PETER SPANGLER died in Centre County, Pa. on May 18, 1867, aged 88 years 1 mo. 26 days, at Tusseyville, Potter Township. Thus he was born March 22, 1779.

He was married first to Hannah. Marriage record #10531 at the Christ Lutheran Church, York, Pa., Vol. 5 of Marriages 1735-1848, page 518 shows April 14, 1796⁶ (with the 6 crossed out to become an 8) Peter Spengler of Heidelberg Township married Hannah Wolfersberger. This is the only name that has a township by it which probably indicates some significance.

All his children were by this marriage, although he later married second Catherine Fengel Stem, widow of Nicholas Stem who was born 12-25-1777 and died 1-4-1849. His third marriage was to Margaret Wolf Decker, widow of John Decker, she was born in 1798 and died 10-7-1863

Peter's will dated October, 1859 and proven July 10, 1867 in Centre County, Pa. names the following children: John, George, Catharine Kephart, William Boal (husband of daughter Elizabeth "Betsy"), George Dinges (husband of daughter Hannah). Grandchildren: Catharine married to James Runkle, George W. Spangler (children of George) and Betsy Boal's (deceased) children as follows: Jones, George, William, John, Peter, Polley, Lydia, Rebeca, and Catharine.

Peter and Hannah's children were:

Catherine born 8-26-1798, Baptised with Michael and Catharine Sander Sponsors, "A Brief History of Schaefferstown", page 113. Catherine married Peter Kephart and they had a son Jacob who moved to Berrian Springs, Michigan and took his widowed mother with him. Jacob was married to Sarah Sunday. Catherine and Peter Kephart also had a daughter Catharine who married a Mr. Jordon, and a son John who married
_____ Murray.

Elisabeth "Betsey" born May 2, 1804 baptised with George and Catharine Spengler sponsors, page 117 of "A Brief History of Schaefferstown." She married William Boal and had children Jones, George, William, John, Peter, Polly, Lydia, Rebecca, and Catherine.

Hannah born Aushst 31, 1808 Baptised with Catharine Spangler as sponsor, page "Errata" of "A Brief History of Schaefferstown." Hannah was married to George Dinges.

In "History of Will Co., Ill" published 1890 by Chapman Brothers page 441 of Portrait and Biographical Album has a sketch of one of Peter's grandsons, Peter S. Spangler, listing his grandfather "Peter S. Spangler thought to have been born in Lancaster County, Pa." Page 630 of the same book lists the sketch of another grandson, Henry Spangler who says Peter was thought to have been born in Lancaster County of German Parents.

Enclosed is the lineage that I have compiled on the Michael Spangler family. I no longer have family group sheets for them since I incorporated the information into this lineage that I compiled for my own use. You understand, I am sure, that it is in no way complete, there are obviously other children whose baptismal records have not been found.

Your information that there was a Spangler cemetery in Heidelberg Township, Lebanon County, came as a complete surprise to me. WHERE DID YOU GET THIS INFORMATION? Michael and some of his children are supposed to have been buried on his homestead that is now part of the Tulpehocken Manor property, although the graves have been lost through the years.

About the Spangler Annals...until we can establish a connection with our own Michael, we didn't want to buy a copy since it is out of print and so a copy is rather expensive. However, it has an index that you can have copied if you are interested. One place that has a copy is The Center County Historical Library at 203 North Allegheny Street, Bellefonte, Pa. 16823.

It is possible that Catherine Mays was a Spangler, although it is likely she was simply a neighbor who acted as sponsor for the baptism of the Spangler child. I notice that a John and Margaret Mays had a child whose sponsor was Peter and Anna Maria Spangler.

My daughter, Karen, bought a copy of the index to the Trinity Tulpehocken Reformed Church, Jackson Township, Lebanon Co., Pa. 1748-1864 if there are any names you would like to have us check in it for you.

P.S. Have you written the Lebanon County Historical Society to ask about the cemetery inscriptions?

A few weeks ago, I was researching Ohio military records in order to try to find information on the son of my great grandfather, Charles Ridgley, who died in the battle of Gettysburg in 1863. I found nothing there, so he must have enlisted while they were still living in West Virginia and the West Virginia information is sparse.

While going through the Ohio records I found a couple of names, which may or may not be of interest to you but I copied them down.

Hezekiah Orndorff, age 36, enlisted Jan 5, 1864, discharged on Mar 26, 1864 following a Surgeon's Certificate for discharge.

