Dear Mrs. Hutchinson:

It was a pleasure to hear from you regarding your Christian family line. I am always delighted to hear from kin—no matter how near or distant—and hope we may have information to exchange that will prove mutually helpful.

As yet, I had not published the material I have collected on the family of Thomas and Nancy (Scurry) Christian since I wished to clarify his line of descent first.

Although 1 have not yet proved the parentage of your ancestor, Thomas Christian, circumstantial evidence would indicate that he might have been the son of Gideon and Sarah (Morse/Mase/Moss) Christian. Gideon and Sarah were married 6 December 1783 in Granville County, North Carolina. Gideon wrote his will 26 August 1821 in Edgefield District, Edgefield County, South Carolina, and it was proved there 10 September 1821. One of the sons named therein was a Thomas Christian, believed born between 1784 and 1795. By the way, in your letter you give Thomas' birthdate as 11 January 1758, which seems far too early to me and is perhaps a typographical error. Can you give me more on this?

Gideon's wife, Sarah, died between & November 1823 (will date) and 6 February 1826 (will proved) in Edgefield District, South Carolina. Marriage bond data as well as full transcription of the wills and probate record of Gideon and Sarah were published in Christian Family Chronicles, Volume No. VII.

Again, although definite proof is still lacking, this Gideon Christian would appear to have been the son of Drury and Lucretia (Williams) Christian. Volume No. III of the **Chronicles** contains an article about this Drury Christian and family as well as full transcription of Drury Christian's last will and testament, written and proved in Warren County, North Carolina. His son Gideon was christened in Goochland County, Virginia 16 August 1760 and was one of the children who drew lots in distribution of Drury's estate 23 January 1787.

In case you are interested in obtaining issues of Christian Family Chronicles, back issues are available at \$4.75 each or \$7.50 for any two issues ordered at the same time. This periodical is published on a non-profit basis since I am primarily interested in sharing the information I have gathered through the years. Order form, announcement, and Table of Contents are enclosed for your convenience in determining whether you wish to obtain any copies. Whether you place an order or not, I shall look forward to hearing from you and hope you will make corrections and additions to the enclosed family group record. Through which child do you trace descent?

I was so pleased to hear from you. I have returned your SASE to use another time. I just began a year ago on the family gen. and have 22 lines which still amazes me. It's been fast on some of it and slow on others. Prior to finding your name and address, I had received (letter enclosure) some information on the AL lines, having just gotten out of Texas, and some notes on the Christian's. Since I was going to a seminar in Dallas, made arrangements to visit w/ lady in Mart, TX. Subsequently, the enclosed Gideon Christian line was zeroxed while there. That's the good news. The bad news is that Mrs. Clonch, who originally had the chart, (and who knows what else) has died and now don't know who has the original chart, Bible or whatever! The only reason I found this is the Chaffin people were working on the connections with the Morgan's, Harrison's, and saw the Christian/Chaffin, in connection with the other names.

Well, on to more facts. I have just received some books "EARLY ADVENTURERES ON THE WESTERN WATERS" Vol I & II by Kegley. It has lots of info on a ISRAL, WILLIAM, & JOHN CHRISTIAN. Just glanced at it as I'm on another line at the moment (we've lost one Grandfather Harrison) and the correspondance is always done asap. If you do not have these books, just let me know and I will zerox all the mention of the Christian's in it and forward to you at the next letter. There is also another book by the Kegley's that I have yet to order "VIRGINIA FRONTIER" which also had Christian's in it. ( I am still at the stage of being confused at times with all these names that I try to remember at once.)

I don't know how much you have on the SCHRNY family. The only note I have found so far is from WAR RECORDS OFFICE, REBELLION RECORDS, Series II Vol V page 857 where Brigddier General W.R. SCURRY, commanding the HDQTRS Eastern Sub-District of TX, Houston, March 25, 1863, letter to a Capt Edmund P. Turner, on what to do about prisoners taken at Galveston. Also some same records Series IV Vol 2 p 549 is a letter from Turner to Lubbock, Gov of TX ordering Brig Gen SCURNY to be in charge of troops in LA. I just started on this series when I came down w/cold so now am trying to get over that.

I have enclosed a check for all the back issues along with your chart which I have filled in with information, along w/chart from Clonch, 1840 census, letter from JAMES CHRISTIAN to Stephen Chaffin, short chart of THOMAS MHRISTIAN, copy of Bible records copied, letter from Kathryn Stutts who has been doing some work for me in MS......and before I close I will also send my family chartw/connection.....



Dear Connie:

I am enclosing what I have found so far on your Chafin and Christian families. I have listed the 1840 and 1850 census records of Chambers County, Alabama and have made copies of the 1850 census records, which are enclosed. I don't think the 1840 would do you any good.

It appears that the mother of Stephen Chaffin was named Clotilda B. and that she was 63 years old in 1850 and living with a daughter, Retunah, who was married to Thomas Taylor. Stephen seems to have a brother named Bluford, who is also shown on the 1840 census. The parents of Sarah Christian seem to be Thomas and Nancy Christian and she had brothers and sisters named James, Gideon, Thomas, John, Susan B., William F., and George W.

I have written to the clerk of Chambers County, Alabama for a copy of the will of Thomas Christian recorded in Wills 1-2, 1833-56, p. 262, of that county. Also, I have written to the clerk of Limestone County, Alabama for a copy of the will of Edward Harrison recorded in the Orphans Court Minutes, 1830-34, p. 26, of that county. I asked the clerk of Limestone County to let me know the publisher of the two books that you were interested in. If they do not know, I am going to Washington, D.C. next week and will see if I can find them in the DAR Library.

I found the marriage of Stephen Chaffin & Sarah Christian and the marriage of her brother James Christian and Margaret Darden in Chambers County, ALA marriage records. There was also a Lewis Christian and Cynthia F.S. Spratling but I do not know if he is related to Sarah (closely), could have been an older brother. There is a male age 15-20 shown on the 1840 census with Thomas Christian.

