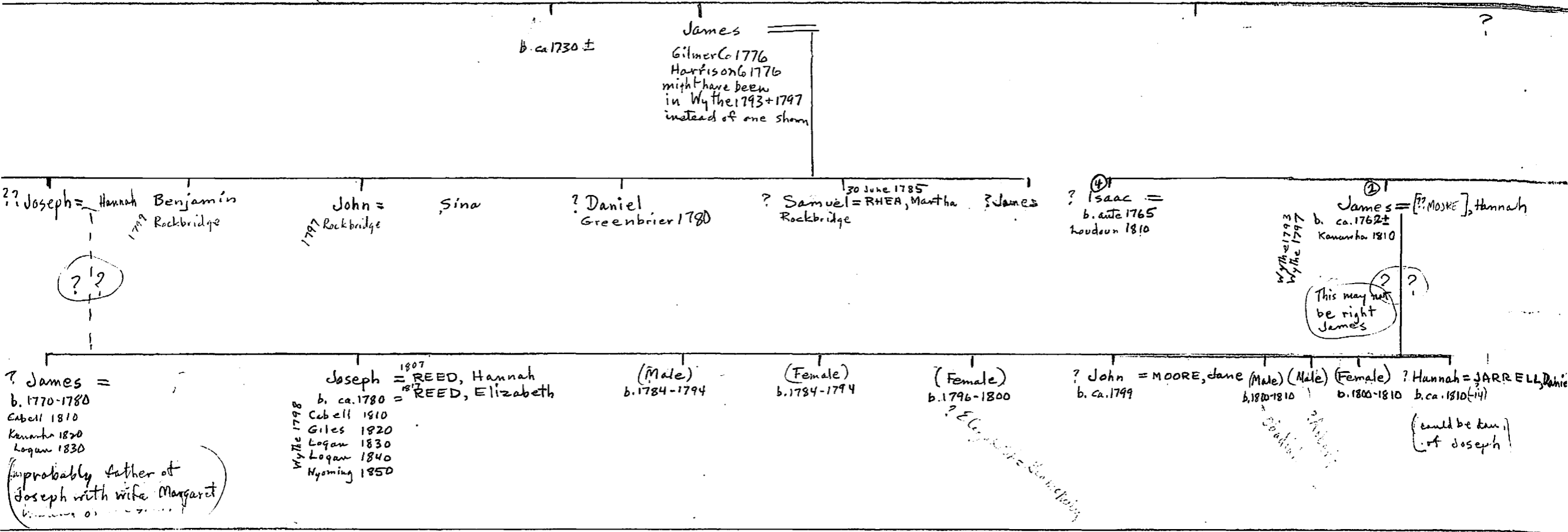

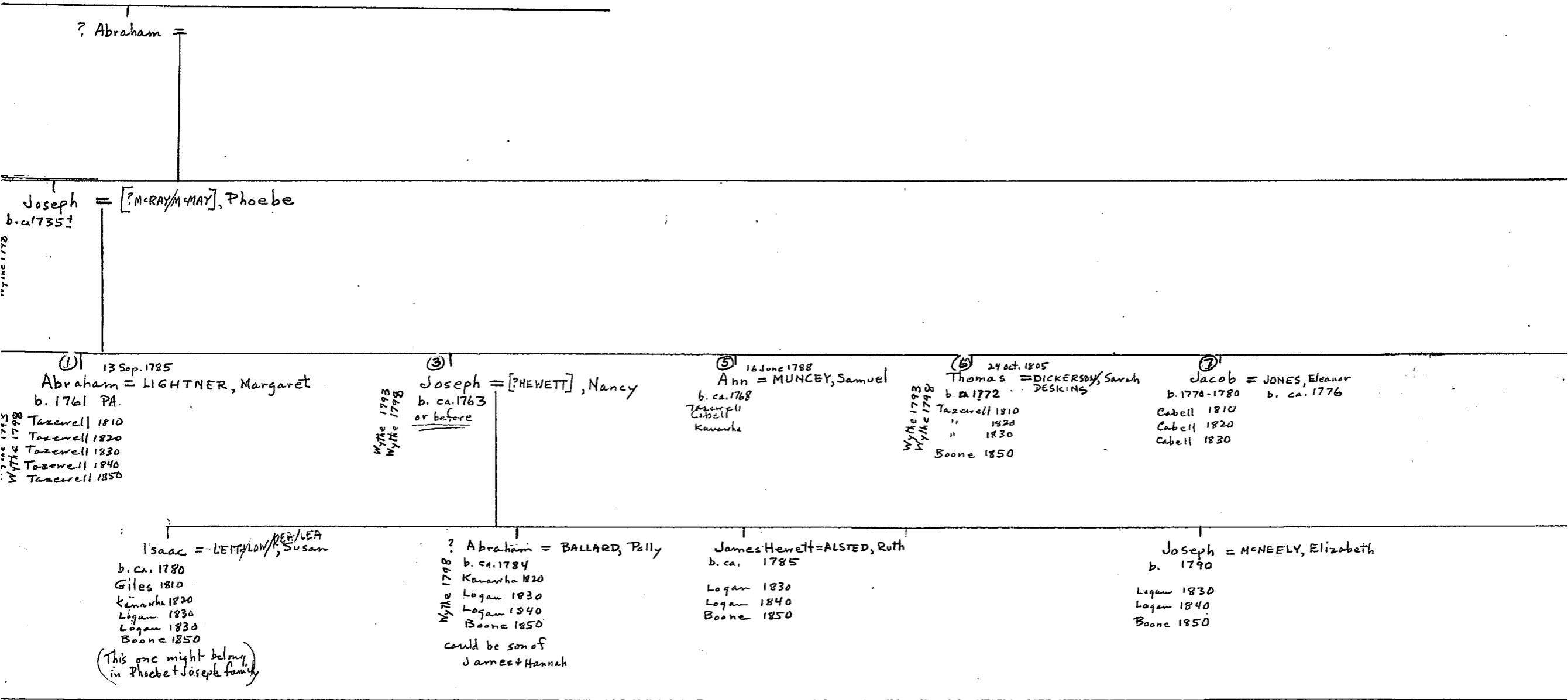

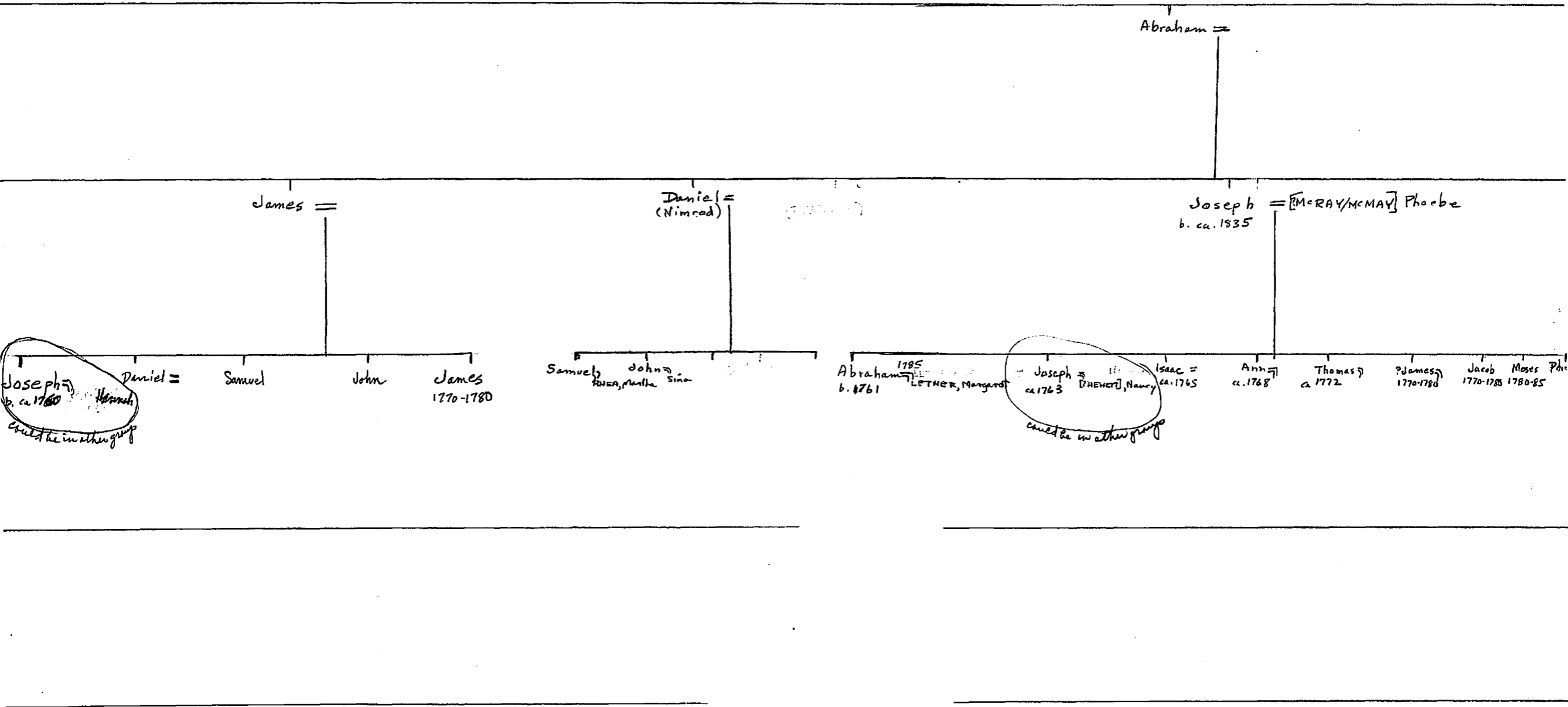

Mr. Editor - Having recently learned some incidents in the life of a worthy, venerable citizen of our neighboring county of Boone, which sheds some light upon the early settlement of West Virginia, and as it is most desirable to perpetuate the memory of the traditions and events connected therewith, which are fast passing away with the declining years of the old pioneers, I hasten to acquaint your readers thereof.

The venerable individual to whom I allude in the most reverential terms I can, is Mr. Joseph Workman, residing on the Pond Fork of Little Coal River, a brave, patriotic soldier of the War of 1812, at Norfolk, under Gen. Porter, and later in the wars under the leadership of the incorruptible warrior and statesman, William Henry Harrison (the hero of Tippecanoe) during the campaign of Fort Meigs; and the father of Wm. Workman, late state senator, and the Rev. Andrew Workman, of P.E.M. Church.

