Your welcome letter arrived like a bolt from the blue - and what a delightful surprize ! I have researched these people often and never been able to untangle what I found. They are on my husband's side of the family. I had good luck in the Salt Lake City library last year, tracing the BAUGHMANs back several more generations, but the ORNDORFs were a different story.

I am enclosing an ancestor sheet, with my current findings to date, and also another one, partially filled in, for you to add the previous generations that you said you had of John's parents and grandparents. What a joy it will be to be able to tell Chuck's folks about this. I am also enclosing a family group sheet as I had worked it out to be from census and marriage records in Starke Co, Ohio. Do you agree with my findings, or have I put some people in the wrong family ? Do you know anything about this "John ORNDORF Jr," who married Elizabeth BAUGHMAN ? I haven't checked Starke Co for land records - they aren't as helpful as some counties. Since you say he did not leave any male descendants who left children, I hope you can clear this up for me. I cannot recall if I checked the 1850 Starke Co, Ohio census for him or not. It has been about a year since I worked on this family.

I would be most happy to have copies of John ORNDORFs death notice and the information of the cemetery records, if you have those. I had not know either when they died or where they were buried. I can have one of Chuck's relatives go look at the cemetery for me, if you can describe where exactly it is.

My husband was born and grew up in St Joseph Co until he was 15 - when he migrated to Fullerton, Calif, where he finished high school and Jr college. I grew up in Anaheim, and we married during WW II in Ariz - moved for 28 years with the army and finally settled down here. My mother still lives in Anaheim, as do Chuck's two brothers. His father and mother live in a mobile home court in Santa Ana. <u>So</u>, the next time I come out to see MOM, I would love to come visit you and get acquainted! I am sure Mom and Dad Summers would love to meet a distant cousin, too.....

Anything you have concerning the ORNDORF or GARBER families - and the rest of the brothers, sisters, aunts and uncles, etc, I would dearly love to have copies of. I know from my own research that the small expenses mount up - so I will enclose \$5. to pay for copies, your time, etc. Also enclosed is an SAE and extra stamps.

We will be on vacation to Northern Calif for the next three weeks - but I am hoping to have further news from you when I return. Many, many thanks for writing and offering to share with me. I appreciate it more than I can say.

Another item on the Orndorff family has come to light. It is an obituary of John Orndorf, who died in 1866 at the age of 81. From the dates, this appears to be the John Orndorf who married Rebecca Garber. However, the obituary is very brief and really does not add any new information that I can see unless it would be the name of the congregation he attended.

Also, our researcher has reported that she found the name Eicher used 22 times in the book, DESCENDANTS OF BARBARA HOCHSTETLER, by Harvey Hostetler, published by the Mennonite Publishing House, Scottdale, PA, 1938. This book is now out-of-print. If you wish, these pages could be copied for you, but it might be more satisfactory to locate a copy of the book to examine for yourself. I don't know in what part of California your city is located, but it may be that there is a copy of this book in the La Verne College Library at La Verne, California, near Los Angeles. Of course it may be found in other libraries, too.

Strassburger & Hinke in PENNSYLVANIA GERMAN PIONEERS give only one other spelling for Eicher and that is Eyeger. They list Eichert and Eichart as separate names. According to them, the first Eicher seems to have been Abraham Eicher who came on the ship COLUMBIA, from Amsterdam. Unfortunately, no date is given for the ship's arrival. There were 149 passengers.

Dear Mrs. Berger:

This is in response to your March letter asking for assistance with your research on the Orndorff family.

First of all I need to indicate that our churches did not generally keep baptismal records. Ours is a denomination that has never baptized infants. Many of our churches did not keep other kinds of records either, which is most unfortunate. However, we do have a number of written histories of various churches, some of which are well researched but others are not.

