Geoff and Enis Saegenschnitter, the Australian Wends, made a stop in State Center, Iowa on their Wendish excursion to the U.S. At Geoff's suggestion, we (brother, Don and Judy Mahlow) met them at the Des Moines Airport. They won us over immediately with their friendliness and their "hang loose" approach to their visit. After we settled them into the local Bed and Breakfast, we took them to Applebee's for supper (still supper in rural Iowa --not dinner) as we were pretty certain they'd find something that met their dietary needs.

Sunday morning, we went to St. Paul Lutheran Church in State Center. Wends attending the services that morning were Geoff and Enis Saegenschnitter of Australia, Jake and Edith Plants of Kansas, Goldie (Schulz) of State Center, Ed (Mahlow) and Phyllis Trites of Boone, Iowa, Paul and Judy (Riese) Tieg of Roland, Ron and Dona Veren and their extended families, Don and Judy Mahlow and Shirley (Mahlow) Schaper, all of State Center.

We had invited all Iowa Wends to join us for food and fellowship at the Country House in Colo on Sunday noon. Geoff had volunteered to talk about the Australian Wends. There were 17 of us so it was a nice sized crowd. Those attending included: Geoff and Enis, Ron and Dona Veren, Don and Judy Mahlow, Shirley Schaper, Goldie Schultz and her guest, Helen Wendel, Ed and Phyllis, Jake and Edith Plants, Richard and Janet Mahlow, Ellen Riese and Marlene Riese. Geoff and Enis included a slide show and movie to go along with his presentation. Lots of interesting information was included.

As a side note---as Goldie was meeting Geoff, mention was made of her father being the last of the Wends who made the trip to Iowa and Geoff said his family was the first making the trip to Australia.

Later in the afternoon, Don transported Geoff and Enis to the Story County Wendish road where most of the Wendish settled on farms when they first came to Iowa . Marlene Riese accompanied them to do the narration of the farm histories. I understand she did an excellent job and we should have a tape recording of that narration. Thanks, Marlene! It was a rainy day so the tour was from the road. They did stop at Ellen Riese's (Mrs. Artie Riese) to look at the barn.

After the farm history tour, Don took Geoff and Enis to the Veren farm to join Ron and Dona Veren, Judy Mahlow and Shirley Schaper. Ron showed Geoff his farm machinery and told of his farming operation. Dona gave them a tour of their farm house. The original part of the house had been built by Ron's Wendish great grandmother (Schmellick) and her husband years ago. We were later joined by the Veren's daughter, Lisa and her children. Enis owns a health store and knows astrology so we had a good visit about those topics. As Don is quite versed on vitamins, supplements, etc., etc., it made for an interesting conversation.

Sunday night we treated them to Bailey's Pizza in State Center --only, they had broasted chicken. Enis likes her chicken!

Monday was a full day. We toured Clemons Cemetery, Hillside Cemetery, St. John Lutheran Cemetery --each time looking at Wendish tombstones. We also showed Geoff and Enis the St. Anthony Christian Church, St. John Lutheran Church and Trinity Lutheran Church in State Center. They had already seen St. Paul Lutheran Church the day before. We were lucky enough to locate the State Center Historical Society president and he gave us a historical tour of Watson's Store, Sheppler Barber Shop and Washington Township one-room country school house. Enis was enthralled with Watson's, as her first job as a teenager was in a store very similar to Watson's.

We were scheduled to go to the Dairy Farm owned by Dona's brother, Kevin Blood, but we canceled. We all took a rest period as it had been a full day already. Geoff and Enis were able to sneak in a short nap and Enis even did a quick load of wash so they'd be ready to journey to Nebraska the next day.
