Dear Mrs. Duke:

The MITCHELL ~~will~~ (that of THOMAS MITCHELL) was awaiting me on my return home last night (had been away most of the day.) as you know, I was afraid something had happened to my letter to you, as one of mine had gone astray recently.

I honestly believe that this THOMAS is my ancestor, but I now have to be certain of the PLEASANT MITCHELL, his son. As you know, I merely picked him out because of the name PLEASANT, as my Elizabeth M. Mitchell had a brother, PLEASANT MITCHELL and a son, PLEASANT E.C. HENRY (who d.y.) and a son, GARNEY PLEASANT HENRY (who was killed in Civil War at age 18).

It now appears that the children of Thomas Mitchell who wrote his will in 1779 (when was it proved?) were named in order of their birth, namely: MARY, WILLIAM, NACHEL, ROBERT, SARAH, ELIZABETH, RICHARD & PLEASANT MITCHELL - hence Pleasant was probably youngest child. At least some - and probably all of the children were "under 21" at time the will was made - 1779 - so when PLEASANT m. REBECCA COLEMAN in 1791, doubtless he was barely 21 at the time, so born ca. 1770. Also, it will be noticed that on the 1792 census of Amelia Co. only E. Johns and James G. Mitchell are named - no Wm., Robt., Richard or Pleasant. (I believe there was also a Thomas - but there is no Thomas Jr. in the will.).

I do hope that ANN, wife of THOMAS MITCHELL, doesn't turn out to be a JONES. (It almost looks as if she might be, because of the Richard Jones Jr. (both exor. and witness; and Thomas Jones, wit.) I read the names John Houston and John Coock as other exors. Is this correct? and BOWLER HALL and Peter (or Petro) Robertson as other witnesses. (In this connection, didn't James C. Mitchell of Amelia m. a Robertson? Were Thomas and James Coock Mitchell related in some way?

You mention in your letter that you have just finished looking up the Mitchells of New Kent, Brunswick, Amelia & Bedford Cos. Va. I presume that Thomas Mitchell is of these Mitchells, since Amelia was taken from Brunswick, I believe, in 1734 - and from Fr. Geo.

For some years I have been trying to get the Mitchells out of Tenn. All I had to go on was that they were born "in Virginia" - (which has a number of counties to choose from). It is interesting to note that the Mitchells of Robertson Co. Tenn. (which adjoins Sumner) were descendants of JAMES MITCHELL, Rev. Sold. from Bedford Co. Va. - m. a Mrs. Rogers, formerly Caldwell - his James was born in Amelia Co. and moved to middle Ky. - later some of his children to Robertson Co. Tenn. One of these was Robt. Brumbaugh Mitchell; another was Daniel and another was John. I eliminated all of them as parents of Elizabeth except John, whose children I wasn't sure of. I have some data on these Mitchells, if you should even want it.

To get back to PLEASANT MITCHELL, p- and my Elizabeth (Betty): I find that the marriage bonds of Davidson Co. Tenn. (also adjoins Sumner - where Nashville is) p. 452 - shows that PLEASANT H. MITCHELL married Ann Ridley, April 5, 1834. (This could be a second marriage of Pleasant (bro. of Eliz.) who in 1827 m. Elizabeth HUNT (dau. of HARRY HUNT (whose will, 1829, shows wife Sally, dau. ELIZABETH MITCHELL and others. JOHN MITCHELL, brother of Pleasant, m. SUSAN HUNT, but perhaps her cousin and not sister.

Of course I want to "go on from here" and if you have already followed 4 this line and know where it leads, let me know what you will charge to copy this ita you have.

We have some microfilms from Amelia Co. in our library here, and I note that in Will Book 3 - 1779-1786 - Will of THOMAS MITCHELL - p. 70 (1779)

Wills before 1800 show 4 separate wills of a THOMAS MITCHELL; in 1779, 1782, 1783, 1784 - all in Amelia Co. (Were these different Thomas Mitchells? The Inventory and settlement of estate of the first Thomas show show and should give additional data. Perhaps he did have a son Thomas, who does not show in his will.)

I am glad that Thomas had no son JOHN MITCHELL. There were about 3 John Mitchells in Sumner Co. Tenn. but they were all there before our Mitchells left Va. (with the exception of John, brother of Elizabeth, of course; he lived for a time in Ky. but also had land in Tenn.)

In Brunswick Co. - I also find there were three THOMAS MITCHELLS who left wills - 1747, 1768 and 1774. Some Henry s were in Dinwiddie & Pitts. Cos. One ANN MITCHELL left a will in Richmond Co. 1793. Could she have been widow of Thomas? (But his widow doubtless re-married, since he died rather young).

