Dear Camilla,

I was very happy to receive your letter and happy to get the information that you had on the Finfrock-Orndorff marriages. I did not have this information. I have been researching the Finfrock name and other lines for approximately sixteen years. Recently I decided that I would put the Finfrock material into book form so I have been contacting various publishing companies for the costs, etc.

I have never heard of Roselyn Wallis and Mrs. Buzzard of Illinois. I would appreciate their addresses as I would like to write to them. Can you tell me as to what line of Finfrocks they are connected? I have always separated them by saying the Pennsylvania Finfrocks and the Maryland Finfrocks. Of course, they were closely related. I am of the Pennsylvania ones and I imagine that they are of the Maryland ones.

I think that it is exciting that you have been searching all the church records in Pennsylvania and that you have completed about 90% of them. I have not been as fortunate as you as I have worked for the last seven years full-time and I have only been able to work on my gamealogy in the evenings and on the weekends. I really would be thrilled to receive any information which you might have on the Fififrocks in any of the counties of Pennsylvania or elsewhere.

I read once in a genealogy booklet that Theobold and Dewalt were the same name, only a variation of English and German, but I was rather skeptical about it. It evidently is true.

I also have some military records of Andrew Peter Finfrock who lived in Somerset county, Pa. I think that there is a possibility that he is my ancestor. If he is, then he was married more than once and I am of his first marriage. He lived in Franklin county, St. Thomas township, before moving to Berlin, Somerset county and my g.g.g. grandfather also lived in St. Thomas township, Franklin county.

Michael Finfrock received a draft of 127 acres in Berks county, Robeson township, Pa. In Berks county, Caernarvon township the following took out deeds: Michael Finfrock, Sr. in 1767; Dewalt Finfrock in 1779; Andrew Finfrock in 1779; Jacob Finfrock in 1779; Michael Finfrock, Jr. in 1779; Peter Finfrock in 1784 and Theobold Finfrock in 1770.

Andrew Finefrock was a York County pensioner. He served 1776-1777 as a private in Captain Henry Weaver's company, Colonel Klotz'Pennsylvania regiment. He was placed on the pension roll in 1832 of York County where he died. He was born in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Andrew Finefrock (1755-1836) married Barbara Neitig.

I have enclosed my family chart for you to keep but I have more data on the ancestors before the chart if you would also like to have this information.

I am going to take your advice and send a query to the address which you gave me. I hope that I can find out some information on them. I did write to a genealogist in Strasburg, France who sent me some data in which I paid \$10.00 but I did not receive very much and it was of no help to me. I could not connect them in any way with our family but, of course, if is a possibility that they were related.

That is all for now. Thanks very much for your letter. It was really appreciated. I am happy that you saw my query in Brossman's Benjamin Finefrock and Juliann Culley (both of Martic) - Feb. mmulo2843

Hoping to hear from you again. I really would like any other information which you may have on the Finfrock family and also any data, other than what I have, from the church records.

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Who was the gentleman in Lancaster County that did the research for you? I possibly may have him do some research for me. It may not be possible for me to make a trip to Lancaster co., Pa. this summer, as I hope, and I would like to have this data.

I received a letter from Mary L. Buzzard. She certainly is a very remarkable lady for her age. She didn't wait long to answer my letter - she must be a dedicated genealogist. I had a little trouble reading her writing - I imagine that she may have some difficulty with her eyes.

As to the material on John Jacob and Elizabeth (Orndorff) Finfrock. I am not entirely certain this is the same John Jacob as was the son of Andrew Peter Finfrock and his wife, Anna Margaret. I feel that it is but it is questionable and should be checked out more thoroughly. I found the children listed in the military and pension records (Bible records) of Andrew Peter from the National Archives in Washington, D.C. I also found the death record of Christian Kurts Finfrock in church records at the Fort Wayne Library, Indiana.

I am wondering who "John Jacob Funfrock" (married to Anna Barbara) was? Could he have been a brother to George Henry Finfrock of Frederick county, Md.? I had found the marriage record a long time ago of Anna Barbara Finfrock, widow, to John Martin and could not figure out who she was. At least I now know that she was married to John Jacob. I also wonder who "George Funfrock" (married to Christena) was? It couldn't be (George) Henry Finfrock of Frederick co., Md. (married to Catharine) as their daughter, Barbara, would have been born much earlier than the date of March 24, 1782.

I would venture to say that the "Michael Fivecoats" who took the Oath of Allegiance in Washington co., Md. was probably the same person as the Michael who later went to York co. and died in Franklin co. in 1812. I am corresponding with a lady in Texas by the name of Naomi Fivecoat that insists that Finfrock and Fivecoat are two entirely different names, even though she is corresponding with several other Finfrock ancestors who claim it is.

I need to prove the parentage of my g.g.g. grandfather, Henry Fine-frock, who was born Feb. 16, 1777 in Pa. (probably York co.) and died May 10, 1848 in Clarion co., Pa. I feel so strongly that he was the son of Stephen and Mary Catharine (Moeller) Finfrock but I have been unable to prove it through any records. Some of these early church records are difficult to find - I imagine that a lot of them are missing.

I couldn't remember whether I had sent you a complete ancestral chart of my family or not so I have enclosed it.

Thanks again so much for everything - I am deeply indebted to you.

Dear Camilla,

You have sent me a wealth of information. I don't know how to thank you. You have given me by far more information on the Finfrock family than anyone of whom I have corresponded. You evidently have been researching the Orndorff-Finfrock families for many years. I have been compiling material off and on for about 16 but there have been periods when I had to lay my genealogy aside because of illness in the family.