I am enclosing for you some pages from A HISTORY OF THE CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN IN MARYLAND published in 1936 which contain histories of Beaver Dam and Pipe Creek churches and a biography of John Garber, a prominent minister in the two churches. Of special interest to you may be the bequests of John Garber because of the names that are mentioned. Also enclosed are some excerpts from the HISTORY OF FREDERICK COUNTY by Williams and McKinsey, published in 1967; and from NAMES IN STONE, Frederick County, Maryland, by Holdcraft. On these pages you will find some references to the name Orndorff.

I am sorry that our researcher apparently did not find information on the name Eicher.

In Roger Sappington's THE BRETHREN IN VIRGINIA, I found mention of Samuel and Martin Garber, sons of John, who married sisters.

You asked about the records for Indiana and Stark and Harrison counties, Ohio. At this point, I am not aware of records in existence other than what may be found in published histories of the Brethren in Indiana and in Southern Ohio. I don't know whether Stark and Harrison counties are in Northern or Southern Ohio. The history of the Brethren in Northern Ohio has not yet been written, although I believe there is one in the planning stages.

I feel as though we have not exhausted our resources in searching for information on the names in which you are interested, but we are really not in a position to do research in depth. The researcher who assists me Mrs. Camilla A. Berger - 2 Yorba Linda, CA 92686

July 5, 1977

is here one day a week on a volunteer basis, which means that there are limits to the service that we can provide, even though we would like to do more. Many of our records are not indexed, and it takes many hours of searching to find information.

I am now in the process of transferring to a newly created full-time position related to historical resources. I am hopeful that later on we will have our materials arranged so that it is easier to find things. If you wish, you may try us again in a few months and by that time it is possible that something more will have come to light related to your names. Another option would be for you to stop and do your own research if you should be able to make a trip this way.

If the information I am sending you on Orndorff ties in with anything you have, I would indeed be glad to receive copies of information that you have on this family, as you offered in your letter.

The cost of photocopying is five cents per page, and the copies I am sending you required 17 pages. We also appreciate being reimbursed for postage.

I should mention one caution in regard to the excerpts from the HISTORY OF THE CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN IN MARYLAND. This is one of the histories that was not very well researched or documented. In my own personal this book research I have found a number of errors in the information of T try to find some documentation for all data taken from this book before I accept it as factual.

I am hopeful that something in the material I am sending will be of help to you.



Hello, Camilla, shall I say cousin Camilla ?

You are a peach. Of all the Orendorff letters I have written, yours is the only one to come back and it really came back loaded and I appreciate it. Follows are random comments on your letter as I go through it again.

To be sure I'il give you everything that I dig up on this line, however, I have had not much luck locating this name in the public archives of St. Joseph Co. I have not done too much as I look for several names at a time and follow those that have some followup available. Joseph Hildebrand married Rebecca and that is all that I know except that she is buried in this county, about 15 miles from here. The date of 3-9-1887 is correct as given to me by a friend that copied it from the stone. I mistyped it. This is absolutely all I know about the family as I fail to find anything in the local records so far.

The local gen. Soc. is copying all of the obits from all of the papers in this Co. pub. since about 1835, When this is finished it will provide lots of leads. All I need is some kind of lead on these names and you have given m¢lots of spark. (I just got the mail about 15 min. ago.) Some years ago the DAR copied all of the stones in all of the Co. Cemetaries. We have lists of Birth, death and marriage records in the library but I find a lot of names missing that I positively know should be in the books. The local Historical Society has a vast amount of information that Ihave <u>never even seen yet.</u>

Keep me posted on any people in my line and I"ll send you anything on this name and its variations that I happen to run across. Another thing, I don't know how old you are or the extent of your interest in this name but if the time ever comes when you are no longer interested or able to keep the history going, I'll do it, unless you have someone else that is interested.

I would also, like to have all the source information available for my line. These bits and pieces provide valuable clues on where to look for more. I am familiar with the "Mill Wheel" Book. Saw it advertised. Nearly bought it but didn't. They wanted \$12.50, I think. Probably worth it.