Perhaps you can suggest how I can connect all this up - will give you a few Tenn. records which might point the way:

I wrote for Tenn. Land Grants to Mitchells. There were none to a PLEASANT, HENRY MITCHELL. - but several John Mitchells and one ROBERT MITCHELL (The latter was Grant No. 417 - Warrant 734 - number of acres not given - June 27, 1793 - Sumner Co. on Cedar Lick Creek - Book G-7 - pg. 281 - N.C. Archives. (This seems too early as these Mitchells were b. in Va. later than this, but an uncle could have come earlier).

I told you of the following: REBECCA MITCHELL m. James Henry, Oct. 1818 Lebanon, Wilson Co. Tenn (near Sumner) - James Mitchell & James Henry bondsmen

One Thomas Mitchell m. Fisa West, 1817, Madison Co., Ky - John Henry bondsman.
" Elizabeth Mitchell (dau. of Wm. Mitchell) m. Henry Shelton, Aug. Co. Va. 1817 - James Henry, bondsman.

On Archibald Mitchell received a land grant of 250 acres S. of Green River in Warren Co. Ky. (Warren Co. just north of Sumner Co. Tenn.) Archibald from Fincastle, Va.

From another source, I have this: The first Mitchell land owners in Sumner Co. were: Elijah - 1797; Jeremiah, 1805; John, 1802; Martha, 1826; RICHARD, 1795; ROBERT, 1818; ROBERT B. 1808. (Robt. B. was Robt. Brumbaugh Mitchell)
If you think any of these significant, I will order them in full.

I have no record of the marriage of PLEASANT MITCHELL to Elizabeth Hunt, but sure she was his wife. I have:

(Shemwell) Mitchell, his wife..... (several other similar deeds concerning Henry Mitchell

Do you happen to know to which HALL family the Bowler Hall of the Thos. Mitchell will belongs? It may have been a HALL, instead of a HENRY connection before the marriage of Eliz. to John Hall Henry (who was grandson of MARGARET HALL (dau. Wm.) and DAVID HENRY (Capt. Am. Rev.). Note that Moses Hall Henry signed the m. bonds of these Mitchells. None of them were signed by Mitchell, which would signify that their father was perhaps not living.

One ROBERT MITCHELL m. Nancy Latimer in 1809; I do not know who he was.

One WILLIAM MITCHELL deeded to Benj. Honey, 2 Feb. 1803 - both of Sumner Co. Lot in Gallatin No. 11 - Bk 3 - p. 438.

Mary Coleman m. Mos. Tucker 23 Jan. 1793 - Amelia Co. - Ewan Mitchell, b. (Was this Ewan related to Pleasant?)

Brunswick Co. Va. p. 186 - Will of John Willey of Brunswick Co. carpenter -14 Sept. 1734 - beloved wife Sarah.....etc.. wits. JOHN MITCHELL.

Will of William Mitchell 1814-1819 - pg. 209 - wife Elizabeth; child named Will dated Nov. 12, 1816. Tenn. (Washington or Wilson Co.)

Have you any data on the MITCHELLS of Botetourt Co. Va.? Want ancestry of JEAN MITCHELL, wife of WILLIAM HALL, who died Botetourt Co., Va. 1771. (this may be the connection to my Halls & Henrys in N.C. & Tenn.) Also the DOAK family (Cecil Co. Md. to Penna. to W. Va. to N.C.) m. into this Mitchell family; also into the Hall family.

Will of THOMAS MITCHELL: In the name of God Amen, I, THOMAS OF THE Parish of Notoway and county of Amelia, being weak in body but of a sound mind do make and ordain this my last will and Testament as followeth: Imprimis:

I give and bequeath to my daughter ELENNER (?) the tract of land from Bland's Creek to a branch called by the name of the Tanfat (or Lanfat) Branch and then up that Branch to the Road to her and her Heirs for ever and my bed and green rug bedstead bolster hide (or hike) apd, one English Shirt one three quart dish, three puter plait, one spittle ^{Basin} one big pot and hooks, two gugs one Search ME (??) one Cow and one You at my decease as also to her spin mortar and pilsel (?) and one Spinning Wheal....My desire is that the remainder of my Estate shall be equally divided between my wife and two daughters, AMY and PATTEY-----the other part of my land lying the North side of the Tanfal Branch a joining Con(?) Clark I give and bequeath to my son HENRY and his Heirs for Ever.-----

I do appoint Thom. Moon (or Moore) and Cno (Jno?) Clark exors of this my last will, Hereby revoking all others. In writings whereof I have hear unto set my hand and fixed my seal this 6th day of May, 1780.