This old gentleman is now 87 years of age, and a few days ago walked across the Cherry Pond Mountain, a distance of 15 miles, to visit one of his grand-daughters, and one whole day assisted his son William and grandson-in-law, Abbott, in topping corn.

When quite a young boy he accompanied his father and others from the settlement across New River to what is now Logan County, then a wilderness; and a short distance below the present Court House cleared on the bank of the Guyandotte River, and fenced a field and planted a crop of corn, and then went back to the settlement until the Fall of the year.

On returning, they found the bears had devoured the corn, and they actually saw them running out of the field. They were driven to the necessity of making a "dug out", and descending the Guyandotte and ascending the Ohio to Gallipolis to procure flour and other necessities, and then navigating down the Ohio and up the crooked stream of the Guyan, a most laborious voyage, but showing the perseverance and energy of our resolute pioneer settlers.

They saw no bees at their first settlement, but having by some mistake sown rape seed for buckwheat, first discovered the bees sucking the rape bloom. Logan proved a productive bee country in the end, and remains so.

Mr. Workman, after having grown up, married and settled upon the Pond Fork, and says that he killed the last buffalo, but one, that was killed on Coal River waters, and that one he pursued as far as the falls of Guyandotte, where it crossed the river and escaped. He also claims to have killed the last elk seen in that region.

The old gentleman is of a cheerful, rather facetious humor, and as I am informed, boasts that when old Elisha McComas and he were young bucks, they each possessed a pair

of red buck skin breeches, and sported them especially on their courting trips. The writer remembers visiting the old gentleman then in his prime about fifty years old, on the 28th September 1840 at his home on Pond Fork, and having been a protege in his early youth of Gen. Harrison himself, soon found this veteran was also an enthusiastic admirer of that patriot, that *chevalier sans tache et sans reproche!*

May we ever bestow our heartiest meed of praise upon those gallant citizens who flocked to their country's standard when our rallying cry was "Free Trade and Sailors' Rights!" against Great Britain's insolent impressments. I noticed recently that the *Lawrence*, Commodore Oliver H. Perry's flag ship, has been raised from her watery grave of 62 years, and has been in sufficient perservation to be removed to the Centennial Grounds at Philadelphia, and by the numerous cannon ball holes and breaches in her timbers, proves that gallant seaman fought the concentrated fire of the whole British fleet as long as he could, and then snatched the victory from his opponents by passing in a yawl through the British fire to the Niagara, rehoisted his flag, and bringing a fresh ship into the action, compelled Albion's Red Cross to come down, and gave occasion to that glorious dispatch, so like Ceasar's *Veni, Vidi, Vici*: "We have met the enemy, and they are ours; two ships, two brigs, one schooner and a sloop."

This ship, this glory encircled ship, would be in my eyes the grandest and most inspiring spectacle of the Centennial of 1776, showing in *alto rehevo* that gallantry displayed in the defense of the National Independence, that has been shorn of so much of its intrinsic glories by the corrupt and truckling political rulers, forced upon the nation by circumstances! May the Great Ruler of Nations replace them by pure patriots, more intent upon the true interests and honor of their country, than for their sordid pelf, and they own selfish aggrandizement.

1796 Kanawha county Tax Lists have no entries for Workman.

1796, Nov. 31 Petition to form Tazewell county lists Joseph Workman, Sr., Jacob Workman, and James Workman.

1797 - 1800 Kanawha county Tax Records are missing

1797, Dec. 6 Petition to form Tazewell county lists James Workman.

1798 Petition lists Joseph Workman, Sr., Joseph Workman, Joseph Workman, Abriham Workman, Abram Workman, Jr., Moises Workman, and Thomas Workman.

1799 Petition lists only Abm. Workman, Daniel Workman, and Moses Workman.

This may suggest that after 1797 James, Jacob, and Isaac Workman have gone to the Kanawha county area. Isaac's middle name could have been "Nimrod" and the three brothers could have been James, Jacob, and Nimrod.

