Dear Gentlemen,

Enclosed are copies I have made of the Coat of Arms of several families I ordered from you. Unlike a previous Coat of Arms I received these were not colored in. The descriptions on three of them are very difficult and on ones I am asking help on

#1. Ames - Manuscript # 320 Solid CK  
I understand the Chevron is gold, but am not sure how to color the Patent Counter Patent. Could you please show where the Red (Gules) and (Argent) Silver Colors are to be placed - use "R" or "G" for Red or Gules and "A" or "S" for Silver or Argent

#2 Brock Manuscript # 877 Solid P  
It reads as though Red and Silver are to be mixed - first the Argent (Silver) and then put Gules (red) on top - also what color is the lion. Please mark "R" or "G" in the place for Gules or Red and "A" or "S" for the Argent or Silver area.

#3 Sullick's Manuscript # 521 Solid CP  
This is possibly the most difficult of them all. About all I can figure out

is that 3 slanting bars on the right side are to be purple.

What color is the back ground of the purple (Purpure). The other halves all confusing. From the description the colors of Argent (Silver), or (Gold) and Vert (Green) are to be used, but where I don't know. I do not see any color used for the tree or the stag.

As before use "A" or "S" for Argent or Silver use "O" or "G" for Or or Gold., use "V" or "Gr." for Vert or Green

The last two were simple, but I just want to check to be sure

#4 Gutzweiler Manuscript #990 Folio R  
I believe the field is blue and the Greyhound - Grey - is this correct?

#5 Kalbus Manuscript #1354 Folio AR  
I believe the field is red and the stars are silver - is this correct?

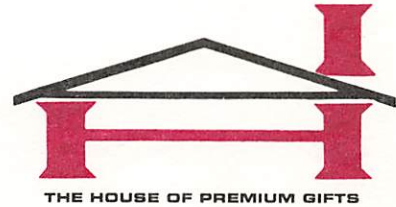

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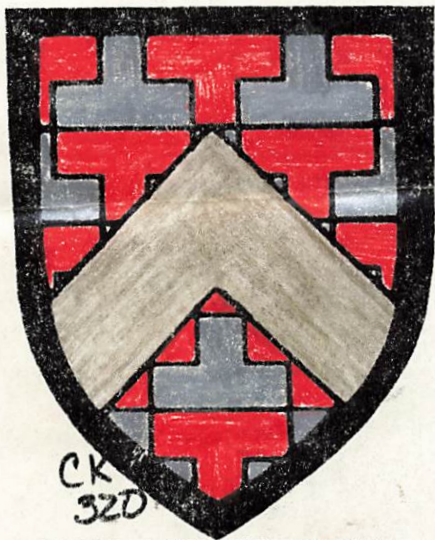