THOMAS GOODWYN of Surry Co., Va. Mariner, was residing there prior to Aug. 1717 in the Parish of Southwark. Of his ancestry, there is no positive knowledge, though it seems probable he was of the family of Cambridge in England, a member of which family, THOMAS by name, is said to have emigrated to Virginia. On Aug. 8, 1717 Thomas Goodwyn executed a power of attorney to Henry Harrison, Gentleman, of Surry Co. In 1720 he made a deed to John Smith Jun. who had married his daughter, AMY GOODWYN. These two documents are just about all that remains of the records of his activities, excepting his will, dated 7 Feb. 1730 and proved Oct. 20, 1731 at Surry Co. Court...though much torn, it shows his wife's name was MARY --? and he had at least 3 sons - JOHN, FRANCIS and WILLIAM and a daughter, PENELOPE, who married a Taylor. He also mentions a grand-son THOMAS GOODWYN, though whether son of John, Francis or Wm., or another son, not known. Name of his daughter AMY SCOTT is also not mentioned - or obliterated - yet from the deed to John Scott Jun. he knew of her - (see Wm. & M. Quar. Vol. VIII No. 2 - Supplement pp 148-9 for his will.)

THOMAS GOODWYN of Surry Co., Gentleman, died in Parish of Southwark, in 1730 or 1731. By MARY, his wife, he left at least 5 children - perhaps others, whose names are lost to us through the obliteration by time of portions of his recorded will. His known issue were:

I. JOHN GOODWYN (or Goodwyne) of Surry Co.. Later, in the formation of Sussex, he resided within the new county, in parish of Albemarle, the Register of which parish now is in the Va. Hist. Soc. at Richmond, and furnishes us with the names of nearly all of John Goodwyn's children. He seems to have been a man of prominence in Sussex in his day and time and was living there as late as 1754. He married Winifred, daughter of ----TUCKER by whom he had:

While the birth of AMY GOODWYN is not recorded in the pages of Albemarle Parish Register, it was found recorded in the family Bible of THOMAS MITCHELL the YOUNGER, her son, (who married ANN RAINES, daughter of Capt. Nathaniel Raines of Prince George County) who removed to Georgia and she died in Thomas County 27 July, 1826. The writer is descended from AMY GOODWYN through both of her marriages.

Mitchell b. before 1805, son of THOMAS MITCHELL and Nancy Moran (there was an older child or two; a sister Nancy, m. David Ward a sister Agnes Chelly Mitchell (hers) m. Wm. Alexander Miller. Thomas Mitchell was described as a "Capt." with birth in 1760 (she says it seems a bit late for a Capt. in Rev. could be in War of 1812) He d. 9-18-1839; Nancy Moran Mitchell in 1820; Nancy Mitchell Ward was m. 1808 d. 1824. This family moved to Tenn. from Va. She wants all possible information on them. Says parents of THOMAS were STEPHEN MITCHELL and MARY BRIDGEWATER; that Nancy's mother was Nancy Coffee niece of "the noted Col. Coffee." She has located none of them.

Dear Margaret:

Perhaps you are not so very interested in the family history, but want you to know that I am slowly but surely making progress on our MITCHELL family, which I had about given up as a "lost cause."

To begin with we only knew that our gr-grandmother, ELIZABETH M. (Betsy) MITCHELL was born in Va. in 1801 and that she married Rev. John Hall Henry (Methodist Preacher) in 1828 in Sumner Co. Tenn.

She died Dec. 14, 1875 and I have a copy of her obituary from a newspaper clipping from the Hartsville, Tenn. paper, which was in Cousin Betty Nimm's scrap-book. This quoted her as being a "lifelong Methodist".

We knew of her sister, Polly (Mary) Mitchell who was born in 1806 and who married, first a Mr. Austin, 2nd, Jesse Meador and who, according to Cousin Emma, lived in a house, part of which was in one county, part in another. Cousin Emma also insisted to me that she had a brother, HARRY MITCHELL who lived in Allensville, Ky. at whose home she had visited when a child, remembering that he had a record of both Mitchell and Henry families.

After further research I have located the following who appear to have been brothers and sisters of Elizabeth:

1. NANCY MITCHELL m. Miles Stewart 9-18-1821 - William H. Henry, bondsman.

6. HENRY MITCHELL (b. 1818 in Tenn. - m. Harriet Shenwell.
7. SARAH A. MITCHELL m. Joseph T. Tooley (who was made guardian of the minor heirs of Pleasant Mitchell).

(Sarah A., Henry and John moved to Todd Co. Ky where Wm. G. Henry (wife Emily Stovall) and Elizabeth Henry (wife of James Rickman) - brother & sister of John Hall Henry - also lived.)

I am not entirely certain that my list of the children of Rev. John Hall Henry and his wife ELIZABETH M. MITCHELL is correct, but I have it as follows:

If you can add anything to the above list or give me names of any of the children of the above-mentioned sisters and brothers and sisters, I will very gladly appreciate it. At least perhaps you can give me your own family record from your grandmother down.

