Camilla:

The Dan Lamb Investigation exists because mother asked me to look into what happened to her husband Dan Lamb. If anyone deserves to know what happened to Dan Lamb my mother does. My Uncle Rene has said mother "endured severe hardships after Dan Lamb left."

So far the Dan Lamb Investigation has taken sixteen months, & encompasses seven states: Michigan, Florida, Alabama, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, California & the state of Washington. That does not include at least (3) states that where I have followed leads, on Dan Lamb but nothing was found. Four months into the investigation I realized it was well past the stage of sending individual documents to those concerned & required a report. The investigation revealed that Daniel Lamb was married three times & fathered four biological sons & had two stepsons.

The report was issued at this time because if I took anymore time my mother may not be able to understand what would be told & shown to her because of her dementia. Mother's memory & comprehension of events (50) years ago is just fine; however, mother has problems with current events.

Camilla, without your help there would be no report! "THANKS" seems so inadequate! I really appreciate all of your efforts! I will forever be in your debt! Let me know your impressions of this investigation.

To my mother the "Dan Lamb Investigation" is dedicated. Because of the arbitrary cut off date there will be an update as I have not received some formal documentation, but there is NO DOUBT with regard to the conclusions. This project is not a character assassination I have only presented facts, & people can make their own judgments on the life & times of Dan Lamb. * Dan Lamb was born on 11/24/1916 in Saginaw, MI to William Pha Lamb & Bertha Maud Holland(maiden name) they were married on 9/8/1900. William & Bertha had six children (4) of which survived they are: Elmer Wesley Lamb was born in Bellingham, WA on 1/25/1902 & died in Traverse City, MI on 10/15/1968; Ethel Clara Lamb was born in Bellingham, WA on 12/29/1903 & died in Clearwater, FL on 11/19/1973 & Richard Lamb was born in Saginaw, MI on 8/7/1908 & died on 5/29/1984 in Bay City, MI. Two other children were born to William & Bertha Lamb in Saginaw, MI who died quite young they are : Bert L. Lamb was born 12/5/1906 & died on 6/28/1915 & Ernestine Viola Lamb was born 12/21/1923 & died 3/21/1924.

* On 12/28/1923 Dan Lamb's mother died (7) days after giving birth to her sixth baby I am sure the death of his mother was one of Dan Lamb's deep problems. Especially in light of William Lamb's(Dan's father) difficult, overbearing & demanding personality.

* On 8/20/1924 Dan Lamb's sister my Aunt Ethel married Raymond Morrow. I am sure that this marriage caused a rift with her father William Lamb since he probably wanted Aunt Ethel to assume the role of mother to Dan Lamb.

* By 1930 Dan Lamb was placed in the Vestaburg Boarding School which is located about (60) miles west of Saginaw, MI on Route 46(Gratiot Road in Saginaw). There was a major fire at Vestaburg about (30) years ago & many records were destroyed which is why I could not get a copy of Dan Lamb's records. I talked with the Headmistress Sharon Gerlach on 11/17/2004 & she said I could have had Dan Lamb's record had they not been destroyed. In the 1930 Census Dan Lamb is listed as a boarder in Gratiot County Michigan where Vestaburg is located. I am sure that being placed in a boarding school caused problems in Dan Lamb's life.

* In 1936 Dan Lamb graduated from Arthur Hill High School in Saginaw, MI where my Uncle Ray was the principal. At this time Dan Lamb was nearly twenty years old & was living with Uncle Elmer(Smoke) & Aunt Gertrude at 934 Ottawa Street in Saginaw, MI. To the best of my knowledge Dan Lamb never went to college. In November 1936 Dan Lamb registered with the Social Security Administration & received SSN: 367-05-4284; at this time Dan Lamb was working for Consumers Power in Saginaw, MI.

* From 1938 to 1943 Dan Lamb worked for the Post Office in Saginaw, MI. I am sure that his brother Elmer(my Uncle Smoke) pulled him in the postal system because he was the postmaster.

* On 9/6/1941 Dan Lamb married my mother Shirley A. Strobel(maiden name) at Trinity Lutheran Church in Saginaw, MI. Dan's brother my Uncle Elmer(Smoke) was the best man & my mother's sister my Aunt Joyce was the maid of honor. I could not find any wedding pictures leading me to believe they were destroyed. I have many other family wedding pictures from that time frame further providing substance to the theory that Dan

& Shirley's wedding pictures were most likely destroyed. There are three people still living who were adults at the time of the wedding & none of them will talk about it even (60+) years later.

* Dan Lamb had (2) children with my mother: on 6/28/1942 my brother William Rhodes Lamb who was born & on 8/3/1943 Michael Scott Lamb who was born; both births occurred in Saginaw, MI.

