

I eventually discovered the the LDS claimed they had them, but misplaced them and that they would have them available to the public in 6 months....that was about 1 year ago.....

What I am looking for are Niederstotzingen, Germany.....the Evagelical Church only....

Our card catalogue showed only Catholic and these are not correct.....

Dear Jim,

Thanks so much for the offer. I really appreciate it! I will give it some thought and see if I can think of something...one thing that comes to mind is locating the Niederstotzingen tapes...these are the city in German that the Koch's come from, about 9 miles from Ulm.

The library claimed, back when Marv and Cheryl were going to Niederstotzingen that these tapes were lost and then found and that they would be added to the collection within six months.

I was to be on a list of people that would receive notification when they had been made available. Of course, I never have. When I did the Koch family research I did all the sheets that I received from the archives in Stutgart, but they "missed" 14 families, or links that would have completed and ID'ed even more families in Niederstotzingen as ours, but I did not want to pay them another \$80-120 to get those families.

Niederstotzingen tapes did not show on the LDS card catalogue at that time, but I would love to know that the tape is now there,or at least have you remind them that I am looking for them still.....

These are the Niederstotzingen, Evangelical Chuirch Records....the Catholic one that have previously been available are not correct and there are in fact separate Evangelical tapes....I am wanting the "church index" and this definately exists....LDS said they had been misplaced in a box and then rediscovered.

Also on that subject is Pauline Koch of Ulm, who is the mother of Albert Einstein.....he was of course a non practicing Jewish person....but because this is so close to Niederstotzingen, (about 9 miles away) I have hunted without success to find her lineage, which I am sure someone has done it already.....because I wanted to follow her lineage a few generations back and find if it leads to Ulm....I don't really want to do the research involved, beyond I was hoping to find someone elses reasearch already completed....I would be able to follow it pretty easilly and see if it takes us into our Koch's....but have never been able to find it....Albert was born, March 14, 1879....I have hunted on line, and also registered on several "Einstein" notice boards, but never had results.

Also, while you are there, perhaps you would want to see Cindy Eaton? She is just outside Salt Lake City....maybe 30 minutes from the library? or so.You two might enjoy meeting up for lunch or something?

We had a really nice visit with her this summer and had a lovely dinner at a "way cool" resturant that was previously owned by "Rockwell" a morman, gun slinger, protector of early Morman leaders, Smith and Brigam Young, I think, and it was really fun and historically interesting.....Just a thought.



Hi James,

I'm sorry, I haven't been home much lately, so I got your email, but hadn't checked it yet. However, I'm afraid the attachment didn't come through. Let me see what I can put together for you on the descendants that I have. Some of the spellings may be different from what you have, but I'm writing them just as I copied them. I've often found many spelling differences in my research, especially dealing with recent immigrant ancestors. Wilhelmenia Kalbus, daughter of Gottfried Kalbus and Ernestine Luebke, married Charles or Carl (seen him listed both ways) Frederich August Pofahl (also seen the name as Pofeil). Kids: Charles, Amilia, Augusta, Johanna (b. Jan 16, 1845), Henrietta (b 1847), and Charles Frederich August, Jr. (b 1853). I'm not sure why there are two sons listed w/name of Charles, if one was supposed to be listed as Carl or if this was some sort of typo on the part of the person from whom I got the research, or what. At any rate, I descend through Augusta. I have nothing further on her siblings. Charles/Carl Pofahl, Sr, was the son of Frederick Pofahl (b abt 1790) and H. Schmisler.

Augusta married Charles W. Pomrening, son of Ludwig Pomrening and ????. Their kids were Bertha, Hannah, Albert, Minnie, Matilda, Paulina, Charles, Herman (b Jun 11, 1875), William A. (twin to Herman), and August. William A. Pomrening m Mary Thiel, daughter of Christian Friedrich Thiel/Theil and Ernestina "Tina" Bacchaus. Mary was b in 1878, and she and William married Mar 31, 1902. Not sure when William died, but he was a widower when Mary died Dec 31, 1914. They had kids Irvin, Irma, and Viola. William remarried to Delia.