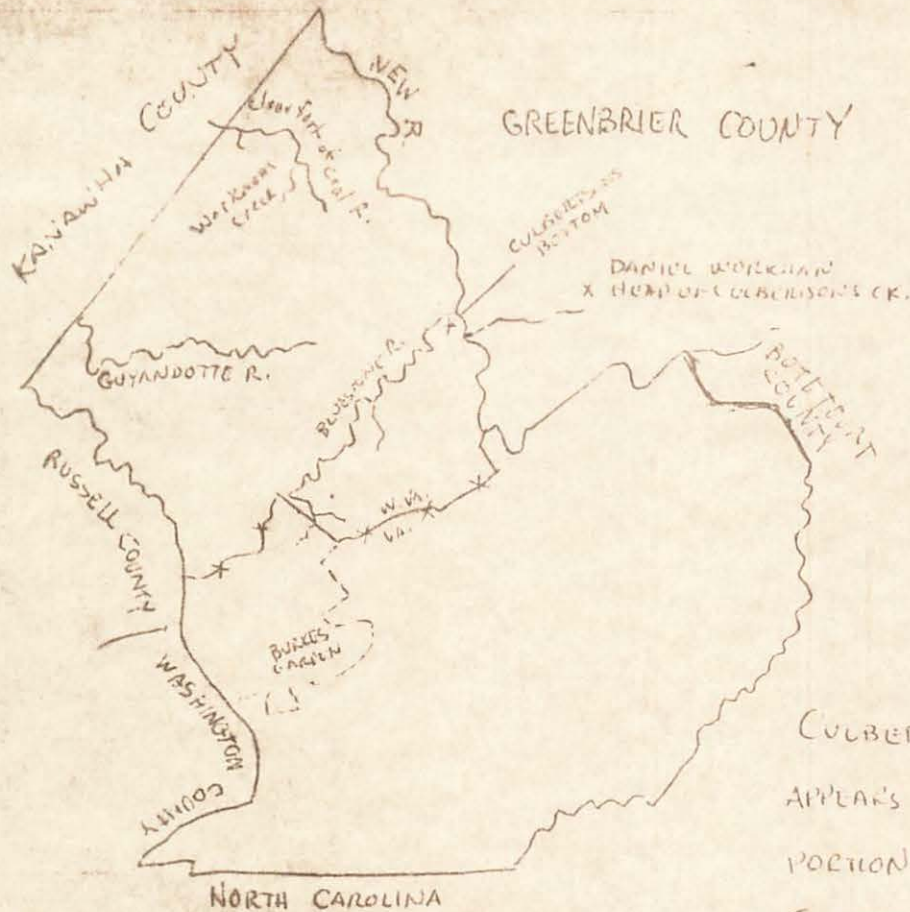

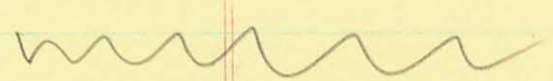

- Thomas Tomblin, aged 73, died 11 June 1925, Whirlwind, Logan County, West Virginia, of tuberculosis, buried Tomblin Cemetery;
 ✓ son of Polly (Workman) and Alex Tomblin
 Note: It is my guess that Polly was a daughter of Elizabeth (Muncy) and Moses Workman and that she was born ca. 1811.
- William Henry Workman, aged 71, died 4 February 1922 Chapmanville District, Logan County, W. Va., buried Whirlwind, W. Va.; died of heart trouble;
 ✓ son of Abiga Workman and Nancy (Perry); reported by wife Mary.
- Robert Workman, aged 59, died 11 May 1922 Chapmanville District, killed by train, buried in Kinser Graveyard; son of Mary Jane (Thompson) and Will Workman
- Margaret Jane Workman, aged 78 widow, died 29 January 1925 Chapmanville District of "old age" and buried Whirlwind; daughter of Polly (Workman)
 ✓ and Alex Tomblin, the parents having been born in Virginia.
- Louis Workman, born 5 October 1861 in W. Va., died a widower 27 October 1926 of acute gastroenteritis Omar, Logan County, buried Atensville, W. Va.; son of Nancy (Quin) and Moses Workman.
 Note: Which Moses is this?
- Sarah Conley, aged 77, born September 1834, died a widow 2 June 1931 Chapmanville, Logan County, of a paralytic stroke, buried Stonewall Conley; daughter of Jane (Workman) and Jim Dalton.
 Note: There is a discrepancy between the age and birth date; if born in 1834, she would have been 97. I have not yet located Jane and Jim Dalton in the census records to verify ages. Jane was probably also a daughter of Moses Workman by either Elizabeth Muncy or Sarah Marrs, probably Sarah.
- Mose Dempsey, aged 75 widower, died 22 April 1928 Mud Fork, Logan Co., of paralysis; son of Barbara (Workman) and Billie Dempsey, both of whom were born in Virginia.
 Note: Was this another daughter of Sarah (Marrs) and Moses?
- Pete Dalton, born 23 October 1861, died 7 December 1931 Chapmanville of bladder and kidney trouble, Chapmanville, buried Charley Conley Cemetery; son of Jane (Workman) and Jim Dalton
- James Matterson Pauley, aged 87 widower, died 23 April 1929, Foley, Logan Co., of burns, buried Chambers Cemetery; son of Mary (Workman) and Henry Pauley.
 Note: James Matterson is a variation of James Madison. His mother Mary Workman was born about 1806. Was she the daughter of Thomas or of James? I am inclined toward James since she was living in the same vicinity as Jane (Moore) and John Workman as well as Dorcas (Workman) Barker.
- Elias Workman, aged 49, died 4 October 1928 Whirlwind, shot; son of Sarah (Workman) and James Workman.
- Will Workman, born 8 February 1847, died 12 October 1929 Chapmanville District, buried Adams Cemetery, died of cancer, parents not given.
- ✓ Abiga Workman, born 1 September 1853, died 9 October 1930 of apoplexy, Chapmanville District, buried Shade Smith Cemetery; son of Polly (Mullins) and Moses Workman
 Note: Which Mose Workman was this?
- Amos Workman, aged 35, died 16 February 1931 of fracture to body, in Logan, Logan Co., buried Huntington, W. Va.; son of Elizabeth (Skaggs) and Amos Workman.
- Josephine Workman, aged 83, died 3 February 1935 Mondo, Logan County, of pneumonia, buried Jeffrey, W. Va.; daughter of Nancy (Jarrell) and Isaac Workman.
 Note: I failed to note whether she was single, married, or widowed. This is probably the Josephine of the 1900 census, whose maiden name was Jarrell. Josephine may have married a cousin, Amos Workman.