* On 4/27/1943 Dan Lamb was inducted into the Marines. Dan Lamb never went overseas he spent all of his service time stateside at Quantico, VA, Jacksonville, FL & Camp Pendleton, CA. The last (8) months of Dan Lamb's service time was spent at Miramar San Diego, CA. Dan Lamb was discharged from the Marines on 11/6/1945.

* When Dan Lamb was discharged from the Marines there was a delay in his return to Saginaw, MI because he was seeing a lady that he met while stationed in Camp Pendleton. Her name was Elizabeth Ethel Starts & she was not discharged from the Marines until 12/17/1945 about six weeks after Dan Lamb's discharge date of 11/6/1945. Elizabeth Starts (maiden name) was a SGT in the Marines as was Dan Lamb. When Dan Lamb did return home he informed my mother that he wanted her to obtain a divorce so he could marry Elizabeth. Dan Lamb & my mother's divorce was final on 12/2/1946. It should be pointed out that although Dan Lamb was required to pay \$85/mo child support for my brother & myself; however, he never sent a dime! The only memory that both my brother Bill & I have of Dan Lamb, at this time, is of him drawing a picture of a Jeep on a chalkboard.

* Elizabeth Starts was the only child of Oscar Francis & Emily Starts she was born on 8/2/1918 in Philadelphia, PA. By the time of the 1930 Census Oscar, Emily & Elizabeth were living in Silver City, NM. Elizabeth enlisted in the Marines on 6/16/1943 & was discharged on 12/17/1945. Unfortunately, Elizabeth died on 1/8/1998 in El Paso, TX.

* After Dan Lamb divorced my mother he married Elizabeth Starts. At this time, I am not sure of the exact date & location, but I will find out. In the late 1940's Dan & Elizabeth lived at several locations in Pomona, CA on 862 North Eleanor, 838 Garey, & 252-1/2 Willow. Elizabeth & her father Oscar ran several laundromats in Pomona, CA called the "Launderette" located at 695 North Park & 386 North Park. While Dan Lamb was raising his new family in Pomona, CA mother, my brother Bill & I were destitute; we spent our days at the Salvation Army Daycare Center in Saginaw. Witness the photo of Bill & me in the Salvation Army Day Care Center dated 7/24/1948. Since we were too poor to own a car mother Bill & I, walked everywhere in all kinds of weather mother went to work, walked Bill & I to the Salvation Army, & the A&P food store (3) blocks away. Michigan winters are very harsh how she ever did it walking with (2) small children I will never know. So we could bowl, mother ran a bowling league at Eastown Bowling Alleys located on Genesee Street in Saginaw, had us in the Redeemer Lutheran parochial school, worked a full time job & took care of the household chores. We lived in a (3) room apartment at 903 Thompson in Saginaw. The only things we had was a radio that we

listened to the Lone Ranger at 8:30pm each night. Mother was a HERO showing extraordinary character, integrity, dedication & love!

*On 5/10/1949 Dan Lamb & Elizabeth had a baby boy that they named Geoffrey Garnet Lamb. Geoffrey was born in Pomona, CA at the Pomona Valley Community Hospital as noted in the Pomona Progress Bulletin dated 5/12/1949.

* From 1953 until 1956 Dan Lamb, Elizabeth & their first born son Geoffrey lived at 2401 North Kansas in El Paso while Dan was working as a Field Engineer for Layne Bowler. El Paso is where their 2nd son David Cabot Lamb was born on 4/21/1953 as noted in the El Paso Times on 4/22/1953. At that time the Dan Lamb family lived at 3315 North Kansas in El Paso.

*By 1959 Dan Lamb & Elizabeth had separated witness the fact that Elizabeth, David & Geoffrey have their own house located at 1230 North Park in Pomona, CA. 1959 is also the year that my brother Bill & I saw Dan Lamb for the first & only time since he divorced my mother in 1946. The only reason Dan Lamb came to see us is because my Uncle Rene Hall accidentally ran across Dan Lamb at the Indy 500 Raceway. Dan & my Uncle Rene had lunch together & Uncle Rene tried to convince Dan Lamb to come to Michigan & see my brother Bill & me in Saginaw, MI. As a direct result of this meeting with my Uncle Rene Dan Lamb did come to visit us. I remember the day when mother called my brother & I to the living room & told us to sit down to tell Bill & I that Dan Lamb was coming to see us. The two vivid memories I have of that day are: (a) his fingers & hands were shaped exactly like mine & (b) the car that Dan Lamb drove (I am a car expert) it was a white 1957 Oldsmobile 98 four door hardtop that had three carbs (the J2 option) I asked him. Dan Lamb took my brother & me to dinner in the Bridgeport/Frankenmuth area brought us back home & that was the last time Bill & I ever saw him! Also on 8/26/1959 Emily Starts (Dan Lamb's mother-in-law) died in Los Angeles, CA; however, Dan Lamb is not listed in the obituary further indicating that Dan & Elizabeth were separated at that time.

