The letter is fascinating in itself but more important it establishes Lydia Bates as wife of Robert, not mentioned in Edward H Fletcher's 1881 book. In fact he gives William<sup>2</sup> a wife named Lydia Bates.

As an example of how items of genealogical interest come to light, Mrs Baul Allee of Boulder Colorado with whom I have corresponded over the years re the Grosvenor family from whose John Grosvenor we both descend sent me the article as an item of <sup>general</sup> interest not knowing of my interest in Fletcher.

Mrs H Parker Burnley and her sister, Ellen Mrs William E Bell descend from Lucy Fletcher sister of Elijah Fletcher and child of Timothy and Bridget (Richardson) Fletcher. Lucy m Dr Richard P Williams (no relation of Indiana's husband Rev James H Williams Lucy's son was Fletcher Williams, whose son was A Ford Williams, grandfather of Katharine and Ellen.

Mrs Burnley states that the copy of the Lydia Bates Fletcher letter was secured some years ago by an uncle from Sir Arthur<sup>Shipley</sup>, Master of Christ College Cambridge; which vouches for its authenticity.

A clew to the Lydia Bates conundrum may lie in a suggestion raised by Viola, Mrs Robert Fletcher in her letter of 2 June 1977, last paragraph; copy inclosed. Can anyone add to the discussion?

I have a great big sheet I keep on the clan and I had Thomas Dixon Fletcher but nothing after that - do you have sheets for your number 20 - 21 - and theirs - which would include your #10 unless an only child - etc. your # 5 etc. I'll put them on the chart - I should really blow it up and send it to Stratton I guess sometime - trying to go back - I went side ways and forward to where I accumulated a lot of pen pals and names etc.

I must look for Juneau County - assume that is Wisconsin - you show FR Isle, Vt. Was that suppose to be Gr for Grand Isle? They were still on the island then.

I have found lots of discrepancies between the county records, state records - family records - and have tried to pin them down as I have gone along - but it isn't always an easy thing to do - a challenge however.

I found that Grace Fletcher was married to a man by the name of Warren.

I have checked medical school records in the east - none of ours listed. Ebenezer was a physician - Silence married a physician - Dr. Samuel Lee. Polly married a physician - Dr. Obediah Winters. I always thought the boys were studying with Ebenezer and that is how they met the girls. Francis Fletcher stayed in Concord - but his grandson Hezekiah became a physician. Probably no connection. But where did Ebenezer learn to be a doctor.

Part of Obediah's family stayed in Canada and later generations had several Dentists who practiced in or near the Capitol but I don't have that folder with me so won't say anything more on that now cuz I don't want to be wrong,

Another thing I have checked - there are references to Ebenezer asking his cousins Timothy and Paul to ask the congregation to remember him in their prayers as he was away at War - which Ebenezer and which War?

I have charted it out and found two Ebenezers -  
our Ebenezer - born May 16, 1699

Francis's son Joseph Fletcher who married Mary Dudley had a son  
Ebenezer born March 23, 1694

Samuel and Cotton's boys did not have Timothy and Paul - William and Lydia boy's did - but they were not real first cousins - but anyway I am not convinced - they were referring to the Ebenezer we claim. I don't know where the Ebenezer came from either because that is the first generation where the name appears - at least as far as I can tell -

Did George Miller send you a copy of Cotton's will? He sent me one but the copy is so bad I can't read a thing - I made a record on Cotton's sheet that somewhere there was a notation that so much had to be paid to the Doctor for Cotton's medical bill. Also a note that Samuel was made guardian for Cotton Jr, Issi, Amos, Calvin, Lorica in 1780 and that he paid to move the family back to Poultney from Salisbury. Then I have another notation to the fact that Isaac Adams was made guardian for Cotton Jr and Issi Fletcher on Mar. 25 1785 at Rutland, Vt.

Marriages in the Westford V.R.'s (P. 163) show those of Amos Fletcher & Mary Perham, 1741; and of Amos and Rebecca Prescott, 1776.

In Chelmsford, V.R.'s I find only one: (P. 62) Amoss (spelled that way) Fletcher, son of William and Mary b. July 11, 1717.

