

HISTORY of MOORE FAMILY
of JACKSON, POCAHONTAS COUNTY, W. Va.

Over two hundred years ago, one of the most widely known citizens in the region now embraced by Pocahontas and Bath Counties was Levi Moore, Sr., a native of Wales. He was the Pioneer of Frost, Pocahontas County, coming there some time previous to the Revolution, and first to make permanent settlement there. His wife was Susannah Crist. Levi first settled in Pennsylvania, where he lived until his family, two sons, two daughters, were born and the older ones nearly grown.

Their daughter, Hannah, married Robert Gay (Robert came from Ireland in the early 1700's).

Their daughter Sally, married John Smith, one of the first permanent settlers of the Edray District, near the head of Stoney Creek.

Their son George Moore, back on a visit from Kentucky; - a practical joke was played on him by James Brindley, at the notable marriage of Jacob Slaven and Miss Eleanor Lockridge, married near Driscoll; - the joke backfired - the horse he was riding took fright from a bur, ran off, and George's head struck a projecting fence stake and was instantly killed.

MOORE FAMILY

Quote from *Historical Sketches of Pocahontas Co., W.Va.*
by William T. Price, 1901. "Felix Grimes Story",
Page 194-S.

"Arthur Grimes and Levi Moore, son of Levi (Sr.), the Pioneer, and afterwards a member of the Legislature, went on a "Scout" to Clover Lick to see if Indians were around. Seeing no sign, they went to the house, placed their guns just outside the door, and finding a bed within, lay down and fell asleep. Arthur dreamed of being bitten by a rattlesnake, sprang out of bed and awakened Moore. The dog was growling at Indians stealing toward the house. The men seized their guns and escaped, leaving the dog shut up in the house. The dog soon came to them, however. The Indians fired the building, cut a pair of moccasins from a dressed deer skin belonging to old (Ben), and amused themselves by stripping feathers from two live roosters to see their antics.

When they reported to Jacob Warwick about the affair, he told them that whenever he dreamed of wild turkeys, he was sure of having trouble with Indians very soon".

Levi Moore, Jr., was a man of prominence in county affairs. In stature, he was over 6' ~~8"~~^{11"} tall and well proportioned. He was a member of the Virginia Legislature and was on the Commission to locate the Court House. Following in his father's footsteps; as he also held offices of Constable, Virginia Legislature, etc.

M - Jan. 21, 1797 Bath Co. Va. (W. Va.)

His first marriage was to Miss Nancy Sharp; daughter of William Sharp, Sr. (1744-1833), a famous Indian Scout, SPX and Revolutionary Soldier. Nancy's mother was Mary Meeks, daughter of Jonathan Meeks from near Staunton, Virginia.

In reference to their children, the following items: ----

(1) Rebecca, married Leonard Irvine on Buck Creek, and resided beside the road that leads to Frost, where it leaves Buck Creek. Their children were: Lizzie, married Henry Coffee (from Augusta Co., Va.); Cornelia married William Gardner (they settled in Webster Co., (W. Va.)); Wilton married Kate McCarty, daughter of George McCarty, and settled on Little Back Creek; Susannah married Cyrus Kelly on Little Creek.

(2) Margaret, married Eli McCarty and resided near Laurel Run. Their children: Margaret married John Simmons and resided on the "homestead"; Paul, died in the west.

(3) Martha Moore, born Feb. 22, 1811, married the Rev. John Waugh, born June 19, 1805, the son of Samuel Waugh (1774-1831), grandson of one of the earliest Pocahontas County settlers, James Waugh, Sr. was in this county in 1739. Their children were: - Eveline, born 1832; Samuel, born 1834; Levi, born 1838; Beverly, born 1840; Miriam, born 1842; Ann, born 1844; and John, born 1853.

(4) Andrew Moore, born 1805 in what is now Pocahontas Co., (W.Va.), died Jackson County (date unknown), married Rebecca Waugh, born Nov. 22, 1802 in what is now (W.Va.); sister to the Rev. John Waugh, and daughter of Samuel Waugh (1774-1831).

Andrew Moore settled on Knapps Creek, thence moved to the head of Stony Creek and finally located in Jackson County. He was noted for his skill in forecasting the season's and the weather. Founder of the Moore family of Jackson County, (my line-Charles Ray Harper).

(5) Levi Moore, the third, went to Nebraska where it is reported he amassed a large fortune in the fur trade. Having no family of his own at that time, he took his nephew John Moore, one of Andrew's sons with him.

