OBITUARY

William Orndorff was born near Gettysburg, Pa. August 15, 1819 and died at his home in Mediapolis, Nov. 28, 1894, after a long and painful illness.

In October, 1841 he was married to Mary Ann Saddler in Adams Co., Pa. Some years later he moved to Baltimore, where he lived several years, engaged in the stock business. In 1856 he moved to Iewa, and settled in Franklin Township, and purchased a farm at Franklin Mills. He made his home on this place for many years, but during nearly all the time was engaged in the stock business and at one time handled more stock than any man in the state. in 1885 he purchased property and moved to Mediapolis where he continued to buy and ship horses until failing health compelled him to give up the business.

He leaves a wife who has gone with him through all the eventful scenes of their fifty-three years of married life. Of the family, but one child, Mrs. Sabina Ballard of Burlington, survives the father.

The funeral took place at 10 o'clock, Friday. Short services at the home conducted by Rev. J. H. Marshall, assisted by Revs. Lovall and sec.

Mrs. McFarland, past 95, a former Lexington resident, died Monday, March 4, at the Masonic Home there where she had resided the past eight years.

Olga Edna Martin was born in Mediapolis, Iowa, Sept. 8, 1979, the daughter of William Allen and Ella Florence Rankin Martin. An only brother and her father died before she was born, and are buried in a cemetery

near Mediapolis.

Olga Martin was married to Virgil Ellsworth McFarland of Amboy, Ind., on April 29, 1902, at Plattsmouth, where she grew up and received her schooling. They lived first at Sioux City, Iowa, then at Beatrice. Later they moved to Lexington, where they owned a drug store until Mr. McFarland's death on Feb. 3, 1930. Later Mrs. McFarland sold the drug store to Mr. and Mrs. Louis J. Stewart who operated it for a number of years before selling it.

After her husband's death, Mrs. McFarland lived in California for five years, then returned to Lexington where she lived until she moved to Plattsmouth to live at the Nebraska

Masonic Home.

She was a life-long Presbyterian, a member of Dawson Chapter No. 33 Eastern Star, Lexington's Woman's Club, and was a charter member of Bonneville Chapter D.A.R.

The Rev. John L. Middents, Jr. of the Plattsmouth Presbyterian Church officiated at the services. Interment was at the Plattsmouth Oak Hill Cemetery