Excertp from a letter from Mrs. C. E. Shirk (██████████) written June 13, 1920

Now regarding the Workmans. I do not know great deal about them as my grandmother Robison died when my father was only seven years of age and he grew up in the Robison families and they did not seem to make records of their ancestry.

Last Summer I was in the Workman cemetery near Danville Ohio and copied the enclosed tombstone records. After my grandmothers death my grandfather married

his sister in law Lovisa Workman, widow of Joseph Workman but she is burried under the Workman name by her first husband. - - - - -

My father brought her son home from the Civil War when he was too ill to get there himself and then paid for his burial. The Workmans and the Robisons fought over the name of the cemetery for years but evidently the Workmans won, for so the cemetery is named.

We know that Solomon Robisons wife was Rebecca Workman and she is supposed to be the daughter of Isaac Workman. I have enclosed the Workman-Robison history as given in the Knox County Ohio history but you will note that the dates are all wrong for both Rebecca and Solomon though the history says she was a daughter of Isaac.

I stopped in Alleghany County last summer to see if I could find a will naming the children of Isaac Workman but I could not find any record of the settlement of his estate and he evidently sold all his property to his sons before his death. It is possible that he went to Ohio and died there.

I have never tried to get a bar on Isaac Workman in the DAR but think I will try it.

he died Sept 10, 1866 in Mt. Vernon.

William Robison was born 1783 married Sarah Workman in 1802 and lived in Md. until 1811 when he moved to Knox County.

In 1832 a German Baptist Church was organized by Elder James Workman Solomon Robison Jacob Schultz Isaac Workman William Robison Jacob Robison and their wives. Solomon Robison was the first Deacon and Elder J. C. Workman was the first Pastor.

Joseph Workman emigrated from Allegheny County Md. in 1814. (pencil note in the margin of the history says he was a son of Isaac Workman.

Pheby (WORKMAN) JONES, widow of Charles JONES (age 77 on May 27, 1871 which would make her birth year 1794); married November 11, 1811 in Tazewell county, Virginia, to CHARLES JONES, who was born February 1, 1784. Phoebe was living near Sebastopol in Sonoma county California in 1871.

I wrote to Sonoma county for her death records and they say they have none.

Charles and Phoebe (Workman) Jones' children were: William born 9-6-1813; Margaret born 5-26-1815; Rachel born 3-14-1816; Nancy born 1-12-1818; Catherine born 12-25-1820; Abraham W. born 12-15-1822; Phebe born 11-11-1824; Charles born 2-15-1826; Elizabeth Ann born 3-15-1828; Timothy born 10-11-1831; Louisa Marian born 9-22-1833; and Rebecca born 3-9-1839.

Since her first daughter is named Margaret and she has a son named Abraham W. Jones, one would almost certainly place her as a daughter of Abraham and Margaret (Lightner) Workman, right?

By deduction her birthdate is 1794, but in this documentary it is more definitely given as May 12, 1793.

She died September 4, 1873.

Enclosed are the results of my five hour search on Workmans. They are really few and far between. I found a Daniel listed in the land patents for Virginia, but he spelled his last name Warkman, which could be Workman I suppose. Warkmans are also found in New Kent Parish Register, but not Daniel, only Mark.

I, also found quite a few Workmans in the Wyoming County Vital Statistics- births, deaths. About your Joseph Workman, I read it that his father was James and ^{mother} Hannah; friend James gave the information. Perhaps he meant that Joseph was born in what was then Alleghany but previously it was formed from Bath, Botetourt and Monroe. Have you checked Monroe County for Workmans? We have P.P. tax list for 1799-1863 and land tax from 1799-1859. By the way I was told that our West Virginia Vital Statistics only go to 1861. If you would like me to search what we have here on the other West Virginia Counties, I would be happy to do so.

You will note the Rachel and James Workman in Wythe County in 1830 and 1835. Also a Peter Wortman in Loudoun- I feel Wortman is probably a different name all together. Also, Benjamin and John Workman in Rockbridge. All of these counties could be searched further I am sure for Workmans.

Henry Clay Ragland says that John Breckenridge, owner of the patent that covered present Logan and the islands, employed James Workman to take charge of his land. Aunt Dorcas (Workman)(Dent) White told Mr. Ball (her grandson) that Breckenridge intended moving to this land and employed her grandfather, James Workman, and his brother to clean up the old Indian corn fields on the island. As far as I ~~am~~ (Olafson) can recall, she did not name the brother. She also said that Breckenridge changed his mind about moving there and went to Kentucky instead, after which the Workmans moved away. Her grandfather, James Workman, eventually wound up in Boone County, settling at the mouth of what is still called James Creek on Pond Fork.

In an abstract of Thomas Ward's will of date 1654 he mentions,
 "my Sister Workman's sonne Thomas". So from this and Thomas
 Workman's will, we know that Thomas Workman married Mary Ward.

Thelma C. Anderson's WORKMAN FAMILY HISTORY states that there were three main branches of the Workman Family in England, and two in Ireland. One of the branches came from England to Ireland about 1642. This no doubt was researched and came to her from a reliable source.

I am not clearly convinced however, that the name came from England as WORKMAN to Holland where it changed to WOERTMAN as it was when the immigrant ancestor came to America, then gradually over a period of years changed back to WORKMAN.

