Rec'd yours of 27th April past and can understand that you have worked this family of Orndorff for many years, and I also understand that you know more than any other researcher of the family, as I have been down that road many times.

I would hope that you can also see the position one gets in doing research as he first always ask his client to tell him all, as he might get or find data and info already gathered.

With that in mind and after reading over all copies of notes from 1978 on, we realized that when we looked at the tax records for Lebanon County, we only searched the time period of 1779/1780, when Wito Orndorf shows(see 28 Aug 1978), and Jacob Orndorff and Lorentz Orndorff show in 1780.

Preserved copies of tax records for Lebanon Twp, Lancaster County, start c.1750 and not all years are there.

1756

Herman Orendorfe shows with 100 acres of land and this list should be in order of place, so John Miller & Peter Shlosser on one side and John Soiler & Martin Hoff on the other should be close by.

Second list is also from 1756 and all four listed above are listed in same order and all names below are same, but another person made this list and must have been English as Lighty becomes Light and Shlosser becomes Slosser.

1769

Herman Orndorff has 150 acres, 50 of it Cultivate (d), also I house and lot, and is farm(er)

Peter Orndorff shows with 2 horses and 2 cows, no land. (note: Adam Ord owned 1 Nager (Negro) 19 years old)

7772

John Orendorff shows under Inmates and this is first year we found John listed. Which John was this? First off he had to be married, and he should be age 21, but not sure which rule shows. John (Hermans' son) Orndorff 1767-1841 (your info) then must be ruled out. John Orndorff (Doctor) was married by 1767 (your info).

Later on only Orndorff shows and we also copied others for your record. We now have tried to help feed you or update your data and info and know you didn't order more, however have spent several more hours doing it. So if you feel so inclinned, please send us twenty dollars for research.

We copied the only deed indexed Orndorff in Lancaster County records from 1729 till 1825, which is one mentioned by you in our phone conversation.

We next copied the tax records of Elizabeth Township and started in middle and then worked both ways;

1782

John Orndorf, had I house, 5 White Inhabetants (which gives idea of family as you reported you are searching for his children)

1793 & 1794

Mathais Orndorf, paid 5 Shillings tax. John Orndorf was not on list from 1783 on.

1800

Matthias Orendorf, listed as farmer

1803

Mathias Orendorf, last year he was on lists, and no other Orndorf thru 1825

Going the other way (sic: From 1782 back to 1750) we found following;

1779

John Orndorf, no oather (sic: Commonwealth of Pennsylvania had passed their Loyalty Oath in 1777 and it was Tax Collectors job to note on records if one had gone to JP and taken such oath.

He had 50 acres of land.

Assessment of the Nonassociators of Elizabeth Township, August 25, 1777 John Orendorf is on list and paid same amount of 3.10 as others. Associators go back to 1750's and Ben Franklin was among early ones whom formed such a group. It had died out, however after 1775 and then our Declaration it was formed again. In book we wrot on Slaymaker of our area, we cover story about one Amos Slaymaker riding all night to track down these people who traded with British.

From yours of 4 August 1978 & ours of 10 August 1978, you have thought that this John is the Doctor, that Herman was son and perhaps only child born with Margaret, as we noted he be an only heir when land was sold.

Matthias Orndorf above, you think was son by another marriage

Since Herman Orndorf lived in Mount Joy when he sold property, will search there and enclose with this.

Dear Camilla,

Enclosed is what I have promised to you on the Orendorff line. I do not know if much of it is new to you. Thanks also for allowing me to borrow your books and papers,

I am still unsure of who Christine Orendorff belongs to...according to the Lancaster Co. census information on Herman Orendorff she is not reported in 1810 (no female children at all), but there is a discrepancy in the 1820 (there is one female older than 10 so she should have appeared in the 1810), and finally in the 1830 census there are two female children (teenagers) that also do not have the correct ages based on the previous census data. It seems that there could have possibly been some errors.

In order to be able to get a better handle on the parents of Christine it would be nice to get her baptismal record (probably in St. Peter's Catholic Church in Elizabethtown, Pa.?). Another thing that might be worth checking is the marriage of her and John Arthur on the 21st of Jan 1827. It could also be in St. Peter's Church. Another piece of information would be to check on the baptisms of the other brothers and sisters of Christine at St. Peter's to see if there is any pattern to the sponsors. The information which I received from you earlier on the baptismal records were the following:

- a. Mary Elizabeth (Arthur ?) in 1832 by M. C. Egan. Sponsor was John Aronordorf (sp?)
- b. Christina (Arthur?) born 2 Feb 1838, baptised 20 May 1838 Sponsors were Herman and Susan Orendorf
- c. Jannen (sp? John) baptised 18 Aug 1839 (How was this related to Orendorff?)