Perry W. Orndorff, age 23, enlisted Feb 2, 1864, mustered out with Company August 7, 1865.

Both of these men were with the 6th Regiment of Ohio Volunteers in the Civil War.

Well, I must close. I do hope this finds you and all your family real well.

Dear Camilla:

Think of you often, wondering how you are, and how your genealogy is coming, but just haven't gotten around to writing.

Last week a friend of mine, June Finlayson, who goes to the Genealogical Library with me every week, mentioned that she wished she knew of someone who ^{could} get her death certificates for a couple of cousins (I think) who passed away in the 1950's in Los Angeles County. I thought of you and told you I would write you. She also wanted to know what you would charge to do it. I had told her you did some professional genealogy.

It does not seem possible that it is almost a year since we moved. We spent about six months doing one thing after another to our house, so that time went awfully fast. And we really didn't do anything major but it takes so long to get workmen and then to get things done.

We love it here - the air is so wonderful. Our winter dragged out a little into April last year as they said, it was the worst winter they had had in 20 years. But I sort of enjoyed it. It was cozy inside and so beautiful to look at from our living room windows, as we look out at beautiful mountains. They have a little snow on the tops now but we haven't had any yet in town. The leaves have turned golden and red and some trees (the oaks) have lost all their leaves. We planted about 350 tulip and daffodil bulbs about three weeks ago so we are already looking forward to what it will look like in April and May.

The first of last April I was asked if I would volunteer to be a hostess guide at the Genealogical Library. I passed the interview and so have been doing that all year. It is very interesting as you meet so many people from all over the world. There are not many countries that have not been represented some time throughout the year. I have tried to spend one other day at the Library during the week, doing some work for myself. There is so much there that it takes quite a while just to learn where it is well enough to be of real value to you. I have made some real progress on some of my lines - just recently.

It seems likely that she could have married a Spengler some time after Herman's death. In that way she would have been remembered by those around 1810 or so as Catherine Spengler whose son Lorentz (Orndorff) had been murdered in 1791. As that had been 25 years earlier they might have referred to him as Lorentz Spengler. She might have outlived Herman by a number of years. He died in such a spectacular way, (murdered in bed, throat slit) that this story much have become quite well known. At the same time, the Orendorff family had pretty much left the Lebanon area for Adams County so that the 1800 census is the last in which they appear for Dauphin (Lebanon) County.

3. The most concrete information I have deals with the following couple:

John Spengler married 25 Ag 1816 Trinity Tulpehocken Church
to Elizabeth Ohrendorff.

I find no other records for this particular couple. Did she perhaps die and he married again? Did they move?

Possibly he had a father or brother named George. They must have lived in the Schaefferstown area.

I have an idea who this Elizabeth may have been. Besides the Orendorffs of Lebanon County, there was also a branch in Elizabeth Twp. Lancaster County, not too far from the Schaefferstown area. Some of their children were baptized in the Schaefferstown church in the 1770's. I think she may belong to this branch. In fact, one of them went over to Dauphin County and this couple, tho I have no record of a daughter Elizabeth, did have a daughter Catharine and was of the right age to have had a daughter to marry in 1816.

Dear Camilla,

We appreciated your letter concerning the Orendorff family and are also sorry to tell you that we have no idea how we came across that bit of information.

It was one of those bits of information that we penciled in to be checked out later when it was convenient and in the process of sending copies back and forth got to be listed as fact.

Our goal in our research had been just to trace the lines back to the ancestor who was the immigrant and since Michael Spangler was our original immigrant there was no reason to pursue the Orendorff line until we had completed all the others.

If it should turn out that Michael's wife was an Orendorff she would have been born in Europe as Michael was married when he came to this country with his wife and grown sons. Michael was born in 1711 in Heidleburg, Germany and came to America on the ship "Samuel" on August 30, 1737. He settled in what is now Lebanon County and his house is still standing and is part of the Tulpehocken Manor Inn and Plantation. Through the years that part of Lebanon County has been Berks, Lancaster, Dauphin and now Lebanon.

There were five Spangler brothers who came to America; Caspar, Baltzer, and Henry all settled in York County; George in Philadelphia; and Peter in the South. These lines are listed in The Spangler Annals that you may have read. Then the family of George Christian who settled in Centre County.

You asked for information on John and Elizabeth Orendorff Spengler. All seven of our Michael's sons were named John, and it was also a popular name with the other early Spanglers. Tell me a little more of her so I can see if anything I have fits.

