I refer to your letter of June 24 regarding genealogical and biographical data on your family in Poland.

The Consulate cannot perform the genealogical research your desire. However, we have been informed that such a study may be undertaken by the following Polish institution:

If you desire the assistance of this institute you should write a letter stating your request to include the following information:

First and last name (the original spelling if changed)

Date and place of birth and death (as appropriate)

Date and place of marriage and the names of spouse

Religion at birth

Identification of places should include name of locality, administrative unit, province (wojewodztwo, gubernia) or nearby cities and rivers. Photocopies of any documents such as passports, old identity cards, documents pertaining to property, old letters may be helpful in searching for the required information. A comparison of pre-war and post-war atlases may reveal changes in place-names. It is suggested that before contacting the institute, you do some research in the United States in order to establish the original spelling of family names. This information is often contained in old immigration records which may be found in the American Congress of Polonia, Buffalo, N.Y. or in the Library of Congress in

Washington, D.C. An Immigration file number is sometimes included in the documents granting titles to property.

Upon receipt of the necessary information the Polish National Archives will make a preliminary search to establish whether the necessary registers exist (many were destroyed during the war). If records exist, the Archives will ask you to make a preliminary payment in the amount of \$20.000

The amount of time required to conduct the search and the number of documents prepared (reproductions, photocopies, and so forth) will determine the total fee which usually ranges from \$100.00 to \$200.00.

Dear James:

I was delighted to receive your letter. I thought that every Blauer in the world was related to us, and they probably are. However, I don't know too much about our lineage.

Both my mother and father were born in the Austrian Empire. They came from a section of Austria which, at this time, is now part of Poland. They came from a small village near the city of Lemburg. I don't know more than that. However, I do have cousins on the West Coast, two (2) of whom were born in the 'Old Country'. They both live in Portland, Oregon. One is a prominent accountant whose name is Henry Blauer and the other is a manufacturer of umbrellas (perhaps you have seen the Shed Rain Umbrella in your local stores). The umbrella manufacturer's name is Sol Blauer. There is another cousin by the name of Dr. Aaron Blauer, and his oldestbrother whose name is Myer Blauer -- all living in Portland, Oregon. Since they are older and some were born in the Old Country, they may be able to tell you more about their lineage.

Additionally, in the City of Montreal and the suburbs, there is a large Blauer enclave -- all of them uncles and cousins. The fact of the matter is that I have an uncle who lives in Cote Ste. Luc (a Montreal suburb) who is now approaching his 98th birthday. He, of course, was born in Austria and undoubtedly could fill you in with a great deal of the details regarding his ancestry. He has a younger brother in Cote Ste Luc who is only 76 years old and might be able to fill you in as well. Being somewhat younger, his memory is probably more clear.

I recently came across a family in Iowa by the name of Blauer. I believe that they were from Switzerland, originally, and that they were of the Protestant faith. I mention this because, believe it or not, all of our family are of the Jewish faith. Now, somewhere there has been a "mutation" or a conversion. My guess is that some of the Jewish Blauer's decided to convert to Protestantism.

I say this because you rarely have Protestants conferring to Judaism. Particularly back in those days. When I mentioned this to the family in Iowa, communications stopped immediately. I guess they must have written the Jewish Blauer's off as a "lost cause". Or, perhaps they couldn't cope with the idea that perhaps, in their deep and distant past, their forebearers were of the Jewish faith.

I rather suspect that, since you are from the Swiss branch, you must be of the Protestant faith as well. And I hope that the possibility of a Jewish ancestry does not offend you.

Incidentally, I might mention that my nephew Michael Blauer lives in Westwood which is a suburb of Los Angeles and not very far from Newport Beach. He is a fine young man of 27 years of age. He is a graduate of the University of Massachusetts and the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York City. He is a most accomplished athlete—and an outstanding tennis player. If you care to call him, his phone number is 213-474-4946.

If you want to delve into this branch of the family (and I assume we are a branch of the family), I will be very happy to send you the complete address of my uncles in Montreal who may be able to take our family back a couple of generations to see if there is any sort of linkup.

Incidentally, in a travel section of the local newspaper, I saw a write up of Austria and reference to a train called the "Blauer Enztrain". This apparently is a train that runs quite regularly in Austria and is well known. I deduce from the article that the name Blauer is somehow or other related to a small blue flower which grows wild in the mountains.

At any rate, this is all that I have to offer. There are Blauers in Montreal, Blauers in Portland, Blauers in Washington D. C., amongst others. If you really want to get into it, I will try to help all I can.

The bulk of our relatives reside in the East coast, Boston, M.D., NYC, Providence, and largely in Montreal. We are all Jewish and I think there are none from Switzerland.

We have a huge family as was evident from the first family reunion which took place this summer here made possible by my wedding, it was a good excuse.
