From the best obtainable information the data for this tree was collected in 1849 by President Polk, with the help of Bishop Leonidas Polk and Col. Winder. See "Polk Family and Kinsmen" page 191.

As Col. Winder was in Maryland, Bishop Polk in Louisiana, and the President in Washington, it is only natural that several errors crept in (as shown by later discovery of wills, deeds, and church records), and much North Carolina information was lacking.

Family tradition says the actual plate or stone from which the prints were made was engraved at Bolivar, Tennessee by a local jeweler, with the help of members of the family and was destroyed by vandals during the Civil War.

The copy of Tree being distributed by the Polk Genealogical Committee has been reproduced from a tracing of an original, revised to conform to later information as explained on pages 33 & 34 of "Polk Family and Kinsmen".

Available originals were so discolored by age that satisfactory reproductions were unobtainable.

Several Nashville members of the Polk family formed the Polk Genealogical Committee in 1952.

The ultimate ambition of the committee is to make available the history of the Polk family brought up-to-date, and to make provision for the continuation of this work in the future. In event this history does not materialize in printed form, data collected is to be deposited in the Tennessee State Library or other suitable place.

To this end, will you, as a Polk descendent, fill out the enclosed forms as completely as possible and return them to the Committee at the address given below. (if you have not already done so.)

Various genealogical books and articles had been written attempting to cover all or branches of the Polk family.

William H. Polk published "The Polk Family and Kinsmen" in 1912 (in many public libraries). This book gives more general data than any other that has come to the attention of the committee.

The late George W. Polk of San Antonio, for many years, collected data on the descendants of Brig. Gen. Thomas Polk and much of his information was included in "Polk Family and Kinsmen".

In 1923 Mrs. Frank M. Angellotti published a series of articles in the "New England Historical and Genealogical Register" entitled the "Polks of North Carolina and Tennessee". These Articles covered the descendants of William Polk II, grandson of Robert Pollock, the emigrant. See issues April 1923 through July 1924.

Mrs. Angellotti, a descendant of Capt. John Polk had available William H. Polk's book, assistance from the late George W. Polk, Mr. Wilmot P. Rogers and others.

Mrs. Angellotti thus had much data on three of the sons of William Polk II, and such data on Capt. Charles and William III as had been collected by William H. Polk and others. In so far as it goes, Mrs. Angellotti's article is excellent and, subject to correction, is the basis of the Committee's work.

The Committee has been in communication with Mr. Wilmot Polk Rogers, Mr. Leonidas Polk Denmark, Mrs. Bonnie Austin Petteway, Mrs. I. J. Pantell, Mrs. E. M. Price, Miss Clara Laney, Miss Gladys Hardeman, Mrs. F. J. McGuire and others who have done a great deal of work on various branches of the Polk genealogy.

Thus, we have at least made contact with interested descendants of all five of the known sons of William Polk II.

As the rules of the New England Register, etc., did not permit the use of some data on female descendants, we are fortunate in having access to a copy of Mr. Roger's manuscript (Descendants of Ezekial Polk) and hope to have access to the records of the late George W. Polk. We have practically no data on the descendants of William II's daughters, nor on the branches of the family other than descendants William Polk II (except as shown in "Polk Family and Kinsmen"), but hope to find other interested descendants so that eventually all branches of the Polks will be included.

We want "Information", not money.

The Committee has paid its own expenses so far and expects to continue to do so until such time as it can publish something for general distribution. Any profits from such publication are to go to St. John's Memorial Association or such other Polk cause as the Committee may select.

If you desire to contribute financially, send it to St. John's Memorial Association, % Wm. Dudley Gale, Third National Bank Bldg., Nashville, Tenn.

The printed cards addressed to Polk descendants have proved to be of help in securing names and addresses of living descendants. It is hoped that these will be repeatedly forwarded from known descendants to others unknown to us. If any are enclosed please mail them to some other Polk descendant.

During recent months we sent data sheets or cards to some one hundred descendants (many addresses 25 years old), and have received many answers and also many returns for lack of street address, or party unknown (dead or moved).

We now have the names and addresses of some five hundred living descendants and genealogical data on more than two-thirds of them.

There are several known living descendants who for one reason or another have not returned our forms. This makes our work harder and more expensive. Our original plan did not involve any research - just to bring Mrs. Angellotti's record down to date - but we have found to do this a tremendous amount of research is necessary, and the correspondence (while a pleasure) is time consuming. Hence this form of letter.

The Committee is grateful for the newspaper clippings, birth notices, bible records and other data sent us. Such information is very helpful.

We will be glad to answer Polk genealogical questions to the best of our ability. At present, there are available for distribution a few copies of the corrected reproduction of the Polk Family Tree, published originally in 1849. These will be furnished gratis upon request.