*From 1960 to 1975 Dan Lamb's second wife Elizabeth & sons Geoffrey & David & Elizabeth's father Oscar F. Starts live at 4892 San Bernardino in Montclair, CA. David Cabot Lamb married Karen Ruth Andersen on 8/12/1972 & Geoffrey Garnet Lamb married Deborah Anderson on 9/20/1974. David & Geoffrey's brides are not sisters. Oscar F. Starts Elizabeth's father died on 12/5/1978 in Riverside. CA.

* In the 1957 to 1959 time frame Dan Lamb met future wife Julia Coyle as a direct result of a traffic incident in the Dothan, AL area. Julia Coyle lived at 11365 6th Street East in Treasure Island, FL from 1962 to 1966. For a period of time Dan Lamb left Layne Bowler & was working as a real estate agent for Tourtelot Realtors located in nearby St. Petersburg, FL.

*On 8/11/1966 Dan Lamb married Julia Coyle, Mary Julia Bledsoe(maiden name) in Winterhaven, CA across the Colorado River from Yuma, AZ: In the summer of 1966

Julia Coyle & her son Tim drove from Florida to California. Julia, Tim & Dan looked for a week in the Pomona area before deciding on which house to rent; the home they decided on was located in Hacienda Heights on 15929 Padova Drive. After settling the house issue the (3) of them drove first to Yuma, AZ & then to Winterhaven, CA so Dan & Julia could get married. Dan had originally wanted to get married in Yuma but that changed because they could not get married immediately in Arizona (there was a two day wait that was instituted in 1956) Winterhaven, CA is about 250 miles distant from the Pomona, CA area. The excursion to get married was made at the time of the year that temperatures are in the 110 degree range. The trip was supposed to be a combined honeymoon & vacation. Ironically on 8/24/1966 I graduated from Michigan Technological University located in Houghton, MI with a BS in Mechanical Engineering. The university is located in one of the harshest climates in the continental United States where annual snowfall typically is 200 to 300 inches/year & in the temperature can fall to 40 degrees below zero in the winter.

*From 1966 to 1973 Dan Lamb, Julia & her son Tim lived at 15929 Padova Drive in Hacienda Heights, CA. Tim recalls that although Dan Lamb was one of the strangest people that he ever knew, but Tim realized that Dan really loved his mother. Dan & Julia were married for twenty two years & Dan waited on Julia hand & foot. Tim recalls that Dan was as good a step father as one could want, but recalls that Dan Lamb was an alcoholic having almost ½ a bottle of Old Forester Whiskey every night. Tim said that Dan Lamb was very intelligent & could do the crossword puzzle in the Sunday Los Angeles Times in several hours without using a dictionary. Tim said that Dan knew engineering very well, & could go toe to toe with with the brightest people. Dan Lamb was aloof but probably out of respect for Tim's father also named Dan. Dan Lamb attended all of Tim's football games in high school & the first year that Tim was in UCLA at which time Dan & Julia moved out of the area.

* In 1970 Dan Lamb had a heart attack in Amarillo, TX & had bypass surgery.

* In 1975 Dan & Julia lived at 29760 4th Street in Saratoga, CA which is within five miles of where my brother lived at that time. My brother Bill has lived in that area since returning from Vietnam in 1967. In fact, when mother & I went to Bill's wedding we stayed at a hotel within ¼ mile of Dan's address. One day when Dan & Julia lived in Saratoga, Julia received a call from David Lamb who was Dan's youngest son that he had with Elizabeth. Julia invited David & his wife Karen over for dinner. When Dan arrived home he got rather upset & there was a very tense dinner. When it came time for David & Karen to leave Dan Lamb told his son David that he never wanted to see him again & Dan gave David a check for \$3500 on his way out the door. I have reason to believe that Julia may have sent David money over a period of time to help out. David was an ex Marine & was having a hard time.

* From 1980 until his death in 1988 Dan & Julia lived at 7512 Burgoyne Apt. 215 in Houston, TX. By this time, Dan Lamb's health had deteriorated & on 9/5/1988 at 7:37pm Dan Lamb died of a massive stroke. Doctor Charles Britt was in attendance & he told me he remembered Julia as being an attractive southern lady, he felt that Dan &

Julia were very much in love. It should be said that Dan Lamb treated Julia like a princess until the day he died & his nickname for Julia was "kitten". After Dan died Julia was lost. It should also be said that even on his death bed Dan Lamb absolutely refused to talk about his life prior to his marriage to Julia & got very upset when questioned about it. Dan Lamb was cremated at the George H. Lewis Crematorium in Houston, TX. His remains were transported to the Oak Hill Cemetery located in Union Springs, AL where Julia's family had several plots. Julia is buried in an unmarked grave to the left of Dan Lamb, she died on 3/20/1998 in Birmingham, AL.

