very efficient cemetery survey committee.

Toland continued:

Wm. B. Christian's grave, if there, is not marked - this gives credolence to a family story that he left for a big town (Hannibal?) (They lived near Clarence, Mo.) with a wagon load of - oats?- and never returned - one story says his body was brought back by rail, the others that strangers came who said they gave him a christian burial ...

Arms - AZURE a chevron confree, between three chalices OR.

Crest - A unicorn's head ARGENT, erased, armed and crested OR.

Motto - Salus per Christum

A family of Scandinavian origin, the MacCristens, Christins, or, as they now call themselves, Christians, must have attained an important position in the Isle of Mann at an early date, as John McCristen, the first of whom there is any record, was one of the judges or deemsters in 1408 and a member of the Tynwald Court in 1422. Of his three successors, who also bore the name of John, the first was seated Altadale, in the Parish of Lezayre; the second was deemster from 1500 to 1510, and the third was also deemster from 1511 to 1535. This latter acquired the property adjoining Altadale and called the whole Milntown. He was the first to put the Manx laws in writing. Daniel, his brother, was the ancestor of the Christians of Baldroma, in Maughold. His sister married Garret, of Ballabrooie, and his eldest daughter Samsbury, of Ronaldsway. John, His second son, was Water-Bailiff. William, the eldest, who was deemster with his father, succeeded to the estate in 1535, but died four years afterward. William's second son, Robert, was also deemster. From him the Christians of Lewaigue, in Maughold, are descended. Ewan, the fourth in descent from William, changed his name from MacCristen to Christian. He succeeded to the property in 1593 . In 1605, when only twenty-six years old, he was made deemster, and held that office fifty one years. He was also deputy-governor of Peel Castle, and the most influential man in the island. His sister, Jane, married Thomas Samsbury, of Ranaldsway, and died s. p. He purchased that estate from her trustees, and presented it, in 1643, to this third son, William the famous "Iliam Dhone." John, his eldest son, who died before him, was assistant deemster. His eldest daughter, Mabel, born in 1599, was John Curghey of Ballakillingan's second wife. Ewan, John Curhey's son, by his first wife, married Margaret, born in 1617, a younger sister of Mabel's. Ewan was succeeded in 1656 by his grandson Edward, who also was a deemster. Edward's eldest son, Ewan, purchased the property of Ewanrigg Hall, in Cumberland (circa 1680) and also succeeded to the Milntown property on his father's death in 1693.

His eldest son, John, married Bridget, daughter of Humphrey Senhouse, of Netherhall, a lineal descendant of King Edward the First. Of his numerous daughters several married into Manx families - Ann to one of the Bacons of

of Ballabrooie (Major Caesar Bacon was her grandson); Jane to Capt. Charles Moore, of the Abbey; Elizabeth to William Fine, of Ballachott; Alice to Quayle Curphey, of Ballakillingan; Margaret to Thomas Wattleworth, of Peel; she had two daughters, one of whom, Elizabeth, was Archdeacon Moore's and W. F. Moore's grandmother; the other, Margaret, married her first cousin, Joseph, son of Thomas, vicar of Croshwaite, in Cumberland, who was Edward Christian's fifth son. From him are descended a branch of the family who are numerously represented at the present day. We may mention Ewan and Joseph Henry Christian, architects to the church commissioners; Henry Bailey, member of the council at the Cape of Good Hope; Henry, admiral and chief constable of Gloucestershire; Alfred, George and William Christian, merchants, and Mrs. W. F. Moore, of Cronkbourne. To return to the elder branch, John, the eldest son of John and Bridget Senhouse, married Jane, daughter of Eldred Curwen, of Workington Hall, Cumberland. He was high sheriff for Cumberland in 1766. His third son, Charles, married Ann, daughter and heiress of Jacob Dixon, of Moreland Close, and had issue, who still possess that property. Their second son, Fletcher, was mate of H. M. S. Bounty, and leader of the mutineers. He settled in Pitcairn's island where he married an Otaheitan woman, by whom he had a son, called "Thursday October," and a daughter, who married the Rev. G. H. Nobbs, the chaplain of the island. Thursday October Christian died in 1850. His grandson, Andrew, now forty one years old, has a numerous family. In 1856 the whole community consisting of 194 souls, viz., 40 adult males, 47 adult females, 54 boys, and 53 girls, were transferred to Norfolk Island, where land was allotted to them by the English government. Mary, daughter of the above John and Bridget Senhouse, married Edward Law, D . D., Bishop of Carlisle, and had issue, among others, a son, who became Lord Ellenborough. John, the high sheriff, died in 1767, and was succeeded by his son, John, then a child of twelve years old, who, in 1775, married (first) Margaret, daughter of John Taubman, of Castletown. (John Taubman had married Esther, John Christian Curwen's aunt. From him are descended the Goldie Taubmans, of the Nunnery.) By her he had issue, John, who became deemster, and who succeeded to the Christian properties. Margaret Christian, nee Taubman, died in 1778. In 1782, he married Isabella, heiress of Henry Curwen, of Workington Hall, his first cousin, and assumed the name of Curwen. He was one of the first agriculturists of his day, and he held a high position in the House of Commons. His descendant Henry Curwen is the present proprietor of Workington Hall. Deemster John Christian's son, William Bell Christian is the present proprietor of the family estat s.