I know that your father was Mr. Carney Hickman. Did he have a "Pleasant" in his name? If not, what was his other name. (Cousin Cass used to speak of him and my father as young boys playing together - apparently about the same age).

I have wondered what the "K" in Wiley K. Henry was for and where he got the name "Wiley" which came down to my father.

Polly Meador, who lived in Transford, Tenn. had a son Henry who came to Texas and had several sons and a daughter Alice who married a Hicks. I have census records on Henry & Harriet, who had William C., Nancy J., Fannie Thomas, Augustus and Malvina (Polly). (Polly and our Eliz. also had daus. named Malvina, if you will notice -)

I have no list of the children of the others, but will try to get them from census records as far as possible.

Apparently the father of these Mitchells was not living - or at least not in Tazewell Co. in 1820 to 1833 (when his children married, also would have signed their marriage records).

There was absolutely nothing to indicate from which Va. county these Mitchells had come; only that they came to Tenn. between the years 1806 and 1818. So, when I came across the marriage record of one PLEASANT MITCHELL 1791 in Amelia County, Va. to REBECCA COLEMAN, daughter of DANIEL COLEMAN of Amelia Co. the name rang a bell, and I was certain that at least this Pleasant Mitchell, if not father of Elizabeth, was at least a member of the same Mitchell family.

I have a maternal Coleman line, so was familiar with the family of this Daniel Coleman Jr. - can trace it "way back" if it turns out to be ours. In an old letter from our cousin Carolyn (wonder what has become of her?) she says that that a daughter of Dr. Elihu Henry had told her we were related in some way to the PLEASANT family - that a Judge of our line was JUDGE PLEASANT HENRY and there was a CARNEY PLEASANT HENRY.

Quite a number of years ago I wrote to Mr. Noel Henry, who was then living in the old Henry home (built originally in 1800 - on "Goose Creek". He wrote very briefly and told me he thought they were children of a THOMAS MITCHELL. (It appears he was right - though Thomas was grandfather - not father, it would seem.

I had a Mrs. Luke search the Amelia records and she sent me a photostat copy of the will of a THOMAS MITCHELL, wife ANN, who names PLEASANT MITCHELL among his children - apparently the youngest, since named last - all of them under 21 in 1779, when the will was made. (I am inclosing a copy of the will.) It is possible, of course, that our group of Mitchells were children of one of the brothers of Pleasant - WILLIAM, RICHARD or ROBERT.

I found Pleasant Mitchell listed on only one Amelia Co. deed, as follows: 3- 1797 - EVAN MITCHELL et al and PLEASANT A. MITCHELL - to John Appes.

On the same day another deed, as follows: GIBSON & ANN MITCHELL, et al and JOHN & THOMAS A. MITCHELL to John Appes.

(I am writing for copy of this deed - both of them. There is no Evan, Gibson, John or Thomas A. listed among children of Thomas Mitchell. Would this be another Pleasant? EVAN MITCHELL was bondsmen to marriage of Mrs. Coleman -

Thomas Tucker in 1793.

Trouble is - Pleasant Mitchell married Rebecca in 1791 and this was 10 years before Eliz. was born - 15 yrs. before Polly was born and 27 years before Henry was born! I do not think he was more than 21 in 1791, but if Henry born 1818 was his son he would have been 48 when Henry was born. There is always the possibility that they were children of a second wife.

(I presume this was Pleasant Mitchell, brother of Henry & Elizabeth)

Marriage bonds, Davidson Co. Tenn. 1787-1837 - p. 452 - show that PLEASANT H. (A?) MITCHELL married ANN RIDLEY April 5, 1834. (Was this also Pleasant Mitchell Sr.? or Jr.? (if either, it was a second marriage).

Book 20-page 342 - dated 12 Oct. 1846 - JOHN MITCHELL & SUSANNAH his wife of Todd county, Ky. to JOSEPH T. TOOLEY, Guardian of the minor heirs of PLEASANT MITCHELL.

(this is John, brother of Eliz. & Susannah Hunt - Joseph Tooley is husband of Sarah Mitchell. Was he guardian of the children of Pleasant Jr.? Or, of the "minor heirs" of the first Pleasant? (These guardianships often lasted over many years). However, more likely to be Pleasant Jr.

Mrs. Potter Womack of Gallatin, who has been helping me with the Mitchells, and whose family also lived on "Goose Creek" for generations, tells me that there were 3 groups of Mitchells in Sumner County. Those on the Sumner-Robertson border (from Bedford Co. Va. via Ky); those on Station Camp Creek near village of Cottontown, about 8 miles west of Gallatin and the 3rd group (ours) lived on or near GOOSE CREEK. She says: "PLEASANT'S land on ridge between head waters of Bledsoe Creek & Trammel Creek would be just east of Westmoreland, which is on the highway 31 E north of Gallatin. This is very near the head waters of Goose Creek - she thinks one branch of Bledsoe's Cr. and one branch of Goose Cr. head in what is now Macon Co. - just a hill or two between. She thinks this Pleasant was brother of our Elizabeth.