* Unfortunately on 1/8/1998 Dan Lamb's 2nd wife Elizabeth Starts(maiden name) died in El Paso, TX & was buried in Ft Bliss Cemetery just outside of town. Equally as unfortunate Mary Julia Bledsoe Dan Lamb's 3rd wife died on 3/20/1998 in Birmingham, AL & was buried in Oak Hill Cemetery in Union Springs, AL. I am sure that both ladies were very nice & loved Dan Lamb very much. My brother Bill & I really wanted to meet both ladies it would have been priceless just to hear what they had to say!

* Dan Lamb worked exclusively for Layne Bowler an irrigation equipment company from approximately 1950 until his retirement around 1981 except for a short period of time when he worked for Tourtelot Realtors in St. Petersburg, FL. Dan Lamb was very intelligent & did very well at both occupations. I believe he retired as a Vice President with Layne Bowler. Through a series of mergers & takeovers Layne Bowler is now part of Pentair Corporation headquartered in Minneapolis, MN. Dan Lamb traveled extensively when he worked with Layne Bowler; however, for much of the 1960's he worked out of the City of Industry, CA Layne Bowler facility.

* My brother Bill & I were fortunate to have many good influences on our life: our Uncle Rene & Aunt Iola, our Uncle Walter(Boots) & Aunt Joyce, our Uncle Cliff & Aunt Linda our Uncle Sandy & Aunt Gladys , our Aunt Ethel & Uncle Ray & our Uncle Elmer(Smoke) & Aunt Gertrude. They helped make us what we are today.

* When Dan Lamb deserted us there was no welfare & if it were not for Aunt Ethel & Uncle Ray & Aunt Gertrude & Uncle Elmer(Smoke) we might not have survived. Aunt Ethel & Uncle Ray virtually adopted us taking us to the movies, their cabin, Uncle Ray bowled with Bill & I, they had us over for dinner & took us shopping. They did all this when they were very busy since they were at the very height of Saginaw society. The same could be said for Aunt Gertrude & Uncle Smoke but to a lesser degree; however, because of their position in Saginaw society both of our Aunts & Uncles from the Lamb side opened a world to us that we otherwise would not have known. Uncle Elmer(Smoke) got me a job at the post office during college XMas vacations to earn some money & he always made a point to come out & speak to me when I was working at the post office. An adult never stands fo tall as when he stoops to help a child!

* As I said before, the term HERO often overused but it certainly applies to mother as she ran a bowling league for us so we could bowl at Eastown Bowling Alley located on Genesee Street; had Bill & I in the Redeemer Lutheran parochial school, made sure we were in all school events, had us in the scouts & was a den mother all while working a full time job & taking care of the household.

* It should be pointed out that neither Aunt Ethel or Uncle Dick's obituaries mentioned Dan Lamb; either both disowned Dan or deliberately said nothing to hide his whereabouts. Both of Uncle Elmer's (Smoke) obituaries wrongly said that Dan Lamb lived in Bay City; therefore, the same could be said here. Knowing Aunt Ethel(my wonderful Aunt) she most likely disowned Dan Lamb; because she NEVER mentioned his name in our presence but was like a 2nd mother!

* Look at the picture of my brother Bill & me at the Salvation Army Daycare Center in Saginaw, MI when Dan Lamb was starting his 2nd family & mother was still writing him a Father's Day Cards which Bill & I signed in 1948. Somehow mother knew that Dan Lamb was in Pomona, CA, but she did not know his exact address that is why the

Father's Day card was sent to General Delivery. Quite a contrast he had enough money to start another family but not help us when we were destitute. I feel that mother might have taken Dan Lamb back even at that point in time. I just cannot get over the thought of my mother struggling like she did; Uncle Rene's words ring really clear: "Shirley(my mother) endured severe hardships after Dan Lamb left." I am so thankful that we had Aunt Ethel/ Uncle Ray & Uncle Elmer/Aunt Gertrude who were on the scene to help us when needed! Uncle Rene said that mother always took Bill & me wherever she went.

* The copies of phone books are presented to give visible evidence of where Dan Lamb lived. He never made any attempt to hide as one can see.

* It is possible that Dan Lamb drank as much as he did & refused, even on his deathbed, to talk about his life prior to marrying Julia because he knew that he had done wrong by one family & quite possibly two.

* It should be pointed out that all during Dan & Julia's marriage Dan Lamb's room was sanitized making it look like a hotel room; ie, no pictures, memorabilia, clothing & etc. He had no hobbies, but was very interested in sports.