In Mass. Soldiers & Sailors of the Revolution, Vol. 5, P. 769 -- one lone item -- Fletcher, Amos Jr., Westford. Private, Capt. Oliver Bates's Co., Col. James Prescott's reg't, which marched on the alarm of April 19, 1775; service, 4 days.

The only other authority to point out to you from here involves no Amos Fletchers, but seems significant in showing how the principal Fletcher line in Vermont came into the state from Massachusetts. The tracing is done in two sections of William Richard Cutter's "New England Families," the first section in Vol. 1 beginning P. 103, and the second section in Vol. 3, beginning P. 1455.


This line, as you would expect, begins with Robert Fletcher, the immigrant; then William (2), Joshua (3) -- now in Concord, Mass., Capt. Joseph (4) -- getting into Chelmsford --; Timothy (5) -- family now in Westford, where Timothy at one time ran a tavern; Jesse (6) -- born in Westford; Jesse was a soldier in the Revolution; Stoughton A. (7) -- the family now getting into Ludlow, Vt. Stoughton moved out to the Middle West but his son Allen Miller (8) Fletcher, came from Indianapolis back to Cavendish, Vermont, ~~to~~ to live. He was the one who became Governor of Vermont. The Governor is the last one of the line given in Cutter.

As an afterthought, in Concord, Mass., V.R.'s, P. 187, I find listed: Amos Fletcher, ye son of William ~~Fletcher~~ Fletcher & Dorcas his wife, born June 22, 1752. You'll notice this Amos fits into the Virkus line as a brother of the William Fletcher who married Sarah Frost.

That's about everything we have here on any Amos Fletcher beyond some of the sources (such as Hemenway & the Boston Transcript) you have already consulted. We have Vermont Census Indexes to 1850; I judge you have checked these.

Dear Mrs. Berger:

Unfortunately for your quest, the sources I would use looking for Amos  Fletcher would be basically the same as yours, with special reference to Hemenway's Vt. Historical Gazetteer and the Boston Transcript. Because you have consulted Hemenway and have already discounted the information in the old genealogical column of the now-defunct Boston Transcript, I have not consulted either of these sources in writing this letter.

We do not have any published Fletcher genealogy (altho, because Fletcher is a prominent Vermont name, having produced one Governor, we do have scattered information on it) and the name Prior (Pryor) does not show here at all, as far as I can determine. Because our Library does not have Vermont Vital Records, we would refer you to the Town Clerks of the Vermont communities concerned, and also to: Vital Records, State of Vermont, Public Records Division, 133 State Street, Montpelier, Vermont 05602.

One trouble in searching for your Amos Fletcher seems to be that there are too many, rather than too few. And the ones who show in our records probably are too early to be yours (although any one or more might be in his background). The key city in the ~~Westford, Mass.~~ Fletcher clan seems to be Westford, Mass., with Chelmsford, Mass., a close second. The Fletcher line that came into Vermont, producing the Governor, passed through Westford, Mass. Closely linked to the Vermont Fletcher family is the ~~Proctor~~ Proctor family, whose genealogy we have. A quick spot-check of Fletchers in the Proctor book does not disclose any Amos Fletcher, but the early generations were extensively in Westford & Chelmsford, Mass.

I will cite what Amos Fletchers I can find, and leave it to you to sort them out, if any fit. For starters, I am enclosing photocopy of P. 251, Vol. 1 of Virkus's "First Families of America. Right side of the page at the top, a line from Robert Fletcher in which the 6th generation is Amos Fletcher (1765-1812) and the 7th generation is Col. Amos Fletcher (1789-1830). Next, from Westford, Mass., Vital Records (Births) I find listed (P. 34): Fletcher,  Amos, son of Amos & Mary, b. June 25, 1755; Amos, son of Amos Jr. & Rebecca, March 14, 1777, and Amos (again), son of Amos Jr. & Rebecca, b. Oct. 12, 1778.

Dear Mrs. Berger,

I am very pleased to hear from you! I am always eager to return to genealogy but just need a little prodding.

I am aware of the info on Silas contained in the Rev War pension files - very interesting.

