A memorial service at 10:30 a.m. Saturday (Feb. 7) in University Chapel (817 W. 34th St.), at the edge of the University of Southern California's campus, will honor the memory of a man who was easily one of the world's foremost talents in the field of motion picture animation.

His name was Herbert Kosower and he had crowded a lot of doing and a lot of helping others do, into just 39 years of living.

A Beverly Hills resident at the time of his death and an assistant professor of Cinema at USC, Kosower died Jan. 25 in Culver City's Memorial Hospital, a cancer victim. A wife and four children survive.

He completed work for his Ph.D. degree in Communications with a major in Cinema just last September and was immediately given academic rank. At USC for eight years, he previously held the positions of Lecturer and Associate in Production. He was the only fulltime animator working on a college or university campus anywhere in the world.

Dr. Kosower was also known to his peers as a fine graphic artist and an incomparable cameraman, who had just written, produced, and directed his first feature film for an independent company.

One of Dr. Kosower's prime themes as he taught animation and encouraged cinema students to use it was so much could be accomplished on a low budget.

"Animation is all labor," he once said. "Compared with trying to tell your story with hired models, it's very inexpensive, while still being a valuable art form."

Dear Nechama and Ed:

In case you have not yet received our air-mailed "Thanks" for your interesting congratulatory message, Carl joins me in saying again, "Thank you so much!"

The main purpose of this brief note is to inform you of a discovery. Recently I came across the following marriage that took place in Tykocin (Tiktin in Yiddish), Polish Russia, in 1846. Although the given name is not the correct one for your great-grandfather, this individual may yet provide a lead to your roots:

Lejbka KOSSOWER, age 26 (born 1820 in Zaremby Kosc., pow. Ostrolenka), residing in 1846 in Brok, married Dyna WYZNIAK, age 17 (born 1829 in Tykocin), residing in 1846 in Tykocin.

Lejbka was the son of Abram Moszkowicz (age 30 in 1820) and Chynka Herszkowna (age 24 in 1820).

Dyna was the daughter of Froima Josielowicz and Chimka z Jankiel.

As you know, entries for the Kosower surname are few and far between, so I believe this one may be significant. The entry offers three new locations for a search of later years' records: Tykocin, Zaremby, and Brok.

We hope your trip to the U. S. was enjoyable and productive.P

Retired Track Coach Bud Winter Is Dead at 76

HOUSTON (AP)—Lloyd (Bud) Winter, who was to be inducted into the National Track and Field Hall of Fame Saturday night, died Friday night of a massive heart attack. He was 76.

The athletic Winter, who played tennis and racquetball for an hour daily, collapsed and died after playing racquetball with a friend.

Winter spent 35 years as a coach, before retiring in 1970. During his coaching career at San Jose State, he produced 102 All-Americans. His 1969 team won the National Collegiate Athletic Assn. title, and three of his other teams finished

second in the NCAA meet.

Twenty of his athletes became Olympians, including sprinters Lee Evans, Tommie Smith and John Carlos, stars during the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City.

Winter was elected to the Hall of Fame in June and was to be inducted Saturday night, along with 93-year-old Abel Kiviat, the oldest living Olympic medalist; high jumper John Thomas, and sprinter Mel Patton.

"This meant a lot to him—the award," said Kathi Winter Koelzer of Huntington Beach, one of his two daughters. "It was a dream."

Winter had prepared a speech for Saturday night's banquet of the Athletics Congress. Part of it read: "There is no greater honor a man can receive than to be acknowledged by his peers."

Koelzer said: "Being acknowledged by his peers—that was very important to him."

Funeral services were pending, but will be held in San Jose. Burial also will be in San Jose. In addition to Koelzer, Winter leaves a second daughter, Jayne Winter White of Los Gatos, Calif.; a son, Mike Winter of Sacramento, and two sisters, Claire Winter and Ruth Coffee, both of San Francisco.