The success of the Committee's effort depends upon your interest in its achievement and upon the promptness and accuracy of your reply.

- p. 1 In the name of God Amen, I George Foote of the parish of Hamilton & County of Fauquier in the Colony of Virginia Gent. being sick and weak of body, but of sound and perfect Memory and Judgment bless'd be God for the same calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this life and it is appointed for all men once to die and being desirous that no difference may arise after my decease about what estate God hath bestowed on me do make Constitute & appoint this my last will or wills Testament or Testaments by me herefore made and declaring pronouncing & ratifying approving and Confirming this to be my last will and Testament in manner following Viz.^t In Primus; I give and bequeath my precious and imortal soul to almighty God my bountiful Creator in hopes of a full and free pardon and remissions of all my sins and transgressions in and through the Merits and Mediation of Jesus Christ my blessed saviour & redeemer my body I comit to the earth, to be Buried in such a decent and Christian manner as to my Executrix shall seem fit and convenient in Expectation
- p. 2 Of a resurrection to eternal life; and as to what estate God of his infinite goodness hath mercifully bestowed on me after my just debts are paid my will and meaning is that it be disposed of in manner following Viz.^t

I give and bequeath to my dear and loving wife Mary Foote for and during her natural life the plantation whereon I now live, according to John Mauzy's last survey containing two hundred and ninety five acres of land, and after her decease to my son William Foote and to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten and for default of such heirs to my son Richard Foote and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten, and for default of such heirs to my son Gilson Foote and the heirs of his Body lawfully Begotten--
- Item. I give and bequeath to my son Henry Foote, one hundred acres of land adjoining to the land I formerly gave him--
- Item. I give and bequeath to my son George Foote three hundred and sixty five acres of land whereon he now dwells, according to John Mauzy's last survey, and to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever--

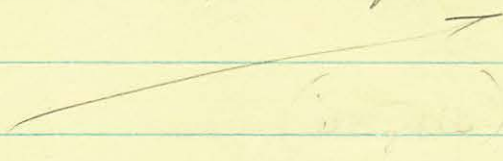



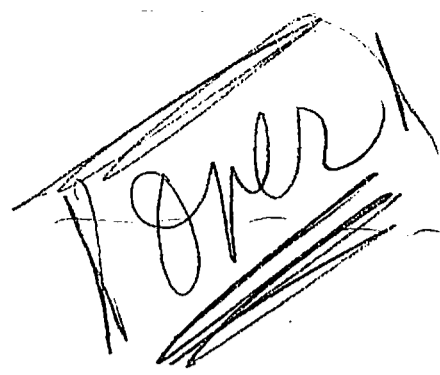

Good morning --

My name is Shauna Woodall and I read a post on Genforum where you stated that you've spent over twenty years trying to unravel the Robertsons of Warren, NC. I've only been at it six years now, but I see how you could spend a lifetime trying to figure them out. You've got the Christopher Robertsons and the Isham Robertsons and the Burwell Robertsons and the Israel Robertsons and all the Henrys and Higdon...it's exhausting.

I've been searching for a William Robertson, b. 1745-1755-ish. He's all over the rolls as a witness to people's estates, but I have yet to find any personal info about him. There are later books where one of his sons, Littleberry, names his brothers and sisters in a matter concerning the disbursement of William's property. His children were Littleberry, Littleton, Medicus (also spelled Modicus and called "Doctor"), Marcus, Thomas, Hudson, Mary, Willis, Henry ("an executor of Higdon Robertson's will") and my ancestor, Marmaduke, b. 1786. Unfortunately, there was no birth or death date given for William and no mention of his wife or wives.

There are people in Northampton County NC with some of these names, as well as people in Brunswick County VA and of course Granville County.

I'd give anything to find a clue to William's wife and parents. Is there a direction you can point me?

Statement of Agnes Branch Fenimore: May, 1968. (Said Agnes Branch Fenimore is granddaughter of Thomas B. and Emily Robertson below.)

Children of Thomas B. Robertson and his wife Emily stated that Emily was an orphan and lived with an aunt and uncle. Then they died, and she was married. [Note: It is possible that this statement is not entirely accurate.]
That it may refer to mother of Emily rather than Emily

Thomas B. was ten years older than his wife.

Thomas B.'s mother died when he was very, very young. Then his father remarried and Thomas B. had a half-sister; and step-mother died soon thereafter. When half-sister was about three and Thomas B. about twelve years old, the father died and Thomas B. lived on in the family home and kept the property from the time he was twelve years old until he was seventy-seven. The three-year old child stayed with him for a while, but she died.