Besides our own Michael, we have quite a bit of information on the lines of George Christian, Kaspar, Baltzar, John Peter, and Peter of Virginia, -- not complete by any means, but who knows, it might be what you are seeking.

Fred mentioned that you were interested in an Elizabeth who married a Schwartz--(that was all the information he sent). However, I did check that little bit of information and wonder if you have looked in the Annals? Page 70 has "Elizabeth, wife of Solomon Moose afterwards married Joseph Schwartz and moved west. children were: Catharine, Anna Mary, Joseph, Barbara, Justina, George N., William H., Luther, Sarah, and David." In any event, if you will send us what information you have we will add it to our little file and hope that someday we can put you in touch with someone else who is working on your line.

Dear Nita:

You are correct in thinking my name and address sounded familiar! I had previously written to you and had received information from you.

I will refresh your memory somewhat:

I research the ORNDORFF-ORENDORFF line, primarily...and all other names associated with it. There are about three instances where the Orendorff-Spengler lines touch:

1. The rumour that your Michael Spengler the 1737 emigrant had a wife who was supposed to be Elizabeth Orendorff. This from you and also another recent correspondent. Cannot trace the reference for this, however.
2. Herman Orendorff (emigrated in 1737) lived in Lebanon County. He brought with him a wife from Germany. They had at least one child in 1739. Apparently his wife died in the 1750's and Herman seems to have married a Catherine _____. In 1778 his estate record mentions her and a number of children, the eldest son being Lorentz who receives a double portion as his rightful share. As he was apparently still a minor at that time it is unlikely that Herman's first wife was his mother as the German church records show Herman's wife to be born about 1700 and 12 years Herman's senior.

Lorentz subsequently buys out his sibling's share of their father's farm. In 1791 he is murdered and his estate descends to his next eldest brother Christian. In early 1800's a deed of the Light family adjacent mentions land neighboring that of Lorentz Spengler alias Orendorff. A search of deed indexes discloses no Lorentz Spengler only Lorentz Orendorff. Was his mother a Spengler? Did she marry a Spengler after his father's death?

Another strange thing..... Herman was Protestant...yet all his children seem to marry Catholics. Guardian for his children was Caspar Michenfelder, a Catholic. In Philadelphia in 1759 there appears in the Catholic records a Catharine Spengler who witnessed as a witness to certain marriages and baptisms. In the Catholic Goshenhoppen records (Berks Co.) 1742 Maria Eva, dau of Peter & Maria Eva Spengler was baptized on J1 25 in John Kuhn's house. Sponsor was George Kuhn. In the Philadelphia records, Catharine Spengler was closely associated with an Arnold family. In Lebanon County, there were Catholic Arnolds who lived less than a mile from Herman Orendorff. One of them had a son named Herman.

How did these people fit together? ? ?

I suspect that Herman's wife Catherine may have been a Michenfelder and a Catholic, probably raising their children in this faith. Apparently none of Herman's earlier family survived by his first wife or they would have inherited also.

Dear Mrs. Berger:

I am descended from John Michael Spangler and Elizabeth Orendorff of Wyeastown, PA. They shipped from Rotterdam Aug. 20, 1737 on the Samuel Hugh.

I am seeking information on the Orendorffs and was given your name and address by Betty Guthrie of O Bessa, Texas.

The only data on the Orendorffs, or Shrendorffs, which I have comes from land transactions between another ancestor, Martin Light, and Herman Orendorff in Lebanon Township, Orendorff having been granted the land in 1753. There is mention

also of a Christian Obendorf who died April 16, 1772 at age 80. He was one of the first 31 persons buried in the Moravian cemetery in Bethel. Also mention of a John Heinrich Threndoff who was one 20 years of age in the winter of 1710. The question is asked in the text - "was he the father of Christian who in 1710 would have been 18 yrs. of age? And was he one of the Lebanon Valley immigrants from N.Y.?"

I would be most grateful for any clues on Elizabeth Obendorf, wife of J. Michael Spangler, such as her parentage and European background and relationships of these other Obendorfs mentioned above. I do not have Elizabeth's dates.

MICHAEL SPANGLER was born about 1711 in Heidelberg, Germany. With his wife, Elizabeth, and two sons, arrived on the ship "Samuel" on August 30, 1737 at the age of 26.

Among Michael and Elizabeth's children were: John Martin, John Christian, John Michael, John Peter, John Adam, John Jacob, John George, Maria Barbara, and Maria Margareta.

