

LAST WILL & TESTAMENT

OF

JACOB PIPER SR. DEC'D

In the name of God Amen I Jacob Piper of Washington County and State of Maryland being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind memory thanks be given to God, calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto Almighty God who gave it to me nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Almighty power of God and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial, and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in the life, I give devise and dispose of in the following manner and form. First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Flick all my real estate until all my debts be paid and then it is my will that my Executors shall to their best thinking build my wife a house and stabel upon my land out of the estate suteibel for her to live in during her natural life with 3 acres of land of which thare shall be 1/2 a quareter of an acre Pailed in for a garden and three apel trees to her choice upon said land and and one cow to her choice and as much of the household furniture as the executors will think suitable for her support. I give and bequeath unto my son John Piper after all debts being paid all my land as I do possess to him his heirs and assigns forever, except the abovementioned three acres the land I do value unto him for five hundred pounds, out of which he shall pay unto his brothers and sisters Four hundred and fity pounds in the maner and form as shall hereafter be mentioned and likewise I give unto my said son John four horses a waggon and gears, two plows and a harrow with this reserve that he my son John after depts being paid as above mentioned shall let his mother live peaceably and quietly upon the land and premises as my executor shall procure for her and he my son John shall give unto his mother yearly and every year during her natural life Fifteen bushels of wheat, twenty bushels of rye, twenty bushels of corn and hay and corn fother for the youse of one cow and in cash six pounds and after all my depts being paid then my son John shall commence to pay the above four hundred and fifty pounds in yearly payments of twenty five pounds to begin at the oldest and so continue on to the youngest and then to begin at the eldest again and continue to the youngest until the above Four hundred and fifty pounds being paid and distributed amongs my nine children namely:

Henry, Elizabeth, Catherine, Margered, Jacob, Madolance, Barbary, Daniel and Rosena and after my wifes deth my son John shall have the above mentioned three acres of land and buildings and the household furniture as she leaves behind her shall be eaqually devided amongst my ten children and whereas I have furnished some of my children with household furniture of which I have taking on acct of and it is my will that the rest of my children shall have the same as the above recd or paid in cash. And further my will is that all my personal estate except what is herein mentioned be sold off and then my just depts and funeral charges being first paid and the remainder to be eaqually divided between my ten children namely John, Henry, Elizabeth, Catherina, Margered, Jacob, Maidolana, Barbary, Daniel and Rosena. And lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth and my trusty friend Christopher Orendorff executors of this my lest will and Testament, In witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this eight day of November Ann. 