Irma was b Oct 16, 1905, and d Sep 15, 1992. She m on April 26, 1924, to Claude Nicholas Sweetalla, son of Nicholas Sweetalla and Lillian ??. Claude was b Dec 30, 1902, d Jun 22, 1963. Their kids:

Darwin Claude (my stepgrandfather), b Aug 2, 1925, d Jun 2, 2001; Marriett; Delvin; Claude Nicholas, Jr.; Veloise; Gary; Gerald; Betty; and Eugene "Spade" (b abt 1941).

Dar, or "PawPaw," as I always called him, married Thelma Juanita "Nita" Brewer after a whirlwind courtship that lasted about 2 or 3 weeks. He, a native of Wisconsin, was in the military; he met Nita ("MawMaw" to me) in her home state of Alabama on a double date. They each had other dates, but during the date, everyone decided to swap. As he was about to be shipped out, he and Nita married and began a family, ending up back in Wisconsin, where they lived until about 1971, when they moved to Georgia. Nita was born Jan 31, 1927, daughter of James Reid Brewer and Willie Lou Bowens. Dar & Nita married Oct 13, 1945; they had 8 kids (6 sons & 2 daughters): Richard Reid "Rick," b Sep 2, 1947. Garret Claude "Pete," b Oct 22, 1949. Gail Louise, b Oct 19, 1950. Carey Gene, b Jul 27, 1952. Debra Luann "Debby," b Oct 3, 1954 (my stepmother). Lonny Darwin, b Nov 17, 1957. Kim Nicholas, b Dec 30, 1960. Todd Lee, b Sep 24, 1962.

Each of the kids has 1 or 2 kids of their own, except for Debby, who had 2 stepchildren by her second husband, my Dad (me and my twin sister Adrian), and now has 4 stepchildren by her third husband. She and my dad divorced in 1989. Debby's brother Rick has a grandson, her sister Gail has a grandson, and Debby has 5 stepgrandchildren (granddaughter Natalie by my sister, and the rest through her current husband).

At any rate, if you're interested in the children of the Sweetalla kids, let me know and I'll put something together for you. PawPaw died last summer; the exact cause was not certain. He'd had heart problems for several years, and it's not known if he suffered a heart attack and then a brain aneurism, or vice versa, but one or the other (or perhaps both at the same time?) took his life. He was a larger-than-life character, and is sorely missed. Please try resending your information, I'd love to get it from you. Thanks

Thought I would pass this on. In those copies I sent last Jan. or Feb. "The Quiet Adventures in North America" on page 137. When I told you about Nicholas Brock marrying Sobriety Hall and thought that maybe he was John's father. In looking at that page today I discover that a Nicholas Brock was in New Castle. NH in 1714 and he married a Elizabeth Holden bef. 1730-34, New Castle being only about 30 miles from Barrington on today's roads, he is listed also in "Early Marriages of Strafford Co." which a copy you sent me. Now this Nicholas, according to Quiet Adventures book, "BROCK, Nicholas, a joiner in Newcastle, NH 1714, mar. Eliz. Holden, dau of John. Nicholas from J (Jersey) fam.?" This Nicholas and Eliz. could be parents of Nicholas of Barrington who is John's father. As far as I can see or find is that there wasn't a Stephen in that time period to be John's grandfather. But there was something I read that you gave me and be darned if I can find it, I thought it was a Stephen who was from an island off New Jersey. I have looked and looked and I can't find it in my file. I will probably find it after I post this. But at the time I saw that, I thought to myself, if that is the Jersey that Tuttles were referring to?

You might want to see if there is a **book on "Portsmouth, NH"** as it might give us more detail. Listed in the Quiet Advent. in Portsmouth were: Andrew Brock, mariner, m. Anna. had a son William (who shows up in Barrington), bought land in Portsmouth 1697; a Francis Brock res. Portsmouth 1686; then Nicholas in Newcastle which is next to Portsmouth.

in the early marriages of Strafford there is a Stephen who married in 1782 that is right time period for John's father, but doubt that as I can't find any of his children born that early. So here is how I am thinking this lineage goes, may be wrong, have to prove first.

