The Last Will and Testament of Allen Christian Made 18 July 1836. In the name of God amen I Allen Christian, Senior of Madison County, Alabama being of sound mind but feeble in body - conscious of the uncertainty of life and not wishing to die intestate, do make and publish this as my last will and testament to wit. I first give my body to the dust whence it came and commend my soul to God who gave me existence and as to my worldly effects it is my will that my debts be paid by my Executor herein after named.

1st I will and devise to my beloved wife Margaret the plantation on which I now live containing two hundred and forty acres, more or less to hold, possess and enjoy the same during her lifetime if she shall remain single after my death. Should she marry however then her interest in said land to cease, and said land disposed of as herein after directed. In the same manner I give to my said wife all the farming utensils on this farm with all household and kitchen furniture and stock of every description and it is my will and desire that this farm shall be cultivated and my family remain together on it heretofore for their comfortable support and maintainance (sic), this provision however to cease as to any of my daughters as they may marry.

2nd I give and bequeath to my said wife Margaret the seven bales of cotton now on hand and also the crop of corn,cotton, oats now on hand and growing to be by her applied in her discretion to the support of herself and family remaining with her.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my said wife during her widowhood or lifetime as the case may be the following negroes to wit: Parnes, Arch, Peter, Lige, Alfred, Westley, Judy, Hannah, Josiah and Lucy the younger. Said negroes to remain with my said wife for her own use and benefit as above mentioned.

4th I give to my son Allen one negroe man named Henry.

5. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth a negro girl named Mary about fifteen years old and a negro child named Jane.

6. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah a negro girl Eliza about sixteen years old and a negro child named Ermine about a year old.

7. I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha a negro girl named Harriet about sixteen years old and an infant boy named Elishia.

8. I give and bequeath to my daughter Myoma a negro girl named Martha about sixteen years old and a negro child named Ellen about two years old.

9. Whereas myself and my son Allen have heretofore cultivated a farm in Jackson County together now it is my wish that my son Allen continue to manage said farm as heretofore, and for this purpose I place under his care the following negroes to wit: Sarah, Lucy the elder, Matilda and Jemina, and also all my share of horses, farming utensils and stock of every description on said farm and I wish the proceeds of my interest in the produce of said farm to be applied to the clothing and comfortable support of my single daughters and the balance if any to be invested by my said Executor as he may think proper for the ultimate advantage of my estate

10. Should my wife die or marry leaving any of my daughters single who are now unmarried, then I wish and will that such daughter or daughters shall have until they marry or die the use of

11. To each of my daughters now single I give a bed and furniture

It is my will and desire that my son Allen employ some suitable person to manage our farming interest in Jackson County, and that he come and reside with my family here, and superintend and manage this farm for the purposes above mentioned - and I wish it understood that in speaking of the support of my single daughters I wish them to live in the family with their mother and at the plantation, but their clothing and other expenses to be furnished out of my farming interest in Jackson County

13. Whenever my said wife shall marry or die then it is my will that the negroes above bequeathed to her and their increase shall be equally divided among all my children, or if any of them should be dead leaving children, their children, with the exception- no part of my estate is given to my son Jesse, but the share to which he should be entitled is to go to his children James and William - and it is further to be understood that the legacies above given to my children, and property heretofore given to any of them is in a general division to be taken into consideration with the exception of the negro girl Liz or Lizzy given this day to my daughter Martha is not to be by her accounted for on division.

14. Whenever my said wife shall die or marry, then my lands and other property to be equally divided among my children as above, that is to say the said children of my son Jesse to receive an equal share of my estate in his stead - and with the further understanding that ther is to be no division of the home plantation while any of my daughters remain single-



I, Christopher Christian, being weak etc., etc.

To oldest son John 400 acres Bedford VA, both sides of Stanton [sic] River, it being the plantation whereon my father Thomas Christian dec'd . [sic, presumably "lived"]. Also 100 acres on Pee Dee River adj. the land of Mark Allen it came of the tract whereon I now live. Also bay colt called Roebuck, one feather bed and furniture.

Son James Christian part of tract and plantation whereon I now live 400 acres, also 100 acres adj. the above it being the tract of land of David Smith. Also one dark colt called Tarlton, one featherbed and furniture.

Eldest dau Patty Christian 100 acres on Huary (?) River, part of the tract I bought of Christopher Monday, also 300 acres on Rocky Creek, it being the land whereon the Court House stands; also one bay mare called Daffodil, one feather bed and furniture.

Dau Lucy Christian 350 acres both sides of Rocky Creek, it being the land I bought of Thomas Mason; also 100 acres on Pee DEE River and on the north side of Rocky Creek; also one negro girl named Silvay, one feather bed and furniture.