It was in late 1837 to early 1838 when John Arthur purchased a lot with a house in the village of Newtown, Rapho Township, Lancaster Co, Pennsylvania, but I only know that in the 1830 census there is a John Lampeter township with two male children less Arter listed in than five years of age (i.e. Daniel and Aloysious), and his wife and he are both listed as between 20 and 30 years of age, which would be correct. Where they got married is only a guess, but I would think that St. Peter's in Elizabethtown. It could be possible that only the three children listed above were baptised at St. Peter's, but usually the children are baptised in the church of the parents and not that of the sponsors, for instance. Could it be that Herman and Susan Orendorf was the uncle and aunt of Christina, the baby. This would make Herman the brother of Christina (born 1805). However, that does not sound too likely, since Herman was born about 1760 to 1765. It could be that Herman is Christine's father and that the sponsor for Mary Elizabeth is John Orendorff, her brother who was called John Simon. Alternately, Christina could be the daughter of John Simon ?

Ican't think of anything else at this time, so I will close and get this into the mail. I will send the book and the xeroxed papers of yours in a couple of days when I get to the Post Office. I am looking forward to receiving your information.

I am planning to stop over in Iowa in the next few months on a trip back East, and I will try to do some more research at that time there. I have found out that the Fort Madison, Iowa newspapers are in the Library of Fort Madison and also some more at the North Lee County Historical Society. My mother has looked at many of these newspapers on microfilm at the Ft. Madison Library, but she has found very little to use. However, I will plan to do this myself when I get there. The papers go back to about 1877.

The Parents

The Descendants of John and Christine Arthur

Nearly one hundred eighty years ago on 27 June 1803 a child was born to an Arthur family living somewhere in the state of Maryland. His name was John Baptist Arthur and he is the most distant relative which has been found to date of the Arthur descendants included in this book. Whether John grew up in Maryland or neighboring Pennsylvania is not known, but his parents were both born in Pennsylvania indicating that the family could have been in that place even at the time of the Revolutionary war. No information has been found to indicate the names of John's parents or if he had any brothers and sisters.

John could have originated from around Fredrick, Maryland as there were several Arthur families living there ar that time, but no details have been found. When John was twenty four years old he married Christine Orendorf who was born in Pennsylvania. The marriage took place on 27 January 1827 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Christine probably came from southwest Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, but the exact place is not known. There were several Orendorf families living in that general area at the time of her birth in 1805. Her parents were born in Pennsylvania in the 1700"s also.

1870 census John and Christine settled in or near Lancaster after their marriage as hirthplace and began their family in the year 1828 with the birth of theifirst of thirteen children including one set of twins. However, only nine of these children would grow to adulthood. Seven of thechildren were born in Lancaster and one of these, a twin, died at the age of eighteen months. In April 1838 the family moved to a house which John had purchased in the village of Newtown, Pennsylvania. This village consisted of only eight houses in the year 1842 and is located a few of Lanc. Co. miles southwest of the city of Lancaster. At this place three or four more children were born with one more dying at the age of six months. family moved one more time in Pennsylvania about the year 1844 when their eldest child, Daniel, was sixteen years old. That place was Juniata County, Pennsylvania near the town of Mifflintown on the Juniata river. In the year 1850 John is listed as living in Fermanaugh township. The remaining children were born there, but both of them died there as infants also. ace to land occords index of tuenata to.

Residing in Juniata County, John was a farmer by trade as he was all his life. John did not own a farm in Juniata County, but either rented or worked for a farmer. By the year 1850 the two oldest girls, Mary Elizabeth and Harriet, were working during the summer for merchants in the town of Mifflintown. The older sons worked at various trades. Daniel, the oldest, worked as a plasterer, Aloysious, the next younger, worked as a stonemason and farmer.

The spring of 1851 marked the last move for the Arthur family, but it was to m be their longest one also. Leaving the Allegheny Mountains of Pennsylvania, the family of eleven probably went west to the Ohio river and then down to the Mississippi and thence north to Iowa, probably landing at Fort Madison, or Keokuk, Iowa. Their final destination wwas to be the town of West Point, Iowa, some nine miles northwest of Fort Madison. It was here that John purchased an 80 acre farm and 50 acres of timberland in June 1851. The farm was located only one half mile southwest of the town of West Point on the road to Franklin and Farmington. With this land John and his family could raise animals and grain crops as well as have a supply of wood for fuel and shelter. John and Christine spent the rest of their lives on that farm. Their younger children all grew up in there also.