Joe Hildebrand had an awful lot of descendants. I'll provide them for you but it will be a while before I get it done. He was my great grandfather. Where did you get the birth of Rebecca ? But I guess that I already ask that question above in the "sources".

13 miles south of So. Bend would be in Union Twp. where all of my Eldreds, Hildebrands, Millers etc settled and where I grew up. (Incidently I'll be 55 Feb. 3.) When I was about 20 I knew <u>every person</u> in the Twp but I get in the Navy in WW2 and havn't lived there since. Don't knew very many people new other than these who I grew up with and if they are still there and some of them I don't recognize anymore. I new live in Centre Twp. next one north and between Union and So. Bend. I'm Twp Trustee here but that doesn't mean too much. I have absolutely nothing nor any knowledge of the Orendorffs except her name and that she was married to Joe. My mother and dad are in their 80's and do not know as much about their family background as I do. In asking questions my mother couldn't remember what her grandfather Mardy's name was. There is not much history in her trunks as I looked. She has a cousin who may be a relative of Joe who is about 90 and still sharp. Mom has been wanting to go see her so I'll take her and take my tape recorder along. Perhaps she can give some information. I know she is a Hildebrand but I don't think she is desc. of Joe. I should have her on my chart but don't.

Just by coincidence, my daughter lives in Burlington, Iowa. I visited there Thanksgiving and gave a fast look at the Gen Section. Got nothing on Orenderff. Copied one name out of the phone book, talked to the lady and she said her daughter was the one that could do the most good. Wrote about two weeks ago but havn't heard yet. While there I looked at lots of Iowa town directories. Got several names. Wrote to some so far. In fact I got a mis-addressed letter back yesterday and am remailing it today. I'll open it and give the info that I have some Orendorff history that relates to Iowa and that will be the bait for them to pursue it. Some people arn't interested. Wrote to a 25 year old Hildebrand girl in Burlington and got her interested in her tree. There was a Hildebrand that went west and I'm trying to find him. One went to Ka. before 1800. I'll write to this girl and ask her to look out for us Orendorffs too.

There was some wrong data on the sheet that I sent you.

Eaker should be Eake according to the tombstone. Mistype. Adron should be Akron. Dhio.

I wrote, some months ago, to an uncle in Mo. and a cousin in Calif. for family sheet information but have not heard from them. They are required to complete both the Hardy and Hildebrand lines. Rebeccas daughter was Savilla Hildebrand who married John Hardy.

I am stumped with miller until I get to a library that has some Va. film or someone gives me some dates and leads. If I knew John Jay Millers date of death I could look for an obit. A few days ago got a letter from Miller cousin whose mother is about 90 and mother says it must have been in Oct according to something she recalled. It is unseasonably cold here and I don't go any more than I have to. The Mosteller and Eake names haunt me too. Where the names change in spelling over the years really tighens the screws on the subject and requires some hard proof on paper.


Just talked on the hook to another Hildebrand digger. She says that in the Bowman cem. near her house there is a John Orenderff b 3-10-1779 Pa. d 8-20-1826. His wife was Rebecca b 12-17-1896 d 9-7-1868. She thinks these are Bebecca Oren. Hilde. parents. Not so according to your chart. We'll have to find out who these people are. She tells me Rebecca was born 12-44-22. Different from your chart.

She says there are some Olinger, Hostetler and Steel desc from William and John Reed in The Liberty Twp area. I don't know if she has hard evidence or is assumming the connection. She is rather flighty and nervous, has high blood pressure and wants to do all the talking. This makes her hard to talk to and I have to find an excuse to get off the phone.

In the last sundays paper it listed the 10 resolutions for genos and nr 1 says, I will not get discouraged by a lengthy "dry spell" but will reread all sources and search for new leads."

Believe me I had a long dry spell. There is plenty of work to do but I keep looking for more sources and new news before I get my old work caught up. Res #3 says, " I shall put all information on family sheets and have a separate family sheet for each family." This I do not have done yet. I have a very big cache of unorganized data. Mostly on Hildebrands and Hardys.