Sources of information are: "Biographical Annals of Lebanon County" published in 1904 by J. H. Beers & Co., pages 119-120. "History of Lebanon County" by Egle, page 252, 253, and 254, and The Lebanon County Historical Society "Shadows of the Rhine Along The Tulpehocken" by Viola Kohl Mohn, Vol. XIV, 1970 #5, Book 1, edited by Henry C. Westenberger, pages 166-175

Information in the Centre County Historical Library shows that the son John Peter Spangler was born 7-23-1749, sponsored by Mr. Schell. He was married to Catharine. We have copies of his estate papers one dated April 15, 1800 lists the following children: "Henry Spingler, Peter Spengler, Catharine Spingler and Magdalene Spengler, John (youngest) and his widow and relict Catharine Spengler."

Another with the petition that son Henry be named guardian of the minor children Magdalene and John during their minority, but one on July 19, 1800 indicates that the court appoints "George Spangler of Heidleberg township" guardian of Magdalene and John Spengler during their minority."

One petition dated December 12, 1799 and another dated April 15, 1800 asking division of property among heirs.

Copy of the inquisition dated March 21, 1800 says the estate will accomodate two of the children without spoiling the whole.

ALL OF THE ABOVE ESTATE PAPERS ARE FROM ORPHANS COURT, DAUPHIN COUNTY, PA. at Harrisburg The daughter Catherine listed above in the estate papers later married Philip Stoner (listed on some of the accounts of where the money from the estate was paid.)

WE ARE TRYING TO DETERMINE WHETHER OR NOT THIS PETER IS THE FATHER OF OUR PETER SPANGLER WHO DIED IN CENTRE COUNTY IN 1867.

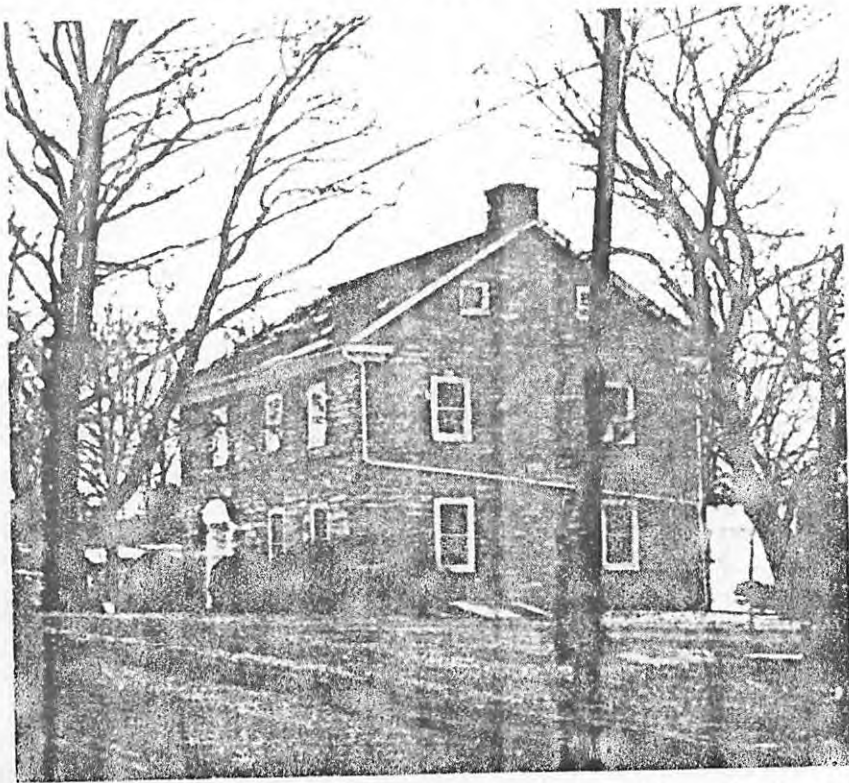

No. 45 - Jacob Spengler House



Jacob Spengler, son of Michael (See Michael Spengler House) and his wife Elizabeth built this limestone house south of Myers-town on the road to Schaefferstown now R-501. The house you see today is rebuilt for the original structure was gutted by fire around 1923. The walls are original and the house was once of Germanic character having the floor plan with kitchen entry and large stone fireplace in the center kitchen wall, with an opening into the huge work room which in this house lay to the east.

An old iron five-plated stove was placed against the opening and heated this part of the house.

The sandstone date stone incised in quaint German characters and dated 1782 has the names JACOB SPENLER & E. S. P. R. N. The last initials stand for Elizabeth Spenglerin his wife, the IN ending being the feminine ending in German.