Any information that you have on Thankful's line would be most interesting to us. I get no cooperation from the probate court at North Hero on Thankful's will, though I've written many times. She died and is buried on South Hero in 1812 as Thankful Preston. I imagine that she married a Preston in Poultney after ~~her~~ Cotton died in 1777, but I cannot prove it. Her first son was Ichabod Bartlett; he served among the personal guard of the Vermont governor - I'll send copies. I have lots of info on Cotton's siblings Silence and Ebenezer and his parents Ebenezer Fletcher and Hannah Morton.

I also have info on the remaining Fletchers all the way back to Robert, who came here in 1592. Please let me know what else you need.

Enclosed is the listing of Cotton's estate found at the Rutland Vermont court house. Also enclosed are Samuel Fletcher's records on moving and caring for the family after Cotton died. See also the correspondence on setting up guardianship papers for the children.

His line is through William Fletcher. The old Edward Fletcher book is inaccurate. Lydia Fairbanks Bates was not the mother of Joshua Fletcher.

William Fletcher & Lydia Bates (lidia bats) were married the 2nd of the 7th or 9th month 1645, Concord. It is transcribed as 2th October 1645 in one place, 7 November 1645 in another. I myself kind of go for the second of November. Anyway, if Joshua was 12 in Feb 1656, he was born before Wm. & Lydia were married. We know nothing at all about Rachell. Perhaps she died in childbirth. In fact, the above is the only record we have of her existence. I think about her, sometimes.

My husband follows along with Joshua & Sarah Wiley (have you anything on her?)

Capt Joseph & Sarah Adams and then  
Joshua & Elizabeth Raymond.

So you can see that I haven't gone into Francis Fletcher's wives & descendants. Are you where you can see the VRs compiled by the WPA? They are invaluable. The Ct. St. Library in Hartford has most of them AND a list of what they haven't got. Not all towns were done, but most of the old ones were.

I had help from a member of CSG with the Lydia problem. I'm as sure as I think I'll ever be that Rachel was Joshua's mother, and Lydia was the widow Bates when she married Wm. Fletcher, after Joshua's birth, & presumably the death of Rachel.

"During our visit to Scrooby, my wife and I were shown a letter, which like Anne Bradstreet's poems, brought us closer than anything else to the men and women who left England to settle in the American Wilderness. It was written by Lydia Bates Fletcher, of Scrooby, just after her arrival in Massachusetts in 1632. Lydia rejoiced that the settlers would shortly "have a Church in a settlement near here - which is called Boston" and then went on to things dear even to a Puritan heart: food, her neighbors, and her clothes. "At first," she wrote, "I could not eat the bread made from ye maize - but now I find it very good. It makes a verry wholesome porridge...we have berries of divers kind and beans, and have planted some punkins..." Elder Brewster is in good health, but his hair is white like ye snow. Love and Wrestling Brewster are both married and are fine men." Mistress Fletcher concluded her letter: "I think a woman should always look faire to her lord - so I pray that you will - if the chance cometh - send my taffeta skirt."

BOSTON TRANSCRIPT 3 - 865 refer back to Question 863-12 H.W.J.  
Fletcher Doty 2 July 1923 Until recently the So Hero Grand Isle County, VT Fletchers were suppose not to descend from Robert (1) of Concord, Mass. and a few of them are given in the 1881 Genealogy in the "unconnected" list. Their line is now established as Robert (1) Samuel (2) Samuel (3) Dr. Ebenezer (4) Cotton (5). - The 11 children of Cotton (5) and Thankful Bartlett Fletcher scattered early and until their lives have been investigated it is uncertain whether your Samuel and Eunice were the issue of Samuel (6) Silas (6) Ipspi (6) or of Amos (6). It is certain that they were not children of Cotton Jr. (6) or of Calvin(6). Samuel (6) and Ipspi (6) resided at So Hero in 1790 the later unmarried at that time.

Ottawa, Ontario, records show various members of the family of Cotton (5) as petitioners for township in Canada and your search may lead you there. They all seem to have inheirted from their grandfather, Dr. Ebenezer Fletcher a greater tendency to pioneer than was characteristic of most of the early Fletchers.

I regret I cannot refer you to printed records, but am confident that a search in So Hero or some other Grand Island Co. town should be revealing.