I can only say that I am so happy that you had the foresight to copy the Finfrock material when you were looking for the Orndorff information. I do not have easy access to the Mormon records as I must travel to Dayton to look at them and even then they have to order it in for me. With my working full-time, it is difficult many times for me to get to Dayton because of one thing or another, such as weather conditions.

You have many good suggestions and I am trying to follow through on all of them. I have written to Lancaster, York, Adams and Franklin counties for deeds and other documents. However, I was unable to find an address for the Adams County Historical Society, except the Lutheran Historical Society Library, at Gettysburg, Pa. Was this the one you were referring to? I also could not find an address for the Lancaster County Historical Society. Have you ever written to them for any information?

I have never seen the spelling of the Finfrock name under "Phina-frock". That is a new version which I will look for from now on. There certainly were a lot of different spellings of the name.


I was first rather amused at the material which you sent me and which was supposedly compiled by H. Lee Finfrock; then shock set in. Almost everything you sent, after the four generation chart was material which I had compiled through the years. I had received a letter from Nancy Kiddoo asking me if I had ever seen the manuscript by Harry Lee Finfrock entitled "The Finfrock Family of America". I answered her that I had not. I had corresponded with Harry Lee Finfrock off and on for several years (not recently, however) and had sent him much material on the Finfrock family as he was new to genealogy and had very little data. After Nancy's letter, I immediately wrote to Lee Finfrock, asking him about his manuscript. He replied that he had it stored away and it would take him some time to get it together. It still didn't sink in, until you sent me the material. He had copied most of my material word for word.

The more I research the more I get confused on this Finfrock family. I am now being to wonder if possibly there were not more than the three Funfrock immigrants coming in the year 1750 (Michael, Sr.) and in the year 1770 (Michael, Jr. and Stephen). I am finding, with your help, too many persons with the same first names. Possibly there were others

Dear Mrs. Berger:

Unfit 1853 all divorces in Maryland were obtained by an act of the Legislature, although from 1829 some evidence in divorce actions was taken by the Equity Courts.

To date, I have been unable to locate exactly what happened to evidence---or, in fact, the bills of complaint. I talked with Phebe Jacobsen at the Hall of Records in Annapolis about it. She was of the opinion that the Official Recorded Copy of the Act of the Legislature would contain the details. I have not followed up on this.*

If you will examine my book closely, you will note a Liber and folio number cited in some early instances. Presumably this refers to the Official Recorded Copy of the Act.

My only suggestion is to write to Mrs. Jacobsen; perhaps she can help you. Am happy to learn the book helped you.

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
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

Dear Camilla,

By your letter, it doesn't sound like jast year was any better for you than it was for me. You lost your brother and I lost my Dad. Like you, I wasn't able to do much genealogy work either but I am now trying to catch up on the time I lost. With my Dad and his age being 86, I knew that I would not be able to keep him much longer but with your brother, that was a different story. It is unbelievable that he would have gone so fast - and at such a young age. I was very sorry to hear about it and hope that you are recuperating from your lost.

I envy you that you were able to make a trip to Maryland and see the old Orndorff farm. You must have had a very exciting time while visiting. It is fantastic that you were able to locate some of the Orndorff stones in the old graveyard. I have always wanted to make a trip to Maryland some time but so far, haven't accomplished it. I would also like to make another trip to Pennsylvania to do some research but it doesn't look like it will be "in the cards" for this year.

On your suspicions about possibly "Frock" being a derivative of "Finfrock". It is possible. Just like another name I have worked on, my husband's family - Pottorf - I have been told that there are descendants of this name named "Potter", so you can never tell about a name. It does seem to be quite a coincidence that The Frocks would be buried right next to Peter and Elizabeth (Finfrock) Orndorff.

I appreciated so much your sending of the Elizabeth (Orndorff) Finfrock and John Jacob Finfrock divorce. I typed it up so I could read it a little better - the smaller print is hard on my eyes - and put it in my notebook with the Orndorff material. It is unfortunate that you were not able to find out anything further about this. If only we could definitely prove who John Jacob Finfrock was. I feel certain that I have been designated in the proper family but I just simply would like to have more concrete proof. It seems unlikely that we ever will.

Would you like to help me further with the Orndorff family? I have enclosed some worksheets on Abraham and Barbara (Finfrock) Orndorff and family and Peter and (Mary) Elizabeth (Finfrock) Orndorff and son. Did Peter and Elizabeth have any other children, besides Henry, as this is all I have listed? Anything you might be able to add to the sheets would be most helpful.

Recently, I made connections with a gentleman from Pennsylvania that is a descendant of Andrew Peter and Anna Margaret Finfrock of Somerset co., Pa. This is the line in which I believe Elizabeth Orndorff married into - their son, John Jacob. I was hoping to find someone that could give me more definite information on this family but, unfortunately, this man knew very little about his ancestry - could only go back to his grandparents. Anyway, I will keep trying and may be I will be able to find someone else who may know more.

I have never asked you - how are you related to the Orndorffs? Through Abraham and Barbara or Peter and Elizabeth?

We have had a rather cold spell since the holidays and quite a bit of snow but it is beginning to melt and warm up. It has limited me to what I could do on my genealogy but may be I can do some traveling again since the weather is getting brighter.

That's about all for this time. Take your time about the worksheets as I don't need them for quite awhile.