An analysis of the document trail is extremely important; ie, phone books marriage & death certificates & military records is as follows:

- (a) The 1948 Pomona phone book links Dan Lamb, Elizabeth & Oscar Starts & the business called the "Launderette," & shows where Dan & Elizabeth lived.
- (b) The 1959 obituary for Emily Starts links Oscar & Emily Starts to Elizabeth S. Lamb & Geoffrey & David Lamb of Pomona, but has no mention on Dan Lamb.
- (c) The 1959 Pomona phone book show ES Lamb living at 1230 N. Park in Pomona further giving credence to the theory that Dan & Elizabeth had separated by this time.
- (d) The 1960 through 1975 phone books link Elizabeth Lamb(listed as ES Lamb) & Oscar Starts living at 4892 San Bernardino Avenue in Monclair, CA
- (e) The 1969 West Covina phone book shows Dan Lamb & Julia living at 15929 Hacienda Heights, CA;
- (f) The 1962 & 1965 St. Petersburg Suburban phone book show that Julia Coyle was living at 11365 Street East in Treasure Island, FL in this time frame.
- (g) The 1976 Saratoga phone book shows that Dan Lamb was living at 20760 4th in Saratoga, VERY CLOSE to where my brother Bill lived.
- (h) The 1981 through 1988 Houston phone book shows Dan Lamb living at 7512 Burgoyne in Houston, TX.
- (i) The marriage license for my mother Shirley Strobel(maiden name) & Dan Lamb shows that they were married on 9/6/1941 in Saginaw, MI.
- (j) The marriage license for Dan Lamb & Mary Julia Coyle shows that they were married on 8/11/1966 in Winterhaven, CA.
- (k) The marriage licenses for both Geoffrey & David Lamb show that Dan Lamb & Elizabeth Starts were their parents & also & Elizabeth Starts was wife #2.
- (l) The death certificate for Dan Lamb shows he died on 9/5/1988 in Houston, TX & gives Mary Julia Bledsoe as the surviving spouse, & that he was cremated at the George H. Lewis Crematorium located in Houston, TX.

(m) The AL death certificate , unfortunately, shows that Dan Lamb's 3rd wife, Julia Coyle Lamb, died in Birmingham, AL on 3/20/1998, & was buried in Oak Hill Cemetery in Union Springs, AL.

(n) The Progress Bulletin Newspaper published for Pomona, CA Thursday evening May 12, 1949 links the birth of Geoffrey Garnet Lamb born May 10, 1949 at Pomona Valley Community Valley Hospital & weighing 8lbs 2oz to Mr. & Mrs. Dan Lamb. The El Paso Times Newspaper published Wednesday 4/22/1953 links David Cabot Lamb to Dan & Elizabeth Lamb.

(o) Dan Lamb's military records, when he was discharged, clearly show that he did not want to return to Michigan to be with his family, Dan Lamb states: "Will make home here." Listing his locality preference as "San Diego, Calif." & job preference as "Mail Clerk 1-18."

(p) The (9/6) coincidence: (1) my grandmother Martha Strobel was born on 9/6/1891; (2) Dan Lamb & my mother were married on 9/6/1941; (3) my son Jeffrey Lamb was born on 9/6/1970 & weighed 9lbs 6oz; (4) Dan Lamb died on 9/5/1988 at 7:37pm for all intents & purpose it was 9/6.

(q) The (1953 to 1956) El Paso, TX phone books show that Dan & Elizabeth Lamb lived first at 3315 North Kansas & shortly thereafter at 2401 North Kansas in El Paso & that Dan Lamb worked for Layne Bowler as a field engineer.

(r) It is distinctly possible that Dan lamb saw his 2nd family when he was married to wife #3 because Dan lamb lived within (30) minutes of family #2 & he never did anything to hide. Besides Dan Lamb was very secretive about what he did. There were certain events that happened providing strong evidence indicating that Dan Lamb had contact with family #2 while being married to wife #3.

However, Barb there is one observation: when Uncle Smoke & Aunt Gertrude retired & went to CA the 1st three months of 1965 they rented an apartment in Ontario, CA. The apartment was located within (5) minutes of where Dan Lamb's 2nd wife Elizabeth, her father Oscar & Dan's two sons Geoffrey & David lived. Elizabeth's address from 1960 to 1975 was 4892 San Bernardino, Montclair, CA. I think it reasonable to say that Uncle Smoke stayed in Ontario, CA for (3) months because he knew that Dan's 2nd wife Elizabeth was nearby. If that is true there is a high probability that Uncle Smoke & Aunt Gertrude saw Elizabeth & the two boys while they were in CA. At that time, Dan Lamb was separated/divorced from Elizabeth. Uncle Smoke may very well have kept this aspect of the CA trip from you. However, I think it safe to say that after driving 3000 miles, to stay in an apartment for (3) months within five minutes of where Elizabeth lived is remarkable. I would be highly unusual to Uncle Smoke to rent an apartment & stay for (3) months in Ontario, CA & not know that Dan's family was nearby.

To my mother the "Dan Lamb Investigation" is dedicated. Because of the arbitrary cut off date there will be an update as I have not received some formal documentation, but there is NO DOUBT with regard to the conclusions. This project is not a character



We purchased the adjoining lot from Nickersons in 1957. A small cottage was built, dormitory style with beds and bathroom facilities, on the second lot so there would be room for company. It was a wonderful abode for Barbara's family when they came up with their family. That has since been replaced by Barbara and Clinton's home.