The Hon. Levi Moore, Jr.'s second marriage was to Mary McCarty, daughter of Timothy McCarty, a Revolutionary veteran. Children of this marriage: - (1) Rachel, married James Sharp on Thorny Creek and migrated to Iowa. (2) Susannah Crist Moore, married Stephen Hadden and also went to Iowa. (3) Mary Jane Moore, had a

named Matilda Moore, and resided near Mt. Zion Church. (4) George Moore, the youngest son, was as tall as his father. He spent some years in the west. He returned to Pocahontas approximately 1841, and was a pupil at the first session taught in the Pocahontas Academy at Hillsboro in 1842. The Rev. Joseph Brown was the Principal at that time. He had the Profession of Medicine in view and was studious to his efforts to qualify himself. Mr. Brown took much interest in the quiet and exemplary student, so intensely anxious for intellectual improvement. After all his hard labor, the young man was seized with pulmonary disease, aggravated by his close application to books, and died at the home of his sister Rebecca Irvine, on Back Creek.

Levi Moore, Sr. located 575 acres of a British survey on the head waters of Knapps Creek. After the Revolution, new requirements were made.

Previous to the time of new requirements, Levi had laid a claim on two thousand acres of land which included the 575 Moore acres. Since there no British rights, he was "just out cold". Anyway, holding to the Golden Rule, George Poage gave the land up to the Moore's even though under the law he could have kept it.

It makes us feel proud of our Pioneer People, to catch glimpses of how, and the manner, of men they were.

Levi Moore (1841-1930) was one of the most widely known and highly esteemed citizens of Jackson County. He was an early Undertaker, Farmer, Teacher, and a leading citizen of the Rockcastle Community, and died at the age of 89, and is interred on old Levi Moore Homestead, located near the Lone Oak Baptist Church on Thirteen Mile Creek, two or three miles from Rockcastle Cemetery, (enclosed in a wire fence), high on a ridge overlooking the old Levi Moore Homestead. His children were: -

- (B) - Charles S., a well known traveling salesman and lived at Spencer at the time of his death.

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN MOSES MOORE THE INDIAN FIGHTER - Levi Moore (Sr.) of Pocahontas County, W. Va. (Moses Moore was born in Rockbridge County, Virginia).

But in the book, "Scotch-Irish Settlement", Virginia Court Records of Augusta County (1745-1800), Volume II, "Levi Moore deposes in Bath County in 1817, has known the place called the Richlands for 44 years, is said by both families to be distantly related to Moses Moore's family but do not know how."

The Nuckles family, three brothers were at the first *Permanent English Colony in America, (John of the three brothers is our line). Then his Grandson is found living in Gouchland County, Va. "John Nuckolls" - John Nuckles, Sr.-Jr. of Tazewell Co., Va. - Elijah Nuckels one of the biggest slave owner's in Virginia. - to William Ed. Nuckles (1870-1953) father - James Harvey Nuckles, born approx. 1839, Mercer Co., W.Va. | then part of Tazewell Co., died Dec. 2, 1927 at Given in Jackson Co. W.Va., was a Confederate soldier that was with Gen. John McCausland when they burned Chambersburg, Pennsylvania.

Levi MOORE, Jr. was married twice. He married first on 21 January 1797, Bath Co., (W)VA Miss Nancy SHARP. Nancy's father was William SHARP, Sr. (1744-1833), a famous Indian Scout, spy and Revolutionary Soldier. Her mother was Mary MEEKS, daughter of John MEEKS from near Staunton, Virginia.

Levi and Nancy had the following children:

- 1) Rebecca, born Pocahontas Co. (now) WV, 1808. Married 18 October 1826 to Leonard IRVINE on Buck Creek, and resided beside the road that leads to Frost, where it leaves Buck Creek.

 - a) Lizzie married Henry COFFEE (from Augusta Co., VA)
 - b) Cornelia married William GARDNER (they settled in Webster Co., (W) VA.)
 - c) Wilton married Kate McCARTY, daughter of George McCARTY, and settled on Little Back Creek.

- 2) Margaret, born in what is now Pocahontas Co., WV, married Eli McCARTY and resided near Laurel Run.
Children:
 - a) Margaret married John SIMMONS and resided on the "homestead".

- 3) Martha, born 22 February 1811, Pocahontas Co. married 17 November 1831, John WAUGH. John born 19 June 1805, son of Samuel WAUGH (1774-1831) and grandson of one of the earliest

Pocahontas County settlers, James WAUGH, Sr., who was in this county in 1739.
Children of John and Martha (MOORE) WAUGH:

e) Miriam, born 1842; f) Ann, born 1844; and g) John, born 1853.