Thomas B. inherited the small family plantation and lived there until he died. Then his wife Emily, who survived him, lived with "Aunt Tiney" and "Uncle Tom," daughter and son of Thomas B. and Emily. The family property in Warren County, North Carolina, was not sold until about 1908. Another daughter Sue Thomas Robertson bought a lot on Ninth Avenue, Huntington, West Virginia with her share.

From letter of July 1968 of Agnes Branch Fenimore:

"Mother did have a brother William (Big Billy) and it was his son who was playing in the yard with Mother when the fathers returned from the [Civil] War."

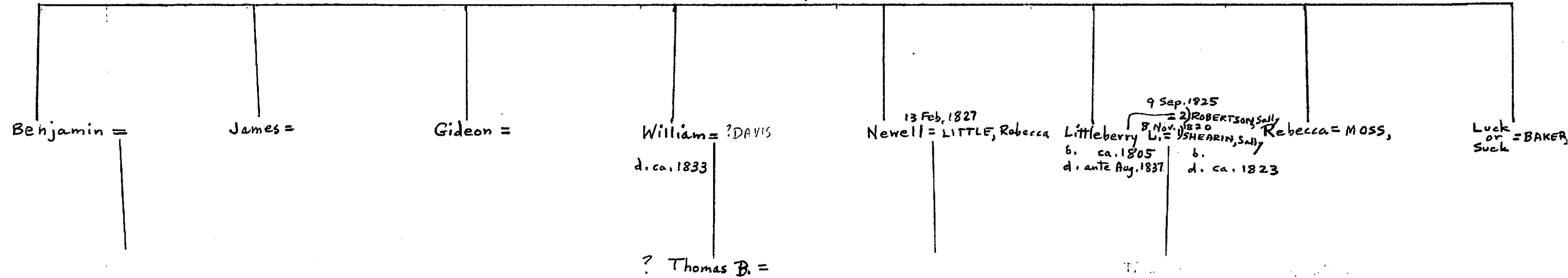

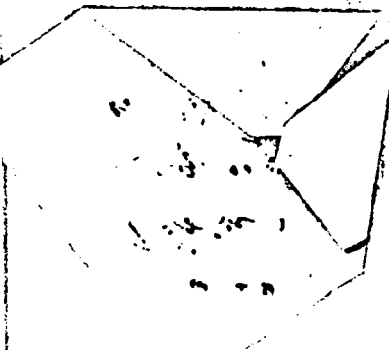

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Frederick Scherrer of North Carolina.

The record of Frederick Shearin which follows was obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, S. 7495, based upon his service in the War of the Revolution. This is the record of the only soldier of that name found in the Revolutionary War records of this office. The surname was searched under various spellings.

Frederick Shearin was born in July, 1761 in Bute County, which was later Warren County, North Carolina; the names of his parents are not given.

He enlisted in Bute County, early in 1780, served four months in Captain Edward Clouter's company, Colonel Seawell's North Carolina regiment. He enlisted early in 1781, served three months in Captain Jordan Harris' company, Colonel H. Haines' North Carolina regiment, was in the battle of Guilford Court House, where he was severely wounded.

He was allowed pension on his application executed August 29, 1832, then a resident of Warren County, North Carolina.

There are no data in this claim concerning the family of Frederick Shearin.

Revolutionary Services of John Clack of Brunswick Co. Va

on Petition showing patriotic service Vol. 1B, p 533. No. 718. May 17 1782. (State Archives, Richmond, Va.) called Brunswick Petition of Remonstrance. Referred to the Committee of the whole House on the State of the Commonwealth.

Among other men who signed the Petition was John Clack, the signers stating they desired no reward for their labours in the cause of Liberty except the secure enjoyment of it.

The Petition reads: ... "It is on this principle, Gentlemen, that we now use the liberty of addressing you on the subject of those Acts of former Assemblies..... & which We are compelled to consider as subversive of the Constitution..... of rights & privileges of the good Citizens of this Commonwealth, who through every danger, difficulty & hardship have hazarded their all... for the preservation of Liberty, the Security of Life & property...

We desire no reward for our labours in the Cause of Liberty, but the secure enjoyment of it..... that immediate provision may be made for discharging all debts due for Government to proprietors of Certificates & others for public services done..... & we shall ever pray & c.....

.....

There is on record War Dept. Adjutant General's Office the rev. service of one John Clack. Looking over the Census I find that the only John Clack given as a tax payer & land owner is John Clack listed from Brunswick Co. Va. the following is the record: "The records further show that one John Clack served in said War as a soldier of Va. Infantry designation of organization not shown. In accordance with an Act of the Va. Assembly passed Nov. Session 1781, on April 4th 1782. he received the sum of 36lbs as the balance of his full pay. No further record of his service has been found."