I will check Virginia records while I am in Washington and see if I can find out anything about Edward Harrison and son William Henry Harrison, who seems to have married in Brunswick County, VA.

I'll be back in touch with you after I return from Washington, April 15.

Dear Connie:

Thank you for your order for the first ten volumes of Christian Family Chronicles, copies of which have just been mailed under separate cover. I hope that you and yours enjoy the articles and that you derive benefit from the information contained in these issues.

Incidentally, you indicated that you would be interested in obtaining the Index to Bailey's Christian-Skelton History & Genealogy, I doubt that there would be anything of particular interest in it for you since it covers the Hawkins County, Tennessee, line. You will find several articles in the Chronicles about them. I should emphasize that this Index (available for \$2.50 each) is to a book by T. H. Bailey--not to be confused with any publication by Beatrice Bayley, whom many reputable genealogical societies have warned us against. As I mentioned, the price for the aforementioned Index is \$2.50 to purchasers of my other works; but I prefer to sell any of my works to those who are apt to benefit from having them.

I deeply appreciate your sending the copies of charts, abstracts from a family Bible, and the D. A. R. papers. I would accept the Bible entries as proof that the Thomas Christian who married Nancy Scurry was, indeed, the son of Gideon and Sarah Christian, as I had previously speculated. I further believe that this was the Gideon Christian who was a son of Drury and Lucretia (Williams) Christian. I am still searching for documentation, however, to prove or disprove this assumption.

The D. A. R. lineage you sent shows Gideon Christian as having been born 26 August 1761. Gideon, son of Drury and Lucy, was christened by the Reverend William Douglas 16 August 1760.

As for Drury's parentage, Lamb (who wrote the articles in The William and Mary Quarterly) had thought that the parents of Drury might have been Robert and Lucy (Bradley) Christian. Robert did have a son Drury mentioned in his will, but current researchers have now established that he was a different Drury. If your ancestor should prove to be Drury, he was more likely the son of James and Anne (Macon) Christian. In passing, Anne's father was named Gideon Macon.

I'll wait until you have had a chance to peruse the Chronicles before commenting further.

So I am typing this note to you while I am waisting for the realstor.

I have enclosed the will of THOMAS CHRISTIAN from Chambers Co AL. I had to type the one section as when it was zeroxed, it did not copy very well. JAMES CHRISTIAN also has a will in Chambers Co AL but I did not order that as I was just tyring to get the direct line for me. It is in the Will Book 1-2 1832-1856 page 171, if you are interested. (oh, by the way, since you do not think that the INDEX is worth ordering just let it go for now with my thanks). I have found quite a few of the family in the Texas census i.e. GIDEON JAMES, ETC., if you want the information I can go get a copy at the University here as they have a complete census for Texas counties. They are to be found in UPSHUR and CAMP Counties if you were wondering.

I note that the dates that are for GIDEON CHRISTIAN are a year off. So now I am not sure that he was the son of DRURY & LUCRETIA. I was in hopes of proving one way or the other but I have been bogged down with the CHAFFIN family and have been unable to get back to this. I am probably the one with the wrong date for birth which at this stage does not surprise me in the least. I also thought that this line of Christian family was descended from ISREEL CHRISTIAN, i.e. then Isle of Man group. The Bible records that I show for GIDEON is b. 26 Aug 1761 and you show in Vol III p 170, GIDEON as christianed 16 Aug 1760. Could this the will of GIDEON that you have published in Vol VII is the correct one for the family line as I show in the Bible records that he died in 1821. However, this does not help on the father and mother of GIDEON. I guess that my next project after the roses will be to find the parents somewhere in S.C. or VA.

As to the children in the will of THOMAS CHRISTIAN: Margaret E. married GEORGE W. MUSICK (he was from TN he d. 1883 and she in 1886 in Upshur Co TX and they had ten children). THOMAS & NANCY (SCRUUY) CHRISTIAN had twelve children. The twins, SARAH & LEWIS; but then you have the list of all these people which I just realized. As you can tell I am getting a bit confused about who has what and just looked at the letter from you and saw the list of the choldren. When I have more info to send I'll get it off to you. I had hopes of going to Dallas to do some research but looks like it won't be until October after the convention.

Any way thanks for the help and I will keep you posted should anything turn up. Meanwhile it's back to the yellow roses ....... Kindast regards,

Dear Connie:

Just a quick note to thank you for your letter of July 3 with the copy of Thomas Christian's will and copies of the guardianship bonds!

You wondered about the birth and christening dates for Gideon Christian. It is my opinion that we are dealing with one and the same individual. I do not know whether the Bible record or the christening record is in error. The latter can easily be checked by reviewing the entries in the Reverend William Douglas's register (available in most genealogical libraries) since his entries are in basically chronilogical order. My experience has shown that transcriptions of Bible records are often in error. You will notice that the D.A.R. Bible entry for Thomas Christian shows his death date as 10 July 1846—certainly several months after his true death date which can be proven by the will date of 3 February 1846 and the probate date of 10 March 1846.

I would certainly be interested in any information you might be able to provide regarding the children of Thomas and Nancy (Scurry) Christian and would be pleased to reimburse your copying costs. I already have copies of the estate settlement of Thomas Christian that took place 13 July 1857 or 1859 (date on my copies almost illegible). These papers will be published in a forthcoming issue of the Chronicles.

I can sympathize with how busy you must have been preparing for the UDC convention in October. Like you, I'm inclined to commit myself to so many community organizations that my genealogical publication efforts suffer. Such activities are satisfying but, oh, so time-consuming.

I'll let you know if I make any significant discoveries.

