Nice of you to reply so promptly. Mogle is not one of the primary  
family lines I am searching, but somehow I've ended up without 50 in  
my file. Most of the information on them is from secondary sources,  
being my grandmother's newspaper obituary collection and her notes. A  
Mogle married into my maternal line about 1862. At least half of the

Below is some information from other MOGLE researchers, I am sending copies of this to each of you. If you know of others searching for MOGLE, especially with links to Henry Co., IN, please let me know. If you would like to share any additional information or suggest possible lines of future research, you can respond to everyone if you like.

I am looking for information regarding Nancy MOGLE who married William Craig BERRY. All I know to date is that her son Charles Alexander BERRY was born in Kentucky, unknown County, in 1835. (He may be the Charles Alexander BERRY who married Caroline M. BICKLEY 06 Feb 1856 in Maysville, Mason Co., KY). Charles Alexander BERRY later moved to Henry Co., IN where he married Mary Elizabeth PEED [d/o Richard PEED/America CLIFT]. C.A. BERRY died in Henry Co., IN 03 Dec 1896.

There is an Anna Mogle, dau of Michael & Maria Mogle born 11 Feb 1813, bap. 25 ap 1813 (Sponsor Barbara Rocky) at Salem Lutheran Church Aasonsburg, Haines Twp., Centre Co., Pa. "Nancy" is a nickname for Anna. They are related to my line. Her brother Michael & wf. Maria came to Wayne Twp. Henry Co. around 1880 or before. All the early Mogles trace back to Valentine Mogle, the 18th century immigrant, as far as I know. I have more Mogle information....Will get back to you later, remind me if I don't. Camilla Berger

I *Edward Shippen jun.* Prothonotary of the Supream Court of the Province of Pennsylvania, certify, That at a Supream Court held at Philadelphia for the said Province of Pennsylvania, the *tenth* Day of *April* in the Year of our Lord, *One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty one* Before *William Allen & William Coleman* Esquires, Judges of the said Court, between the Hours of Nine and Twelve of the Clock in the Forenoon of the same Day, *Nolanin Mogle* of *Wern* in the County of *West* being a Foreigner, and having inhabited and resided for the Space of Seven Years in His Majesty's Colonies in *America*, and not having been absent out of some of the said Colonies for a longer Time than Two Months at any one Time during the said Seven Years. And the said *Nolanin Mogle* having produced to the said Court, a Certificate, of his having taken the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper within Three Months before the said Court, took and subscribed the Oaths, and did make and repeat the Declaration (appointed by an Act, made in the First Year of the Reign of King *GEORGE* the First) according to the Directions of an Act of Parliament, made in the Thirteenth Year of His late Majesty King *GEORGE* the Second, intituled, *An Act for naturalizing such foreign Protestants, and others, therein mentioned, as are settled in any of His Majesty's Colonies in America*; and thereupon was admitted to be His Majesty's natural born Subject of the Kingdom of *Great-Britain*, pursuant to the Direction and Intent of the said Act of Parliament. In Testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand, and affixed the Seal of the Supream Court, the *tenth* Day of *April* in the Year first above mentioned.

Biographical Data

From: " Book of Biographies of Berks County, Pennsylvania ":

" Albert F. Mogel, whose excellant portrait is shown on the opposite page, is one of the foremost businessmen of Leesport, his success being commensurate with his popularity. He has long been a recognized leader of the Democratic party in his district, having entered the political field and been identified with the interests of the party since he reached his majority. All his leisure time not given to his business is spent in the interests of that party or some of the fraternities to which he belongs, and in which he occupies a distinguished place on account of his untiring efforts in their behalf. His political influence has been potently shown in the great number of candidates he has successfully placed in important offices from his district, and was the subject of a leading and highly complimentary editorial in the " Reading Eagle " of recent date. He is a son of David W. and Elizabeth ( Fryberger ) Mogel, and was born November 5, 1864, in Center township, Berks County. Valentine Mogel, who came to America in 1754, was the progenitor, five generations removed, of our subject, and came from the Rhine River provinces, in the western part of the German Empire. He landed at New York, and soon afterward settled in Penns Valley, north of Harrisburg, where he received a grant of land from the government. He was obliged to vacate this land on account of the hostilities of the savages, who at the time were invading that territory, and came to Center township, this county, where he received another grant of land of 70 acres, and to which he added additional acres, that brought up the total to 135. This property, known as the Mogel homestead, has descended thru five generations of the family, and is at present occupied by David W. Mogel, the father of our subject. In the meantime the elder Mogel sent one of his sons, John Adams Mogel, back to occupy the abandoned land and protect it against the encroachments of the Indians, and it was cultivated and tilled by the family, although not used as a home. Valentine Mogel Jr., the great-grandfather of our subject, at length came into possession of the Mogel homestead, through the death of his father, the elder Valentine. Jr. died at the age of 77 years, leaving the following children: Valentine; Henry; Peter; Samuel; Daniel; Mrs. Bagenstose; Mrs. Phillips; Mrs. Hoffman; and Sallie, who died in Stouchsburg, this county, in December 1895, aged 99 years. She was a maiden lady, highly esteemed by everyv one. Henry Mogel, the grandfather, was all his life a resident on the old homestead, where he followed the pursuits of agriculture, and held various local offices in the Democratic party. He was a member of Belleman's Reformed Church in Center township, of which church he was a founder and an official during the greater partv of his connection with it, being an earnest worker and useful



