

JOHN SLATOR (SCHLATTER) TIME LINE

1762 – born about then, Alsace, Germany – France was ruling at the time.

Joined Rochambeau's Army (1780)

May 2, 1780 – Fleet sailed from Brest, France

July 11, 1780 – Arrived off of Newport, R.I., was in Battle of White Plains, N.Y., served under LaFayette about 3 years as cavalryman.

Present at Battle of Yorktown – September 5, 1781 (82?)

Present at surrender of Cornwallis (& General Charles O'Hara) to General George Washington & Rochambeau.

Present at framing of U.S. Constitution and witnessed signing of same, (stated as fact in Butler County, PA history book).

Discharged at Wilmington, DE – May 9, 1783

Married Catherine (?) about 1770's – where ?

To Butler County, PA and took claim to 200 acres where St. Joseph Station stood, now known as Martin Farm (in Donegal Township?). This was after 1797 (see History of Butler County, PA)

To Clarion County for a time, then back to Butler County, where he died.