His will was made in Arkansas but sent back here. His wife Nancy died a few years after "..... The rest of the letter is about the CHAFFIN part of the family and she is telling me how we are related A the JOHN CHAFFIN and his sister, CATHERINE are how we tie in to each other. (Her Catherine and my John.) As you know I was trying to take this month off and finish all these projects but when her letter arrived yesterday (and from the handwriting, I gather she is elderly) along with your letter and three others, Idecided that I would just take all day today and write everyone since the mold was too wet to pour anyway. Anyway, I have written her today as she said in her letter to write \*\*\* SOON so I have done that. You may wish to have two corrections on your transcription: 1) You show William Malthrop as one son-in-law; but I believe if you check again, you will find that the son-in-law's surname is Balthrop. See page 170 of Volume III, Christian Family Chronicles. 2) Those lots that were to be kept together by Mrs. Lucretia Christian were for three minor children—not three male children.

I was pleased to find clarification of a puzzling point in Gladys Phillips' letter where she mentions that Thomas Christian wrote his will in Arkansas. My records had shown that he wrote his will in Bradley County [no state given] and that the will was proved in Chambers County, Alabama. The individual who sent the information to me had not indicated that Bradley County was in Arkansas.

Thanks for the note. You asked me to send you the proof of the death in AR but buried in CHambers Co, AL. As you may recall, I sent you the letter from Gladys Phillips that had the first of this notation and just have not had the proof until now when I ordered the census books for Chambers Co. Did I send you other CHRISTIAN notations from the books? and/or do you want them????

I just spent this past week going through the CHRONICLES again making some notations and was planning to do some work on this line when the flood came. We are lucky as we only had 6 inches standing in the yard while others had to rent or buy pumps to get it out of their houses. Needless to add, the roofers will be here on Tuesday to give us a new roof; Wednesday, the folks to work on the back wall of the house will appear to re-do that which was ruined. When you live where normally the total rainfall is 10 inches and you get five in one day, it just is too much; particularly due to the fact that there has been too much water at the dam so they have been letting lots flow out and the water level is high and banks of the river are overflowing. What a mess!!! So whatever it was that I was going out to do on this family line, obviously will be put off for a bit.

I sent you that lineage chart as I was questioning some of the info. I however, thought that you would be interested as she used your CHRONICLES as her sources for much of the proofs. Yes I am always a bit leary on these lineage charts but have ordered three of them as I am having trouble finding some references for a couple and at least this helps with a new source, right or wrong.

Lawt but not least, I have enclosed some paperwork from Lavern Summerlin who lives in AR and I forget how she (not me I don't think) found my name, maybe through LDS files. Anyway, I found some of her problem on the CHRISTIAN line and sent her the info as it was a brother or sister to one of my line. She has just sent this to me and I thought that perhaps you might like to have it. You may already have all of this but if so, then you can toss it. I gave her your name and told her to order the CHRONICLES but don't know whether she has or not since receiving this info. I have not had time to sit and really get into all this that she sent (arrived last week) but hope that after the middle of September, barring another rain, I can concentrate on this.

It was a pleasure to hear from you again, and I did appreciate your sending the additional information although I already had some of it.

Yes, Eugenia Toland and I have been corresponding off and on for many years. She is an excellent, conscientious researcher, and the information she sent on her line was published in **Christian Family Chronicles**. At the moment I forget which issue.

If you look at "On the Bookshelf" you will notice that I have a copy of McClanahan's manuscript. For many years he lived only a few miles from my home and belonged to the same genealogical society. We visited with each other and compared Christian family notes.

I also have the article by Mabel Van Dyke Baer in my personal library. That consists of abstracts of the Revolutionary War pension records from the National Archives. Most of them have been included in one form or another in articles in the Chronicles.

Be extremely cautious in accepting information given in the DAR and Colonial Dames lineage records. For example, there is no proof that the Anthony Christian of Powhattan County, Virginia, who served in the Revolutionary War is the same as the one who settled in Cocke County, Tennessee. In fact, the evidence suggests otherwise. See article starting on page 789 of Volume IX of the Chronicles. For other problems with such lineages, see also "Elusive Connections—The Progenitors" starting on page 718 of Volume IX.

I'm hoping Volume No. XI will be ready by mid-October. In the meantime, do keep me posted.

Dear Connie:

Many thanks for your letter of August 29 with the pages of information from Lavern Summerlin. I also appreciate your sending her address.

Although I already had some of the same information in my files, there was supplementary material previously unknown to me--particularly in regard to the William Christian who married Tabitha House (or Howze, as she has it). I had always surmised that he was the son of Drury and Lucretia (Williams) Christian but was never sure. I wrote to her asking whether she had proof of the relationship or whether her conclusion was based on inference.

I was in a position to add to and correct some of her information on the children of Drury and Lucretia (Williams) Christian. As I was sending it to her, I realized that the articles published in the Chronicles did not contain all the data from my files. I tried to avoid including names of spouses where I was not absolutely sure of parental relationship. For example, was Drury's son William actually the one who married Tabitha House? Was Drury's son Drury, Ir., actually the one who married 1) Betsey Brewer and 2) Sarah Peyton? Was Drury's son Jesse the one who married Mary Greenwood? And, of course, was Drury's son Gideon the one who married Sarah Morse? It's easy to make assumptions—many times quite accurate—but often difficult to find proof.

I suppose the reason one has to be so careful of the "proof" on lineage charts of the patriotic societies is that an individual may be so anxious to become a member that the facts presented are interepreted by the applicant to suit the purpose of joining. As noted in the cases of Anthony Christian, William Christian, Gilbert Christian, etc., there were several contemporaries carrying identical names. Distinguishing between the various namesakes was not always easy. Even when it could be done, applicants were often reluctant to accept whatever did not fit their plans to join a society.

I hope by now you have your new roof and that your home is back in order. Flooding can be so disruptive, but you were fortunate it was not as serious a problem for you as for others.

I deeply appreciate your sending the abstracts and records. Even when I already have part or even most of the information, any small item that is new is especially helpful in making my files more complete.