I find where one REBECCA MITCHELL married JAMES HENRY Oct. 13, 1818 in Lebanon Co. Tenn. James Henry & James Mitchell, bondsmen. This could have been a second marriage of Rebecca, widow of Pleasant Mitchell, who could have died soon after - or even before - the birth of his son HENRY in 1818. Or, Rebecca could have been a daughter of Pleasant & Rebecca.

Will of Hardy Hunt is in Sumner Co. He names wife Sally; Hardy H. Seawell; Martha Jane & Walter Allen; ; Benj. Pate Seawell; Sally Rowlings; daughter ELIZABETH MITCHELL; dau. Lucretia Stroud; dau. Penelope Grimsley; dau. Lavrina White; Pelding Grimsley; Patsy Linkey of N.C.; son Zion Hunt & Thomas Hunt, exors. N.C." - and here is another Mitchell family "puzzle: You will note will of ANDERSON MITCHELL in Amelia Co. 1772 - Robert Fleming & Wm. Fleming witnesses. Now, in Sumner Co. ROBERT FLEMING married NANCY MITCHELL June 6, 1806 - John Mitchell bondsman. I have the 1850 census records on Polly (Mitchell) Meador and her family. Living in her home with her husband and children in that year were also BEVERLY M. FLEMING - age 34 and MARY FLEMING - age 26. Wonder who they were.

Rejected Pension Claim: THOMAS MITCHELL formerly of Charlotte Co. enlisted in Hezekiah Norton's Co. Pr. Edw. for 3 yrs. in Rev. Service. Served his time out excepting short time before he was discharged, being badly wounded in Battle of Guilford, N.C. when he was discharged as being incapable from wounds, of further service. In his life he rec'd 100 a. land only.
CLAIBORN MITCHELL, SARAH HOWARD (w. Benj. Howard) & SAMUEL MITCHELL are only ch. & heirs except PALSY LUCAS (wf. Gideon Lucas) and his wife, NANCY MITCHELL & Feb. 1834 (by Wm. Almond).

Mrs. Richard T. Daughtie, Jr., 24 South Rose Road, Memphis 17, Tenn. has the following MITCHELL line:

WILLIAM M. MITCHELL b. 1770, Asheville, N.C. (one reference says Franklin Co. N.C.) another says England. all could be wrong as with articles on Co. Hist. where Wm. was listed as ancestor). He m. Mar. 3, 1790, ELIZABETH N. HUNT, b. Dec. 18, 1771, Whitehall, Lincolnshire Co. Eng. She was dau. of LORD FRANCIS TRAVIS HUNT and his wife LADY THERESA HUNT. (One of the articles referred to above states that Lord Hunt was knighted and was famous for his leadership in the Hunt Rebellion. She has not been successful in proving this or even finding mention of a Hunt Rebellion in English Hist.

WILLIAM MITCHELL d. 1816 in Wilson Co. Tenn. His will was exhibited in Ct. Sept. 19th, 1816 in which he mentions his wife ELIZABETH and ZADOCK and SION MITCHELL (his sons). The will was pvd. by 2 witnesses Ardy Merrit and Born Webb. On Mar. 17th, 1817, the account of the sale of the property of WILLIAM MITCHELL was exhibited and recorded.

ELIZABETH MITCHELL moved to Ill. and d. there but she does not have date. The following account was sent to her by Daisy Roberts Malone of Col., who wrote a book "Our Families" in which she included MITCHELLS, COOKS, ROBERTS, etc.

"At the time of William Mitchell's death (1829 in Tenn.) their sons Zadock & Sion Hunt were already away from home having gone to Ill. about the time it became a state (1818). The Mother and youngest son, William Nazareth then made their hom with her brother, Dr. Hunt of Lebanon, Tenn." She has tried in vain to find a Dr. Hunt of Lebanon, Wilson Co. Tenn. at this time.

We see that a Stephen is here mentioned as under 21 and son of William As another Stephen was in the Rev. the name was continued in the family. Apparently Thomas, who was the guardian was a brother of William who had the children as named. This Thos. & Wm. may have been sons of an earlier Stephen.

The only Stephen shown was in the Guardian's Bonds - evidently a younger Stephen. Further examination of individual will might show something on an earlier Stephen.

In an effort to place the Thomases we note a number of deeds both "to" and "from" 1772 to 1806.. In an effort to place the THOMAS, b. in Richmond supposedly the son of Stephen we note that we have given the 1782 Tax List of Richmond in the 1st report as th Mitchell. Richmond deeds not yet examined..