The main cottage was small and not finished inside. We enlarged the main cottage, and Elmer finished the inside and insulated it. We enlarged the cottage further and put the deck on in 1964. That deck was replaced in 1997.

During the summer I stayed at the lake all summer, and Elmer drove up each Friday night, returning to Saginaw Sunday evening. This was the cottage he had always wanted; and he spent as much time as possible there, even before he retired. While I was teaching, we drove up each weekend, leaving as soon as Elmer got home from work.

RETIREMENT

Elmer had a coronary in January of 1962. He returned to work in the fall, and in 1964 he retired. After a winter of travel, we went to Fedhaven near Lake Wales, Florida, to live the winter of 1965-66. Fedhaven was a community started by Postal Clerks. The rent was only \$86 a month when rented by the year. There was a social center, a post office, an auditorium, a laundromat, and a restaurant at Nalcrest, the carrier's community. We spent our summers at Island Lake. We enjoyed being at Fedhaven in the winter and Island Lake in the summer until 1968 when Elmer became ill with congestive heart failure and died on October 19, 1968. At that time insurance companies did not regulate health care, so when Dr. Hall felt it was in Elmer's best interest to allow him to remain in the hospital, the insurance company agreed: he was hospitalized at Munson Hospital from July of 1968 until his death in October.

My first visit to California was with Elmer in early 1965, right after he retired on 12/24/64. We went to the Los Angeles area and rented an apartment in Ontario for three months. We took trips from there. One of Elmer's favorite places was the San Diego Zoo. We visited a friend Elmer, another postal employee. We visited places as far north as Oregon. The main road between Oregon and California had been destroyed by storms. We came south along the California's coast- the drive south from Los Angeles was beautiful. I remember being very impressed by the olive trees. We took the northern route out and returned via California, New Mexico, Arizona, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and Florida. We visited Agnes Newstead Crisp in Tucson, my half-brother Loren in Dallas, and then went on to Jacksonville, Florida. While in Florida, we visited Fedhaven, a new retirement apartment complex for retired Federal employees, and we made arrangements to return the following year.

Summers were spent at Island Lake. By then the cottage had been enlarged, the deck added, and insulation added. We could now stay north until mid-fall and see the lovely fall colors.

One summer, about 1960, we had six weeks vacation; so we took a trip west. We crossed into Canada at International Falls, Minnesota, and went west across Alberta and on to the coast. The road was very rough and in poor condition: we found out later that we'd been on the wrong road- it was closed to traffic. We didn't know where we had gone wrong. Later we stopped at a restaurant for lunch. Elmer forgot to turn off the motor and to take the car keys out before locking the doors. The spare key was in a pair of jeans locked in the trunk. A man in the restaurant helped him get the window open. There were some anxious moments. From that time on, I carried a spare key. We went north to Lake Louise, Banff, and across Canada and to Seattle. They were beautiful places to see. We wanted to go to Victoria Island but there wasn't enough time. Elmer remembered how beautiful it was, for he was born in Bellingham, Washington, and lived there until he was eight or nine years old.

BARBARA'S FAMILY

On April 2, 1955, Barbara and Clinton were married in Saginaw, Michigan. Clinton was a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army, and he was sent to Germany three weeks after they were married. Barbara flew to Germany that



Michael,

I am so glad you were able to find information about Dan's middle(?) wife and their son's. I hope some of the info I gave you helped. I have a few pictures of my mom and Dan that I will send. I also have several reel-to-reel audio tapes that Dan sent mother back in the early 60's. That was one of the ways they communicated back then. I don't know whether you can find the technology to play them, or whether you want to. I have not abandoned you, but frankly this is something I don't enjoy doing. Your biological father was a very good person to me and mother. Yes, he was one of the strangest people I have known, but there is no doubt that he loved mother. It was terribly unusual for mother to accept someone without knowing everything about them, but she did with Dan. They spent over two decades together; the last few years of Dan's life, he waited on her hand and foot (even though he was more ill than she). After he died, she really was lost, and stayed in a fog most of the time. Additionally, as I told you, he was as good of a step-father as a boy could want. I never "loved" him, as I had my own father. I did respect him, because he let me set the boundaries of our relationship. If I needed him, he was there. If there were situations in which I didn't seek his input, he never once tried to impose himself.

I know "respect" is a word that you and your family would never associate with Dan--- and I understand that. But I did respect him, and I will never get to hear his side of why he left two wives and four sons. I asked myself the other day why hadn't I responded sooner to your requests for information. I realized that it was because I had made my peace with my mother's death, and with how she lived her life, and with how she raised my brother and I. She had two sons, nearly 20 years apart, and we are both relatively decent, good-hearted folks. A doctor and a lawyer.