A volume of the Abridged Compendium of AMERICAN GENEALOGY states "William or Daniel Workman came from France to Coleraine, Ireland, then to Massachusetts, ca. 1690."

This statement seems uncertain as to exactly who it was bearing the name, but it is clearly WORKMAN. William and Daniel are both very common in the later Workman families. Yet it is not certain that this person is the immigrant ancestor either. It may, however, be the person who is in the information to follow. Let it be noted here that the name Daniel can be easily construed for Samuel in handwriting.

By the list 85. 215 freights, 240 souls from Wirtembergh, Alsace & Hanau." Among those listed was HENDRICK WORKMAN.

Another note I had from the book, "Names of Foreigners..." mentioned first above is an oath list for the passengers on the Mary, June 28, 1735 were Henrich WURCHMAN, and Johannes WURCHMAN.

By Phonetics, it would seem logical that this name WURCHMAN would later become WORKMAN in America.

1. Abraham, born 25 January 1761 in Washington Township, Pennsylvania, married in Montgomery County., Virginia, 13 September 1785 Margaret LIGHTNER. May be found in Tazewell County, Virginia, 1810 tax list and censuses of 1820, 1830, 1840, and 1850. At least seven, possibly ten, children. Names of children not yet fully determined, but Joseph, born about 1802, who married Margaret, could be a son.

2. James, born about 1762, married Hannah _____, Probably the James who was in Wythe County about 1797 signed a petition to form Tazewell and with his brothers in 1794 had planted a crop on "the Island" of Guyandotte River. Moved with his family and listed in 1810 on Kanawha County, Virginia, Census. Apparently had ten children, the eldest possibly James born 1779±; the next Joseph with wives Hannah and Elizabeth Reed; among others John, born 1799± who married Jane Moore. The Elizabeth who married George McNeely and the Hannah who married Daniel Jarrell could belong here or among children of James' brother Joseph.
3. Joseph, born about 1763 in Pennsylvania, moved to Wythe/Tazewell Co., Virginia, area, married Nancy ??Hewitt??. With brothers, planted crop on "the Island" of Guyandotte River about 1794. Pioneer settler of area which became Boone County, West Virginia. He and wife may have died about 1800 since they disappear from records. Their children were, according to tradition: Isaac, born about 1781, who married Susan _____, and can be followed in census Giles 1810, Kanawha 1820, Logan 1830 & 40, and Boone 1850; Abraham, born about 1784, married 9 Nov. 1809 Mary "Polly" Ballard; Joseph, born between June and October 1790, married Elizabeth (?McNeely) (Elkins) 7 Nov. 1813; ~~likely also are~~ Elizabeth who married George McNeely and the Hannah who married Daniel Jarrell, mentioned above as possibly James' children. The death record of Hannah (Workman) Jarrell shows her father as Jos. Workman, and the proximity of the McNeely's would seem to favor Elizabeth's inclusion in this group.
4. Isaac, born about 1765, is apparently the only one of the brothers who moved to another part of Virginia. He is listed in the 1810 Loudoun County census. The Isaac born about 1781 (shown above) might be the correct Isaac for this spot, but the arrangement shown seems to me more likely.
5. Ann, born about 1768, who married in Montgomery County, Virginia, 16 June 1788 Samuel Muncey. I have not yet traced records on her, but information on her death record, if available, might furnish significant clues about parentage.
6. Thomas, born about 1772 in Pennsylvania, indicating that the family had not yet made the move to Virginia, married (Was this for the first time?) Sarah Dickerson/Deskins 24 October 1805. His family may be traced through census records from Tazewell 1810, 20, 30 to Boone in 1850. Still trying to separate identity of his children from those of Abraham.
7. Jacob, born between 1770-1780, married Eleanor Jones. He made sworn statement in 1816 that he had accompanied brother to Guyandotte River twenty-three years before. He settled in that part of Cabell which became Wayne County, and his family can be followed there in censuses of 1810, 20, and 30. He had apparently died before 1850 when his widow, aged 74, was living with children.
8. Moses, born 1780-1785, married 17 June 1801 Elizabeth Muncey. While in Tazewell County in 1810 and 1820, he was in Lawrence Co., Kentucky, by 1830. Did he marry secondly Sarah Marrs? *Back to Logan 1840 + Boone 1850*
9. Phoebe, born ~~about 1775-1780~~ *1775-1780*, married Isaac Roberts.

POSSIBLE WORKMAN FAMILY LINEAGE: ALTERNATE TWO

The preceding page does not take into account the presence in 1776 of an adult James Workman, "said to be the first white man to build a cabin within the Gilmer County area." It is, of course, possible that as a young man of fourteen a James born about 1762 might have built the cabin. Much more likely, however, is that the preceding family group be changed, eliminating James in the group. The elder James (with a much earlier birth date and an even larger family) would be perhaps a younger brother of the Joseph who married Phoebe. Another of their brothers would have been Daniel/Nimrod--names which can be easily misread (Nimrod for Daniel or vice versa) if the initial "D" and other letters are quickly written in the old style. Note samples below:

Daniel Nimrod Daniel Nimrod

If the family groups (or most parts thereof) following prove to be correct, several otherwise difficult-to-explain traditions and facts are quite reasonable. The seemingly conflicting accounts of precisely who went to the Island then fall into perspective. Depending on who told the story in later years and depending on which of the two generations represented there quite early was mentioned in the account, the impression left was different: It would have been "my grandfather and brothers came to the Island," "my brother and I were on the Guyandotte," etc. By careful study of the census records and tax lists, one can clearly determine when and which ones actually moved to (West) Virginia.