VIRGINIA BIOGRAPHY

The Christian family is descended from an ancient family located on the Isle of Man, where members were for centuries the dempsters or judges of that island. The coat of arms of that family is described: Azure, a chevron humettee between three covered cups, gold. Crest: A unicorn's head erased, silver, collared and armed, gold, and these arms are found on a spoon brought to Virginia by the founder of the family, Thomas Christian. Seven different crests belonging to various Christian families are known, of which only three have the unicorn's head, which is erased on but two, and in only one family, that of the Isle of Man, has it a collar on the neck.

Mr. Thomas Christian was founder of the family in Virginia, and his title indicates social standing, as it was given only to those of education and worth. He patented ten hundred and eighty acres in Charles City county, Virginia, October 21, 1687. In 1694 he received a patent for one hundred and ninety-three acres south of Chickahominy Swamp. A considerable portion of his land has continued in the family to the present time. A Thomas Christian, undoubtedly his son, patented lands in 1712 and 1727 on Beaver Dam Creek, in what is now Goochland. James Christian, son of Thomas Christian, of the parish of St. Peter's, New Kent, married Amy (perhaps a daughter of Gideon Macon, of New Kent) and they were the parents of William Christian, formerly of Goochland, who was probably a member of the Charles City committee of safety in 1775. It is thought that his first wife was a Miss Collier, and he married (second) Susan Browne. She was the mother of Henry Christian, who lived in Amherst County, Virginia, and was a captain in the revolutionary army under Major-General Marquis de la Fayette. The great, great granddaughter of William Christian was Letitia Christian who married John Tyler, President of the United States in 1845 when Texas was annexed.

James Christian and Amy Macon Christian were also parents of Gideon Christian who was born in Charles City, Virginia, February 7, 1729 and died 1797. His baptism is recorded in St. Peter's Parish Register. He married Susan Browne who was the daughter of William Brown and Alice Eaton. One of their sons was Captain William Christian, also known as Reverend Christian, and he was married to Mittie Allen.

They were the parents of Gideon Christian, born in 1776; married Sarah and died August 1822.

Gideon and Sarah were the parents of Thomas Christian whose wife was Nancy Scurry Christian. A sketch of their lives is as follows:

Thomas Christian of Virginia was born in 1795 and died in 1846. He was buried at Antioch Church, Chambers County, Alabama, not far from Dudleyville; the church and the old Christian home were visited by the great, granddaughter, Genelle Jennings, in 1937. Thomas and Nancy built the home about 1835. They came from Virginia with a land patent, and settled on a large tract of land in Chambers County, Alabama. Their second or third child, Gideon Christian,

was old enough to remember a fight with the Indians his family had as they moved into Alabama. Fourteen children were born to Thomas and Nancy. Thomas died in Arkansas when he was on a prospecting trip. His son, Gideon, became administrator of the family property.

Nancy Scurry Christian was born in 1798 and died in 1855. She was married to Thomas Christian in Edgefield District, South Carolina, where she was born, daughter of Jesse and Margaret Scurry. Nancy was buried beside her husband, Thomas, in Antioch Church yard, Chambers County, Alabama. She and her husband helped build that Baptist Church and eleven of her children were baptized there by Rev. Francis Calloway. Her sons, Thomas and Gideon, were clerks at the church for many years. The Christian home stands today and is owned and occupied by the Lambert family. It is about one mile from the Antioch Church. Nancy made her son, Gideon, guardian of her youngest boys, William and George. William died in Hopkinsville, Kentucky during the Civil War. He was a Confederate soldier, as was George who lived to be an old man and made his home in his last days with his nephew, Claud Christian in Paducah, Texas.

Gideon Christian was born, October 9, 1828; married Caroline Kizzia Barr, August 5, 1856; died, April 7, 1904; buried in Masonic Cemetary, Abilene, Texas. He was born in Edgefield District, South Carolina, October 9, 1828. Moved with his parents--Thomas and Nancy Christian to Chambers County, Alabama when he was a small boy. He remembered an attack the Indians made upon the wagon train as they moved into Alabama. Gideon was the second or third child in the family of 14. He became administrator of the family property and guardian of his two youngest brothers, William and George, when his father died. He was baptized the 27th of July, 1842 into the Antioch Baptist Church in Chambers County, Alabama, where he was made a deacon at the age of 25. He made a trip to Texas in 1856 when he bought land in the Longview vicinity, close to homes of James and John, his brothers who had preceded him to Texas. He returned to Alabama where he married Caroline Barr at Dudleyville on August 5, 1856. The couple moved to Texas and Gideon united with the Bethlehem Baptist Church in Upshur County, Texas, January 24, 1857. There he donated a library to the church. Later he had his negroes build a church near the plantation. His two children, Lizzie and Hayden, are buried at that church. He and the white people sat in pews on the main floor of the church and slaves sat in the balcony.

Gideon had been in Texas only five years when the Civil War started. He owned negroes and teams, as well as a blacksmith shop and a tannery on his plantation. He enlisted in the Confederate Army but was sent back to raise supplies and run a supply train to the front. Although he was in the service of the Confederacy, he paid a man to take his place in his old company.

At the close of the Civil War, he was left without slaves and with a large plantation to be worked. The land had to be paid for a second time because the deed had been destroyed during the war.

# Christian Family General Information

Note: The following comments were taken from a letter written by Genelle Jennings, July 14, 1969.

"In 1953, I visited Richmond and also Williamsburg and Jamestown, Virginia. As a tourist, I wanted to see all I could and I had a particular interest in seeing one of the old Christian homes that had remained in the family many, many years. I had the good fortune of seeing through one that was located on the land that was an original land grant to Thomas Christian, the immigrant, in 1687.

I talked to Mr. Stuart G. Christian, a lawyer, by telephone and found him to be most cordial, with a laugh like Jack Christian. I, who was his "10th or 15th cousin", was given directions to his country home with permission to ask the gardner to show me and my friends through the house. It was amazing to me to see how well preserved it was and to find portraits hanging on the walls bearing name plates of Gideon Christian, George, Thomas, William, James, etc.—the same names in our branch of the Christian family. The house was located a few miles from Richmond and in the direction of Williamsburg.