Dear Camilla,

It has been a long time since I have heard from you so decided I would drop you a few lines to see how your Orndorf/Finfrock genealogy research is coming along. I am still researching the Finfrock lines but for a period, I was forced to shelf it. My Dad took ill last Jan. (shortly after the holidays) and was ill through Aug. 2nd when he passed away. He was in the hospital the entire time and I finally decided to quit my full-time job as there was just too much pressure on me. Then, on Sept. 22nd after Dad died, we had a disastrous fire and almost lost everything. Luckily we were at home at the time, and could call the fire department immediately. It happened during a severe thunderstorm and we were hit by lightening. I carried out all of my genealogy material so fortunately it was all saved. We had a lot of smoke damage, besides, losing one bedroom but we have it all cleaned up now and are back to normal.

I am still trying to straighten out the mystery of the "John Jacob Finfrock" who married Maria Elizabeth Orndorf, grand-daughter of Henry and Catherine and daughter of Abraham and Barbara (Finfrock) Orndorf. I firmly believe him to be the son of Andrew Peter and Anna Margaret Finfrock of Berlin, Somerset co., Pa. who also lived in Frederick co., Md. and Franklin co., Pa. I have not been able to prove this - have you? I am enclosing copies of 2 pages from Andrew Peter Finfrock's Bible and also the translation of the German by a German lady from this area. Some of the writing she could not decipher. On page 2, in English writing is George H. Finfrock, Anna Margaret Jones, Elizabeth Finfrock, (John) Peter Finfrock and Cristian Kurts Finfrock. I believe the four Finfrock children to be the offspring of John Jacob and Maria Elizabeth (Orndorf) Finfrock. The Berlin Lutheran church records list Peter Finfrock (above) as John Peter. It seems so logical that these children would be Maria Elizabeth's because of the similarity of the above names: George H. and John Peter.

I have been corresponding regularly with Roselyn Wallis who told me that you have a copy of the divorce of Elizabeth Orndorff Finfrock which took place on March 1, 1832 according to the Reference Laws of Maryland, Chapter 152, Session 1831. In her petition Elizabeth asked that money due her from her grandfather's estate (Henry Finfrock) be paid directly to her and that her husband receive none of it." Would it be possible for you to send me a copy of this? Also, according to Darius White Orndorff, Elizabeth married as her second husband, Joseph Reaves. Do you have any other information about Elizabeth and her 2nd husband, such as any children, etc.? He also gave her death date, I understand, as May 19, 1867. I would like anything else which you may add to the above.

If I can help you in any way, don't hesitate to ask as I appreciate all the help you have given me in the past.

That's about all for now. Hope the New Year will be a good one for you and your family.

Weybright, the gentleman in question, who entered upon his new duties under Clerk Fitzpatrick on January 1, 1907, is a young man of popular manners, excellent education and good business qualifications, with a large capacity for making and holding friends. He was born September 8, 1875, in Washington township, Whitley county, Indiana. His parents, Martin B. and Mary E. (Smith) Weybright, were old settlers of Whitley county, the former coming here in 1837 and the latter in 1850. They were respectively natives of Montgomery and Wayne counties, Ohio, and were married after coming to Whitley The father died in September, 1899, but his widow still lives on the farm in Washington township, where she went to housekeeping as a bride more than half a century ago. This worthy pioneer couple became the parents of eight children: William H., now on the home farm; Keziah, wife of Henry Benner; Belle, wife of John Faudree; Sherman E., clerk in the quartermaster general's office at Jeffersonville; Nelson and Allie, deceased; Charles E. and Harley, a resident of South Whitley. The parents were members of the Baptist church and the father became attached to the Republican party at its foundation. On coming to Whitley county, he entered seventy acres of wild land, which he eventually improved into a valuable piece of property. Charles E. Weybright, seventh of the children in order of birth, had a yearning desire to obtain a good education from his earliest boyhood and as he had a natural adaptability his wish was gratified before he was

called to enter into business affairs. Besides attendance at the common schools he had the benefit of one term at the Valparaiso Normal and one in 1896-98 at the Terre Haute State Normal. During this period and later he had ten years' experience as a teacher, four in the common schools and six in the graded schools at South Whitley. In 1903 Mr. Weybright was appointed deputy in the office of County Auditor Charles E. Lancaster and retained that place until he resigned to assume his new duties at Indianapolis.

June 14, 1904, he was married at South Whitley to Miss Blanche, daughter of George and Ella Allen. Mr. Weybright is a member of the Knights of Pythias, of the County Officers' Association of Whitley county and for three years has been secretary of the Republican county central committee. Mrs. Weybright is a member of the Methodist Episcopal church and popular in the social circles of Columbia City.

This name, now so familiar throughout northeastern Indiana, was first heard of in this section of Allen county when George W. Orndorf settled on a farm in Lake township in 1846. He was successful in his business affairs and in 1876 removed to Churubusco, where he died a few years later in his seventy-second year. He married Eva Spinks, who bore him eight children, of whom John W. Orndorf was the fifth. He was born in Allen county, Indiana, February 9, 1854, and grew up on his father's place

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with the usual experience of farm boys. This consisted in working during the summer and attending school in the winter, his educational acquirements being supplemented later by one year's term at the select school in Churubusco. His first business venture was as a teacher in the schools of his native district, which occupation he followed for four consecutive terms, during this time attending the normal at Valparaiso and spending his vacations at work on the farm in the summer seasons. In the fall of 1877 he went south and remained there two years looking after some real-estate interests of his father. In the spring of 1879 he returned to Churubusco and accepted a position in a hardware store, owned by his father and William A. Geiger. After a year he joined his father in purchasing the Geiger interest, but disposed of it by a resale before the end of twelve months. In the spring of 1882 Mr. Orndorf was elected justice of the peace and after serving four years was admitted to the Whitley county bar, since which time he has been in active practice of the law at Churubusco. In July, 1887, he was appointed postmaster by President Harrison, served four years and acted a year as deputy prosecuting attorney under John C. Wigent. In 1886 he was candidate on the People's ticket for clerk of the county, but was defeated by Samuel P. Kaler by about three hundred votes. In the spring of 1906, Mr. Orndorf was nominated as a candidate of the Republican party for state senator from the district composed of Whitley and Huntington and was, elected the ensuing November by a majority of three hundred and sixty-one votes, carrying both counties. He has enjoyed other po-