Amherst County seems to be the head quarters of the desired family. This county was formed in 1761 from Albemarle Co. therefore the part of the family which was in that part of Albemarle previous to that date, which became Amherst, will be found under Amherst records. It appears that the Albemarle family became mainly Amherst on records.

Original records are the most important in tracing family history, but searching such records is slow work and takes much time to be thorough. The first STEPHEN might have been in Albemarle and a WILLIAM MITCHELL was certainly in Albemarle in 1772. However, Stephen was in Amherst during the Rev. period, as shown in our 1st report.

Introduction:

The Mitchell Family is among the 49 "best families" selected by the American Historical Genealogical Society for whom the Society has published family histories during the past two years.

The Mitchell Family has been prominent in the British Empire and in the U.S., its members having played important roles in war and in peace. Family pride is a commendable trait and should be cultivated. All Mitchells have just cause to be proud of their family history and traditions.

There are 24 British crests for the name Mitchell and 60 works contain Mitchell genealogy. There were 54 Mitchell families in Conn. in 1790 and some 20 persons of the name had served in the U.S. Congress before 1916.

The Mitchell Coat-of-arms (shown in the front of the volume) is the Arms of the Mitchells of Scotland. Several other great Mitchell families use Coats of Arms very similar to it. This is the most widely used of all Mitchell Coats of-Arms- description:

Arms: Pale a fesse between three roses or within a bordure chequy of the last and first. (On a black shield a golden band between three diamond-shaped figures, also of gold. The shield within a chequered border of black and gold.)

Crest: A stalk of wheat with three ears

Motto: Sapiens qui assiduus (Latin) (He is wise who is assiduous.).

Apr. 25, 1952: "I am convinced the Mitchells came from Nash Co. N.C. The Bass family came from that county. Jordan Bass was in Census of 1800 for Nash Co. and a tax payer along with EDMUND MITCHELL from Logan Co. 1805-14 and then both turn up in Christian Co. after 1815. One CORNELIUS MITCHELL was in Census of 1810 for Nash Co. and he later turns up as a tax payer in Logan Co. and later I found him owning land on same creek in Christian Co. where Jordan Bass & EDMUND MITCHELL owned land. No EDMUND MITCHELL is found on any record in Nash Co. He could have lived in an adjoining county, especially since Jordan Bass is known to have owned land in some of the adjoining counties....."

July 27, 1955: "You wrote: 'You mention that there were other Mitchell deeds in this region (?) Do you happen to remember whether JOHN MITCHELL was mentioned again in any of them - or whether there is a mention of SOLOMON, WYLEY, WILLIS or ARCHIBALD MITCHELL.'" I recall telling you that after leaving Elkton I drove on to Russellville and there found other MITCHELL deeds which called for land on Whipperwill or Big Whipperwill Creek; I did not take any notes on these deeds. Are these the deeds you have in mind? I obtained a list of all Mitchell deeds in Russellville. None of the names you mentioned were listed; neither was EDMUND MITCHELL who was a tax payer in that county for 10 years. At Elkton I took notes on all the Mitchell deeds I found of the names you gave me for the period specified. Before & after these dates your names were not listed. There were later deed books I did not have time to examine; that there were Mitchells mentioned would be almost a certainty....By all means have all census records from 1840 to the date your people left. That is about all you can hope to do in Todd County unless you find someone to make an exhaustive search. So you will have to return to Tenn.

I do not know too much about EDMUND MITCHELL. He is said to have served from N.C. in the Rev. EDMUND & CORNELIUS MITCHELL & Jordan Bass appear on tax lists of Logan Co. from 1806 to 1814; and EDMUND MITCHELL and Jordan Bass on tax lists of Christian Co. from 1815-1830, along with BLAKE MITCHELL in later years. EDMUND MITCHELL in later years listed 129 acres on Little River.

In 1834 EDMUND MITCHELL and COURTNEY his wife and John Harkins and Unice his wife sold 129 a. on Little River to Abner Bennett for \$200. An unrecorded deed from EDMUND MITCHELL to John Harkins was mentioned. In description of land Pyle's corner was mentioned. BLAKE MITCHELL was one of the witnesses. EDMUND MITCHELL bought these 129 a. from Bartholomew T. Wood in 1825 for \$100 in which deed Pyle's corner was also mentioned. ...There is a deed of Samuel Pyle of "Illenoy's territory" to Joseph MITCHEM (MITCHELL?) of Christian Co. Ky. for \$400 - 200 a. on Little River. That the above EDMUND MITCHELL was my man is indicated by the fact that the deed was witnessed by BLAKE MITCHELL and on tax lists they are recorded together. Apparently Unice Harkey was his dau., for BLAKE MITCHELL had a dau. Unice who m. a Yarkey and who, at one time, lived with John Harkins. It seems that EDMUND MITCHELL had deeded John Harkins part or all of his land.".....