4 June, 1781, this last will and testament of James Christian, decd., was presented by George Christian, one of the executors, who made oath thereunto according to law, and the sd. will was proved by the oaths of John Christian and Mary Christian, two of the witnesses thereto, and entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of 3000 specie with the condition required by law, and the sd. will and bond was ordered to be recorded. Test: Edmund Wilcox, C. A. C.

At a Court held for Amherst County, Virginia, 3 September, 1781, John Christian, the other executor named in this will personally appeared in open court and with James Pamplin and Charles Patterson, his securities, entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of 3000 with the conditions required by law, and took oath of an executor, according to law. We know that the Virginia progenitor of the family was 1-THOMAS CHRIST-IAN. As "Mr. Thomas Christian" he patented Oct. 21, 1687, 1080 acres in Charles City County. While the family did not assume in the 18th Century the importance it has enjoyed in the 19th; the term "Mr." accorded to the immigrant is indicative of social standing. In 1694 "Thomas Christian Sen." got a patent for 193 acres south of Chickahominy Swamp. Then "Sen." here shows that there was another Thomas Christian who was probably a son of the elder Thomas and already of age.

Then we find 2. Thomas Christian of "Charles City County", pat. land (1712 and 1727) in the forks of Beaver Dam Creek in that part of Henrico called Goochland; 3 Charles Christian of "Charles City" locating lands in the same vicinity (1714-1727) 4 James Christian in same vicinity, bounding on Thomas Christian's line (1719); 5 John Christian of "Charles City", in same vicinity (1724). All this furnished strong presumptive evidence in the absence of any other Christians mentioned in the records of Charles City and New Kent that 2, 3,4,5, were sons of 1, THOMAS CHRISTIAN, SEN. the immigrant.

2 THOMAS² CHRISTIAN'S will was proved in Goochland Co., in 1736. He married Rebecca _____ (perhaps the daughter of Drury Stith, near whom in Charles City, Thomas Christian patented 1320 acres on Dec. 16, 1714 and has issue: 6 Thomas³, 7 Robert³, 8 William³; of Albermarle Co., living in 1756; 9 James ³, 10 Constant³; 11 Rebecca ³, 13 Morning³ who m. _____ Coleman. Mentions grandson Thomas.

6 Thomas³ (Thomas², Thomas¹) will recorded in Goochland Co., dated Oct. 23, 1743 and was proved March 20, 1743-4. He married Rebecca and had issue: 14 Anthony⁴ b. June 9, 1724 (St. Peter's Par. Reg.) not mentioned in will, but in deed as "son and heir" and as residing in Cumberland Co., in 1753 (Goochland Co., Reg. 15 Nathaniel⁴, 16 Thomas, 17 Jesse⁴, 18 David⁴, 19 Lins⁴, 20 Mary⁴, 21 Archer⁴, and 22 Susannah⁴, and 23 Elizabeth⁴.

Thomas had property on Willis Creek

8 William³(Thomas², Thomas¹) In 1756 he sold lands in Goochland Co., given him by the father Thomas² Christian, dec. He styles himself of Albermarle County (Goochland Co. Rec.)

Mrs. Rita Browne of Somerset, England, says that descendants of William (1) Christian, who m. Elizabeth Collier (not Cottier as stated in A. W. Moore's "Manx Worthies") and who settled in Virginia in 1655, have done much research on this family. This Wm. (1) Christian's son, Thos. (2) Christian, was patenting land in Virginia in 1657. Mrs. Browne believes Wm. (1) Christian to have been the grandson of Daniel Christian of Baldroma, Isle of Man, who was son of Demster John McCrystyn of Milntown, living 1498-1511. She further states that in 1913 Louisa Christian, gr. gr. gr. dau. of Thos. (2) Christian (WM) who had m. her cousin Capt. Thos. Llewellyn Christian, and lived on part of the original grant to Thos. (2) Christian (Wm.1) and was having her house repaired, when in a rat's nest a silver teaspoon engraved with the Milntown Crest was found. This would seem to indicate a connection between the family of Wm. (1) Christian and the Christians of Isle of Man. Although I now know that Martha Christian Richards was not given her middle name through any religious feeling on the part of parents, I am convinced that those who call themselves Christian have much to live up to and owe a great debt to the past as well as the future.