member. He was married to Mrs. Weiser, and had the following children: Henry; William; John; Mary Ann ( Stput ); Susan, unmarried; Samuel; David; Elizabeth ( Bagenstose ); and Isaac. The grandfather died in 1867, at the age of 76 years. David Mogel, the father, was born on the old Mogel homestead, September 17, 1838, received his education in the common schools, and then learned the trade of a carpenter and pumpmaker. He was, however, to continue to live on the ancestral acres, and for the past 35 years has devoted his time to their cultivation. His farm contains 135 acres of well-improved land, and he also owns and operates a creamery and cider mill on the farm. He served as county treasurer from 1887 to 1890, and has held numerous township offices, and is a recognized leader of Democracy in the county. He was a member of the 167th. Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, for 10 months, when the Regiment was stationed at Suffolk, Virginia; serving thru a part of 1862 and 63. He is a member of McLean Post, No. 16, G.A.R. at Reading; Washington Camp No. 165, P.O.S. of A., at Leesport; and the Patrons of Husbandry in which he takes a decided interest. He was married to Elizabeth Fryberger, by which he has 9 children, as follows: Morgan Franklin; Albert F.; Valentine, who died in 1896; Ellen, who died in 1887; Howard; Levi; John; Adam, who died in 1888; and David. Albert F. Mogel began travelling in 1881 and went to Bloomington, McLean County, Illinois. He later entered the Northern Indiana Normal School at Valparaiso, Indiana. On April 19, 1887 he married Alice Henrietta Rahn. They have two children ( Alice is the daughter of William Rahn ), Emma Valeria, and Adam Cleveland, who died December 11, 1890, aged 2 years, 2 months, and 7 days. Mr. Mogel was united with the Reformed Church in 1880."

### Census Lists

The first federal census in this country was taken in 1790. It was then taken every ten years thereafter. Until 1850, only the name of the head of the household was given. Beginning with the 1850 census, the name, age, birth-place, and occupation of each member of the household were given. These records are available, on microfilm for census years 1790 thru 1880. They are to be viewed at most large libraries, or they can be rented thru the mail for \$1 per roll, or you can have a checker in Washington, D.C. search for your surname for \$1 or \$2.



Searching these census lists is the best way to begin tracing your family line.

On the 1790 census for Pennsylvania:

In Berks County; In Bern Township--Valentine Mogul had in his household, three males over 16 years of age, three males under 16 years of age, and two females.

Note: the early clerks were almost always English or of English extraction, and they just could'nt grasp these unusual German names. Therefore, you will see mistakes in spelling throughout this report. Also, this accounts for the variations in the spelling of this surname throughout the United State today.

Dear Mrs Berger,

I have been all over trying to help you on the location of Eliz Mogle's tombstone. I have visited some locations, tried to determine if there had been churches at some of the rural cemeteries and of what denomination they were etc. I have also talked to most of the ministers in the area about their church records and asked them if they ever heard of the Albright group. I have talked to people they recommended and to no avail. However, I have finally found information and I quote from the Historical Atlas of Henry Co Indiana by Higgins and Belden Co Chicago, Ill pub. 1875 reprinted 1972 by Mayhill Publications Knightstown, In. Page 19.

"EVANGELICAL CHURCH An organization known as the Evangelical Church, sometimes called "Albrights" or German methodists have their place of worship at New Lisbon. They number about 30 and hold property estimated at \$800." This may be of help. Now, New Lisbon is in Dudley Township not Liberty.

