Fourthly, I give and bequeath unto my son *Stephen Brock* five dollars, out of my estate.

Fifthly. I give bequeath and devise unto my son Elijah Brock the marsh pasture so called situate in said Town of Strafford also one cow and four sheep or the value thereof at my decease.

Sixthly. I give and bequeath unto my son John Brock five dollars to be paid out of my estate.

Seventhly. I give and bequeath unto my daughter in law Marian Brock widow of my son James Brock deceased, five dollars.

Eighthly. I hereby give and bequeath unto my son Ephraim Brock five dollars, out of my estate.