The Arthur family members were all very devout Catholics by religion which is reflected in the names chosen for their children. No doubt they were all members of Assumption Church in West Point, Iowa since their arrival in 1851 when the Church was only six years old. To this day the Arthur family is of the Catholic religion and some of the descendants have become nuns and one a Brother.

After spending twenty nine years on the farm west of West Point, Iowa and at the age of seventy five, Christine passed away. She died on 29 Tan (or Feb) 1880 and is buried in the Calvary Cemetery of Assumption Church in West Point. Nearly three years later John died on 22 December 1882 and he is buried under the same limestone tombstone as his wife, Christine.

The farm and household furniture of John and Christine was left to the youngest children of John and Christine, Mary Magdeline and Henry for as long as they both shall live. The personal property of John was willed to them also, and his farm equiptment and some grain and hay 7 soll pos was auctioned off on 16 Nov 1883 with Henry acting as administrator to his father's estate. Only six years later, in 1888, Mary passed - records away and Henry them moved on to Kansas City, Kansas where his oldest sister, Mary Elizabeth Burgard was living. Henry was the last Arthur to own a farm in West Point township of Lee County, Iowa. Only James A., the second oldest son, would continue farming, but it would be in south Lee County just west of the town of New Boston. By the time of John and Christine's deaths in the early 1880's their children were living in Kansas City, Kansas; Spangle, Washington Territory; West Point, Iowa; and New Boston, Iowa.



Dear Camilla,

I hope that you had a good time in Boston. Did you have a chance to do any searching while in Massachussetts?

While in Washington area last week, I had a few days to do a bit of searching. I managed to go to the Carroll Co., Maryland Historical Society in Westminister, but did not find out any thing of value. I did find one history on the Arthur and Arter families of that area. About the only thing of value was that they indicated that the names had apparantely originated from the Oerter or Erter or Erder or something like that. I know believe that the Arthur name of mine probably took such a course and the original ancestral home was probably in Germany.

I have included some material which I found while in the Lancaster area. Unfortunately, I had only one and a half days there, but I felt that I had found quite a lot of information. I did not go all of the way through the St. Peter Catholic Church records to locate all of the Orendorfs, but I did include a few. Never did find the baptismal record of Christine Orendorf, but I am convinced that she is the daughter of Herman and Susanna. Herman was the only Orendorf in Mt. Joy township except for Mathias in 1828 and John in 1835. As you can also see, I was able to find another Arthur baptism in Columbia, Pennsylvania at St. Peter Catholic Church.

The only information which I didnot include were the tax lists of Rapho township which listed John Arthur from the year 1831 through 1844. In all cases he is listed as living in Newtown, just a mile north of Columbia and a few miles southeast of Elizabethtown. In the year 1831 I also found John Arthur in Lampeter township and the 1830 census lists him there also.

I have a request. Somewhere in the Lancaster area I missplaced my Orendorf file. Could you send me the sheets which you had given to me before? Also the record of the Reunions held in the 1880's and 1890's in or around Galesburg, Illinois? The sheets which I am referring to are the Orendorf family listings on the LDS forms which you have.

This week I am off to New York, but I will be back on the 8th of Oct.

"8 May 1842 <u>Henricus</u> natus ex Joann Arthur et Christina Orndurff 10⁰ Martii. Spons. Hermanus Eagle et Anna Maria Eagle. D. Kelly"

The pastor is Rev. Daniel Kelly the first pastor of St. Peter's who began on 3 Feb 1842.

The baptisms begin on the 18th of Aug 1829, but there are not very complete and the period from 1830 to 1836 there are no entries.

The better baptismal records begin on 1 Nov. 1844 where the child's name is listed to the left hand edge of the record page.

Marriage records begin about 1840.

Deaths begin 8 July 1846.

No Arthur children names were found in the confirmation records of the following dates, Duodecima (20th ?) Sept 1830, 22 June 1842, 9 Sept 1844, and 26 July 1846.

Records in the earliest book end with a baptism on 31 Dec. 1871.

The cornerstone for the first church laid and the dedication was on 12 Sept 1828 by Coadjutor Bishop F. P. Kenrick of Philadelphia.

Rev. Bernard Keenan supplied Columbia, Pa area from St. Mary's in Lancaster until 1842, visiting the church once a month. Later 1832-33 Fr. Keenan came twice a month, but in the meantime Rev. Francis X. Varian Cooperation of Lancaster was the visiting priest. This is taken from the 150 th: year celebration in 1978, a copy was examined in the rectory. (Note: it appears that Fr. Keenan came from 1828-1842)

Rec'd yours of 14th yesterday, 20th and thank you for same. I want to respond right away to several of your coments and observations;

First off, I do keep all of your letters with notes, data, info. In fact I have 21 dwarers full of such notes (sic: Started in 1933 and now my two grand-daughters, Holly Ann Ochs 10 & Heather Ann Ochs 8 are now starting to file for me as it isn't that I don't have it, it is I don't have it filed in order. Heather is writing a book and one chapter is Filing Forever.) and thats drawers or filing cabinet ones.