Children of Phoebe & Joseph Workman would then be:

1. Abraham, born 25 January 1761, etc.
2. Joseph, born about 1763, with wife Nancy, etc.
3. Isaac, born about 1765, etc.
4. Ann, born about 1768, etc.
5. Thomas, born about 1772, etc.
6. Jacob, born about 1770-1780, etc.
7. Moses, born 1780-1785, etc.
8. Phoebe, born perhaps 1780-1785, etc.

Children of Daniel/Nimrod might then be: Known to have been in Rockbridge/Greenbrier/Wythe

1. Joseph, born ante 1760 with wife Hannah, whose son Joseph married Reed's
2. Samuel, who married Martha Rhea in Rockbridge in 1785
3. John, who already had wife Sina in Rockbridge in 1797
4. Benjamin in Rockbridge in 1799

2. Joseph, born ca. 1780 (if #1 in Daniel/Nimrod family non-existent)

The above lists are probably not complete. I would also like to make another comment concerning the elder James. He and his family are in Kanawha County in 1810, and I have not picked them up later. Is it possible that they went to that area subsequently covered by Clay County, West Virginia, or to one of the Ohio counties? Most of the children attributed to Joseph and Phoebe above can be followed easily in their migratory patterns.

I would be most interested in any suggestions, comments, or corrections and additions to the above which might also prove or disprove any or all the speculation.

9. Moses WORKMAN, born 1780-1790, seemingly married twice: first to Elizabeth MUNCY 17 June 1801 in Tazewell County, Virginia, and secondly to Sarah Marrs on 11 July 1820 in the same county. By his first wife he probably had Eleanor who mar. Acles Fannon; Obadiah who mar. Rebecca Lambert; Moses who mar. _____; female _____; Nancy who mar. Eli Gore; Elizabeth who mar. Isaac Adkins, Jr.; and Abijah who mar. Nancy ??Perry _____. By Sarah he had a male _____; female _____; Henry who mar. Nancy Dalton; female _____; female _____; another female _____; and Moses.

A few words of explanation: I have not placed too many dates (even those which I have) in the descriptions of the children's children but shall do so another time when taking each of the nine families separately. The listings within the paragraphs above are in the order of birth as reconstructed from the census records.

The above nine families can be documented in southwestern Virginia and southern West Virginia and include those individuals who were there in 1810, 1820 and 1830. By 1830, 1840, and 1850 the grandchildren of the nine can be fairly well documented as well.

Further research may require some switching of a few of the off-spring; for example, the Robert attributed to Abraham may belong to Thomas (Robert had own hsid. 1840 Tazewell) the James attributed to Thomas may belong to Abraham (James had own hsid. 1830 Wythe) Russell and Squire T. might belong to James rather than to Isaac since I still have not accounted for two males who were "out" in 1840 (John in Monroe may be one). Thomas and Sarah had a son out before 1850 unaccounted for. As you will notice, many of the girls are not yet identified.

The above tentative lineage is consistent with all the traditions so well known if we consider Nimrod as Jacob and if we assume that an older James, son of Daniel, was the one who built in Harrison and Gilmer County area. I believe that Daniel's family, like him, probably moved westward.

On the 22nd day of September one thousand Eight hundred and thirty four, personally appeared in open court the Circuit Superior Court of Law & Chancery for the County of Lynchburg now sitting Abraham Wallman a resident of the County of Lynchburg & State of Virginia aged Seventy three on the twenty fifth day of January last past, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States in the following manner & circumstances as herein after stated (viz) this declarant entered the service while a citizen of the County of Meigs near Fort Pitt, as a draughtsman & was under Capt Morgan Capt Hezekiah Morgan, Lieutenant John White, on the 1st of April 1777. was run away at Capt Russ on a creek called "Sturlew" and was taken to Fort Pentacost, called "Fort Pentacost", Fort, where he remained only one day, and was then marched to Fort Pitt, where this declarant remained three months, and was discharged from the service by Capt Morgan, the term of service for which he served being three months which had then expired, & then remained within the discharge which this declarant had the satisfaction to lose by the burning of his house, he left the service on the 1st day of July 1777. he feels certain of the time of the year when he entered & left the service, as above, he arrives at the year of 1777. by calculating from the age which he then was, and what he now is, and feels nearly certain of its correctness.

This declarant entered his service a term of duty on the 1st of April the year following, while still a resident of the County of Meigs near, under Capt Morgan, Capt Morgan & Lieutenant White, the same officers under whom he served his first term, as a draughtsman & was under the term of Six months, was then removed by the same plan as above stated, and was marched from there to Fort Pitt, where this declarant

You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 40725 that Daniel Workman enlisted in Lewisburg, Greenbrier County, Virginia, September 13, 1776 and served one year in Captain Matthew Arbuckle's company, Colonel John Neville's Virginia regiment.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 25, 1818, at which time he was a resident of Logan County, Ohio and aged seventy-eight years.

It is stated that he died about September 10, 1823 in Logan County, Ohio, leaving the following heirs: Elizabeth Dodge, the wife of Nathan Dodge and James Workman.