No. 17 - Christian Spengler House



CHRISTIAN SPENGLER (b. July 15, 1781 - d. Jan. 14, 1843) son of JOHN GEORGE built this stone Georgian house directly east of his grandfather's house. The date stone 1838 is on the north side of the main part of the house. The wing to the west appears to be the oldest part of the house. Christian Spengler married CATHARINE ELIZABETH IMMEL, Jan. 9, 1793, daughter of Leonard Immel, Jr. Catharine died May 25, 1825, so the oldest part of the house could have been her home.

Christian married Catherine Walborn Albert, widow, Nov. 26, 1826.

The house contains a lovely open stairway to the third floor. Outstanding panelling graces two downstairs rooms and the master bedroom. Old six-panelled doors and fireplaces make a graceful Georgian interior.

No. 21 - Michael Spengler and No. 22 - John George Spengler Houses



MICHAEL SPENGLER house, left. The handsome rounded arch of this house is the other example of pure Germanic Architecture mentioned in the Christopher Lei treatise. This house exterior appears much as it did in the early eighteenth century when it was built. Michael Spengler and his family came to Philadelphia, Aug. 30, 1737 from Heidelberg, Germany. The first land grant found, registers 140 acres, Tulpehocken tp. 1745.

Michael Spengler had seven sons. His seventh son, JOHAN GEORGE SPENGLER (b. Nov. 1, 1755 - d. Mar. 28, 1819) built the house on the right. He married ANNA BARBARA RAMBLER May 29, 1781. The barn in ruins, east of the house, bears the date 1782. This house had a Germanic floor plan with central chimney but has since been remodelled.

SEVEN GENERATIONS.

First Generation.—Michael Spangler and his wife, Elizabeth, and two sons, emigrated from Heidelberg, Germany, to America. Shipped from Rotterdam, August 20th, 1737; ship Samuel Hugh, Percy, master; arrived in Philadelphia and became one of the pioneer settlers. He purchased a large farm, located in Heidelberg township, Lancaster county, Pennsylvania, and afterwards Jackson township, Lebanon county, Pennsylvania, five miles east of Lebanon, one and a half miles west of Myerstown. On this farm is a large and never-failing spring of the purest water, which was a great resort of the Indians. They were reluctant to give it up. This was one of their resorts—plenty of deer and wild game. In those days the Indians made frequent raids among the white settlers, committed murders, robberies, stealing horses, boys and girls. As a means of protection and safety he built a large two-story stone dwelling-house with a large garret, about 35 x 45 feet, besides a large two-story spring-house, 30 x 50 feet. These buildings are standing yet and occupied. When the alarm of the Indian raid was sounded in the vicinity, the whole neighborhood made for the stone houses, men, women, and children well armed, as a place of safety. These houses were called and known as the stone fort.

No. 16 - Hannes Immel House



A quaint old world aura surrounds this stone house that once had beavertail tiles on the steep pitched roof. Two attics add to this feeling, and a very German looking sandstone date stone, dated 1757, with romantic carved heart completes the effect.

The chimney is central and until very recently a double hung "Dutch" door opened into the kitchen.

Johannes Immel disembarked at Philadelphia, May 30, 1741. The land belonged to George Weirich who bought it from Caspar Wistar, January 10, 1739. Johannes married George's daughter, Anna Barbara. The Weirich house stood immediately north of the Immel homestead on the bank of the Tulpehocken.

Johannes Immel bought the land November 15, 1751 on sheriff sale. Capt. Leonard Immel, his son, was a Revolutionary War soldier. Capt. Immel's daughter married J. Andrew Schulze, Governor of Pennsylvania.

No. 17 - Christian Spengler House



CHRISTIAN SPENGLER (b. July 15, 1781 - d. Jan. 14, 1843) son of JOHN GEORGE built this stone Georgian house directly east of his grandfather's house. The date stone 1838 is on the north side of the main part of the house. The wing to the west appears to be the oldest part of the house. Christian Spengler married CATHARINE ELIZABETH IMMEL, Jan. 9, 1793, daughter of Leonard Immel, Jr. Catharine died May 25, 1825, so the oldest part of the house could have been her home.

Christian married Catherine Walborn Albert, widow, Nov. 26, 1826.

The house contains a lovely open stairway to the third floor. Outstanding panelling graces two downstairs rooms and the master bedroom. Old six-panelled doors and fireplaces make a graceful Georgian interior.