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litical honors, having been chosen delegate from the twelfth congressional district to the national convention which nominated Theodore Roosevelt for the presidency in 1904. He has also served in various state and county conventions of his party. In fact, he is easily the leading citizen of his community and one of the most prominent as well as most popular of Whitley county's public men. He is interested in lands in Whitley, Steuben and Noble counties and owns land in Kansas and South Dakota besides other valuable property. In April, 1906, he sold his law practice at Churubusco owing to pressure on his time arising from other duties, and his friends feel confident he will make a hard-working and influential member of the state senate.

In October, 1881, Mr. Orndorf was married to Miss Jennie, daughter of William G. and Nancy Hyatt, who were old settlers of Allen county. Mr. and Mrs. Orndorf have an only daughter, Miss Ila, and the family are welcome in the best social circles of the county. Mr. Orndorf is a member of the Masonic fraternity and with his wife and daughter also holds membership in the Eastern Star. Mrs. Orndorf is a member of the Methodist Episcopal church and takes an active interest in the work.

GEORGE W. ORNDORF was born in Franklin County, Penn., June 9, 1824, the son of John and Barbara (Stewart) Orndorf, and is one of the two living of their family of three children. The father moved with his family to Richland County, Ohio, in 1836, where he engaged in his vocation of farming. There our subject was reared, and there he married, January 14, 1845, Eve Spinks, and thence emigrated, in 1848, to Eel River Township, Allen Co., Ind. A year later he moved to Lake Township, and in 1877 came to Churubusco. He had learned the carpenter and joiner's trade in 1842, began married life with little or no means at his command, and had but \$12 in cash after paying his expenses of removal to this State, had a wife and two children, and no household goods. By thrift and industry, however, he has acquired a good farm of 104 acres in Allen County, as well as valuable town property in Churubusco. He and wife are the parents of eight children, viz.: Priscilla, Mary, Barbara, John, Talitha, Ellen (deceased), George (deceased), and Ida Of the above, John W. is a leading young man of Churubusco. He has received a good education, has taught school, is married to Jennie Hyatt, is now studying law, and is a Justice of the Peace of Smith Township. The parents of George W. Orndorf moved to Allen County in 1854, where his mother died in 1873. His father moved to Churubusco in 1877, where he died in March, 1880. The family is an old and respected one of Churubusco and

ABRAHAM PENCE was born in Fayette County, Ohio, December 19, 1818, and was one of the eleven children born to George C. and Sarah (Windel) Pence, the former a native of Highland County, Ohio, and the latter of Shenandoah County, Va. Our subject came with his parents to this township in 1836, and has since resided on Section 19, where he was employed on his father's farm until twenty-two years of age, when (in August, 1840), he married Nancy Buckley, a native of Holmes County, Ohio. To their union were born eight children, of whom four are living. Mrs. Pence died in Smith Township in June, 1866, a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church. May 7, 1867, Mr. Pence married Mrs. Sarah (Hyre) Humbarger, a native of Montgomery County, Ohio, and daughter of Wesley and Susan (Van Schaick) Hyre. Third, Last month I spent a day at the York Co. Pa His Society. They have many church records from Adams and York counties. Adams Co is directly above Carroll County. In some of the early records, in the indexs, I ran across the name Orndorff several times. I did not take notes because of the limited time and not knowing what you have searched and what you still need.

I received the copy of the letter which you sent to Nancy Kiddoo in regard to the children of Josiah Finneyfrock. I was happy to get this additional information to add to my records. I have worked very diligently on this particular line to try to prove his parentage but no success. I am beginning to wonder if he wasn't possible one of two things. Either a possibility that he was illegimate as I come across quite a few in the earlier days or whether he could possibly have been a child by a first marriage of the mother and taken the name of a step-father (Finefrock). I need to write to Nancy Kiddoo again and will relate my suspicions.

I have a correspondent who is probably a descendant of Daniel Finefrock of Washington co., Md. so she is interested in his administration papers of 1837. She wrote to the Washington co. courthouse who referred her to the Hall of Records so she is now waiting for those papers. I certainly hope that it will reveal the names of his children and consequently prove her line.

In one of your letters to me, back in Dec. 1979, you mentioned that you had a gentleman do some research for you in Lancaster co., Pa. at the courthouse and that he did a pretty good job for you. Could you possibly give me his name as I am interested in contacting him? It does not look very promising that my husband and I will be able to make a trip to Pennsylvania this year and I do need to have some research done. I am trying to tie up loose ends so I can possibly start typing up a manuscript this year some time. Also I need research done in Berks, York and Adams cos., Pa. Do you know anyone who would do me a good job in these counties also?

One time you mentioned that you had seen the variation of the Funfrock name, such as "Phinafrock". In all of the research I have done I have never seen this particular spelling. Can you tell me where you have seen it in this form? I thought I would try to give a complete list of all the different spellings. This is what I have come up with - would you have anything to add?

