



Notes.

- (1) The name "Starbuck" is from the old Norse "Starbocki", meaning a great man or leader. It first appears in old English records of the Poll Tax for West Riding, Yorkshire in 1378.
- (2) The name "Gayer" was originally "Gare" meaning a gore of land in North Britain. In the Hundred Rolls of County Kent in the year 1273 is honorable mention of Stephen de la Gare. William Gayer is stated to be in direct descent from Edward I of England. (Starbuck, "History of Nantucket" p 82, footnote). He was from Devonshire, Eng. Was first representative of Nantucket in the General Court after its transfer from the Colony of New York to the Province of the Massachusetts Bay Colony.
- (3) Peter Folger came from Norwich, County Norfolk, Eng. in 1635. Went early from Watertown to Martha's Vineyard, probably with Thomas Mayhew. Removed to Nantucket about 1663. (History Nantucket, p 790).
- (4) Thomas Coleman came from Wiltshire, Eng. in 1635. First settled in Newbury.
- (5) Abiah Folger, daughter of Peter Folger and Mary Merrill was the mother of Benjamin Franklin. (History of Nantucket, p 740).
- (6) At the time of his death, Nathaniel Starbuck was one of the wealthiest, if not the wealthiest, man on the Island. He was Town Clerk for several years. His wife was one of the ablest women who ever lived on Nantucket. Her advice and influence were not unworthy factors in the conduct of affairs. She was the leading spirit of the Society of Friends. (History of Nantucket, p 803).
- (7) Mary, daughter of Nathaniel Starbuck and Mary Coffin, born Nov. 30, 1663, was the first English child born on Nantucket.
- (8) Rachel Allan moved to New Garden, N.C. in 1785. She returned to Nantucket later, where she died.
- (9) Gayer Starbuck, according to "History of Nantucket", left Nantucket Nov. 28, 1774.
- (10) Reuben Starbuck's children were Malinda, Uriah, Elishu, Darius, Lewis, Benjamin, Thomas Clarkson, and Matilda.
- (11) Alexander Nelson appears in the 1780 Census of Guilford Co., N.C.
- (12) Dr. Andrew Gregg, brother of Rachel, was a Mormon and went to Utah about 1876.
- (13) Children of Ogden Starbuck were Nava Opel, Glen, Dale Wheeler, Ann Leal, Mabel, Elishu Bayard, Nelson (died at 19), and three others, Craig, Blaine, and Montrose, who died in infancy.