I had had a letter from another "10th or 15th cousin" in Texas, before I visited Virginia, who said she had once been a guest of Miss Emily Christian, the librarian at William and Mary College, and had had the pleasure of visiting at "Green Oaks", Charles City Co., Virginia and at other Christian places in Providence Forge, Virginia.

I think the house I saw was known as "Green Oaks"; I am not sure. The visit was made sixteen years ago.

I went to the library at William and Mary College and inquired for Miss Emily Christian and learned she was deceased. The official who gave me the information spoke of her with great respect. I am sorry I did not get to see the other Christian places, nor to meet Mr. Stuart G. Christian in person; however, I am sure, from the tone of his voice, he would be glad for James, Ennis, or Christy to call him and visit the home. I do not know his age, but I should think he is past seventy-five, if he is living. The law firm was "Christian and Christian", I think. He could be located through a city directory, I am sure. He told me he had two sons; I am sorry I do not remember their names.

I want to enclose a few fragments of family history that might be interesting to you and your family. What I have is not complete, but is fairly authentic. Use it, if you like and feel free to ask for more details any time."

VIRGINIA BIOGRAPHY

The Christian family is descended from an ancient family located on the Isle of Man, where members were for centuries the dempsters or judges of that island. The coat of arms of that family is described: Azure, a chevron humettee between three covered cups, gold. Crest: A unicorn's head erased, silver, collared and armed, gold, and these arms are found on a spoon brought to Virginia by the founder of the family, Thomas Christian. Seven different crests belonging to various Christian families are known, of which only three have the unicorn's head, which is erased on but two, and in only one family, that of the Isle of Man, has it a collar on the neck.

Mr. Thomas Christian was founder of the family in Virginia, and his title indicates social standing, as it was given only to those of education and worth. He patented ten hundred and eighty acres in Charles City county, Virginia, October 21, 1687. In 1694 he received a patent for one hundred and ninety-three acres south of Chickahominy Swamp. A considerable portion of his land has continued in the family to the present time. A Thomas Christian, undoubtedly his son, patented lands in 1712 and 1727 on Beaver Dam Creek, in what is now Goochland. James Christian, son of Thomas Christian, of the parish of St. Peter's, New Kent, married Amy (perhaps a daughter of Gideon Macon, of New Kent) and they were the parents of William Christian, formerly of Goochland, who was probably a member of the Charles City committee of safety in 1775. It is thought that his first wife was a Miss Collier, and he married (second) Susan Browne. She was the mother of Henry Christian, who lived in Amherst County, Virginia, and was a captain in the revolutionary army under Major-General Marquis de la Fayette. The great, great granddaughter of William Christian was Letitia Christian who married John Tyler, President of the United States in 1845 when Texas was annexed.

James Christian and Amy Macon Christian were also parents of Gideon Christian who was born in Charles City, Virginia, February 7, 1729 and died 1797. His baptism is recorded in St. Peter's Parish Register. He married Susan Browne who was the daughter of William Brown and Alice Eaton. One of their sons was Captain William Christian, also known as Reverend Christian, and he was married to Mittie Allen.

They were the parents of Gideon Christian, born in 1776; married Sarah and died August 1822.

Gideon and Sarah were the parents of Thomas Christian whose wife was Nancy Scurry Christian. A sketch of their lives is as follows:

Thomas Christian of Virginia was born in 1795 and died in 1846. He was buried at Antioch Church, Chambers County, Alabama, not far from Dudleyville; the church and the old Christian home were visited by the great, granddaughter, Genelle Jennings, in 1937. Thomas and Nancy built the home about 1835. They came from Virginia with a land patent, and settled on a large tract of land in Chambers County, Alabama. Their second or third child, Gideon Christian,

was old enough to remember a fight with the Indians his family had as they moved into Alabama. Fourteen children were born to Thomas and Nancy. Thomas died in Arkansas when he was on a prospecting trip. His son, Gideon, became administrator of the family property.

Nancy Scurry Christian was born in 1798 and died in 1855. She was married to Thomas Christian in Edgefield District, South Carolina, where she was born, daughter of Jesse and Margaret Scurry. Nancy was buried beside her husband, Thomas, in Antioch Church yard, Chambers County, Alabama. She and her husband helped build that Baptist Church and eleven of her children were baptized there by Rev. Francis Calloway. Her sons, Thomas and Gideon, were clerks at the church for many years. The Christian home stands today and is owned and occupied by the Lambert family. It is about one mile from the Antioch Church. Nancy made her son, Gideon, guardian of her youngest boys, William and George. William died in Hopkinsville, Kentucky during the Civil War. He was a Confederate soldier, as was George who lived to be an old man and made his home in his last days with his nephew, Claud Christian in Paducah, Texas.

Gideon Christian was born, October 9, 1828; married Caroline Kizzia Barr, August 5, 1856; died, April 7, 1904; buried in Masonic Cemetary, Abilene, Texas. He was born in Edgefield District, South Carolina, October 9, 1828. Moved with his parents--Thomas and Nancy Christian to Chambers County. ... Alabama when he was a small boy. He remembered an attack the Indians made upon the wagon train as they moved into Alabama. Gideon was the second or third child in the family of 14. He became administrator of the family property and guardian of his two youngest brothers, William and George, when his father died. He was baptized the 27th of July, 1842 into the Antioch Baptist Church in Chambers County, Alabama, where he was made a deacon at the age of 25. He made a trip to Texas in 1856 when he bought land in the Longview vicinity, close to homes of James and John, his brothers who had preceded him to Texas. He returned to Alabama where he married Caroline Barr at Dudleyville on August 5, 1856. The couple moved to Texas and Gideon united with the Bethlehem Baptist Church in Upshur County, Texas, January 24, 1857. There he donated a library to the church. Later he had his negroes build a church near the plantation. His two children, Lizzie and Hayden, are buried at that church. He and the white people sat in pews on the main floor of the church and slaves sat in the balcony.