All the old records of the Methodist Church are housed at Depauw University in Greencastle, In. Perhaps they could help you at the Archives there.

I also have a note that I took at the library when I was looking for some other family and do not have dates. There is a listing that an Eliz Mogle married Alexander Baughn.

Also, I tried to contact the trustee for Dudley township and she is on vacation. Her name is Dorothy Meyerholtz RR #1 Straughn, In 47387. She might have some cemetery records for the Albright group. I did go to New Lisbon and the postmaster has all the cemetery



records for the New Lisbon cemetery. There were no Mogles listed but he said the records are not complete and some of the old ones were not listed.

I shall keep you and Eliz Mogle in mind but at the moment I seem to have reached a stopping point.

You have contacted the right party. I grew up adjacent to the Mogel farm and knew many of the Mogels personally. Howard who operated the farm and cider mill and his father David (one armed) who was a veteran of the Civil War and many others. There is quite a bit in listings of the Mogels in our books.

Stanley, son of Levi and Mary (Rentschler) Mogel upon retirement, built a home on the old homestead, died a few years ago, and was a personal friend of mine. He gave me a substantial amount of historical material on the Mogel Family. In fact, one Emanuel Mogel was married to my dad's aunt way back.

The old homestead is indeed still here and is a neighboring farm to Old Belleman's Church where the Mogels were members and are buried.

David W. Mogel, like one of his brothers, had a language block and this is the basis for this story which Grandfather David liked to tell. The brother, I forget which one, was a bit of a lady's man. On the first day of the famous battle the brother was in the town of Gettysburg in a young woman's home. He never realized that the rebels were taking the town. Upon leaving, he was spotted. He ducked under the porch but was dug out by bayonet. Because he could not speak English, the rebels decided that he was foreign mercenary. He was placed against a board fence to be shot by a firing squad. A split second before the fire order, he swung over the fence and got away. Believe it or not!

Oscar A. Mogel, Sr., son of Valentine F. Mogel, who in turn was the son of David W. Mogel, researched the family history. The information from his work verified known family history. However, the most interesting result of his work was that the family has a crest or coat-of-arms which was bestowed on a family for being engaged in the manufacture of metal items (swords) or skilled in the use of the sword. Since the past Mogels were artisans this seems to be the more likely reason. The coat-of-arms can be seen on Oscar's headstone at Belleman's Church, Centre Township, Berks County, Pa.

It is requested that anyone who reads this Mogel family history who can supply additional information or corrections, please do so.

Valentine Mochel moved from the Rhine River country of Western Germany to Alsace. A short time later he emigrated to America from the seaport of Rotterdam (Netherlands) and qualified in the port of Philadelphia, Penna., Aug. 28, 1750. He appears on the list of 337 passengers imported on the ship "Phoenix," John Mason, Master. The Phoenix sailed from Rotterdam, Holland to Philadelphia touching at the Port of Cowes, England.

Valentine Mochel first settled and took up land in a place known as Penns Valley in Perry County, Penna., and also Millheim in Centre County. He found the Indians troublesome and moved to land north of Belleman's Church, Berks County in 1752. A son of Valentine Mochel, John Adam Mochel later returned to Penns Valley.

The following interesting story of Valentine Mochel was passed down. Valentine Mochel was forced to move from the Rhein River Valley to Alsace due to Prussian oppression. While farming in Alsace he hired a pretty French Housekeeper. The Prussians came to Alsace and an officer made improper advances to Valentine Mochel's Housekeeper. In a fair fight Valentine Mochel killed the Prussian Officer, but since Valentine was just a farmer orders were issued that he was to be hung. Valentine Mochel fled to Holland and took passage on the sailing ship the Phoenix. The ship's master, John Mason was ordered to put Valentine Mochel ashore but John Mason set sail as the Phoenix had already cleared the harbor. If this account is true, and there is no reason to the contrary, the Mogels are here by the grace of a hangman's noose.

Valentine Mochel, Valentine 2nd, Heinrich and David were all craftsmen with skills in gun smithing, carpentry, black smithing and mechanics. I recovered from the barn a hand truck completely made of wood including the wheels, a badly rotted percussion pistol and some wooden gear wheels. Also, the frame of the old barn does not have a single nail - it is held together by wooden pegs.