Dear Mrs. Berger:

Thank you so much for sending the Fletcher notes. So many of the names in Judson Landons letter rang a bell I am still checking my old research. I notice under Polly - Hannah - Eunice - Issi - Amos and Calvin there are further references. Did Mr Strattons paper continue? Or is this part of the book on So Hero?

My husbands family and cousins knew little about the Fletchers in Vermont. They were not even aware Thomas Dixon Fletcher had been married before. I do not have a copy of the Fletcher - Dixon DAR Bible record. Will try to track it down.

I am so anxious to hear about your trip to So Hero. Had hoped to get to Laguna this week, but we are having a room remodled and can't leave until the workmen are finished. Am tenatively planning to be there on tuesday, the 10 of November about 8:00 A.M. Would this be convient for you?

Have enclosed the vital records from Vermont, I copied last spring. Please keep in mind they are far from complete, copied on the last day of a long week of concentrated research. (I was tired) But did find the name of Thomas Dixon Fletchers 1st wife. Still haven't found his marriage records.

Am also enclosing two notes I found interesting and the reason I have so little faith in "The Fletcher Genealogy" by Edward H. Fletcher.

Lydia Bates is suppose to have married William Fletcher in Concord Mass 7 Oct 1645 and born in England 1622. Too young to have written the letter referred to in The National Geographic letter. Of course the birth date could be wrong and Sir Evelyn Wrench aware she later married William - or there could have been two Lydia Bates Fletchers. This is a good article and well worth reading.

Most of the Fletcher Genealogy has been submitted to the LDS Archives using "The Fletcher Genealogy" by E.H. Fletcher from various descendants. I thought it interesting that Cottons 1729-1777 family group record was submitted in 1924 by one Katie Llewlllyn living in Lethbridge, Canada. She also sent one for Calvin 1778-1857 and two of his children Cotton and Eunice. Because she knew the marriage dates for Eunice I believe she is probably descended from her. ( I have tried to do some census work in Canada, but because I do not read French easily - gave it up.

Coincidental - I correspond with a Grant descendant in Conneaut, Ohio and my fathers family were from Redwood Falls, Redwood, Minnesota. Was your Wall family descended from Andrew Wall, PA, physician in the Revolution?

Thank you again for all the information. I will pay more attention to the Fletchers I run across in Ohio and Iowa now and am looking forward to meeting you.

Where did you find Silas' pension papers? How terrific! Thank you so much for sharing.

I have written Mr. Stratton. Asked again about Mr. Miller, Thomas Dixon Fletchers' 2 wives, and Lydia Dixons' father.

My daughter checked at Scripps Institute of Oceanography to see if Mr. Miller had published any papers recently (5 years). He hadn't. Incidentally psychology is the study of seaweed and algae.

I was mistaken about having copied from The Fletcher Genealogy. They are merely references that used that source. FGRs from Salt Lake and The N.E. Historical Register. My copies of the latter are very poor. The source of The History of Ancient Windsor from Vol II. A facsimile of the 1892 ed. New Hamp. Pub Co., 1976.

I cut off the LDS endowment dates, from the Archive records. Don't think we need these. Copied in Salt Lake last year.

I do have a copy of Gen. Samuel Fletchers' Rev War record -son of Eleazer. Will copy another time. It contains no genealogy. Thought they might have confused with Samuel, son of Cotton.

Next week I plan a trip to Carlsbad public library. The San Diego Gen. Society has donated their entire collection - understand they had or have a copy of The Fletcher book.

Also have access to a copy of the Grant Book, correspondant in Ohio. Will try to get copies of the pages referred to on the Archive record.

With both our ads running this month in The Genealogical Helper, perhaps we will turn up some new information or find Mr. Stratton.