Gideon had been in Texas only five years when the Civil War started. He owned negroes and teams, as well as a blacksmith shop and a tannery on his plantation. He enlisted in the Confederate Army but was sent back to raise supplies and run a supply train to the front. Although he was in the service of the Confederacy, he paid a man to take his place in his old company.

At the close of the Civil War, he was left without slaves and with a large plantation to be worked. The land had to be paid for a second time because the deed had been destroyed during the war.

Gideon Christian moved his family to Gilmer, Texas in 1871 where he owned a farm a few miles from town and operated a grocery store in town. His business was burned twice. His eight children went to school in Gilmer; his three older sons were teachers in East Texas during this time. Three faithful old slaves--"Uncle Charles", "Aunt Fannie", "Butcher"--lived on the place. "Aunt Fannie" cooked the family dinner at Christmas for many years.

Gideon was a representative from the Eleventh District, Camp and Upshur Counties, in the State Legislature at Austin under Governor Ireland. Gideon was a member of the building committee that planned the present capitol of Texas. He was present at the laying of the cornerstone of the capitol in 1885. He and the other members of the guilding committee were given souvenirs—a small block of red granite from the building. While in the legislature he was a member of several committees, two being County Government and Military Affairs.

A sketch of his life is found in the State Library under the title: PERSONNEL OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT FOR 1885.

He and his family moved to Abilene, Texas in the spring of 1891, where he and his sons owned a grocery store for several years.

Gideon Christian died in Abilene, April 7, 1904 and was buried there A Confederate Iron Cross marks his grave as well as a marble shaft with a Bible on top and a hand pointing upward; the tombstone was designed by his wife.

He was the father of ten children and furnished a home and some education for nine orphans at different times. Mr. T. C. Mitchell of Gilmer was one of the boys who lived in the Christian home. Though he suffered many financial reverses, he was always a generous giver to the causes of religion and education. He helped build a church and a school near Gilmer, Texas. All his life he was a leader for prohibition.

#### Gideon Christian

G. Christian, of Gilmer, was born in Edgefield District, South Carolina, October 9, 1828. Moved to Texas, January, 1857 and settled in Upshur County. He is of the Missionary Baptist Church, and K. of H., I. of R., A. F. and A. M. lodges and the State Grange. He was reared on a farm and has followed the pursuits of agriculture with great success. During "The late unpleasantness" he served in the Western Division of the Confederate Army, and carried his musket with honor to himself and the cause he battled for. He is a man of extensive information, logical and well developed mind and thoroughly conversant with the great questions of state government. He was a member of the following committees: Agriculture, County Government, County Finances and Military Affairs. In the committee room and on the floor of the House, the guiding rule of his action has been "the greatest good for the greatest number" and in that direction his efforts have been untiring and unceasing. The sovereigns of the Eleventh District--Camp and Upshur Counties--had a bold and able representative in the Honorable Gideon Christian, and one whose exhaulted worth they doubtless justly estimate.

Caroline was born near Dudleyville, Alabama, December 25, 1837; married August 5, 1856; died December 18, 1930 in Paducah, Texas; buried beside her husband in Masonic Cemetary, Abilene, Texas. Her mother died when she was young. Caroline was 3. She and her sister, Lizzie, spent much time in the home of Aunt Leetie and Dr. Coe of Atlanta, Georgia. They made a trip to New York City with this couple about 1854. She and Lizzie graduated from LaFayette College, LaFayetteville, Alabama about 1852 or 1854. Caroline was a piano student and continued playing the piano until she was past 85 years of age and could speak a few sentences in French at this age. All of her life she was known for her beautiful embroidery. Caroline was very mischievous and was constantly embarrassing her more sedate sister. While in school with William and George Christian, she met their older brother, Gideon. He went to Texas to buy land. Caroline asked her father's permission to marry Gideon after she had been with him only two or three times and before he proposed. They married at the Barr home, Dudleyville, Alabama early the morning of August 5, 1856. A wedding breakfast was held there. Her father, James Barr, and Aunt Adaline were host and hostess. Adaline was the lady of the house after Tallitha, the second wife of James Barr was divorced. Caroline had a trousseau of fine silk dresses made by her colored seamstress. Among her wedding gifts were two slaves—a cook and a personal maid, given to her by her father. Many other fine gifts were given the couple by the wealthy James Barr. Her wedding handkerchief of beautiful linen and point lace was purchased with other accessories in New York City. The handkerchief, as well as her second day dress, were part of the trousseau of her daughter, Carrie, when she married William K. Jennings, forty years later. The hankie is a keepsake of Genelle Jennings.

Gideon and Caroline moved to Texas with all their slaves and household furnishings in wagons and in a carriage. A "Curly Maple" sewing table belonging to Caroline's mother, Mary Hulsey, in Atlanta was brought to Texas and now is in the Jennings' home, 1941. The last part of the journey was made by boat that landed at Jefferson City, Texas in January 1857. This couple settled on a plantation near Longview, Texas. Caroline owned the first piano in that part of Texas. She felt conspicuous in her silk dresses at church when the other pioneer women dressed in cotton. She gave most of her jewelry to neighbor girls when they married. Her first baby was born six months after they arrived in Texas. Her second child, Lizzie, died during "The Civil War". A faithful slave made a coffin and Caroline lined it with black silk from one of her own dresses.

Caroline had to manage the plantation in her husband's absence. The family of John Christian (Aunt Sallie and children) moved into her home to live during the war. Only a few faithful slaves remained on the plantation. For the first time in her life, Caroline had to do the washing and care for her babies. From her home had gone five men to join the Confederate army. They were her husband, Gideon, her cousins, George Henry and John Barr, and her two brothers-in-law, William and George Christian. All returned but William who was buried in Kentucky. One day George Henry returned on furlough and found Caroline had rubbed the skin off her hands trying to wash at the spring.

