## Elizabeth O'Neill, active volunteer

Elizabeth Brobston O'Neill, a homemaker and longtime volunteer, died Nov. 13 at her home in Bala Cynwyd after a long illness. She was 88.

A native of Nazareth, she lived in Bala Cynwyd for almost 60 years.

Mrs. O'Neill was a graduate of Moravian Academy in Bethlehem and the Cathedral School of Saint Mary's in Garden City, N.Y. She received artistic training and was a graduate of the Philadelphia School of Industrial Arts (later known as the Philadelphia Museum College of Art). She used her artistic talents to create the "O'Neill's Christmas Card" which, for over 60 years, graphically chronicled the continuously growing size and exploits of her family.

Between raising nine children, she also was active in civic and charitable affairs throughout her life. She was a volunteer for the American Red Cross, the Bryn Mawr Hospital and was honored by the Franklin Institute, where she was affectionately known as the "train lady" for her years of service as a volunteer tour guide.

She is remembered for her devotion to her family and friends.

The widow of the late Thomas M. O'Neill, a certified public accountant who had offices in Philadelphia and Camden, she is survived by four daughters, Elizabeth A. Anderer of Palm Beach, Fla., Jane O. Keck of Lakeland, Fla., Joanne O'Neill of Ardmore and Judy O'Neill Burns of Ardmore, four sons, Thomas M. Jr. of Pacific Palisades, Calif., Hugh of Washington, D.C., David T. of Narberth, Steven T. of Bala Cynwyd, 18 grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren, and one great-great grandchild. She was the mother of the late Michael T. O'Neill, who died in 1970.

Interment is private. A memorial service took place Nov. 15 at her home.