Received the data about the "Diary of an Old German Midwife". It is fortunate for me that you keep finding Finfrock data, but am sorry you seem to find more of my line than the Orndorff line.

I am happy to relate I know which line Jacob and Michael Finfrock belong. In fact, it is a line which I have been devoting extra time and thought as I am especially interested in proving the children of these gentlemen. Jacob and Michael were brothers and sons of Theobald and Rosina Magdalena (Rau) Finfrock of Lancaster, Pa.

The information which I have on Jacob is, as follows:

Jacob Finefrock, Sr. - born in 1775 New Holland, Lancaster co., Pa. married Anna Montgomery Feb. 22, 1798 Lancaster, Pa. Their children:

- 1) Elizabeth Finefrock born Feb. 25, 1804 Providence tp., Lancaster co., Pa. bapt. July 1, 1804, sponsor: Anna Montgomery in the New Providence Reformed church, Lancaster co., Pa. Note: The date above and date from your sheet matches: 1804 hornung 25 for iocob finfrock. Isn't that exciting!
- 2) Susan (Betsy) Finefrock born in 1810, married Joseph Boley.
- 3) Emanuel M. Finefrock no birth date
- 4) Benjamin M. Finefrock born June 14, 1814 Lancaster co., Pa., married Anna Hains July 21, 1839 Lancaster, Pa.
- 5) Christian M. Finefrock no birth date.
- 6) Henry Finefrock no birth date
- 7) Jacob M. Finefrock born in 1824 Lancaster co., Pa.

Unfortunately, only the one date matches. If only I could match up the other dates with the above persons. The date of 17 May 1805 in the amount of 0.15.0, I assume must have been for "twins" as the midwife charged almost twice.

The information which I have on Michael is sketchy as far as his children:

John Michael Finefrock - born March 13, 1780 New Holland, Lancaster co., Pa. married Elizabeth Reiss Oct. 14, 1800 Lancaster, Pa. Their children:

3) Isaac Finefrock - born cal815 Lancaster co., Pa.

I have several other children listed for Michael and Elizabeth but they have not been proven:

and I am sure there were more.

What language is the word "hornung". I have both German and French dictionaries but do not find this word in either one. I am wondering why the name Michel would be spelled or abbreviated as "meig". It seems rather peculair but it does appear that it is Michel as both Jacob and Micael Finefrock were in Providence tp., Lancaster co., Pa. vicinity at the period of these births.

I will try to check out this film at the Mormon library some time. At the moment, I am too busy trying to catch up on all my correspondence, and have been writing letters "like mad" to France and Germany trying to prove my Funfrock lines. No luck to date but I haven't given up yet.

Keep up the good work and let me hear from you again. I will forward on to Nancy Kiddoo a copy of the midwife information.

Christian Orndorff was witness to naturalization of Henry Weshenback, German, on 20 Sept., 1764 at Annapolis. In March, 1768, Frederick Co., 65 residents of the county petitioned the court for relocation of the road from Christian Orddorff's Mill to Captain Luckett's Ferry (Fredk. Co. Judgment Records, Liber P-7). The court appointed Christian Orndorff a commissioner to report on a new route. ...etc.

How is your genealogy coming along ? It gets very tedious after exhausting the obvious resources, doesn't it ?

Dear Mrs. Wilcox,

I recently received your name from Camilla Berger, who wrote me that you are compiling a history of the FINFROCK family. If you plan on publishing a book on the family, I would be most interestedin purchasing a copy of it. Could you let me know where I can write for the book?

Camilla visited me last May (1980) with her parents, and we went around the countryside searching for ancestral homeplaces. She and I share a mutual Orndorff line.

In her latest letter, she said she believes that the Finfrock name and my surname, Frock, are related. She bases this on the closeness of family ties in early church records here in Maryland, as well as in Penna.

She noted that the Finfrock clan came from Berks County, Penna. And the only Frock tie outside of Maryland is to Berks Co. A certain Magdalena Frock was born 1813 in Berks county, Pa, but was living near my region.

If you have any information on a possible tie between the FROCK and FINFROCK families, I would appreciate any leads. So far, I have traced my surname back to 1775 in Maryland, but have absolutely no connection back to their place of origin in Penna. I do know that the original German spelling was Frack, and there is a northern Penna community known as Frackville.

I do have in my possession some Lutheran and Reformed church records from Silver Run, Md (which is located 2 miles south of the Penna border). There are some Finfrock names contained in those records that I can search, if you don't already have them.

At any rate I would like to hear from you, wheteher you can help me or not. Thank you for your time.

As you are, no doubt, aware the Brethren kept very few records; and if any exist, they would likely be personal records of one of the members.

In 1917, Otho Winger published THE HISTORY OF THE CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN IN INDIANA. On page 33 he gives a short history of the Baugo congregation and states that it was organized in 1868. It was formerly a part of the St. Joseph congregation, and included the western part of Elkhart County and the eastern part of St. Joseph County. Winger named the ministers and deacons of the congregation, but the name Orndorff does not appear in the list.

I have done only limited research in the St. Joseph - Elkhart County area, and that was mostly in connection with the Frame family. They were on Portage Prairie in the northwest part of the county.

You would probably be able to identify the son of John in the 1850 Federal Census. From this clue, you might identify him in the 1900 Federal Census, and there you would find quite a lot if information regarding his family.

This is about all that I can offer; sorry that I can not provide more help.



GEORGE HENRY FINFROCK

Born in Germany, around 1755, and the son of either Stephen or Michael Finfrock (der Yung): immigrating to America with his parents aboard the ship "Minerva" on October 1, 1770, from Rotterdam to Philadelphia.

