Concerning Genealogical Research:

The staff of the Archdiocesan Archives is always happy to give reasonable assistance to persons engaged in study of their family tree. However, our microfiche copies of sacramental records may not be handled by the general public but only by authorized personnel. The delicacy of the film, the complexity of the equipment and the sensitive nature of the records all combine to make this restriction a necessary one.

Persons seeking genealogical information are asked to submit their requests in writing to the Archives at the address listed above. Your requests should be as specifically stated as possible. The name of the party whose record of baptism, marriage or death you are seeking should be given as accurately as possible and alternate spellings should be indicated, if you know of them. It is extremely important that we have the exact parish in which the baptism, marriage or funeral took place, since we do not have a general index of all the sacramental records. If you do not know the exact parish, then occasionally the exact address of the person concerned may help us determine the parish. The exact date of the birth, marriage or death will obviously be extremely helpful, but we must have at least an approximate date.

You should be forwarned that some 19th Century records omit information which we consider standard today. Marriage records, for example, do not always give the date and place of the spouses' birth or the names of their parents.

We are always willing to give you a specific record of one of your ancestors, if we are able to do so. We suggest a fee of \$5.00 to cover the expense of office and staff. We regret, however, that we are not able to do extensive research for genealogists. We can consider some requests for a limited search, but our staff and our resources are not adequate for lengthy investigations.

We do consider it both a duty and a privilege to help you, if we can. And we sincerely regret when the limitations of our resources sometimes prevent us from assisting you. Is it ever possible to pay someone to come in and make a general search of the records. I really would like to have all of the Harrigan records. Is there anyone on your staff that could be paid to do this? Have the records been microfilmed and made available in any other way, such as through the Genealogical Library at Salt Lake?

I am interested in locating descendants of a Harrigan family that lived in Cincinnati from before 1850 to at least 1900. My g-grandfather Patrick Harrigan, son of Roger Harrigan and Bridget Doyle, was born in Cincinnati in 1853.

In 1900 Charles Harrigan born 1836 in Pennsylvania was still living on Hatch Street in Cincinnati. His wife's name was Mary and he had a daughter named Isabella living with him. Charles, Jr. born 1864 also lived on Hatch St.

If you have any Harrigan ancestors in Cincinnati before 1900 I would be interested in hearing from you. Do you have any family bibles or any other information on your family? I am interested in all the Harrigans.

My grandfather's youngest sister is still living and is age 87 now. She remembers being taken to visit relatives of the Harrigans named Schaeffer in Cincinnati, way back in about 1910 or thereabouts. Other relatives were Conlins, Doyles, My branch of the family went out to Indiana, Fulton Co.





Dear Ms. Berger:

I hope you will kindly accept my apology that the research you have requested has been so long in progress. My own schedule has been much more hectic and demanding than anticipated, thus the extended delay.

With regards to your request, I have been able to research through some baptismal records, from Saint Peter's in Chains parish, and have located the attached listings. You will note that the variant styles of handwriting does little to aid the search. In particular, I would direct your attention to the attached copy, indicating #193, at the top. I found it impossible to determine, beyond some reasonable doubt, that the name listed is "Harrigan," and not "Hanigan". Perhaps the information at your disposal may be of service in clearing up any question, on your part.

My time at the Athenaeum of Ohio is fast coming to a close. Next month, I will be ordained a priest for my diocese, and will leave the seminary for a parish assignment. I will attempt, in the time I have remaining, to at least complete the search of the baptismal records in question. Any subsequent information obtained in that endeavor will be forwarded to you forthwith. Research of marriage records may need be completed by another person in the Archives, since my own time is drawing short. If I am able to devote some time to the search of marriage records, I will do so, as well.

Since this effort has been more protracted with regards to the time you have been waiting, I would not feel at ease expecting any type of compensation from you. You have been most patient in awaiting even this amount of news, and I could not feel comfortable accepting a fee for the search, particularly when the time it has taken has been drawn out.

### Dear Sir/Madam:

I am writing to you in response to your request for geneological research. St. Mary's is the oldest church in southwestern Ohio, and the oldest German-American church west of the Alleghenies. Because of this, and the consolidation of St. Paul's Church records with ours, we have an extraordinarily large number of sacramental records. There are probably 125,000 entries in our files. Unfortunately these entries are unindexed, written in several languages, and in several forms of script. Because of these great numbers and historical shortcomings and shortage of staff ( our parish operates without secretary or housekeeper) we simply cannot respond to your request.

If there is a pressing need such as the reception of a sacrament or eligibility for Social Security or another welfare program, we will be happy to send you a document from our files. If however your request is for a family tree, personal history, or a "Roots" project, we are unable to honor your request. Because of the frail, faded, and complicated nature of our records, searching through them is a difficult and time-consuming task.

If you are willing to visit the rectory by appointment, you are welcome to look through our record books as much as you wish. The books never leave the house. Please set up a time in advance so that you do not travel a distance only to find no one at home.

If visiting the rectory in person is difficult, I advise that you contact the Archives of the Archdiocese where all the records are microfilmed. Write to: Archives, Attn: Mrs. Pat Heile,6616 Beechmont Ave. Cincinnati,0hio 45230.

Peter moved over to Newport, KY. One of his grandaughters Belle Harrigan was still living there in 1967.

In 1900 Charles Harrigan born 1836 in Pennsylvania was still living on Hatch Street in Cincinnati. His wife's name was Mary and he had a daughter named Isabella living with him. Charles, Jr. born 1864 also lived on Hatch St.

#### Dear Reverend:

I have been searching for the marriage of my g-g-grandparents Rhody HARRIGAN (also Rodney or Roger) and Bridget DOYLE in Cincinatti about 1850-3 and also the baptism of their son Patrick who was born on or about February 15, 1853.

City directories indicate that this Harrigan family lived not far from what is now Holy Cross Immaculata at Pavilion & Guido, but this parish was not established until about 1873.

From the old city directories I have learned that there were a number of parishes in 1850 not far from where the Harrigans lived. I have located some of them which are still in their original location, but I would like to locate the sacramental registers of the other churches which may be now defunct or have changed name and location. Also the old city maps show a canal between the area where the Harrigans lived (now Monastery Road, apparently) and the area of downtown Cincinatti where all the churches seemed to be. I am not sure whether they could easily get across the canal to go to church, or if they had to go around it. This might have influenced what church they went to. I also noticed that some material in the history books I have read indicates that certain of the churches catered to the German Catholics. I don't know if the Irish attended these at all.

At any rate, could you please tell me where I might write to search the sacramental registers of the following:

- 1. Holy Trinity (German) 5th between Smith & Parks Streets
- 2. St. Paul's German corner of Spring & Abigail
- 3. St.Philomena (German) north side of Congress between Pike & Butler (this was probably fairly close to them, if the canal did not interfere)
- 4. St. Thomas west side of Sycamore between 5th & 6th
- 5. Chapel of Sisters of between Broadway & Sycamore (also close by)
  Notre Dame

I have already written to the following parishes for which I located

St. Francis Xavier, 607 Sycamore St. Patricks, Blue Rock & Cherry St. Mary's 123 E. 13th St. St. John Baptist 5356 Dry Ridge RD. St. Joseph, 745 Ezzard Charles Dr.