A family of Scandinavian origin, the MacCristens, Christins, or, as they now call themselves, Christians, must have attained an important position in the Isle of Mann at an early date, as John McCristen, the first of whom there is any record, was one of the judges or deemsters in 1408 and a member of the Tynwald Court in 1422. Of his three successors, who also bore the name of John, the first was seated at Altadale, in the Farish of Lezayre; the second was deemster from 1500 to 1510, and the third was also deemster from 1511 to 1535. This latter acquired the property adjoining Altadale and called the whole Milntown. He was the first to put the Manx laws in writing. Daniel, his brother, was the ancestor of the Christians of Baldroma, in Maughold. His sister married Garret, of Ballabrooie, and his eldest daughter Samsbury of Ronaldsway. John, his second son, was Water-Bailiff. William the eldest, who was deemster with his father, succeeded to the estate in 1535, but died four years afterwoards.

Williams's second son, Robert, was also deemster. From him the Christians of Lewaigue, in Maughold, are descended. Ewan, the fourth in descent from William, changed his name from MacCristen to Christian. He succeeded to the property in 1593. In 1605, when only twenty six years old, he was made deemster, and held that office fifty one years. He was also deputy governor of Peel Castle, and the most influential man in the island. His sister, Jane, married Thomas Samsbury, of Ronaldsway, and died s. p. He purchased that estate from her trustees, and presented it, in 1643, to his third son, William, the famous "iliam Dhone". John, his eldest son, who died before him, was assistant deemster. His eldest daughter, Mabel born in 1599, was John Curghey, of Ballakillingan's second wife. Ewan, John Curghey's son, by his first wife, married Margaret, born in 1617, a younger sister of Mabel's. Ewan was succeeded in 1656 by his grandson Edward, who was also Deemster. Edward's eldest son, Ewan purchased the property of Ewanrigg Hall, in Cumberland (circa 1630) and also succeeded to the Milntown property on his father's death in 1693.

His eldest son, John, married Bridget, daughter of Humphrey Senhouse, of Netherhall, a lineal descendant of King Edward the First. Of his numerous daughters several married into Manx families-Ann to one of the Bacons of Ballabrobie (Major Cassar Bacon was her grandson); Jane to Capt. Charles Moore, of the Abbey; Elizabeth to William Fine, of Ballachott; Alice to Quayle Curphey, of Ballakillingan; Margaret to Thomas Wattleworth, of Peel; she had two daughters, one of whom Elizabeth was Archdeacon Moore's and W. F. Moore's grandmother; the other, Margaret, married her first cousin, Joseph, son of Thomas, vicar of Croshwaite, in Cumberland, who was Edward Christian's fifth son. From him are descended a branch of the family who are numberously represented at the present day. We may mention Ewan and Joseph Henry Christian, architects to the church commissioners; Henry Bailey, member of the council at the Cape of Good Hope; Henry, admiral and chief constable of Gloucestershire; Alfred, George and William Christian, merchants, and Mrs. W. F. Moore, of Cronkbourne. To return to the elder branch, John the eldest son of John and Bridget Senshouse, married Jame, daughter of Eldred Curwen, of Workington Hall, Cumberland, He was high sheriff for Cumberland in 1765. His third son, Charles, married Ann, daughter of Jacob Dixon, of Moreland Close, and had issue who still possess that property. Their second son, Fletcher, was mate of H. M. S. Bounty. and leader of the mutineers. He settled in Pitcairn's Island, where he married an Otaheitan woman, by whom he had a son, called "Thursday October," and a daughter, who merried the Rev. G. H. Nobbs, the chaplain of the island. Thursday October Christian died in 1850. His grandson, Andrew, now forty one years