- 4) Andrew MOORE, born 1805, in what is now Pocahontas Co., died c1879, Jackson County, WV married Rebecca WAUGH (born 22 Nov. 1802 in what is now WV). Sister to Rev. John WAUGH and daughter of Samuel WAUGH (1774-1831). Andrew MOORE settled on Knapps Creek, thence moved to the head of Stony Creek and finally located in Jackson Co., (W)VA. He was noted for his skill in forecasting the season's and the weather. Founder of the MOORE family of Jackson County (My line - Charles Ray Harper.) Andrew's family information is continued further in the article.
- 5) Levi MOORE, III, born Pocahontas Co., (W)VA 24 June 1813. Died 6 November 1898, Red Cloud, Nebraska. He moved to McHenry County, Illinois, 1836, where he married, in 1842, Prudence D. ACKERSON. They had a daughter who died in infancy. In 1851, he moved to Winneshick County, Iowa, then in 1873 to Red Cloud, Nebraska, where it is reported that he amassed a large fortune in the fur trade. Having no family of his own at that time, he took his nephew John MOORE, one of Andrew's sons, with him.

The Hon. Levi MOORE, Jr.'s second marriage was to Mary McCARTY, daughter of Timothy McCARTY, a Revolutionary veteran. Children of Levi and Mary were:

- 1(6) Rachel, born 18 March 1824, died 11 September 1906, buried Burr Oak, Iowa. Married James SHARP on Thorny Creek and migrated to Iowa.
- 2(7) Susannah Crist MOORE, born 1827, married first William MOORE. Second, Stephen HADDEN and also went to Iowa.
- 3(8) Mary Jean MOORE, born 1823 had a girl, Matilda MOORE, and resided near Mt. Zion Church.
- 4(9) George MOORE, youngest son, was as tall as his father. He spent some years in the west. He returned to Pocahontas c1841, and was a pupil at the first session taught in the Pocahontas Academy at Hillsboro in 1842. The Rev. Joseph BROWN was the principal at that time. George had the profession of medicine in view and was studious to his efforts to qualify himself. Mr. BROWN took much interest in the quiet and exemplary student, so intensely anxious for intellectual improvement. After all his hard labor, the young man was seized with pulmonary disease, aggravated by his close application to books, and died at the home of his sister, Rebecca IRVINE, on Back Creek.

A Note on Levi MOORE, Sr. -- He had located 575 acres of a British survey on the headwaters of Knapps Creek. After the Revolution, new requirements were made.

Previous to the time of new requirements, Levi had laid a claim on two thousand acres of land which included the 575 MOORE acres. Since there were no British rights, he was "just out cold". Anyway, holding to the Golden Rule, George POAGE gave the land up to the Moores even though under the law he could have kept it.

It makes us feel proud of our Pioneer People, to catch glimpses of how, and the manner, of men they were.

JACKSON COUNTY, WV MOORES

Andrew MOORE, son of Levi, Jr. came to Jackson Co., c1851, moving near Given. The house he built is now the old BOWSELL home. Andrew married 13 August 1829, Rebecca WAUGH, Pocahontas Co., (W)VA, and they founded the MOORE family of Rock Castle, Jackson Co., WV. Their children:

- 1) Nancy Ann (M.) MOORE, born 1830 married Robert M. DUFFIELD of Pocahontas Co., they moved to Jackson County, WV. Robert was the son of Andrew and Jane (MOORE) DUFFIELD. Grandson of Abram DUFFIELD, a Revolutionary soldier, and Hannah MOORE. Hannah MOORE was the daughter of Moses MOORE and sister to Robert MOORE, Sr. Moses MOORE was a famous Indian Scout and fighter. His birthplace and date is unknown at this time but he arrived in Pocahontas Co., Knapps Creek c1770 from Timber Ridge, Rockbridge County, Virginia. Robert's mother, Jane MOORE, was the daughter of Robert MOORE, Sr. (born - 27 May 1772) and Rebecca McCOLLAN. Jane was the niece to Hannah (MOORE) DUFFIELD, as well as her daughter-in-law.
- 2) Lavinia MOORE, born 1834, married Bennett RAYBURN.
- 3) Samuel W. MOORE, born 1836, married 20 February 1870, Alice CASTO, daughter of Elmore and Phoebe CASTO. A letter from one of John's sons from Pawnee, Oklahoma, Carrie (CASTO) FERRELL received a letter from Levi MOORE, dated May 28, 1961, and he wrote that he had gone to Indian Territory at the age of 10 (1894) - lists Samuel's children as: Mary (Mollie; Stella; Sena; George; John; Lidia; Bell; Perry; and Orvil) and Olivia married Tilden PARSONS. Later research has turned up these children of Samuel W. & Alice (CASTO) MOORE:

Levi MOORE, the fourth child and second son of Andrew and Rebecca (WAUGH) MOORE, who moved to Jackson Co. c1851, was one of the most widely known and highly esteemed citizen of Jackson Co. He was an early undertaker, farmer, teacher, and a leading citizen of the Rockcastle community, and died at the age of 89 in 1930 and is interred on the old Levi Moore Homestead, located near the Lone Oak Baptist Church on Thirteen Mile Creek, two or three miles from Rockcastle Cemetery, (enclosed in a wire fence), high on a ridge overlooking the old Levi Moore Homestead. His children were:

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN MOSES MOORE, THE INDIAN FIGHTER

Levi MOORE (Sr.) of Pocahontas Co., WV (Moses MOORE was born in Rockbridge Co., VA).

But in the book, "Scotch-Irish Settlement", Virginia Court Records of Augusta County (1745-1800). Volume 11, "Levi MOORE deposes in Bath County in 1817, has known the place called the Richlands for 44 years, is said by both families to be distantly related to Moses MOORE's family but do not know how."

The NUCKLES family, three brothers were at the first "Permanent English Colony in America (at Jamestown, 1607)." (John of the three brothers is our line) Then his grandson is found living in Goochland County, VA. "John NUCKOLLS" - John NUCKLES, Sr. - Jr. of Tazewell County, VA - Elijah NUCKLES, one of the biggest slave owner's in Virginia. - to William Ed. NUCKLES (1870-1953) father - James Harney NUCKLES, born approx. 1839, Mercer Co., WV (then part of Tazewell Co.), died 2 Dec 1927 at Given in Jackson Co., WV, was a Confederate soldier with Gen. John McCausland when they burned Chambersburg, Pennsylvania.

Newspaper Obituaries - - The Webster Co. Argus, 11 Nov 1898 - Death of Levi MOORE, son of Levi MOORE, Jr. & grandson of Levi MOORE, Sr. who came from Wales. "Last Sunday morning the people of this community learned with sincere regret of the death of Mr. Levi MOORE, a pioneer of the city and county and a citizen of genuine worth. Levi MOORE, born 24 June 1813, Pocahontas, Tazewell Co., VA and age at death was 85 yrs., 4 mos., 11 days. In 1836 he moved to McHenry Co., Ill., where he was married 10 July 1842, to Prudence D. ACKERSON. One daughter was born to them, who died in infancy. In 1851, with Mrs. MOORE, he moved to Winneshiek Co., Iowa, where they lived on a farm near Decorah until 1873 when Mr. MOORE came to Red Cloud, arriving here 1 June, Mrs. MOORE following soon afterwards. Mr. MOORE took an active part in developing the town and was always prominent in any movement for promoting its welfare, He followed farming as a vocation throughout his entire life though he has at different periods been interested in other business enterprises. in his death all mourn the loss of a model citizen."

Red Cloud, Nebraska, Friday, July 8, 1910 -- THE LIFE STORY OF A PIONEER LADY ---

"...the Argus presents for its readers a brief notice of a woman who is entitled to honorable mention in the columns of a Webster Co. newspaper. Mrs. Levi MOORE came with her husband in 1873. She began moving west when a little child of seven years, and her home was on the frontier when parts of New York was "out west". Mrs. MOORE, at age 7, was moved to Michigan. In 1837, Prudence ACKERMAN (now Mrs. MOORE) with her parents moved to McHenry Co., Ill., where she met Levi MOORE, whom she married in 1842. 1851, they moved to Winneshiek Co., Iowa, on the banks of the Mississippi. 1873 they moved to Red Cloud. In her 87th year, she is the oldest woman in the county of those who came before the grasshopper invasion of 1874. A few years ago, her aged brother, William ACKERMAN, died at her home. He, also, had been a pioneer. His travels had been wider than those of the very few. The west coast of South America was as familiar to him as the Mississippi River is to the rest of us. Mrs. MOORE has in her possession a painting of Red Cloud as it appeared in 1874, executed by Mrs. H.J. MAURER during that year. She has always identified herself with the Congregational Church since its organization in 1874, in this county, although formal union is not recognized until a later date, she is the only person now connected with the church who can recall its beginnings."