Yours of 14th shows three lines;

- 1. Peter Orndorff, Sr (no dates)
- 2. Herman Orndorff (no dates)
- 3. John Orndorff, doctor (no dates)

Your data sheet on 1., called Identify Graph of Peter Orndorff, Sr. reports he came in 1753 with his brother, Johan Conrad, and one Philip Heinrich Arndorff. Only one other, Joes. Orendorff, emigrates in 1765.

How do you know that Peter & Conrad be brothers ?

Do you know what happened to Conrad ?

Do you know what happened to Joseph?

We understand that the John or Johannes is for John the Baptist, to seperate those who are Baptist from the great Anti-Baptist movement of Mennonites, Brethren, Amish and the like. You will find Ully or Uly or Ulrich for Anti-Baptist.

I also have several questions about the family of Herman Orndorff-1778;

Why do you rule out his son being the doctor ?

He had minor children and married children, so this son John could well be married, as you have him getting land in 1767.

Do you know what happened to his sons, Lawentz, Christian, John ?

Going over all of your notes, it seems to me that you assume that Doctor John Orndorff had children not proven.

In your letter of 4th August 1978, you mention Peter shows in 1771 tax list for the township of Lebanon and Doctor there and Heidelberg.

From 1729 to 1785 this area was part of Lancaster County, then from 1785 to 1815 this was Lebanon County, and now Lebanon County.

Going over all notes and data, we think that both Dauphin & Lebanon records should be searched as answers must be there. That is our suggested route to take at this point in your search.

Ornedorf, Anne M., also Adams County, 293

Point is, if you want to find out if they do go back to your line of Herman, they should be traced, get ages on the census, names, place of birth, etc.

Right off, we have two thoughts of relationship, they say Johannes Peter Orndorff was 19 in 1753, and came with two cousins; Johan Conrad Orndorff 30 & Philip Lenrich Arndorff 38

You report that Peter & Conrad be brothers, neither one states source of reference to prove point.

Great words are used in description,
Philip Lenrich sojourned into Chester County, PA,
Johann Conrad wandered into Maryland,
Johannes Peter wended his way to Frederick County, VA
John, Jr, Philip, Jonathan, William, Elizabeth, are mentioned children.

From Mill Wheel to Plowshare,
Julia Angeline Drake & James Ridgely Orndorff,
Cedar Rapids, Iowa;
Herman Orndorff, came in 1737, perhaps son of army officer ?????,
Christian Ohrndorff, later signed Johann Christian Orendorff, father 49, son 15,
John Christian baptized March 16, 1746,
Christian settled in Bethel Twp, Lancaster County,
Heidelberg Twp after 1758, also Lebanon Twp.

Now 7 AM and want to post this as we now have the data we need to find the Common Pleas Court and can tell you now that Hermanus Orndorf of Mount Joy Township was Sheriffed and more will follow as we go to Lancaster County Historical Society (sic: They are closed on Mondays) as there the records are stored.

Deed M-3-572;

Daniel Clark had 300 acres in Mout Joy Twp

5 June 1767, Clark & Mary his wife granted 50 acres to John Orndorf and his heirs as shall begotten (lawfully begotten on the body of Margaret, his wife, and daughter of the Clarks).

This is repeated again, which suggests that he might have had other children, not with his wife Margaret.

Both John and wife Margaret died Intestate and Hermanus Orndorf is their Heir at Law, to whom the 50 acres descended (Estate tail, another suggestion that other children existed as it mentions that both John & Margaret lived up to the Estate tail with words that they never "docked, barred, or destroyed the same ".

Word barred is used again, which means that it was then made known that the land could only come down to children born my Margaret lawfully (sic: Also means that if they had a child before being married, that child could not share in this).

This is all repeated so that John Newman could not be sued by others claiming.

All of above was recorded on the Records of the Court of Common Pleas, 10 May 1803, and recorded on 11th, as well as the deed from Clarks to John Orndorf & wf Margaret.

All done according to the Acts of General Assembly in such Case.

Does this mean because other heirs claimed ?

Does this mean because he had been Sheriffed out ?

We hope to find the answers to these questions today.

Spent two hours plus on this, twenty dollars is the bill.