On page 334 of "A Genealogical and Biographical Record of Miami County" by The Lewis Publishing Company - Chicago - 1900, the following article related to Uriah Valentine who was married to Harrietta Finfrock:

" It will be interesting in this connection to note something of the Finfrock family, to which Mrs. Valentine Her great grandfather was a native of Germany, and her grandfather, GEORGE HENRY FINFROCK, was born in that country, whence he came to the United Sates in early manhood. On reaching this country, he was sold to pay his He settled near Lancaster City, Pennsylvania, passage. where he followed the blacksmith's trade. He was an excellent mechanic and his mechanical ability was often displayed for the benefit of the boys of the neighborhood, for whom he manufactured jewsharps. He was always a friend to the young people and did what he could to make their lives happy. Both he and his wife were members of His children were as follows: the Lutheran Church. John, who made his home near Chambersburg, Pennsylvania, until his death; Peter, who married Barbara Palmer and was a wagon-maker by trade, following that pursuit until his removal to Miami County, where he developed a farm in the midst of the forest, in what is now Newberry Township, making his home thereon until his death; and George Henry."

IMMIGRATION DATA

One of the oldest and best books of compiled names of Pennsylvania German Pioneers is I. Daniel Rupp's "30,000 Names of German and Swiss Immigrants to Pennsylvania between 1727 and 1776".

Rupp says, in part: "While the Synod of South Holland was in session in Dart, 1731, 800 exiled Palatinates passed through the place to take ship at Rotterdam for America". There were great numbers of those refugees who left the Rhine and took refuge in 'England and Holland until ships could be secured to bring them across the ocean, which accounts for the "Holland" tradition.

On page 246, Volume 1, "MICHAEL FÜNFROCK" was listed as having arrived in Philadelphia, aboard the Ship Sandwich on November 30, 1750 from Rotterdam. There were 200 passengers aboard and Captain Hazelwood was the Master.

On page 391, Volume 1, of this collection of Pennsylvania German Immigrants, it tells that "STEPHEN FÜNFROCK", and MICHAEL FUNFROCK THE YOUNGER", arrived on the ship "Minerva" in Philadelphia Harbor, on October 1, 1770 from Rotterdam; Thomas Arnott was Master. Stephen and Michael Fünfrock were brothers and the sons of MICHAEL FÜNFROCK (Sr.) It is believed that another FUNFROCK was also aboard (GEORGE HENRY FINFROCK) and because of his young age was not listed as a passenger. Children under 15 or 16 years of age were not listed on the Passenger Lists. If this be true, then I am inclined to believe he was the son of either Stephen or Michael Fünfrock the Yungere; rather than Michael Fünfrock der Alsere, who preceded him to America 20 years.

In the three volume work "HISTORY OF THE PENNSYLVANIA GERMAN PIONEER" by Strassburger and Hinke, this same information is given on page 730, Volume 1. Only Stephen's name is spelled "Staffen". These three immigrants were all from the Palatinate section of Germany (Bavaria). Incidently in Volume 2 of Strassburger and Hinke's book, on pages 525 and 844, contain the signatures of these early Finfrocks when they pledged their Oath of Allegiance to the King of England; copies of these signatures are included elsewhere in this write-up.

Many people were indentured; that is to say, they were bound as servants for a certain period of time, say two or three years, to work out their passage overseas. These passages was a considerable amount for them to pay and it often took years of savings, and even then, in many cases, they left their families behind to send for them years later when they had made their fortune in the new land.

GEORGE HENRY FINFROCK was indentured for his passage to the America in 1770; the indentures were sold at Willing and Morris in Philadelphia.

TAX RETURNS

Excerpts from the Pennsylvania Archives. This return is from Lancaster County - Earl Township (this is very near Robeson Township, which is across the county line in Berks County).

THIRD SERIES

Volume 17, page 278 - In 1772, Henry Finfrock was listed among "inmates" and paid 2 pounds and 6 shillings tax.

Page 498 - In 1779, George Fenfrock was listed among "inmates":

Page 830 - In 1782, Peter Finfrock was listed as a "single freeman" and paid 4 pounds and 14 shillings tax, in Leacock Township, Lancaster County.

Page 844 - In 1782, in Carvarvon Township,

Henry Finfrock was listed, as owning 1 horse, 2 cows and paid 1 pound

2 shillings and 6 pence tax.

Berks County - Carvarvon Township

Volume 18, page 24 - In 1767, Michael Finfrock was listed, a farmer, owning 100 acres of land, 1 horse and 2 cows; paid 2 pounds tax.

Page 113 - In 1768, same data as above, except 3 sheep and 2 horses were also listed for Michael Finfrock.

Page 212 - In 1779, <u>Dewalt Finfrock</u> had 45 acres and 2 cows; <u>Jacob Finfrock</u> had 100 acres and 4 horses; and <u>Michael Finfrock</u> was listed as having 2 cows. Among "single freeman" was <u>Andrew Finfrock</u>, who paid a tax of 11 shillings.

Page 345 - In 1780, <u>Jacob Finfrock</u> had 120 acres, valued 70 pounds; <u>Dewalt Finfrock</u> had 50 acres and 1 cow, valued at 24 pounds; <u>Michael Finfrock</u> owned 1 cow, valued at 7 pounds; and <u>Michael, Jrl</u> owned 2 horses and 3 cows, valued at 17 pounds.

Page 471 - In 1781, <u>Dewalt Finfrock</u> owned 50 acres and one cow and paid 13 shillings and 3 pence tax; <u>Michael Finfrock</u> owned 100 acres, 3 horses and 3 cows and paid 1 pound, 13 shillings and 9 pence tax. Another <u>Michael Finfrock</u> was listed (probably junior) with 1 cow and paid 9 pence tax.