There were only two points in favor that John & Lydia were Ephraims parents, birth date and will, we have found no evidence to be absolutely sure of it. John, Nicholas & Stephen seem to be names used in several generations. I can see that many points that Nicholas and Sobierty Hall are John's parents,

time frame that they had a son John and the Hall name used by Ephraim to name a child. If you look at John and Lydia's sons there doesn't seem to be the traditional naming pattern of those years, if so Daniel first son born to John should be named after John's father, second son Stephen could be name of grandfather or an uncle, third son Elijah was name of Lydia's father, fourth son John is after him and also Lydia's brother's name besides being a family name. This guy may be in the Channel Islands as his name sounds French, I asked him where he was in email this morning. He wanted my address, hopefully to send this info to, I gave my PO box in Laughlin as I just don't want to hand out my street address to anyone, specially if I don't know them, think it is safer.

Have you found out anything on that Hall line or found anything new on Nicholas Brock? I think we still need to pursue this as Ephraim got the Hall name from some where and this is the most logical place and naming trends I have found is that grandchildren use grandmothers maiden name as middle name on their own children, have even seen it on Gene's lines, that is how I found some of the wives lines.

Anyhow this is just a short note so you can do research in St. Ouen, Jersey, the name he spelled was Le Brocq, so that is name used over there I guess. Boy this internet is great. If you decide to go on-line let me know and I will make you a list of places with addresses you can go to and etc.

Hi Jim;

Haven't heard from you in a coons age it seems. I owe you \$3.70, but was waiting to get more copies so I could write a bigger check.

I am on-line on the internet and am doing great on genealogy, have gotten about three different lines and gained three more shirt-tail cousins in the Wheeler line. I am still trying to find more proof that the one line is mine. The church bapt. say a "Sammy" was b. 4 April 1823, my Samuel's dc says b.date 23 Apr 1823, which could be in error by accidentally writing the 23 same as year. It also states his father was John & mother Eleanor, but bpt. records say mother is Lena, so would like to get these two items cleared up. I also found Samuel's wife's family, the Miller's, line goes back to 1400's. After sending a letter 5 years ago I got an answer last month which gave me more Hallett information. So now I have John E. Hallett b. 2/14/1835 Waverly, Tioga Co. NY, although he doesn't show in the Waverly History book, I found him and more children in the 1850 census. His father was a Gilbert Hatfield Hallett m. Emily Philipine Tissot, which John uses Hatfield, Tissot & Philipine in names of his children, so I have no doubt about that connection. This line does go back to the Barnstable Hallett's, which you sent me copies of out of the book.

I only do genealogy on the net and have found a BROCK list I joined and get copies of all Brock queries. Just recently there was a new one added on CHANNEL-ISLANDS. So sent a query out on it too on Stephen, but heard nothing. How are you doing in trying to trace John Brock back? In the NH 1776 census there is only a Nicholas Brock listed, and in 1800 in Barrington a Nicholas and a Stephen. If you can think of a good query with more info to send to Brock and Channel Islands lists send it to me and I will put it on the net, anything you might want to put out on the net send to me. In the Oct. 1996 issue of Brock Babblings, James G. Faulconer gave us information on a number of Brocks in early Virginia, some from England, one family from Wales, and the Rudolph Brock family from Germany.

In June 1997, J.W. Doyle, Jr. provided us with variations of the name Brock and advised us to look to Brooks, Brookes, and Broach, especially in tracing one's Brock ancestry in Virginia.

I thought I would provide a little of the English origins of the Brock name as uncovered form a number of sources.

Many alternate spellings of the Brock name are to be found and are typically linked to a common root, usually one of the Norman nobles at the Battle of Hastings (1066). Some of the variations are: Broc, Brock, Brocke, Brockes, Brocks, Brock, Broch, and Broche.