Concord in ye Plantation  
of Massachusetts,  
June 1, 1632

Most Dearly Beloved Sister,

Governor Winthrop has informed us that ye "Lyon" will soon set sail for England, so I will give this letter to Richard Gardner, who will bring it to you when he comes to Scrooby--that you may know how we are faring in this New Land. While we have endured many hardships, no one repents that he has come hither or desires to goe back, for we count it happiness enough that we are free to enjoy God & Jesus Christ. We will shortly have a Church in a settlement near here--which is called Boston & there will soon be many others for all do exult in ye escape from oppression & are happy to continue heare. You cannot think how full of courage these Pilgrims be. With ye help of ye neighbors Robert has built a fine house with one roome at which I do think you would smile-- for it is made of logs with mud mortar between--to keep ye cold without. Ye glass was so deare that ye window is of oiled paper--which doeth verry well for light--and we will be verry comfortable. I cannot think how Beef or Veal or Mutton would taste, but we find ye Deare meat verry good & sometimes we have wild turkey & with fishe & els we have plenty of meat.

Robert uses ye skins of ye Deare for jackets & breeches & they doe verry well. At first I could not eat ye bread made from the maise-- but now I find it verry good. Ye only mill for grinding it is at Water towne--where Robert had to carry it. Ye maise is quite white & floury when parched in ye coals. It makes a verry wholesome partridge. Ye savage Squanto--whom you saw in England was ye first to show our men how to tend & dress it--& it makes a verry good food. Then we have berries of divers kinds & beanes & have planted some punkins. There is a sugar tree here which yields a juice when ye tree is wounded & this juice boiled down makes a verry good sweet. Since our candles gave out we have burned ye knots of a Pine tree. By reason of ye Pitche & Turpentine they give a light as cleare as a Torch. A most strange thing did happen to me in ye Spring which did give me a greate fright. You must know that our house is ate ye edge of ye Forest. Well, one day I hearde a nowse on ye rooffe & looking up ye chimney I saw two big eyes & a fur nose. Filled with feare I seized Joshua from ye cradle & sprang into ye big Cheste & none too soone--for there came down ye chimney--for ye fire was almost out--a big Beaste like unto a Lion. He walked about sniffing here & there & finally after a verry long time it seemed to me--he climbed back up ye chimney. I declare to you he was a most unwelcome visitor.

Next Thursday--Mr. Winthrop has appointed for a day of Thanksgiving on account of ye good news that ye privv council of ve King has passed favorable measures toward ve Colonies. we intend to goe to service at ye Boston settlement. There was a Thanksgiving Day ye first yeare we came--in February, when after Mr. Winthrop had given his last handfull of meale to a poore man-- & no one had anything worth the speaking of & it seemed as if we must all die of ye cold & no food--a ship came into ye harbor at Charlestown--laden with provisions-- & was not that good cause for Thanksgiving. I believe this will soon grow into a custom of keeping days of thankfulness to God for away out here we feel how much we have to depend upon His good providence--

& we do praise Him that He has brought us safely through so many hard ways. Do you know how Governor Bradford, ye first yeare after coming to Plimouth, appointed a day for Thanksgiving in November--and had a fine dinner of game and Deare Meat and fruit and many other delicacies and had for guests ye Indian Chief Massasoit & his warriors. We had been guided by God across ye greate Ocean & had been supplied. O but I think that was a time of reale rejoicing for those Pilgrims who with so many good things & had been befriended by ye savages. I heard also that they sett apart another day--some time afterwards to give thanks--when after a long drought--which had made all nature to languish & they were in sore straits--a plentiful rain brought forth a fruitful harvest to their no small comfort & rejoicing. Robert made ye journey to Plimouth which is more that 12 leagues from here--hoping to find where ye body of our deare brother Moses is laid--but as you know the place was made into a field--so that ye savages might not know how many had died--and he could not find ye spot--but it matter-eth not where ye body lieth when ye soul is with God. He sleeps by ye side of James Chilton & his wife & Mary Brewster & many others you used to know. Mary Chilton has grown into a fine woman--is happily wedded & had three children. Elder Brewster is in good health--but his haire is white like ye snow. Love & Wrestling Brewster are both married--and are fine men.

Some say that many in this Plantation do discover to much pride--but I think a woman should always look faire to her lord--so I pray that you will--if the chance cometh--send me my taffeta skirt and Robert's Ruffles and cape, that we could not bring. You see I have writ a long letter for there is much to tell about this New Strange Land. I pray God we may be preserved & in ye enjoyment of this sweet libertie we will not forget Him. Robert bids me to present his love--& William who is now a tall lad--kisses your hand. Praying for your health & happiness in this world & everlasting peace in ye world to come--