In 1855 Elizabeth Dodge was living in Boone County, Indiana, and at this time James Workman is referred to as James Mc. Workman.

The soldier's only living child in 1859 was a daughter, who was about eighty years old, her name is not designated.

The above noted Daniel Workman is the only soldier of that name that is found on the Revolutionary War records of this bureau.

August 1775 I was enlisted under Captain Watson, I think his Christian name was James. The names of the other officers of the Company and Regiment I cannot now recollect. I left the service on this occasion, as near as I can remember on the first of June 1776. On this tour I served as a regular in the Pennsylvania line for nine months. When I was enlisted I resided in Washington County Penn^a but being on a visit to Lancaster County Pa where I formerly had lived I there enlisted and entered the service immediately after my enlistment the Company to which I was attached marched directly from Lancaster to Albany in New York. On our way to Albany we passed through Philadelphia and the State of New Jersey to the Hudson River, when we were taken on board a vessel and sailed up to Albany. We lay in barracks in Albany during the State of the ensuing winter. Early in the Spring after we arrived we arrived in Albany I had my foot very severely scalded by the upsetting of a kettle of boiling soup. This accident disabled me for active service and was the reason of my discharge from the Army two or three months after my return home to Washington County. Albany I was drafted in the fall of the same year 1776 to serve as a soldier & spy on the frontiers.

against the Indians. On this occasion I was
in the service three months and 28 days. The
officers who commanded this expedition as near as
I can recollect were Col^l David Williamson
& William Crawford Major Stinson. - Captains
Eliaser Williamson, Dab^l Leek and Capt Farrell
and other officers whose names I have forgotten.
We marched from Washington Penn^a to the
place where the town of Beaver now stands on
the Ohio river below Pittsburg and there built
a fort called "Mackintosh's fort" After
we had constructed this fort we marched
to the Muskingum river in the state of
Ohio and built a block house on the
bank of that river, we then returned home
having been out just 2 days less than four
months. - In the following summer (of 1777) I was again
drafted to serve against the Indians and
was marched to Ganes fort in Virginia
where Wheeling now stands and from that
twelve miles farther down the Ohio river to the
mouth of Gane creek. The company with
which I marched to these places had
in charge a small drove of Cattle for
the use of the forts. On this occasion I ser-
ved between five and six weeks the dangers
of the season being over we had permission to

to return to our homes

In the following Spring of 1778 I was again drafted into the same service for two months the whole of which time I served. We were commanded during this time by Colonel David Williamson, we marched from Washington Pennsylvania directly to "Kellums Block house" on the waters of Dunand Creek near the Monongahela and just far from the foot of the Laurel Hill in Fayette County Penn^a.

In this fort we remained till the end of our two months when we were relieved by another Company drafted for the same length of time, and we returned home —

In the year 1783 or 84 I was again drafted and served under Col. William Crawford for two months or upwards. On this occasion the Company to which I was attached marched from Washington Penn^a and crossed the Ohio river a short distance below Pittsburg at a place called "Logstown" but before we reached the Ohio we were joined by the other troops under Col. Crawford. From the Ohio river we were marched directly to the plains of Sandusky in the State of Ohio where we were met and encountered by the hostile Indians and completely defeated and

obliged to seek safety in flight. In this engagement our loss was very great in killed and wounded and we were obliged to leave all those who were disabled by their wounds to the mercy of the savages. Col. Crawford was taken prisoner and (I have been informed since) was burnt at the stake by the Indians. We were pursued by the Indians to the Ohio river on our retreat and great numbers of our men were either killed or captured. This is what is generally called "Crawford's defeat".

I should have mentioned in its proper place that I also was drafted and served a tour of duty for about six weeks in the Spring of 1779. During the whole of this time except so much as was taken up in going and returning I was stationed in "Redstone fort" where Brownsville in Fayette County now stands, I am unable now to state in what month I was stationed in this fort or who was its commander.

I was born in September 1757. I have a record of my age in my family bible. I was born in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. When called into the service on all and each of the several occasions I have mentioned I lived in Washington County Penn^a. Where I have lived ever since the revolutionary war, and where I now live. On all the occasions I entered the service I was drafted except,

only only the time I was enlisted when on a visit to Lancaster County Pa. My memory has so much failed by reason of old age and disease that I am unable at present to tell any thing more of the officers under whom I served or the regiments in which I served or the general circumstances of my service than what I have already stated.

When I left the regular service I received a written discharge or permit to return home. But I am unable to say what has become of it; it is lost. On no other occasion did I receive a written discharge.

I know of no clergyman who has a knowledge of my revolutionary service and who can testify for me in the manner required by the regulations of the War Department.

I have no documentary evidence of service whatever. I know of no person at present who has a personal knowledge of my services except Hugh Workman (whose affidavit is hereunto attached) of this County and and James Seal of Greene County Pa. Spencer's company Virginia militia in the war declared by the United States against Great Britain in the 18th day of June 1812. That her said husband entered the said service from the county of Cabell in the state of Kentucky on or about the 1st day of July 1812, or 13, and continued in actual service in said war until on or about the 30th day of December 1814, and was honorably discharged as she was informed by her said husband in his life time but as to the correct and true date of her said husband's entry into said service with the time when and where he was discharged she is unable to state with any certainty and has given the above statement of dates being the present impressions of her mind