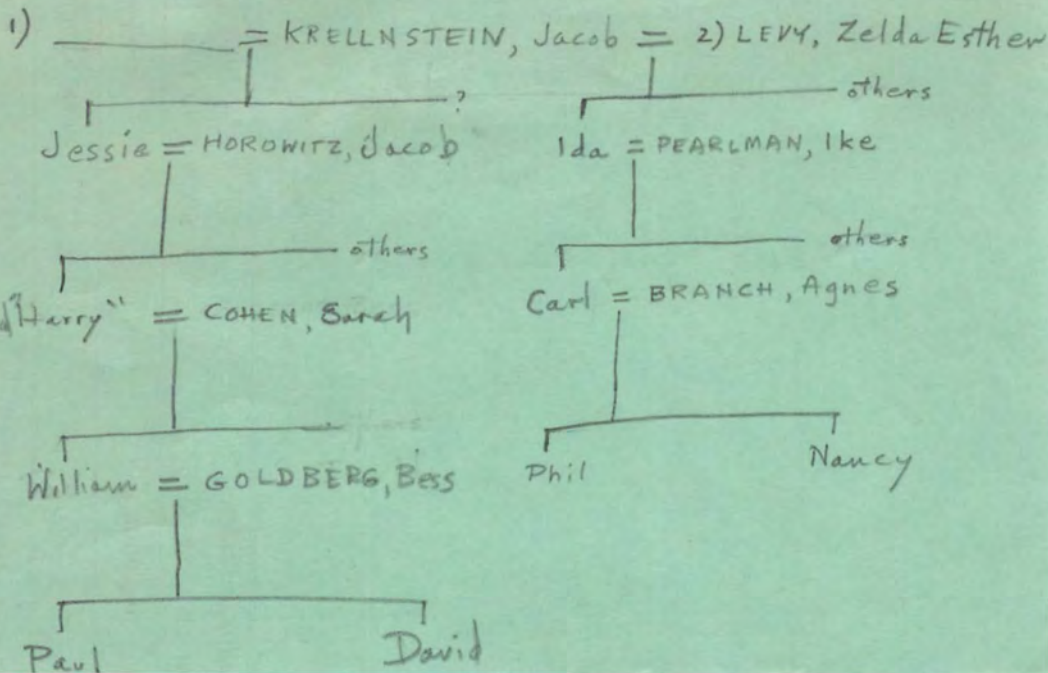

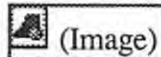

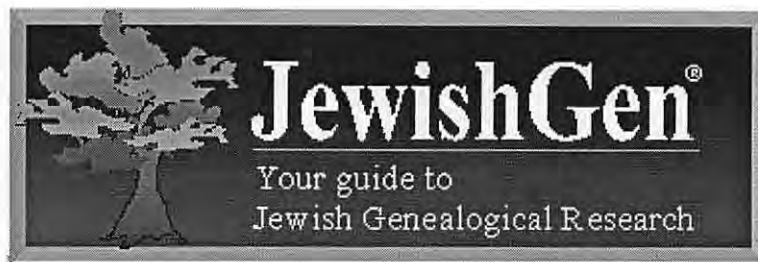

A . Jewish life in the 19th century

The oldest record of Jewish presence in Stawiski goes back to 1820.

In that year a local postman wrote about that town. "Stawiski town is a property of a landlord and is located on the main trade road leading to Saint Petersburg. In the best years of trading it became quite known because a lot of merchants lived there. The population of Stawiski was 917 inhabitants, among them 328 were Christians and 589 were Jews."

Out of 2,570 people that lived in Stawiski in 1857 2,243 were Jews (87 percent). Stawiski as well as the nearby Szczuczyn town was a typical shtetl with Jewish tradesmen, moneylenders and craftsmen. All houses around the square were in the hands of Jewish families. The ground floors were occupied by little shops and inns. One local bakery belonged to a Jew named Rozwadowski. Jews were also owners of a brewery and factories producing clothing and hats.

Jewish children went to a Jewish school and were taught by Jewish teachers.

There are no definitive facts about the timeframe of the founding of Stawiski. According to Karel Czirhoffer in "Names of Settlements in Northern Mazowia" which was published in 1957, Stawiski was recognized as an urban settlement in 1426. In 1697, Zamowski, the owner of the estate, built the Franciscan monastery and the Miec church. Later, a church was built out of bricks, and between the years 1790-1818, the large church which still exists today was built.

Around 1813, all of the houses of the town burnt down. The portion of the church that survived the fire was attached to the Porita church.

In the 8th century, the lands were in the possession of the noblemen of the Karmkowski family, and later in the possession of the noblemen of the Kiszlaniczki family.

In 1886, the lands of Stawiski included the estates of Smolnik and Sokolocha, which had an area of 3048 morag, including wheat fields, pastureland, forests, and irrigated land.

In the latter years, the population of Stawiski reached 8,163 people, and covered an area of 19,182 morag. It had schools, liquor stills, 2 brick kilns, 5 flourmills, and an oil-press. The community of Stawiski included the town as an urban center, 14 estates, and 13 villages.

Dear Friends,

We are gathered here today to pay our last respects to Rae Morrock, devoted wife of Samuel, beloved mother of Richard and sister of Carl Pearlman, cherished friend, relative and neighbor.