We have gone to the State Library in Nashville, Tenn. once or twice a month in the 1½ years we have been in Alabama. We have made a visit to N.C. to 6 different counties searching for records. I will complete the different MITCHELL notes I have accumulated and send them to you."

13 Feb. 1966:

"I finally got through my MITCHELL folder and compiled the assorted information I have been collecting. I am sending you a copy as I promised. Some of these may be of my line but I haven't been able to fill in the missing links in order to prove them."

27 Feb. 1966:

"...I have found the information in the Tenn. State Library at Nashville, the Rowan Public Library at Salisbury, N.C. and in several of the central N.C. Co. Courthouses. So many of them had their records burned during the Civil War which makes it even harder to find data...."

This chain was divided among the officers for a souvenir, and his three links brought to America by DAVID & ANDREW, his sons. On one Census record CLEM M. MITCHELL, my Gt-grandfather, said that he was born in Virginia, but on the other census he said Tennessee.

JAMES MITCHELL

"The maternal parents of JAMES MITCHELL were of Scotch-Irish descent. His father, ANDREW and wife, Mary McGowan, were married in Ireland, and emigrated from County Limerick and settled in the Scotch-Irish Colony in Western Pennsylvania in 1752.

With them came his brother DAVID and sister ISABELLA STEWART and her husband, who settled in said Colony. (In the old record the name seems to be Stuart).

In 1759 ANDREW and DAVID moved to North Carolina. Andrew settled in Orange County - on Eno Creek about 5 miles south of Hillsborough His brother on Hico Creek in Caswell County. about 18 miles North east of Hillsborough. Here they raised their families and died. They left two brothers, JOHN & WILLIAM and one sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Davis, in Ireland., who afterward came over and settled in Virginia.

ANDREW MITCHELL and wife MARY MCGOWAN raised three sons and seven daughters - JOHN, MARY, SUSAN, SUSAN, JENNIE, ANDREW, MARGARET, NANCY, HANNAH, ELIZABETH, and JAMES.

ANDREW MITCHELL'S sons, JOHN and ANDREW were born married and in the troops raised by the Governor of North Carolina to protect his citizens from the depredations of the Tories. The services of of these state troops were recognized by the Congress of the U.S.A. as regular, and survivors received pensions the same as the soldiers of the Regular Army.

M I T C H E L L (3)

For some reason it was very desirable that ANDREW should be with his family, to attest this, his brother JAMES now fifteen years old was mustered in as his substitute, and served two years or till the close of the war. ANDREW also in a short time returned to his place in the army - then JAMES re-enlisted on his own account.

JAMES MITCHELL sold his native home in Orange Co., N.C. in 1801 and located temporarily in Juncomb Co. N.C. until 1805 when he settled in the Western portion of Logan Co. Ky. near where Elkton is situated, now in Todd County. Here he was intimately associated with the Mc McClains and Ewings. In 1808 Eleanor Johnston Craig, his mother-in-law and her five sons settled on the Grant given Rev. Soldiers in N.C. (by the State) which was located on Bigaby Creek in Maury County, Tenn. about 2 miles west of where Mt. Pleasant is situated. In 1808 JAMES MITCHELL visited them and went back to Kentucky, sold his land and the same year located a 640 acre land warrant on the west boundary of the Craig grant where he opened a farm at what is known as "Boiling Springs", where he spent the balance of his life. The country was heavily timbered and entirely overgrown with very large cane; and the soil was very rich.

JAMES MITCHELL, four sons and a negro man opened a farm, which yielded to their support. The population increased rapidly, and in a short time schools and churches were organized. One mile south of where Mt. Pleasant is located, of which JAMES MITCHELL was a charter member and an elder - Salem Church, organized by the Presbyterians.-which office he filled until his death, Nov. 11, 1843.

JAMES MITCHELL and MARY CRAIG were married in Orange Co. N.C. Oct. 29, 1780. He is his 24th year and she in her 18th year of age.

From letters of Mrs. Robert Bowling, Marion, Alabama -
Nov. 3, 1961: "Your letter is of interest to me because you seem to be linked with a MITCHELL family in Amelia Co. Va. I haven't found any ancestors in that county. My earliest known was JAMES. He could be a brother to your PLEASANT, but not old enough to be more than a brother of cousin. I have been wondering if THOMAS MITCHELL was the father of James. I feel that JAMES had a brother WILLIAM MITCHELL. Who were the children of THOMAS MITCHELL of Amelia?"