In compiling the records of the ancestors and descendents of James Franklin Weber and Arlena Mae Hatten Weber the question comes up as to what is of interest to others than myself. I have tried to include interesting pieces of information on our family but have a vast amount that was impossible to include. Some records have as yet not been found so as time passes I hope to find the missing and will add to this loose leaf record as they are found. You will note our lines of Hatten and Schlewitz are still missing, many hours of research have been spent on these two lines with no records at this date, it will come, am sure it is there!! This booklet is the result of ten years of continuous research, the records are accurate, some are by word of mouth when all else failed. This is the part that has been most interesting, meeting people who have family stories and records passed down through their families. Many of the records I will not be able to copy as they are not really relevant but are still interesting and will be happy to show them to anyone interested. Most of those included are milestones in the lives of the people involved. I have tried to keep the records to those of our lines unless a line is there for me to collect along with our lines without a lot of additional research and are still connected with our lines in some way.

So many times I think of Grandma Arlena Mae Hatten Weber as I research her family and wish I could talk to her, is amazing how accurate dates and places she told of in her late years were. Most she only knew from knowledge passed down from her mother. One thing she would have been proud to have known was the fact she was born Dec. 21, 1869 and not 1871 as she thought. It made her just three months short of 100 years of age when she died. She was always proud to be a year older. I have found her family the most interesting of all the lines and to think we never knew her family!!

Working with all the ancestors records one gets to feel they know them personally, have yet to find one we should not feel proud to have as ancestors, most have been hard working farmers in early times with a dream to come West for land. Life was hard, many dying young and losing children, when you see how young many died and sometimes several within a few days it makes one thankful for our times with better health and lives than our ancestors had. It took people with strength and character like our ancestors to be a part of making up our country.

FAMILY RECORD OF LEVI MOORE, SR. AND SUSANNAH CRIST

Sometime previous to the Revolution Levi Moore, Sr. and his family were among the first settlers to make their home in Bath and Pocahontas Counties, Virginia. Coming from Pennsylvania when their family was nearly grown. Levi Moore, Sr. was born in Wales. He located 575 Acres of land of a British survey on the headwaters of Knapps Creek. After the Revolution new requirements were made in order to obtain permanent possession. It was to pay a requisite fee, a warrant would be laid, and a patent granted by the federal government. The new papers were dated 1798, attested by Henry Grimes and Allen Poage, and signed by James Madison, Governor of Virginia.

Birth and Death Dates for Levi and Susannah are unknown at present as well as Burial place. Many of the Cemeteries are marked with river rocks and time has lost names of who the markers were for. It would be near Frost, Pocahontas County, West Virginia.






Off the main-traveled road in the valley of Thirteen Mill Hill between Given and Rock Castle still stands a log house. This house was built with logs taken from a fort used to house women and children from raids or reported skirmishes during the Civil War. An original port hole is in the side of the house. A spring above the house, well concealed by an over-jetting rock, and the water coming from an unknown source, supplied the families with very cold drinking water even during the hottest weather.


The present owner of the house is Mr. W. A. Boswell who reared 9 children and lived there as long as his health permitted. He was 91 years old July 10, 1975.



✓ **Death of Levi Moore.**

Last Sunday morning the people of this community learned with sincere regret of the death of Mr. Levi Moore, a pioneer of the city and county and a citizen of genuine worth. He had been in poor and failing health since early in May last but was not confined to his bed until about a month before his death. The funeral services were held from the family home Monday morning, conducted by Rev. Edson, pastor of the Baptist church, assisted by Rev. Yeiser. A large concourse of people assembled to pay the last tribute of respect to an honored citizen and followed the remains to their last resting place.

Levi Moore was born June 24, 1813, at Pocahontas, Tazewell county, Virginia, and his age at the time of his death was 85 years, 4 months and 11 days. In 1836 he moved to McHenry county, Illinois, where he was married July 10, 1842, to Prudence D. Ackerson. One daughter was born to them, who died in infancy. In 1851, with Mrs. Moore, he moved to Winneshiek county, Iowa, where they lived on a farm near Decorah until 1873 when Mr. Moore came to Red Cloud, arriving here June 1, Mrs. Moore following soon afterwards. Mr. Moore took an active part in developing the town and was always prominent in any movement for promoting its welfare, and was identified with other citizens in securing the building of the railroad into Webster county. Through his efforts the cemetery association was formed, and the present cemetery grounds secured and located. He followed farming as a vocation throughout his entire life though he has at different periods been interested in other business enterprises. In all the relations of life he was an upright and honorable man, dealing fairly with everyone and expecting the same treatment in return. Though he suffered some severe losses during the panic of 1893, as a monument to his business energy and foresight he died possessed of several fine farms, beside his home and other town property. As a friend and neighbor Uncle Levi Moore was held in high regard by the entire community and in his death all mourn the loss of a model citizen.

Over Eighty Nine Years Old.