It would be no exaggeration to say that Rae was someone special to all of us, and her loss, after an illness of several months, will strike us particularly hard, especially coming as it does in the midst of what is normally a joyous holiday season. Rae, in all her capacities as friend, aunt, mother, wife, teacher, and activist, was one of the most caring people we are ever likely to have known. For many years, she worked as a teacher at Public School 184 in the underprivileged East New York-Brownsville area. She was one of the few teachers who truly empathized with her pupils, making breakthroughs with troubled children whom too many other teachers would have dismissed as uneducable. She understood that these children faced serious problems at home, such as poverty, abuse, language barriers and the like, which were far less widespread in the more affluent areas of the city. Yet she had faith in her ability to reach every pupil, to overcome the reading blocks and the behavioral problems, and allow her pupils' natural taste for learning to grow and flourish. One of her fourth-grade pupils continued to keep in touch with her for more than twenty years.

During the Great Depression, Rae hired a housekeeper, a poor Christian woman from Russia who, it turned out, was

completely illiterate. Rae took the time out to teach this woman to read and write. After fifty years, her former housekeeper was still grateful to Rae, writing her on every holiday to offer prayers for the well-being of Rae and her family. Her last letter only arrived on the day of Rae's death.

Rae was a consummate hostess, and a great cook. Whenever a niece or nephew became engaged, she made sure to have the couple over for a memorable dinner party. It was always her sorrow that so many of her dearest relatives lived thousands of miles away in California, so that she was not able to do this even more often.

Rae was an activist. She was involved in numerous organizations--the PTA and the Child Guidance League, when her son was young, and later the B'Nai B'Rith, the Women's League for Israel, Hadassah, the Phi Lambda Kappa medical fraternity, the Caldeonian Hospital Women's Auxilliary, and the Faculty Wives of the Downstate Medical School. She was also involved in the Teachers Union. One of the things for which she will long be remembered is her work on behalf of equal retirement for teachers, which gave New York City teachers the right to retire after the same number of years of service as policemen and firemen.

She also was a great letter writer, having published literally hundreds of letters in various newspapers. Many of her letters were published in a paper which, in the past, had somewhat of a reputation for championing progressive causes.

When that newspaper changed hands and became a right-wing scandal sheet, Rae's letters continued to appear on its editorial page, a near-solitary voice of sanity in a chorus of cynicism and neanderthalism.

She, alone, was largely responsible for the fact that New York City letter carriers were given wheeled carts, instead of being made to carry the mail in the heavy sacks they used to use. When she heard that the carts had been adopted in another city, she got after our politicians and persuaded them to follow suit.

And she had her ways of influencing the movers and shakers in New York. One day, a politician would do something she liked. Promptly, a letter would appear in the newspaper, signed by Rae, praising the politician for his deed. There is nothing a politician likes better than free, favorable publicity. After that, they knew her name, and when, sometime later, she would write to the politicians, asking for favors, you can be sure that they listened. The favors, of course, were never asked on behalf of herself, but only on behalf of other people. She was very much what people call a "do-gooder." And she remained a do-gooder even in times when being one was not particularly trendy or popular.

One of the saddest tragedies of life is that, when we lose someone we love, we almost never have the chance to say thank you: thank you for the dinner parties, for the loving letters of concern, for the birthday presents to grandnephews

and grandneices you would seldom get to see in person, for saving us from a lifetime of illiteracy, for all the hard work you put into so many different organizations without ever neglecting your family responsibilities, for all the encouragement you gave us when things looked bad, and just for being there and showing us that you cared.

You were born with the name Rachael, and toward the end of your life you sometimes preferred to use it. But most of us knew you all along as Rae. And it is as Rae that we will remember you, because you were indeed a ray of sunshine in so many of our lives.

TRANSLATION FROM THE HEBREW

The Exalted Rabbi, Reb Joshua Heschel Shapira

Born to his father, Reb (Mr.) Dov Ber in Augustov (vowels uncertain) and Bayleh (phonetic transliteration)(.) The years of his youth and the period of his being a youthful scholar in the tent of Torah, under the supervision of his brother, the Gaon, Reb Israel Isser Shapira, Av Bet Din (head of the religious court) of Mota', and also with his father in law, the Ga'on, Reb _____ Lippe Hayim Ha-kohen (the priest), Av Bet Din, Zambrova (Province of Lumzheh). He served afterwards as Av Bet Din in two important communities, Shaki (province of Sovalek) and Chuchin (vowels uncertain) (province of Lumzheh).

In contrast to his brother, the Ga'on, Reb _____ Israel Isser, Reb Joshua Heschel opposed the Hibbat Zion movement. Despite this, he headed the Lumzheh-Sovalek College and did great things to strengthen institutions of Torah of the Old Settlement in Jerusalem. He was an intimate of the Ga'on (exalted one),* Reb Joshua Leib Diskin, the Brisker Rabbi in Jerusalem. It happened, when Reb Heschel learned that one of the men in the Kollel (college) in Jerusalem, Reb Joshua Yellin sent his son to a modernist school, that Reb Joshua Heschel approved the decision of the men of the Kolel to annul Reb Joshua Yellin's right to take advantage of Kolel funds. The attempts of noted personalities from Subalek, Lumzheh, and even from Augustov (Reb Mordecai Marcus), to nullify the zealous decision of Jerusalem, were of no avail.