There was a THOMAS MITCHELL who had a land grant in 1753 on both sides of Sandy River, 300 acres. I assume in Pittsylvania Co. Va. So far I know no more of this THOMAS MITCHELL. Do you have any information? Is he father of JAMES who was in Pittsylvania Co. in 1768? I have done some research on MITCHELLS in Va. but when I found the above THOMAS my time was up and I had to come home. My Mitchells were b. in 1700's and settled in Va. I am desc. of a MITCHELL daughter and was b. in Va. My MITCHELL surname was lost so long long ago. While in Va. after Dec. I found THOMAS had several surveys and so did JAMES.

I have lived in Ala. many years but do not know any MITCHELL data here. Marion is in Perry Co. I know nothing about these records.

A Porter Mattison is collecting Mitchell data. I have read there were 74 different MITCHELL lines in the Colonies in the 1790 census. My ancestor JAMES died in 1795. Va. census was destroyed..... He was one of the older children and not living with his father in 1850 census. The 1850 census of Sumner Co. Tenn may record him. I rather think he was born around 1815 or 1816 and that means he was too young to be Elizabeth's father, yet I decided to mention him since he did go to Sumner Co. Tenn. Was he following PLEASANT? If so then there may be a connection.

Let me know what you want. I am still on the alert for Mitchell data... "..... May 7, 1962:

"I do not think JAMES was from Amelia Co. Va. Another JAMES was, who was about the age of your PLEASANT. I think my JAMES was a generation older because he was in Pittsylvania Co. in 1767. I firmly believe there was a connection among Mitchells of that section of Va.

I have wondered who JAMES MITCHELL'S son named a son JOHN COLEMAN? You say PLEASANT of Amelia married REBECCA COLEMAN. Were the Mitchells and of any previous connection? I have also wondered if THOMAS MITCHELL of various land surveys and our THOMAS of other surveys were father and son - all in same section of Va. This means a lot of searching & thinking. My MITCHELL data not known is all prior to 1767 and in Va.

If you can prove your ancestor is the daughter of JAMES & LOUISA J. MITCHELL of Sumner Co. Tenn. then I can connect you with his parents in Va. I don't know when they went there to live....."

Letter from Mrs. Edith F. Mitchell 4535 N. Hamilton, ? 25, Ill June 19, 1951 writes that her husband, LELAND E. MITCHELL passed away Aug. 22, 1945, so she has no Mitchell data. He spent many hours looking up the Mitchells as a hobby as he was ill for many years).

A wonderful book I found reference to my ancestor as belonging to the State Militia in 1808 and as Sheriff.....My THOMAS was supposed to have gone from Richmond Co.Va. to N.C., then to Tenn....trouble is, I have no record of sisters & brothers of THOMAS. A friend paints coats of arms and is not making my MITCHELL Crest, which if Black & Gold, in blocks. Beautiful. It is the Scotch Coat-of-Arms of the MITCHELL Family....." I do wish You and I could find our ELIZABETH MITCHELLS.....

I shall be happy to have you send any MITCHELL, MITCHELL data you have. The only thing I have is that STEPHEN MITCHELL (Rev. Soldier) and CELIA BATTIS were the parents of my LUCRETIA MITCHELL who m. Joel, John or Thomas Neal, probably in Washington Co. Ga. before 1791. My ancestor MITCHELL NEAL'S tombstone (in Boyce, La.) says he was b in Washington Co. Ga. m 1791. This could have been a second marriage of REBECCA, widow of PLEASANT MITCHELL, who could have died soon after - or even before-birth of son HENRY in 1818. Or. REBECCA COULD HAVE BEEN DAU. OF THIS COUPLE. The marriage record of our "BETSY" MITCHELL names her as "BECKY" M. MITCHELL to JOHN HENRY, 1821. Could she have been "BECKY" not ?? "BETSY" as the family say. Her obituary calls her ELIZABETH!

Mitchell in a certain tract of land situate in Pickens Dist. containing adjoining lands of Stephen Watson (Wilson?) Gilliland and others and known as the Pickensville Tract, which said land was part of the estate of the late Stephen C. Reid. That at the death of SARAH MITCHELL her undivided interest was subject to partition among her distributees viz. one third thereof to said husband, F. M. MITCHELL, and the remaining to be divided between her 8 children viz. George M. Reid, Adeline D. Lawrence and her husband, B.F. Lawrence, Joseph B. Reid, Adeline D. Lawrence & her husband, Mary Reid, Esther Reid, Stephen C. Reid, James M. Reid and BENJAMIN MITCHELL. The last 5 mentioned are minors.

The male 15/20 could be the son, NICHOLAS, b. abt. 1811/12; the 20/30 group could be a daughter, husband & children or a son, wife & children. In 1810 Kentucky Index there is a NICHOLAS MITCHELL in Warren County. I'm anxious to get that reel of film so I can compare that. There was no NICHOLAS in 1790 S.C. Census, so I'll look in N.C.