Page 600 - In 1784, Peter Finfrock owned 50 acres, 1 horse and 1 cow; Andrew Finfrock owned 50 acres and 1 horse:

Dewalt Finfrock owned 50 acres, 1 horse and 2 cows; and listed among "single freeman" was Peter Finfrock, who paid 2 pounds tax, and Andrew Finfrock who also paid 2 pounds tax.

' Page 731 - In 1785, Peter Finfrock paid 11 shillings and 6 pence tax. Among "single freemen" was another Peter Finfrock who paid 15 shillings tax.

York County - Manchester Township

Volume 21, page 13 -- In 1779, Michael Finfrock had 3 horses, 3 cows and paid a tax of 12 pounds, 18 shillings and 6 pence.

Stephen Finfrock had 3 horses, 3 cows and paid 13 pounds, 18 shillings and 6 pence tax.

Page 184 - In 1780s, Michael Finfrock and 2 horses, 3 cows and paid 7 pounds and 10 shillings tax. Stephen Finfrock had 2 horses, 3 cows and paid 8 prounds and 15 shillings tax.

Page 369 - In 1781, Michael Finfrock had 3 horses, 4 cows and paid 1 pound, 6 shillings and 4 pence tax. Stephen Finfrock had 4 horses, 4 cows and paid 1 pound and 12 shillings tax.

Page 496 - In 1782, Michael Finfrock had 3 horses, 4 cows and paid 2 pounds, 10 shillings and 1 pence tax. Stephen Finfrock had4 horses, 4 cows and paid 3 pounds, 2 shillings and 6 pence tax.

Page 677 - In 1783, Michael Finfrock was listed as having 6 inhabitants on his property; Stephen Finfrock was listed as having 9 inhabitants and owning 150 acres of land.

Berks County

Volume 26, page 261 - Under "warrantees of land", Theobold Finfrock was listed as having 70 acres, date of survey, October 18, 1770.

Michael Finfrock, 30 acres, date of survey, May 12, 1773; Dewalt Finfrock 33 acres, date of survey, April 14, 1774; and Peter Finfrock, 127 acres, date of survey, January 14, 1786.

THE FINFROCK'S IN REVOLUTIONARY & POST-REVOLUTIONARY PERIOD

Excerpts taken from "The Pennsylvania Archives"

THIRD SERIES:

Volume 6, page 436 - From the accounts of Lieutenants in Lancaster County; Captain Elliot's Company: HENRY FINEFROCK was in the first class and paid a fine 200 shillings to Robert Good, Esquire, for non-attendance on days of militia exercise.

Volume 7, page 108 - STEPHEN FUNFROCK was fined 6 pounds by John Hay, Esquire, and as in Captain Herman's Company, 7th class of Youk County Militia.

Volume 23, page 423 - In Captain John Roland's company, GEORGE FINFROCK was listed among "associators" in the Pennsylvania Militia, in Leacock Township, Lancaster County, on a payroll dated July 5, 1775.

Page 544 - On a list of York County Pensioners, dated January 7, 1833, ANDREW FINFROCK was listed as having served as a private in the Pennsylvania Militia. His age in 1833 was listed as 78.

FIFTH SERIES:

Volume 5, page 217 - Among the officers of the 8th Company of Barks County Militia, Ensign JACOB FINFROCK was on a payroll dated May 17, 1777.

Page 238 - In Captain John Ludwig's Company, Sergeant PETER FINFROCK served in the 6th Battalion of the Berks County Militia, commanded by Colonel Joseph Hiester, on a payroll dated from August 10, 1780 to Sept 9, 1780.

Volume 7, pages 468-469 - The following was a return of the company of Lieutenant Samuel Elliot, of the Lancaster County Militia, in 1779: In the 7th class was ANDREW FINFROCK; and in the 1st class was HENRY FINFROCK.

Page 471 - On a return of the officers of the Lancaster County Militia was Ensign ANDREW FINEFROCK, Listed in the 2nd Company of the 5th Battalion, under Lieutenant Colonel Jacob Carpenter, and also listed was Ensign GEORGE FINFROCK in the 3rd Company on a return dated August 26, 1780.

Page 472 - A list of the first class of the 5th Battalion of Lancaster County Militia ordered to Northumberland County in October 1780, in Captain Elliot's Company, was HENRY FINEFROCK.

-FIFTH-SERIES-(Continued)

Volume 7, page 473 - On Captain's Elliots payroll dated May 2, 1781, private first class HENRY FINFROCK was listed; and also Ensign ANDREW FINFROCK.

Page 511 - On a return, dated April 15, 1783, listed Ensign ANDREW FINEFROCK in the 2nd company, 5th Battalion of the Lancaster County Militia; and Ensign GEORGE FINFROCK was listed in the 3rd Company, under Lieutenant Colonel Jacob Carpenter.

Page 810 - In captain Henry Weaver's company of Lancaster County Militia, Colonel Peter Grubb's Battalion, was listed Corporal ANDREW FINEFROCK on a return dated August 29, 1776.

Page 969 - In Captain John Roland's company of associators of Leacock Township, in Lancaster County, GEORGE FINFROCK was listed on a payroll dated July 5, 1775.

Page 977 - On a return of the 10th Battalion of Lancaster County Militia, Colonel David Jenkins commanding, in 1777; in the 2nd company, 1st class, HENRY FINFROCK was listed and ANDREW FINFROCK was listed in the 7th Class of the 2nd company.