Valentine Mogel took the oaths of Naturalization to become a subject of the Kingdom of Great Britain April 10, 1761 which is signed by Edward Shippen, Jr., "Prothunotary of the Supreme Court of the Province of Pennsylvania."

During the Revolutionary War, Valentin Mochel and Valentin 2nd would serve in the Army during winter weather and farm in the other seasons. This is apparently the reason that their names do not appear on any muster role. It is a fact that they never received pay for serving in the Army. One letter sent home by Valetin Mockel, which was lost when the Mogel log home burned about 1916, told of the Army's defeat and retreat from Long Island and how Valentin and Valentin 2nd worked as a team in shooting British officers. One would be reloading while the other was in firing position. The letter indicated that this was the strategy of the troops.

A word of mouth story which is very interesting, is that the women that were left home on the Mogel farm poured lead bullets while the men were away. After the Battle of Trenton a Prussian deserter came to the farm house for food. Upon seeing what the women were doing he asked to help. The Prussian made multiple bullet molds and improved methods. Production increased to such an extent that a letter of commendation was received from Washington's Quartermaster. Unfortunately this letter was burned in the Mogel log house fire.

The original Mogel home was a huge log house which was destroyed by fire about 1916. As the years passed wood sheathing and a type of stucco were added to the sides. One side room had ceiling and walls completely covered with old guns and pistols. Most of the guns had been made by the Mogels. Everything was lost except Grandfather David's Civil War bayonet and a badly melted flintlock which I recovered. I still have the bayonet.

Heinrich (Henry) W. Mogel, a son of Valentin Mochel, 2nd joined the 15th Regiment, Volunteer Troop of Cavalry. The Captain was Samuel Wilson and the unit was the 2nd Div., 2nd Brigade, Bucks Co. Militia which saw service in the War of 1812-1814.

David W. Mogel (Mokle), a son of Heinrich W. Mogel, saw Civil War service at Suffolk, Va. He was a member of the 167th Regiment, Company D, Penna. Volunteer Infantry.

Even though David W. Mogel spent most of his service in northern Virginia in the Army of the Potomac, he sometimes found himself elsewhere. The story goes that in June 1863 he and other soldiers were sent on a mission by railroad. These troops were filtered in with units already in position. David W. Mogel found himself with a Michigan outfit at a place later known as the Gettysburg Battlefield. Even though wounded he never received disability.

THE MOGLE FAMILY

As descended through Valentine's son Nicholas.

The name MOGLE has been spelled several different ways by members of the same family; MOCHEL, MOCKEL, MOGLE, MOGEL, MOKEL, MOKLE, MOGUL, etc. These early spellings can be attributed to those persons doing the translation to English since the first two generations in America communicated in their native German. Angelican school teachers most certainly had a great deal of influence in the final spelling of the name, which today is predominately MOGLE and MOGEL.

The early picture is that of a strong, aggressively courageous, and religious family of farmers continually migrating toward open land, building as they go. Family members often migrated together or with inlaws. Some never learned to read or write. Some died young. It is the picture of a hard life but with strong family and religious values.

This line of decendency is limited to Nicholas' son Solomon who migrated to Ohio and on to Indiana.



GENERATION I

VALENTINE MOGLE

The family originated in America with the arrival of Valentine Mogle at Philadelphia August 28, 1750 on the ship "Phoenix", John Mason, Master. When he arrived he registered his name spelling it "Valentin Mochel". The Vessel had sailed from Rotterdam via Cowes, a seaport on the Isle of Wight in southern England. Valentin came from Alsace Lorraine and would have traveled down the Rhine to Holland as was the custom of the Rhineland emigrants. The entire trip to America --- 4 to 6 months!

When Valentin arrived in America, he drifted to what is known as Penns Valley in an area where Milheim, Pa. is today. He took up land but found the Indians troublesome so pulled back to the more populated Berks county near Centreport, in the vicinity of Bellman's Church. Here he took up land in 1752. This original tract was 62 acres which was eventually brought up to 145 acres by the family. When Valentin died in 1795, this homestead was acquired by one of his sons, Valentine Jr. and passed down in the Mogel family over five generations, or into the early 1900's. ( This line of decendancy spell their name MOGEL and are still predominate in the Reading, Pa. area.)

Little is known of the children of Valentin and Anna Eva other than Johann Nicholas, born 7/20/1756 and Valentine Jr. born 6/22/1758. A son, John Adam is mentioned in the biographical history as being sent back to work the original land in Penns Valley. And a Chasper Mokol, born 1/13/1762 and buried in the Neidig Cemetary east of Arronsberg, Pa., must be another son. He died June 16, 1822.