The family name is believed to be traced back to the Normans, who in turn were of Viking origin. The Vikings landed in the Orkneys and Northern Scotland about 870 A.D., under their chief, Stirgud the Stout. Later, under their jarl, Thorfinn Rollo, they invaded France about 940. The French king, Charles the Simple, after Rollo laid siege to Paris, finally conceded defeat and granted northern France to Rollo. Rollo became the first duke of Normandy. Dulke William, who invaded England and defeated the Anglo-Saxons in 1066, was descended for the First Duke Rollo of Normandy.

The first record of the name Brock is found in Essex where Ralph Broc was granted lands in Colchester, in 1119; it is thought he was invited to England to support the need for industrialists and trades people.


Meanwhile, there was a Norman warrior or chieftain, Oyn Porcell/Purcell, who probably married an heiress by the name of Broc, as his son, was known as Radulphus Purcell/Ranulph (or Ranulf) de Brock. Ranulph married in 1166. He had lands in both Kent and Sussex counties. He was of the family who hated Thomas Becket and it was said that it was at one of Ranulph's castles that the conspiracy to murder the Archbishop of Canterbury was planned. Ranulph himself died about 1187.

One of Ranulph's children was Robert de Broc. It is said that branches of his family settled in Shropshire, Cheshire, and Somersetshire and were progenitors of the Broke families.

As for Somersetshire, it is stated that beyond the walls of Ivelchester (or Ilchester), towards Montacute, there was an ancient village called Brook, or the Brook, from where a family of great antiquity derived the name at At-Brook and de la Brooke, the being the place of their usual residence.

The earliest reference I have to this family is William de la Broke/Brooke/Brook, lord of Broke/Brooke Manor near Ilchester in either the reign of King John (1199-1216) or his son, Henry III (1216-1272). This manor continued in the possession of his direct male descendants until the attainder of Henry Broke, Lord Cobham, in 1603.

After 10 generations in direct descent from William de la Broke/Brooke/Brook,

As we discussed this week...the strange mystery of the Gullicks, here are the records that relate to the Gullick family that I have found, and the strange situation that these people are know as "Gullick" in this country but as "Bulkow" in the Drachhausen books.....sometime between 1843-1849 the name changes from Bulkow to Gullick....Bulkow's are fairly prominent family in the books, Gullick family rarely otherwise appears...

the 1840 birth of Frederick says "Gullick"..but this is a sheet of paper added later to the books, perhaps after the name was changed......

The birth dates of these children coincide with the births of the "Gullick children" as recorded in this country. But in Germany their names are recorded as Bulkow. (Had we not already had the dates, I would never have figured out this much!)

CINDY: glad to hear you got the books, perhaps you can decipher something here, what's up with this family? JIM: Your Gullick copies will be in the mail on Friday.

Concerning Charles and William Markusch, in the obit......Obituaries are very helpful and also have alot of false leads in them, as do death certificates....both include information is normally taken from people, often the oldest child, right at the time of their parent's death. These children of the deceased are often knowledgable, but very upset people. Then you have who ever took the information and wrote the article...again newspapers misconstrue so much that I have rarely seen an article that doesn't have something wrong with it.

This and many of the obits I have came from Connie. She spent hours and hours of time one summer hunting these down, every time I thought of someone I did not have, yet in the program, she would go look it up....then she would type them into the computer to me, by email.....It is not impossible that in copying literally dozens of these, that some error could have been made picking up some info from one page and getting it on another.

I find absolutely no other evidence that Charles and William Markusch ever existed.....William of cousre was the name of 2 of Chris's son in laws.....so that could have been a case of just getting confused, by the newspaper, some one who didn't know these people could easily have thought, that's his son and put in William Markusch, instead of Mehlisch, There was also William Hennis......

Because you are the primary source on the Gullick family, I am sending you some details that may (or not) be new.