Caroline was reared a Methodist. After she was the mother of several children, she joined the Baptist church. For awhile she did not want her husband to know she was reading the Bible; she would read it secretly in the hen house. For many years she was the teacher of the youngest children in the Sunday School.

She and her husband moved to Gilmer, Texas in 1871, with their four boys, having buried Lizzie and Hayden Coe in Longview. In Gilmer were born the last four children. In a runaway at Gilmer, Caroline was thrown from a horse and seriously crippled. This was the second runaway she had experienced. The first time she threw her baby over the fence in a field corner and saved his life. This time she lay in bed five months and her daughter, Carrie, then 12 years old, was her nurse. The family suffered a financial strain—two fires had destroyed their grocery business.

In 1891 the family pioneered to West Texas, settling in Abilene. There her youngest children attended school. The home was located on Peach Street where the Abilene High School Gym now stands.

After her husband's death, "Grandma" moved to Paducah to keep house for Claud, her youngest son. She spent much time in the Jennings home every summer and every Christmas there until she was too old to travel. Then she made a rag doll and dressed it like herself—even made one leg shorter than the other, put spectacles on the doll, put some of her own hair on it—and sent it to Abilene with a box of presents to be at "the tree".

She died in Paducah, Texas, December 18, 1930 a few days before her 93rd birthday. She had been able to remember seeing her grandfather, Jennins Hulsey, in Atlanta and remembered his stories about fighting in the Revolutionary War. He was a very old man then--just sat in a chair and was fanned by a little negro boy. She had lived through the Civil War, the Spanish American War, and saw two grandsons off to World War One, and welcomed their return. They were Captain Walter G. Jennings and W. K. Jennings, Jr. in the Navy.

In her life she had mothered nine orphans besides her ten children. Her last admonition to her children is found in Philippians 3:13b-14: "Forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus".

Note: The above account is based mainly on stories told me by my grandmother, Caroline Barr Christian, and my mother, Carrie Christian Jennings.



## OF CHARLES CITY AND NEW KENT COUNTIES

MESSAGE FROM THE

By Michael W. Berry, Washington, D.C. and Ann Arsell Wheat Hunter Annandale, Virginia

As I was going down New Kent Road
I met a tarrapin and a toad.
And every time the toad would jump
I'd meet a Christian or a Crump.
-19th century rhyme

Any genealogist who has worked on the Christian family of Charles City and New Kent counties will agree that the task is a difficult one. Not only, as the above rhyme implies, was the Christian clan numerous but the records of those two counties have suffered greatly from various devastations. Finally, the frequency with which the given names Charles, John and William were used in all branches of the family has only added to the confusion.

For almost a century, one of the primary sources for information on this family was the writings of Judge John Christian Lamb. Published in 1900, Judge Lamb's extensive genealogy of the Christian family accomplished the monumental task of untangling the major branches of the family--with remarkable accuracy.

The purpose of this article is to correct and amplify some of the conclusions reached by Judge Lamb. Admittedly, Judge Lamb's task was hindered by the unavailability of many of the Charles City records now in use. Specifically, this article will focus on the 18th century marriages between women of the Collier family of Charles City County and the Christian family. Judge Lamb stated<sup>2</sup> that two Christian "brothers" William and John Christian, alleged to be sons of William Christian (inventory 11 March 1771, Charles City County<sup>3</sup>), married two Collier sisters, Elizabeth

and Mildred. This article will clarify the relationship between William Christian and John Christian (cousins, not brothers) and document the parentage and siblings of their wives, the sisters Elizabeth (Collier) Christian and Mildred (Collier) Christian.

WILLIAM COLLIER, planter of Charles City Co., Va., was the son of Charles and Mary (Eyers) Collier of King and Queen Co., Va. The Collier family Bible records the birth on 29 Dec. 1688 of William Collier, son of Charles and Mary Collier. This Bible also records the birth of William's older brother, the better-known John Collier (1685-1735) who married Elizabeth Ballard, Mrs. Elizabeth (Ironmonger) Gaines, and finally Ann [Nancy] Epes (1696/7-1765). Stella Pickett Hardy's states that the wife of William Christian was the daughter of Thomas Collier; son of the aforegoing John Collier (1685-1735), but gives her name as Ann. Thomas Collier of "Wyanoke," Charles City County, died without issue prior to April 1741 when his widow "Rebecca Collier made oath that her dec'd husband died intestate and was granted administration of his estate." Thomas Collier's widow and administratrix (not daughter) married John Minge. The following records will prove that the Elizabeth Collier who married William Christian was the daughter of William Collier, uncle of Thomas Collier (died ca. 1741).

William Collier's name figures prominently in the early land records of Charles City County. About 1738, William Collier married, probably as his second wife, Mary Rivers, daughter of Robert Rivers of Prince George Co., Va.<sup>7</sup>

William Collier died prior to Dec. 1748 when his will was presented and proved in Charles City County Court by Benjamin Collier, one of the witnesses. Dancy Stanly, Edward Dancy, George Minge and William Clarke were ordered to appraise his estate.\*

William Collier's widow, Mary (Rivers) Collier, married William Terrell

prior to August Court 1749 when their marriage contract was pro William Terrell, planter, owned property in St. Peter's Parish, New County, and in Charles City County. By 1762 Mary (Rivers) Collier T was again widowed with a family of eight children, four by her first hus William Collier, and four by her second husband, William Terrell. 1762 Mary Collier does not appear again in existing Charles City records so it is possible that she died shortly after this date.