When he passed away in the year ^{see attached note} 1868, old and full of days, he was eulogized in villages near and far. In Augustov, city of his birth, the Dayyan (Judge of religious court) Reb Azriel Zelig Kushlovsky eulogized him. Reb Joshua's scholarly innovations in Torah-study are found in books by other authors, especially in the volume of responsa, "Ezrat Yisrael" (the Help of Israel) of his brother, the Ga'on Reb. Israel Isser, Av Bet Din in Augustov. Similarly in the book, "Face of the Living Lion" by Rabbi Hayim Leib (Yiddish for Lion) Rotenberg (equiv. of contemporary name, Rothenberg), known as "the Saint of Stavvisk."

- 1-avrekh=youthful scholar (a term of profound respect used in Genesis for Joseph) lit. av (father, i.e. possessed of the wisdom of an elder) but rekh (lit. rahh, i.e. tender (young) in years
- 2- the movement of the Hov'vay Zion (Lovers of Zion), a movement of largely Rumanian orthodox Jews who migrated to Palestine and became farmers. The movement was opposed by most East European Orthodox leaders as premature, since the return to Palestine must be brought about by the Messiah. ** -Brisker Rabbi = Rabbi from ^{East} European town of Brisk, who led a group of his landsleit living in Jerusalem (and being supported by people in Brisk and from Brisk living elsewhere). Each successor, normally a son, even if born in Jerusalem, is called the Brisker Rebbe or, simply, the Brisker.

Ha-RAV ha-GA'ON REB JOSHUA HESCHEL SHAPIRA

Born to his father, Reb Dov Behr in Ogustov (Augustov, Ogostov-?) and spent the years of his youth and the period of his young scholarship in the tent of torah, under the oversight of his brother, the Ga'on Reb Israel Isser Shapira, the Av Bet Din (head of the Religious Court) of Mota (?), and also with his father-in-law, the Ga'on Reb Lippe Chayim Hachen, Av Bet Din of Zembrova (?) (pelekh (province, district) of Lumzheh (?). He later officiated (served) as Av Bet Din in the two important communities of Saki (Shaki?) (Province of Sovalk--?) and Schochin (Schuchin-?) (Province of Lumzheh).

In contrast to his brother, the Ga'on Reb Israel Isser, Reb Joshua Heschel opposed the Hibbat Zion movement. Despite this, he headed the Kollel (college) Lumzheh-Sovalk and greatly strengthened torah institutions of the Old Community (Yishuv) in Jerusalem. He was the secret supporter of the Ga'on Reb Joshua Leib Diskin, the Brisker Rav, in Jerusalem. There was an incident in which, when it became known to Reb Heschel that one of the men in the Kollel in Jerusalem, Reb Joshua Yellin, turned his son over to a Modernist school, Reb Heschel authorized (or 'approved') the decision of the men of the Kollel to cancel Reb Joshua Yellin's right to benefit from Kollel funds. The efforts of well-known personalities from Sovalk, Lumzheh and even Ogostov (Reb Mordecai Marcus) to nullify the decision of the Jerusalem Zealots were to no avail.

When he passed away in the year ¹⁹⁶⁷⁻⁸ 1868, in ripe old age, he was eulogized in villages near and far. In Ogostov, city of his birth, the Dayyan (judge of religious court) Reb Azriel Zelig Kos(h)lovsky. Reb Joshua's torah innovations (in interpretation, legal and otherwise) are to be found in the books of other authors, especially in the book of responsa, "Ezrat Yisrael"

4-AV BET DIN: Av-Father; Bet-House; Din-Law; Bet Din-Court (consisting of a minimum of three dayyanim, rabbinic judges; Av Bet Din: Chief judge of the Bet Din.

5-Hibbat Zion: "Love of Zion", the mid-19th century movement for settlement in the Holy Land which preceded the political Zionism of Theodore Herzl. Religious Jews from Rumania and elsewhere in Eastern Europe began migrating to Palestine in the 1880s, supported financially by Jews in the diaspora, most notably Baron Edmond de Rothschild.

If JoshuaHeschel Shapira was an opponent of the Hibbat Zion movement, it places him in this period.

6-The Old Yishuv in Jerusalem--was long in existence before the birth of the Hibbat Zion movement and totally independent of it. It was supported by Jewish religious charities in the diaspora.