- 1. Years ago Gerhard Krüger wrote an article on German migration from the Cottbus region and then listed names of people who obtained exit permits. According to him Christian Gullick of Drachhausen migrated to the US in 1853. This date is supported by the places of birth of Caroline (1850 in Germany) and Henry (1855 in US). With this date of migration pinpointed, he would have been the first of the lowa Wends. Do you have any idea what brought him here instead of Australia, Canada, or Africa?
- 2. In the 1900 census he is listed next to Bubner and has a boarder named Fred. Yurth. Yurth is a Wendish name. Have you encountered it any other place?
- 3. Their migration route through England was common at that time and the Wendish colony in Texas used it in 1854. They sailed from Hamburg to Grimsby, England, they by train to Liverpool where ships, empty from the cotton bales, were modified and took passengers to New Orleans. (Or Galveston in the case of the Texas group). Have you checked the New Orleans port records?

Dear All.

In response to a email from Barry DiBernardo (married to Heidi Muschick, previously of Cottbus), Yesterday I called their Aunt Annie Muschick, of Osprey, FL. Barry and Heidi had just been there for a visit and had realized she had been doing research in Germany on the Muschik family.

WOW!!!!WOW!!!! WOW!!!! is all I can say...Annie and I were on the phone for several hours and exchanged lots of information. I could help her with gaps in her research and completed several lines she had not had success with, but she also had really exciting news for us as well! It included lots of new information about the Muschik families!!!

I'll try to itemize some of the new things I learn:

- 1. Annie has a picture from Drachhausen about 1910 vintage, at a village event, that includes many friends and family members of her parents, but they were never labled as to who they were. She is going to take it to a friend and see if she can get it scanned and emailed to us, so we can take it to Drachhausen, or share it with Kristin and Manya, etc., to see if anyone in Drachhausen can ID it. If she can not find a person with a scanner, she will copy and send it to me, so I can scan it.
- 2. For GEORGE: Some of her family A Martin Friederich Bossenz, from Drachhausen, migrated to Canada, with his wife and children in 1868, A cousin of her Bossenz great grandparents, George Bossenz, born Jan 1852
- 3. "Bossenz" name originated from the French. It is not a Wendisch name. The Bossenz' came to the area during the 30 years War and never went back to France at its conclusion. The French name was not Bossenz.....but perhaps Bissene? or something similar, so this became "Wendized" but it is not Wendisch, even though they became a family in Drachhausen for many years.
- 4. JACK: .Annie's family of Muschick's come from the village of "Suechow" I find this on the map spelled "Suschow"

This village is east of Cottbus about 5 or six mile, just about the large town of Vetschau. My guess, about 15 mile cross country to Drachhausen which is North and west of Suschow. She also mentions "Papitz" books for the village of Kunersdorf, where her great grandfather, Christian Martin Muschick came from. This is a microscopic village on the edge of Cottbus. Below are notes on this, that I put in PAF that details this information a bit more.

Annie believes, as I do that all the Muschick families tie into one, if we could only back track the research alittle farther. I can not tie her Muschick's into my families Muschick's or into Jack, or any other of the Muschick families at this time, though it would be relevant on the Muschick research to pull the church books from Suschow and Kunnersdorf......and see if we come up with any more of anyone elses great grandparents!

Annie has done all her family searching on live, site in Germany, so we don't know, what if any the LDS library has on tape from these areas. Since she knows the village names and their stoarge churches...this is a HUGE help in looking for these records!

She has the birth records for all the major peopl on her chart!

2003: Information from Annie Muschick Irmer of Osprey, FL....is that the Suechow church books are located in "Vetschau" though the birth and marriage books were originally listed as "Weissagk" but might also be found under the name of "Maarkisch Hiede", When Hitler came into power he did not like the names of some of the Wendisch Villages So he just changed them. These Suechow Muschick's would be tracked through these books....

However....the first of her Muschick: Christian Martin was born in 1830 in Kunersdorf and later moved to Suechow where he had his children. The books for Kunersdorf are to be found in "Papitz" and hopefully would yield the start of this Muschick line.