Apparently, mother felt she needed my father to help her raise her first child, and Dan to help raise me. It worked. It took two marriages, each over 20 years, but she did pretty well for herself and her brood. If it took marrying an alcoholic Irish Catholic doctor, followed by an alcoholic mystery man, then so be it.

[REDACTED] But I wanted you to understand my reticence. Not that you have said a lot of negative things about Dan....you've been excellent about keeping your most negative feelings out of our communications. I just wanted you to know that I miss my mom terribly, and this wakes those feelings again.

First, I'm glad you received the materials I sent. I hope they help fill in a few of the missing pieces of the past. As a lawyer, one of the subjects of which I have learned to be leery, is memory. People will absolutely swear some event happened a certain way, then see a video of the incident and be shocked that it happened differently than they remembered. This is true of my memory of Dan and mom's marriage. I would have bet the mortgage that they were married in Yuma, Arizona...but your records show different. It just goes to show.

As to your questions- My mother divorced my father (the second time) in 1956. Mother and I then moved from the house that the four of us lived in (in Birmingham), to an apartment in '56. (My brother was playing football at Alabama at that time, and he never did move back home.) The apartment was also in Birmingham. Dan Lamb visited her at the apartment on several occasions...my guess is 4-6 times a year. The way they met...at least the story I was told...was as I related to you. However, mom had driven down to Treasure Island alone, at least a couple of times in the period from 52-56. I do not know on which trip they met. But you do see the picture with her handwriting that says she had know Dan about a year, and that picture was taken in the 56-59 time period. As to the trip from Treasure Island to California in the summer of '66, there were three of us in the car...my mom, me and our bird, Spook. (Dan named the bird.) Dan was supposedly living in a motel in Pico Rivera, CA, at that time. When we got to the area, we called Dan, and he came and got us a room. In response to your question of March 12, '05, about the timing of Dan's death, my best recollection is that it happened fairly suddenly. It was not like he was seriously ill for months and slowly went down hill. Mother called and told me Dan had to be hospitalized, and she was very worried that he was going to die. I flew out to Houston and stayed a few days. This was the time I asked him to tell the whole story, and he got angry. After a couple of more days, I came back to Birmingham, and my cousin, Judee Burke went out to stay with Mom. Dan died a few days after that. I believe I did fly back to Houston about a month later, to drive Mom back to Alabama. As for Dan recognizing David, it is my guess that Dan had seen David and Geoff regularly over the years, but not for any length of time. Maybe once or twice a year. I have absolutely no evidence of this, it just seems that he must of seen them.....my God, we only lived 25 minutes away! I don't think he would have kept the two families that close, unless it was necessary for a while for some reason.


Since then, medical science has progressed and gone into the field of transplanting hearts and other parts of the body from the dead to the living.

Salvation Army Believes Two Issues Cannot Be Separated

A total expense of nearly \$37,000 was incurred last year by the Salvation Army in its large job of aiding the poor and unfortunate.

The Army's services, ranging from home and hospital aid to maintaining a nursery at the Citadel, are under the direction of Maj. and Mrs. Robert McMahon. Included in their staff are Mrs. Bertha Bruce, secretary and welfare worker; Mrs. Bessie Williams, superintendent of the day nursery; Warren Berlin with the children's work department; Mrs. Marianne Diebold and Mrs. Frances Knuibas, day nursery teachers; Miss Betty Wichert, part-time nursery worker; Mrs. Fannie Schlicht, in charge of nursery maintenance; Mrs. Rebecca Enos, the nursery dietician; Edward Wolf, custodian of the building, and William Hogg, gymnasium supervisor.

AIDES VISIT SICK.

Staff duties include visits to the sick. Last year Army workers met and talked with over 6,000 shut-ins. Hospital patients and home shut-ins are visited when requests are made through the office. County institutions are visited regularly and reading material distributed. Twice a month Salvationists take music to all the rooms at the County Tubercular Hospital.

Maj. McMahon stresses the fact that the Salvation Army is also a church as well as a social service organization. Army workers believe the two cannot be separated. Street meetings, week night and Sunday services are conducted. Spiritual counsel is given to hundreds of persons each year who have no church affiliation or who have drifted away from their church fellowship. Officers sometimes officiate at weddings and funerals.

The Salvation Army sponsors the Church Basketball League of 23 teams. The Army furnishes the floor, heat, light and attendant. Fees paid by the teams take care of referees, scorekeepers, checking, showers and trophies for the two winning teams.

One of the largest sources of

income for the Army besides the Community Chest is the day nursery. Children are under constant supervision by trained teachers. A dietician prepares their meals and visiting nurses come three times a week for inspection. An outdoor playground on the roof of the gymnasium provides fun when the weather is good. About 30 children attend each day.