old, has a numerous family. In 1856 the whole community consisting of 194 souls, vix., 40 adult males, 47 adult females, 54 boys, and 53 girls, were transferred to Norfolk Island, where land was allotted to them by the English government. Mary, daughter of the above John and Bridget Senhouse, married Edward Law, D. D. Bishop of Carlisle, and had issue, among others, a son, who became Lord Ellenborough. John, the high sheriff, died in 1767, and was succeeded by his son John, then a child of twelve years old, who in 1775 married (first) Margaret, daughter of John Taubman, of Castletown. (John Taubman had married Esther, John Christian Curwen's aunt. From him are descended the Goldie-Taubmans, of the Nunnery.) By her he had issue, John, who became "eemster and who succeeded to the Christian properties. Margaret Christian, nee Taubman, died in 1778. In 1782, he married Isabella, heiress of Henry Curwen, of Workington Hall, his first cousin, and assumed the name of Curwen. He was one of the first agriculturists of his day, and he held a high position in the House of Commons. His descendant Henry Curwen is the present proprietor of Workington Hall. Deemster John Christian's son, William Bell Christian, reciever-general, M. C., M. A., J. P., the mineteenth in descent from John MacGristen is the present proprietor of the family estates. His eldest son, Ewan John, is commissioner of Police at Kimberley, South Africa .

The late curiously erudite Dr. J. R. Christian, of Holly Springs, Miss. traced the origin of the Christian family to Scotland, where, prior to the loth century, the name was rendered MacChristian. They were established in Wigtonshire, Scotland, until the year 1422, after which they figured in the Isle of Man, only a few miles distant. The name is historic. John Christian, of Undrigg Castle, married Isabella, daughter of Henry, Lord Percy, the famous Earl of Northumberland. William MacChristian of Albdale and Milntown, parish of Lezayre, was a member of the House of Keys in the Isle of Man, in 1422. Evan Christian, born in 1579, was appointed deemster, or judge of the Isle of Man, at the age of twenty six, and held the office for forty eight years. Gilbert Christian married in 1720, and removed from Scotland to Ireland. Several of the name migrated to America and founded families in Pennsylvania, the Valley of Virginia, and in Tennessee. But the family was much earlier seated in Eastern Virginia. Thomas Christian patented lands in James City county in 1667, and was granted, October 26, 1687, 1030 acres in Chrles City county. Col.

William Christian, of the text, was the son of Israel (?) Christian, who emigrated from Londonderry, Ireland, and settled in Augusta County, Virginia, in 1740. Rosanna, his daughter, married Hon. Caleb Wallace, of Kentucky. When very young, Vim. Christian commanded a company in the Second Virginia regiment, Colonel Wm. Byrd, in 1756, in the French and Indian War; married Anne, daughter of Colonel John and Sarah (Winston-Syme) Henry; and the sister of the orator, Patrick Henry; settled in Botetourt county; appointed colonel of militia in 1774, he raised 300 volunteers, and by forced marches made a distance of 200 miles to join the forces under General Lewis at the mouth of the Great Kanawha. He did not arrive, however, in time to participate in the battle of Point Pleasant, which occurred on the preceding day, the 10th of October, 1774; member of the Virginia Convention in 1775, and in 1776 was appointed colonel, and commanded an expedition of 1200 men against the Cherokee Indians. Upon his return resigned his commission in the Virginia line but served afterwards effectively in the militia. After the Revolution he represented Botetourt in the Virginia Assembly for several years. In 1785 he emigrated to Kentucky and settled in Bear Grass; killed in April, 1786, near the site of Louisville in a conflict with a body of marauding Indians, whom he had pursued at the head of a party of settlers. In the bloody conflicet, the Indian force was entirely destroyed. His death created a strong sensation in Kentucky. He was brave, intelligent, and remarkably popular. (Collin's Kentucky, p. 233) Colonel Christian left issue, one daughter, who became the wife of Governor John Pope, Her descendants include, among others, the honored names of Bullett, Dickinson and Warfield in Kentucky.

CHRISTIAN - One of the leading spirits and prominent citizens of Weatherford, Texas, is Lewis W. Christian. He combines an energetic business spirit with the affability and courtesy of the old Virginia gentleman. He is of a retiring disposition, but of set purpose.

His father, Colonel A. S. Christian, was of English ancestry, and a native of Augusta County, Virginia. He was a merchant, and dealt successfully in cotton and merchandise at Tuscumbia, Alabama. They had none of the modern conveniences of commerce now in existence, and he was compelled in 1819, to haul goods by wagon all the way from Baltimore, Maryland, to Tuscumbia, Ala. Col. Christian married Miss Paulina C. Lewis of Roanoke County, Virginia, of Irish lineage. She was the granddaughter of General Andrew Lewis, one of the

noble and gallant officers of the Revolutionary fame. His history is so well known, and his memory so dear to the heart of every Virginian and lover of the grand old herces of that day, that we make but brief and respectful mention of him in these pages. His well known statue now graces the Capitol Grounds at Richmond, Virginia.