5. Now we get to some really crazy stuff!!!!! This is too fun! After much discussion and computer searching we have positively attached Annie Muschick into the Schlodder, Mehlow, Kullowatz, Bubner, Lukas & Liebitize families.

I am attaching a pedigree chart on Annie so you can see this, but of course, these don't always download like they look on the paper, so good luck!

What does it mean??????

Annie Muschick Irmer is a 2nd cousin to Don Schwanke...common relative Martin Schlodder Sr. + Caroline Mehlow Annie is a 2 nd cousin 1 generation removed to Leroy Mehlow, via same grandparents as Don + a 3rd cousin 1 generation removed through his Bubner line Annie is a 4th cousin 1 generation removed to Eloda Yule

Everybody here is decendents Drachhausen!!!! Isn't that fun!!!!!!! All these offical cousin.....except I am a Muschick and so is Annie, and we can't tie it together...Sometimes these Muschick's are so difficult.....Oh,well, you can only prove so much in one day...and this was a bunch!!!

I am making a package of goodies to send to Annie, because she does not have email. They will include her connection to the Schlodders, Mehlows, Kullowatz families as she did not have this reasearch. I will e mail these to Leroy and Barry, who also requested them.....

She has even marked with post-its cards that tell when various families left for America----as these notations are quite small and hard to read in the xeroxes.

I will start translating soon....it is roughly 200+ pages...xeroxed front and back.so perhaps 4-500pages total! ..all in old German! But what a thrill! Just think what we will find out next! Will make a copy and send to Cindy...and we will try to get to work on them!

Below is a computer translation of their letter, difficult, but not impossible to understand:

Dear Cathy, dear Phil,

now we created it entlich.(in total?) The koupierte (The copies of the) church book of Drachhausen goes with the post office to you.

Writes please, if your asking have or email sends. (Probably write or email us when you get it)

In the supermarket we met Mrs. Schnabel. She is already excited and is pleased, (for when we will?) comes it in the autumn to Drachhausen. We come then also to Drachausen and look forward to seeing you again.

Tomorrow we drive to Ernst Schwester to Ingelheim to the Rhine. Ernst Schwester wirol 75 years old. Then it continues to go to east realm. I did not see ever the alps. I am strained like it wirdl

Dear Leroy,

Remember our discussion on the Castle in Peitz?(The fortress is called "Die Festung" or "the Castle")

& that I thought we needed to visit also the "Eisenhutten" & "Hammerwerk" also in Peitz. (The iron works and Hammer factory, used by the Germans, not the Wends in 1500, the Germans were after the Wendish natural resources, wanted to use the area for building their weapons) This is a museum that can be toured today, in Peitz.....(we did not get to this place in either of our visits, but I have a brochure on it, and it looks worth seeing, good chance some of our relatives worked in it.

I looked up.....the castle was built when the "Germans" captured the Wends, 1373 and it was to protect the Germans, not the Wends, from Wends & any other invaders.......Today, it is much restored and is a cool building and museum, in Peitz.

This is from my notes from our first trip to Drachhausen and this is the fortress I think we should visit in Peitz: See below:

THE HISTORY OF THE WENDISH PEOPLE

Because of its location, Drachhausen and the surrounding area was captured repeatedly through out history. They were first conquered by the better armed Germans, in the l0th Century, who introduced Christianity to the area.

They were conquered by Poland in 1002 and then occupied by the Germans from 1373-1625. During this period the Germans built a mighty fortress in Peitz, the largest town (7,000 people) and the parish center for the church. This was about 8 miles from Drachhausen.

The minister of the church took us on a tour of this fortress. We were marched into the Rathaus, or town hall, right through a meeting of the council in session. We went into a small back room, where two young engineers were working on the plans for the restoration of the Fortress. They showed us artifacts excavated from the foundation of the fortress. Some tools' dated back 3000 years. We were given the huge 6" keys to the fortress doors. We climbed several flights of scaffolding and entered the fortress.