About 1762, Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell's children brought suit as her in Charles City County Court as the "Adm'x of William Terrell, of who was executor of Robert Rivers, dec'd ..." The division of Rivers is recorded in August Court 1762, is important in documenting the child Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell by her two husbands. Obviously, childreach of her marriages inherited since their right to the property came the their mother. The division of Rivers' slaves was as follows: Charles Creceived Ben and Lucy; William Christian (in right of his wife Eliz [Collier] Christian) received Black Peter and Alice; Mildred Collier received Jack, Phil and Isham; and William Collier received Nancy and Grichmond Terrell acquired Yellow Peter; Rebecca Terrell received Martha Terrell received Sam; and William Terrell received Robin. 10

Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell's eight children who survived to adul and their descendants intermarried with the leading families of Charles and New Kent counties, leaving numerous progeny today:

CHARLES COLLIER, oldest child of William and Mary (Rivers) C was born prior to 1739. In 1760 he witnessed the will of John Min Westover Parish, Charles City County. If Minge was the second husbe Rebecca, widow of Thomas Collier of "Wyanoke," son of John Coll King and Queen County. prior to August Court 1749 when their marriage contract was proved. William Terrell, planter, owned property in St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County, and in Charles City County. By 1762 Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell was again widowed with a family of eight children, four by her first husband, William Collier, and four by her second husband, William Terrell. After 1762 Mary Collier does not appear again in existing Charles City Court records so it is possible that she died shortly after this date.

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Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell's eight children who survived to adulthood and their descendants intermarried with the leading families of Charles City and New Kent counties, leaving numerous progeny today:

CHARLES COLLIER, oldest child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier, was born prior to 1739. In 1760 he witnessed the will of John Minge of Westover Parish, Charles City County. Minge was the second husband of Rebecca, widow of Thomas Collier of "Wyanoke," son of John Collier of King and Queen County. Charles Collier and his wife Milly are listed in the 1762 division of Charles' grandfather Robert Rivers' slaves.

ELIZABETH COLLIER, second child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier, was born about 1740-41 and married ca. 1759 William Christian [Jr.] of Charles City County. This William Christian was the son of William Christian of Charles City County whose inventory was filed in that county 11

March 1771.12 The senior William Christian, who married Susannah [name unknown, not Browne] was the son of James Christian of St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County, and his wife Ann, daughter of Gideon Macon. William and Elizabeth (Collier) Christian are named in the 1762 slave division. After Elizabeth (Collier) Christian's death about 1780, William Christian married Sally Atkins.<sup>13</sup> William Christian [Jr.] died 27 April 1808, aged 72.<sup>14</sup> He left numerous children by each wife.

MILDRED COLLIER, third child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier, was born about 1744. She was listed as unmarried in the 1762 division of her grandfather's slaves. About 1764 she married John Christian (died 1801) of New Kent County and their first child, Dr. William Collier Christian, was born 25 Dec. 1765. This John Christian was actually a cousin of William Christian (died 1808), being a son of John Christian, Sr. (ca. 1703-1765) and his wife Sarah. Another child of this marriage was Charles Christian who would later marry Mildred's half-sister, Rebecca Terrell. By the senior John Christian's second marriage to Susannah Browne, John Christian (died 1801) was the half-brother of Capt. Henry Christian, William Browne Christian, Edmund Christian, Turner Christian, Susanna Christian and Elizabeth Christian. Judge Lamb made the error of stating that there were children of William Christian [Sr.] (inventory 1771) based on an orphans' account which does not name of the father of the orphans but only their guardian, Susannah. Additional orphans' accounts filed in Charles City County by the widow Susannah (Browne) Christian clearly state that these children were "orphans of John Christian, dec'd."16 The senior John Christian (ca. 1703-1765) was the son of Charles Christian of Westover Parish, Charles City County, and his wife Elizabeth (Hunt) Christian, daughter of John Hunt, Gent., justice of Charles City County. 17 This Hunt-Christian connection explains the use of the name "Turner" and "Turner Hunt" in the following generations of the Christian family; Elizabeth (Hunt) Christian was the sister of Turner Hunt who died prior to 1 Sept. 1726 leaving two daughters, Elizabeth Hunt (later

wife of John Gregory) and Lucy Hunt (later wife of Richard Crump of St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County).<sup>18</sup>

WILLIAM COLLIER, JR., youngest child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier, was born about 1746. In 1761 he selected his brother-in-law William Christian as his guardian. Prior to 3 Nov. 1773 he married Agnes Anne Marrable, daughter of Charles Marrable of Westover Parish, Charles City County, who signed his will in 1776 naming his daughter Agnes Collier. 20

RICHMOND TERRELL, oldest child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell, was born about 1750.<sup>21</sup> He married Catherine Crump, daughter of Robert Crump of St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County. Richmond Terrell died in 1797 and the inventory of his estate in Charles City County was taken on 13 Sept. 1797. By 1801 the estate records name Richmond Terrell's widow, Catherine (Crump) Terrell, as presently the wife of James Garnett. A chancery suit in Williamsburg of 1808, Gregory vs. Terrell's Administrators, names Catherine, wife of James Garnett, formerly wife of Richmond Terrell, daughter of Robert Crump of St. Peter's Parish.<sup>22</sup>

REBECCA TERRELL, second child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell, was born about 1752 in Charles City County. The marriage bond for her to marry Charles Christian was signed on 3 June 1772 with her guardian William Christian (husband of her half-sister Elizabeth [Collier] Christian) giving his consent.<sup>23</sup> The groom was the brother of John Christian (died 1801) who married Rebecca's other half-sister, Mildred Collier.

MARTHA TERRELL, third child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell, was born on 12 Sept. 1756 in St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County.<sup>24</sup> Prior to 1775 she married John Gregory, Jr., of Westover Parish who signed his will on 3 Dec. 1776, naming his wife Martha and sons

Richmond Gregory and John Munford Gregory. Capt. John Gregory died in service in the army during the American Revolution.<sup>25</sup>

WILLIAM TERRELL, JR., fourth child of William and Mary (Rivers) Collier Terrell, was born on 8 Oct. 1758 in St. Peter's Parish, New Kent County.<sup>26</sup>

As Judge Lamb appropriately noted in 1900, owing to the destruction of so many Charles City and New Kent County records, it is frequently very difficult to prove family lines in these two counties.. It is hoped that this article will help those trying to untangle the web of kinship of the Christians, Colliers, Terrells and other early Charles City County families.