Emergency aid absorbs a large part of the Army's budget as in the case of flood relief. Groceries are given from the Army commissary, clothing and furniture is supplied from the Salvation Army store, fuel orders are given, rents paid, loans made and transportation provided.

Approximately 4,000 quarts of milk was distributed to needy families last year as well as for Christmas baskets. Last Christmas 769 families received baskets containing vegetables, bread, fruit, meat, butter, sugar, coffee, flour, candy and miscellaneous delicacies besides toys and other gifts.

Each year the Saginaw Salvation Army organization—the only unit in the United States to do such a thing—gives a party for old age pensioners. Each guest receives a gift, refreshments are served and an hour's program is provided. Candy, fruit and gifts are given away through the Mexican Baptist and Ukrainian Orthodox Churches. About 200 children are entertained at the annual Christmas party when gifts, treats, candy, fruit and nuts are distributed.

One of the largest jobs Mrs. McMahon undertakes is counseling and caring for unmarried mothers. The Booth Memorial



The Salvation Army was organized in 1865 by General William Booth, a Methodist minister who disagreed with his superiors on evangelism among the poor. He believed in bringing the church to the people if the people couldn't

get to the church. This was the beginning of the street services.

It was General Booth who enforced many of the strict regulations for officers. He believed that if an officer was to join a club, he would become too entangled materially to have time for spiritual jobs. He believed that jewelry should not be worn. This regulation ran into difficul-

ties about wrist watches and a special order in the code book recites, "Salvation Army officers may wear wrist watches not in gold cases. They must not be of a showy make, build or size. They must be worn so they don't show when the sleeve is down, but looked at only to tell the time."

As for the new look, Salvation Army have had it for years. Their

code book says uniforms must be ten inches from the floor. But the women must not bob the hair, according to the rule book.

The Salvation Army believes that religion gives material aid and counsel. When a man becomes acquainted with God he then, able to help himself, the Army people say. This is the guiding rule of the Army's work.

PROPERTY SETTLEMENT AND AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, Made this 24th day of September A.D., 1946, by and between DANIEL LAMB, First party, and SHIRLEY A. LAMB, Second Party, both parties having their legal residence in the City of Saginaw and County of Saginaw, State of Michigan.

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are husband and wife and heretofore have become permanently separated, and

WHEREAS, certain unpleasant and unfortunate circumstances and differences have arisen in the marital affairs making the separation between the parties hereto irreconcilable and permanent, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have arrived at an amicable settlement adjusting all their alimony and dower rights and all their property rights of every nature and description between the parties hereto or concerning them and the custody of the minor children of the parties hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements herein contained from one to the other it is agreed as follows:

1. That each of the parties hereto shall have their own belongings and personal property and the same shall be their own and neither person shall have any interest in any personal property in the possession of the other.

2. That the first party shall pay to second party the sum of One Dollar at the present time for alimony and support and maintenance of the second party, which shall be the total sum to be paid by him for alimony until circumstances are determined by the Court that further alimony payments are necessary.

3. That the first party shall pay to second party the sum of Eighty-five Dollars (\$85.00) a month, payable in equal installments on the fifth and twentieth of each month hereafter until the eldest child reaches the age of seventeen years or until the further order of a competent Court; upon the eldest child reaching the age of seventeen years, unless otherwise determined by a competent Court, then the payments shall decrease fifty per cent (50%) until the youngest child shall reach the age of seventeen years or until the further order of a competent Court.

4. That the party of the second part shall have all the household furniture and effects accumulated by the parties hereto in their home at 903 Thompson, Saginaw, Michigan, except a portable radio which shall belong to first party.

5. First party shall pay to second party for the use and benefit of her attorney the sum of One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00) payable at the rate of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) on the execution herewith and the balance of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) within sixty days. That there shall be no further attorney fees or court costs of any nature or description in any divorce case filed between the parties unless the ~~action~~ shall be contested.

6. That the first party shall keep in force and maintain his National Service Insurance of \$10,000.00 with the second party as the beneficiary until the termination date of said insurance in approximately four to five years from the date hereof; that second party, if she so desires, may convert said policy at or before the termination date thereof in the full amount of any

portion thereof and pay the necessary premiums and expenses thereafter; that any portion of said policy that second party does not desire to reconvert, then in such event first party shall have the right to reconvert and to keep and maintain as his own and to name the beneficiary of such portion.

7. That the party of the second part shall have the custody, control and education of the minor children of the parties hereto, the issue of said marriage, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the party of the first part shall have the right to see and visit any and all of said children at all reasonable times and to take any and all of said children with him for short visits and entertainments.

8. That the provisions herein made for the party of the second part as above set forth shall be in lieu of her dower in the lands of the first party and he shall hereafter own his remaining lands free, clear and discharged from any dower right or claim and this provision shall also be in full satisfaction of all claims that she may have in any property which the first party may own or may hereafter own or in which he has or may hereafter have any interest.