The huge and ancient building was made almost entirely of brick, with walls that appeared to be 10 feet thick, going out tunnels to tiny windows that let in the only light.

Though the building had been electrified for work and display purposes, the minister was unable to get the lights on. We lit large candles and proceeded up the steep staired corridors to the top of the building. The upper levels were

half timbered on the inside, with stucco in the middle.

Giant cannons faced out in all directions. Ladders were used to get us up to the small look out tower on top, where we could see for miles in every direction and we looked down on the church steeple.

This fortress was used for the protection of the conquering Germans. The Wendish people had to defend themselves when the area was under seige.

The minister also took us on a tour of the "Evangelisches Church in Peitz" Though this was the parish church for Drachhausen, it had not been built until 1860, three years after the Muschicks left for America.

The interior had been remodeled at some point and appeared to be 1950's in design. The minister took us to the top of its steeple, past the bells, and up crude and narrow ladders to a tiny hole at the top that exited on to the approximately 4' circular top of the steeple. There were no lights, except for the little bit that filtered in through cracks, so this

was done more by feel than anything else. It was very cold and my hands felt frozen trying to take pictures at the top. Though the minister spoke no English, we had great fun on his tour of Peitz. He can be written to at: Evagelisches Pfarramt, Lutherstabe 8, Peitz 7520, Germany.

The Germans also discovered iron ore, around 1500, which became a main source of

industry. The Germans used the many rivers to transport the ore and built dams to develop the fishing industry. Like the rest of Europe, the Black Plague swept through the area, in 1585, killing many.

The Wendish were hunters, farmers, and fishermen.

After the Seven Years War, from 1806-1815 the Wendish were conquered by the French, who burned entire towns to the ground and created great poverty.

In 1830, the area became part of Prussia, under King Frederick Wilhelm III who attempted to force a union between the State Church, of which he was the head, and the Lutheran Church, which was then and is still the prevailing religion of the Wendish. (The Muschicks were Lutheran). The Lutherans were severely persecuted for their refusal to accept the "Church Book."

From 1844-1848 the area was plagued by a great famine and many were starving. Barely recovered, in 1853 and 1854, the potato crops, a staple food in the area, died from blight, causing severe food shortages. Then the summer of 1855 was extremely hot, causing additional crop failures. Though the Muschick family was considered to be one of the most wealthy, the farm was now supporting Mathes and Liese, his three offspring, and their children, approximately 30 people. A shortage of land made it impossible to purchase additional farm land.

In 1857, when the first Muschick's came to this country, they were part of Prussia. The law at the time required that all 11 year old boys be drafted into the army, where they remained into their 30's. Martin Muschick Sr. had already had one son die at a young age. Between difficult times on the farm, religious persecution, and the military policy of the country, and who knows what other considerations, he left Drachhausen, with his wife and 7 children, to find a new life in America.

Sorry for responding so slowly.

- 1. Reisner is an unknown name.
- 2. I know of no list of meanings for Wendish names. A Wendish dictionary may provide hints, and certainly someone who knows Wendish.
- 3. The photos of the Bubner baskets are impressive. If I ever need them, I will get permission.
- 4. This is my limited knowledge of farmer designations. The most common designation for the immigrants was Häusler. He owned a cottage and less than five Morgen of land. (A Morgen is the amount of land a farmer could plow in a morning or between .6 and .9 acres). A Büdner owns a cottage and from 5 to 30 Morgen. A Hüfner and Kleinbauer have up to 60 Morgen. A Kossat owns a house, from 30 to 200 Morgen, and draft animals. A Bauer or Gross Bauer owns 100 to 300 Morgen. At times the word Halb precedes the noun and that simply means half. Wends in the southern part seldom used Kossat, but Halbbauer. The Bautzen area Wends also used the term Gärtner which was the equivalent of a Büdner.

You can get the Wendish book and the CD from The Texas Wendish Heritage Society and Museum, 1011 CR 212, Giddings, TX 78942-5940. I am not sure about the costs.