Page 1059 - In Captain Roland's company of associators, dated July 5, 1775, GEORGE FINFROCK served.

SIXTH SERIES:

Volume 2, page 498 - In Captain Reinhart Butt's company of York County Militia from Manchester Township; in the 7th class was STEVEN FINFROCK and also listed were privates MICHAEL and STEPHEN FINFROCK.

Page 619 - MICHAEL FINFFROCK served in the 6th class of the 5th company of York County Militia, commanded by Captain Emanuel Herman, on a return dated April 5, 1778. STEPHEN FINFFROCK served in the 7th class of the same group.

Page 663 - STEPHEN FINFFROCK was listed on the muster roll of Captain Reinhart Butt's company, November 20, 1782.

Volume 3, page 594 - In a return of the 6th company, 8th Battalion, Lancaster County Militia, commanded by Captain Jacob Forney, in 1785, DEWALT FINFROCK. (Note: Dewalt is an old Lancaster County surname, so this probably was the maiden name of his mother.)

Page 1470 - ANDREW FINFROCK was on a muster roll of the 4th company of the York County Militia, commanded by Captain Martin Will, in the Spring of 1785.

SIXTH SERIES (Continued)

Volume 8, page 1320 - On a muster roll of Captain J. Snyder's company of the 2nd regiment, 2nd Brigade of the Pennsylvania Militia Infantry, under the command of Lieutenant Colonel J. Lotz, at York, Pennsylvania, on a return dated September 5, 1814, was Private GEORGE FINFROCK.

Page 1324 - On a muster roll from September 1 to December 4, 1814, was Private GEORGE FINFROCK sick on furlough since October 21st.

Page 1327 - In Captain Jacob Snyder's company of the 2nd Regiment of Pennsylvania Militia, under the command of Lieutenant Colonel Lotz, on a return dated August 26, 1814, was GEORGE FINFROCK private, with a pay of \$2.00 per month, commencing with service on September 2, 1814 and the total amount paid to date was \$6.00.

WAR OF 1812

SECOND SERIES:

Volume 12, page 449 - GEORGE FINFROCK was a private in the War of 1812. He was in Captain Jacob Snyder's company from Lancaster County in the 2nd Regiment, 2nd Brigade of Pennsylvania Militia, under Lieutenant Colonel Lotz at York.

CIVIL WAR

There are five large volumes of Pennsylvanians who served in the Civil War; unfortunately, these volumes are not indexed, except for the officers' names.

Volume 1, page 25 - EPHRAIM FINEFROCK was aprivate in the 2nd Regiment, Company A, and was mustered in April 20, 1861. He was recruited at Chambersburg, Franklin County, which borders York County.

Page 70 - ROBERT FINFROCK was recruited at Pittsburgh and was mustered into Company H. on April 23, 1861.

Volume 4, page 565 - John A. FINFROCK was a private in Company D and was mustered in November 1, 1861 and out Nov. 4, 1864.

From the book "Pennsylvania at Gettysburg", the following fought in the Battle of Gettysburg: WILLIAM FINEFROCK was a private in Company H, 155th Infantry, and JOHN FINFROCK was a private in Company D, 147th Infantry.

Also, in this book, is a map of the Battlefield at Gettysburg, as it was in the 1860's, and the farm of D. FINNEFROCK was listed.

THE FINFROCK FAMILY OF AMERICA

FAMILY NAME

Funfrock, Finfrock, Finefrock, Finnefrock, Finnyfrock, Finnifrock, Finfrock, Finefrock, Fivecoat, 5-Rock, etc.

Although German in origin, the Finfrock family is classed among that group of early Americans called the "Pennsylvania Dutch". This term, coined by the English settlers, was applied to those German and Swiss immigrants who arrived in Pennsylvania in the 1700's, and settled in an area roughly defined as: bounded on the Northwest by the Blue Mountain Range, on the Northeast and Southeast by the Delaware Rive, and on the Southwest by the Susquehanna River. The term was originally meant to be "Pennsylvania Deutsch" (meaning German) but it soon became corrupted into "Dutch".

The word "funf" means five, and "rock" means a coat or frock in German. One source (a native of Germany, living here in Denver, Colorado) in studying the original signatures of Michael Finfrock (1750) and his sons, was of the opinion that the name was spelled "FUNFTROD" and not "ck". rod not rock on the ending. This word comes from cutting down trees. Sometimes instead of using "Senior" or "Junior" after the same name of father and son, Germans would use "der Alsere" for Senior; and "der Yungere" for Junior. One 1770 signature, as you will note herein, appears to read "verehelicht Funftrod der Yung" (married Finfrock, the boy).

One must also remember that quill pens were used in those early years and many immigrants did not know how to read or write. Many signed their names with their mark.

In Newark, Ohio and El Paso, Texas are families that have translated the name into "Fivecoats". Finfrock is a very uncommon name, except in Pennsylvania and Ohio; and judging by the given names, probably all are distantly related.

She further lists Abraham Orndorff, s/o Peter, married ca. 1792 to Barbara Finfrock, d/o Henry & Catharine, d. before 1819, and their children: Catharine; Nancy; Mary Elizabeth m. John Jacob Finfrock; George; John.

I feel sure that you must have information which would interest her, and that she has many notes which you might like to have. I know that she would appreciate the Finfrock genealogy which you sent to me, for she says that she did not know of its existence even though she had corresponded with that Harry Lee Finfrock of Colorado.

Do let me know if you are continuing to be interested in this and if you would like to get in touch with Mrs. Wilcox.

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
