old Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally
suitable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living
during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service.

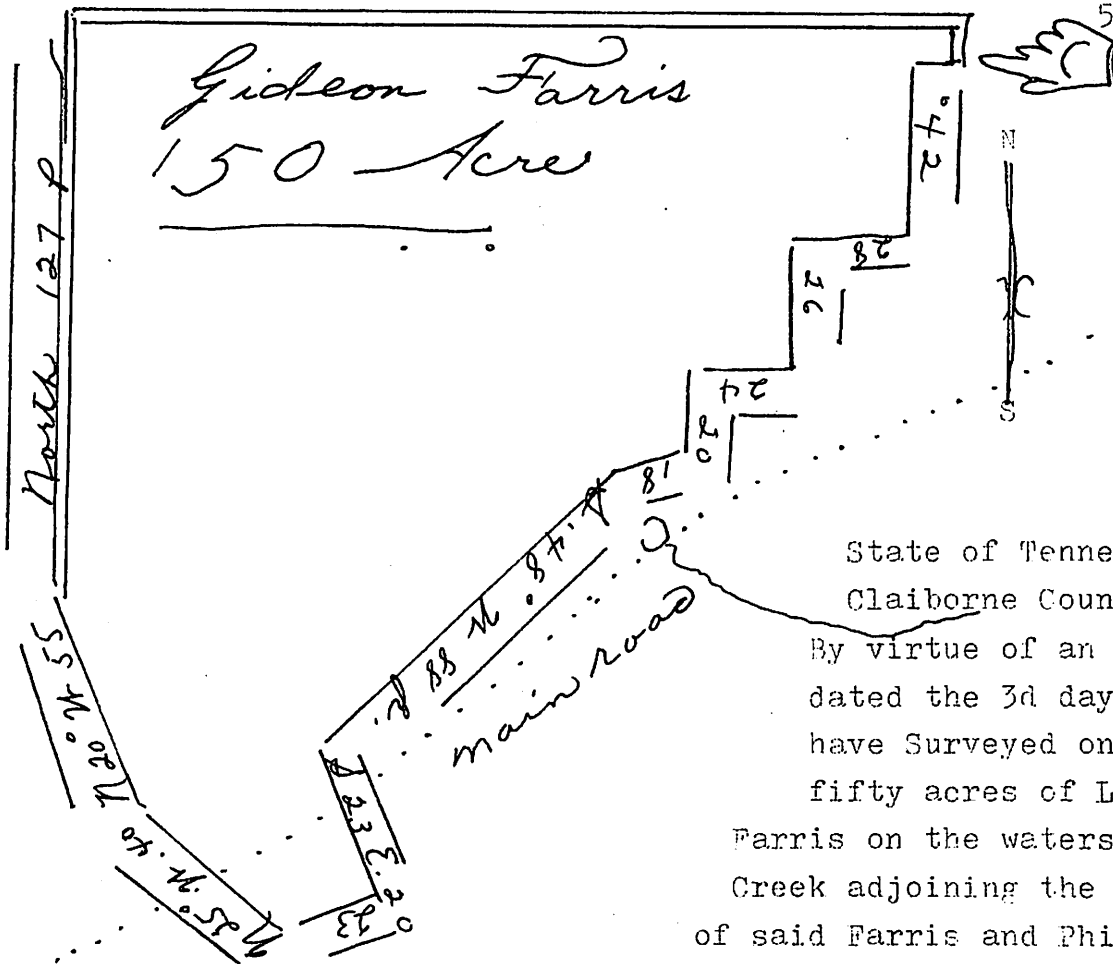

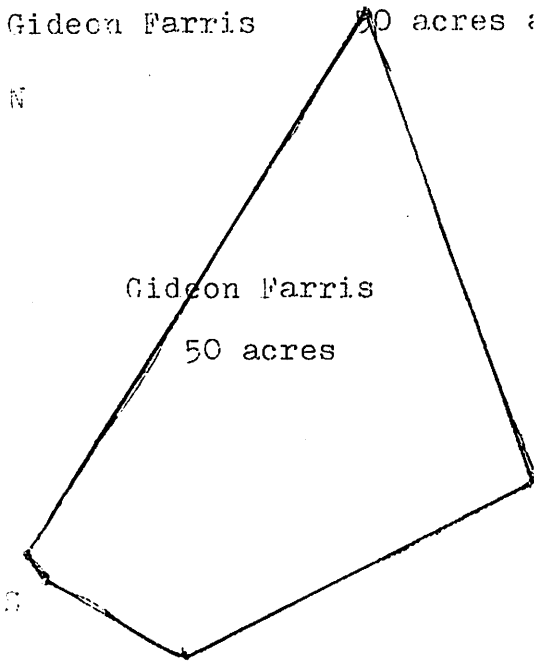

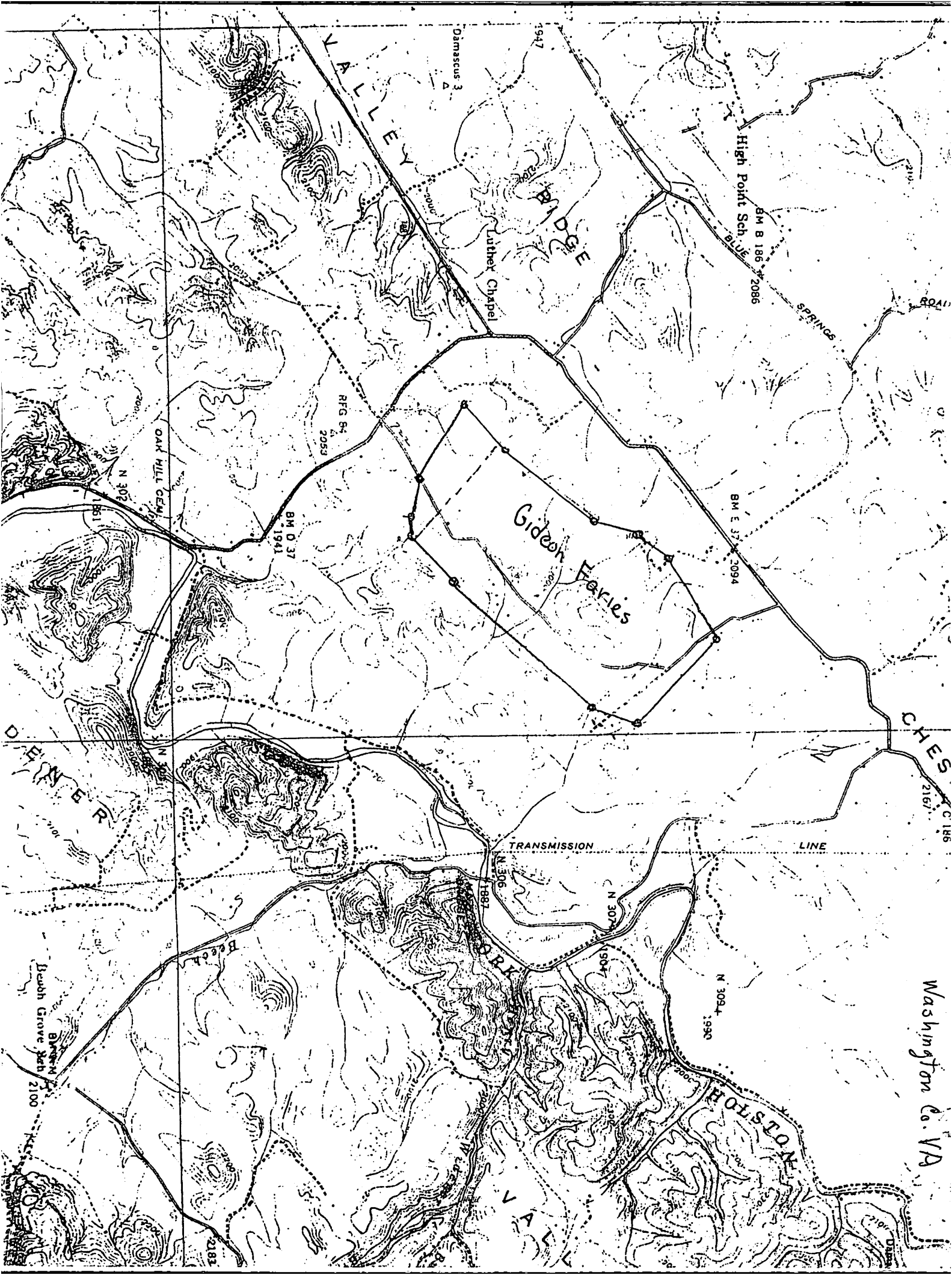

Jack Farris, 78, surgeon in LA area

LA JOLLA — Dr. Jack Farris, 78, a respected surgeon and community leader, died Wednesday of heart failure at Scripps Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Farris, who had retired from medical practice, was associate dean for community relations and a professor emeritus of surgery at the University of California, San Diego, School of Medicine.

In 1983, he was asked to interrupt his retirement to accept an appointment as associate dean for community affairs at the medical school. He joined the medical school staff in 1973 as a professor of surgery.

Dr. Farris is survived by his wife, Carolyn; brother, Roy Farris of Fremont, Neb.; daughters, Mary Anderson of Costa Mesa and Melinda Wortz of Pasadena; two stepdaughters, Carol Rowan of San Francisco and Pamela Rowan of Boston; a stepson, Nicholas Alexander; and five grandchildren.

Memorial services will be held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at Torrey Pines Christian Church.