Colonel A. S. Christian was the father of eight children, all of whom were boys. Charles was killed by a deer while yet a youth; A. S., Jr. died in infancy; Harry F served as adjutant of the Fourth Alabama Cavalry, under General Joe Wheeler, and died at Huntsville, Alabama, in 1875; John B., now living in Arkansas; William L. is a farmer residing in Madison County, Alabama; George Cabell was killed in the battle of Tishomingo Creek, Mississippi, June 10,1864; Robert Breckenridge, now a practicing physician in Little Rock, Arkansas; and Lewis W., the subject of this sketch.

Lewis W. Christian in his early boyhood days was blessed with the advantages and influences of a good home, with loving and intelligent parents and manly and courteous companions. He came of good old Revolutionary stock, and was prompt to take up arms against a ruthless invasion of his native Southland. When the war broke out he was but fifteen years of age. He enlisted in the Eleventh Alabama Cavalry, under Gen. Bedford Forrest, and served under that gallant General in all the noted and brilliant raids made by him in Mississippi Tennessee, Kentucky, and Alabama. At the battle of Tishomingo Creek, Miss., June 10, 1864, he was wounded, while his noble young brother George Cabell, was killed by his side. After this battle he was detailed by Col. Wm. A. Johnson, who was then commanding a brigade, as his private courier. He remained with Colonel Johnson until that brave officer was disabled at Pulaski, Tonn. Mr. Christian was also in the bloody battle of Seluna, Ala., which closed his military career.

After the war he returned to his home and attended school for one year. His beloved parents died soon after, (This sounds as if his parents died in Alabama) and he found himself, as did many other young men of the South at that time, in the midst of a devastated land made so by the havoc of cruel war, but with the true old Virginia characteristics, he started life anew with redoubled energy, bent upon building up the broken fortunes of his former home. He began close confinement and the effects of a malady contracted while in the army compelled him to abandon this avocation, and he went to New York City for medical treatment, where he found but little relief, and upon the advice of a prominent physician of that city, to the effect that travel and camp life was

In Kansas City he met Capt. Julian Fields, a Government contractor, and joined him in a train to Texas with general supplies. After a long and hazardous trip they reached Weatherford, Texas where Mr. Christian turned over his train to Warren and DuBose, contractors. This very train was captured three weeks later in Lost Valley, in Young County, by the Kiowas and Comanches, and the whole train of eleven wagens burned and every member of the outfit massacred. Weatherford, at that time, was the largest town in West Texas, and the depot from whence the Government distributed its supplies. ...

He was elected President of the first Board of Trade ever organized in Weatherford. ...

In 1883 Mr. Christian married Miss Jennie Hannon, a charming young lady who had just removed to Weatherford from Montgomery, Alabama, where she was born May 11, 1861. Her father, W. H. Hannon, was born in Baldwin County, Ga. in 1825, and was a prominent commission merchant in Montgomery, under the name of W. H. Hannon & B... Her mother before her marriage was Miss Clara Judge, a daughter of the late Hon. T. J. Judge, Judge of the Supreme Court of Ala. They have three children living and two dead, all of whom were boys. Those living are L. W. Jr., Thomas K. and William Hughes.

Marion's brother Frank, in Missouri married Ellen Forsythe. As far as I know, none came to Texas. My grandmother wrote, all through the years, to ber cousin, Maggie A. Forsythe. The only existing communication I have between them is a card, 1928, from Excelsior Springs, Mo. (Her writing is very shaky.) "Keep this, Dear Cousin Helen: Bro Watt Christian died at 9:35 PM Feb 24th 1928, from acute myocarditis after an illness of 12 days. He was

laid to rest in Phoenix, Arizona, was given a Military Burial. M. A. F."

Mar. 30 - By the direction of the President, you will be cited in War Department orders for gallantry in action. George W. Christian, veteran of the Phillippine innsurrection, was notified today by the department, but the citation came too late, as Christian died late February. The Honor came through Christian's deeds in the pursuit of the insurgent General Tintus in Northern Luzon, Phillipine Islands, Dec. 4 to 18th, 1899. One card is signed, Your cousin, Maggie A. Forsythe nee Christian."

George Watt Christian visited in the home of my grandmother's brother, Jack Meason, of Roaring Springs, Texas, and his children remember George Watts' telling stories of serving with Teddy Roosevelt. He was no doubt, a nephew of william B. Christian, b. 1832, Ralls Co., Mo. but I can not connect either he or his sister Maggie A. Forsythe with any of the families. He could be the George belonging to Frances Marion, as this citation doesn't give his age.

I would appreciate hearing from anyone that might be able to help me solve THIS problem, also.