To my friend Patty Coley 100 acres on Huary (?) River, it being the other half of that tract lying on Little Rocky Creek, it being the place where Nathan Briggs formerly lived. Also one blaze faced sorrel mare, two cows and calves and one feather bed and furniture.

Also to my oldest dau Patty Christian one mulatto girl named Tilly, until she arrives to the age of 21 the said Tilly being bound to me for 11 years of indenture.

Also to son John Christian one negro man named Caesar.

Remaining part of my estate equally divided among my four children as follows: When oldest dau is married my estate shall be divided the remainder of my estate when my oldest son comes of age the remainder to continue until my youngest son comes of age, also my friend Patty Coley have her part immediately after my decease.

My estate shall continue and my plantation with my 4 children to raise and educate them until each chid comes of age.

Virginia An account of Quarterly sessions, contained & held, for Montgomery County, at the court-house on Wednesday the 7th day of November 1821.

It is ordered to be certified to the Secretary of the war department of the United States, that William Christian who is a citizen of the Commonwealth of Virginia and has resided in the County of Montgomery and state aforesaid for upwards of Twenty five years, and is aged about Seventy one years, personally appeared in open court, the same being a court of record, and on oath declared that in the latter part of the summer or early in the fall of 1776, he was commissioned a lieutenant in the army of the Revolution of the United States on continental establishment, he then resided in the County of Augusta Virginia, where he qualified to said Commission and enlisted his full quota of men, and joined the 10th Virginia Regiment, commanded by Col. Edward Stevens, and was attached to the company of Capt. John Sims, and he served in said regiment and under said officers as a Lieutenant until sometime about the spring in the year of 1778 when the 10th and 14th, ^{Virginia} Regiments were consolidated and the command given to Col. Charles Lewis, he then was directed to return home as a supernumerary officer and he did return home to Augusta County where under an appointment of the field officer of the militia of said county, he mustered the militia for about two years and he further stated that about the first of March preceding the battle of Guilford, he took seven or eight men which he found in said County of Augusta, who belonged to the Army and marched with them and joined General Green in North Carolina, the men were placed under Capt. Thomas Smith, and he further stated that he then was appointed an aide to Col. William Campbell, in which office he remained and acted in the battle of Guilford after which Col. Campbell was appointed General, he stated he was then appointed a quartermaster to provide provision for all the light troops, under the command of

Gent Campbell in which station he remained until the death of said Campbell, after which he was appointed an Adjutant to a regiment of Rifle men commanded by Col S Samuel Davis in which he remained and acted until the siege of York, and the taking of Bowness, where he was present; he was then directed to return home which he did; he further states that his commission and other papers containing evidence of his service are lost, and he has no other evidence in his power of the said services. 

I do hereby certify that in the year 1776 I was appointed Lieutenant in the company of Captⁿ Syone of Augusta County of the 10th Regiment commanded by Colonel Edward Stephens - in the time of the State of Virginia in the Continental Establishment we marched from Staunton Augusta in 8th year & joined the main Army at Bonbrook & Middle Brook the spring following in 1777 - There in consequence of the Captⁿ of 1st dist^t: Resigning the command of the Company devolved upon me, which command I continued in until the next spring, in the year 1778. In this year the 10th Reg^t and 14th commanded by Col^l Charles Lewis was join^{ed} in one in consequence of which I got leave from Col^l Richard H. Meade to leave the Army for want of a command; & when returned home shortly after I was appointed by the officers of the County of Augusta to Train the Militia in which capacity I acted for two years, after which time of Lewis in the Militia I was appointed Adjutant of a Regiment commanded by Col^l George Moffett of Augusta which joined Gen^l Greene in North Carolina, and was commanded by Col^l William Campbell under whom I acted as Brigade Major and did all the duty until after the Battle of Gilford Col^l Campbell some time after taking sick went to Col^l Syone in Hanover & there died. Your letter of the 18th instant has been received. I have taken some trouble to endeavor to find out some evidence to sustain the statement of Wm Christian in the papers forwarded to you some time since, but have been unable to do so.

In hunting for such evidence I find that in Augt. 1776 Wm Christian was commissioned a Colonel & Commander in Chief of all the forces against the Cherokee Indians. His instructions are on record.

One of the Battalions in this expedition was commanded by Col Charles Lewis. Whether this is the same Wm Christian or not I of course cannot say. In 1777 I find that Col Christian was appointed one of three commissioners to make a treaty with the Cherokee Indians & in May 1777 he reported that he had made a treaty & it was approved.

I regret that I could find no information such as you desired.