Valentine Mogle was naturalized in Pennsylvania on April 10, 1761 by the Supreme Court at Philadelphia. Although Valentine came from Alsace Lorraine, Mogel family records indicate he may have moved there from Western Germany. He is buried in the old Bellmans Church Cemetary.

## GENERATION II

### NICHOLAS MOGLE/MOCKEL/MOKEL

Johann Nicholas Mogle was born July 20, 1756 in Berks County, Pa. He was baptized at Bellmans Church in Bern Twp., by Daniel Schumacher on August 15, 1756. He died on Sept. 20, 1825 at his home in Centre County, Pa., and is buried in the Reformed Cemetary in Arronsberg, Pa. His tombstone, still visable, is written in German.

Nicholas migrated to Lebanon County, near Schaeferstown, where he was living in 1782-83. Baptismal records show him having a son John, born Sept. 25, 1782 and baptized Nov. 17, 1782 at St. Lukes Evangelical Luthern Church. The parents are shown as Nicholas and Eva Catharine. This child and the mother evidently died since subsequent family members were from Nicholas and his wife Elizabeth. In 1788, Nicholas was living in Snyder County near Selingsgrove and a member of Rows or Salem Luthern Church. By 1792 he had migrated to Haines Twp., Northumberland County, which is now Centre County. Tax rolls show him owning a grist mill in 1800, undoubtedly near Milheim which got it's name from it's mills.

In 1805, Nicholas purchased 19½ acres located in Haines Twp., about a mile south of Milheim and a mile and one-half southwest of Arronsberg.

Nicholas mentioned nine children in his will, along with his wife Elizabeth. They are Michael, Valentine, Solomon, Frederick, Daniel, Katharine, w/o John Neidigh, Eva, w/o Jacob Hettinger, Elizabeth, w/o of Michael Homan, and Sarah.

His brother, Adam ( John Adam ) is shown on the tax rolls for Miles Twp. in 1800. This includes Brush Valley and Rebersburg, which is about five miles from Milheim. Brush Valley and Penns Valley are separated by a ridge called Schriners Mountain. A third brother (assumed) Casper was on the Potter Twp. tax rolls as early as 1792.

Nicholas' wife Elizabeth died Jan. 17, 1840 in Henry County, Indiana where her son Solomon was living at the time.

In the county of NORTHUMBERLAND in 1792, Tax Rolls list Valentine Mogle for 100 acres. Succeeding years list Nicholas Mogle for 100 acres. It is possible that the John Adam referred to in the old biographical history was really Johann Nicholas, although an Adam did exist. It does not seem logical that there would be two sons named John/Johann.

It is also questionable that Valentine drifted to Penns Valley in 1750 or 1751 after he arrived in America, as the old biographys suggest. It is more likely that he settled first in Berks County. He probably acquired his 100 acres in Penns Valley in the 1760's or early 1770's, and then abandoned it during the " GREAT RUNAWAY " of 1775, sending his son, Johann Nicholas back in the early 1780's to work the land. This would have been about 30 miles from where Johann Nicholas was living in Selingsgrove.

### GENERATION III

#### SOLOMON MOGLE

Solomon Mogle was born March 3, 1800 in Centre County, Pa. near Milheim, Pa. He was the son of Nicholas and Elizabeth Mokol(Mockel)(Mokle)(Mogel)(Mogle). He is listed in the Metrical, or Birth and Baptismal Register, along with wife Barbara, of the Brush Valley Union Church, Rebersburg, Pa. This historical hand written (in German) volume records the baptism of Anna Catharina born April 5, 1822. ( She became the wife of H.W. Bailey and is buried in the old Bauman Cemetery in Wayne Twp., Fulton County, Indiana. She died Dec. 3, 1878. ) Shortly after her birth, Solomon and wife Barbara moved to Jackson Twp. in Ohio. ( Records show that Solomons brother Michael, his cousin Jacob, and Barbara's family, the Kiplingers, also migrated to Ohio ). This was in an area of Wayne County which was later to become Ashland County. In 1832 he migrated to Henry County, Indiana where he lived until the end of 1855 and early 1856 when the family moved to Wayne Twp. Fulton County, Indiana.

On Dec. 3, 1838 Solomon bought his first land in Henry County. This was 80 acres in Stoney Creek Twp. for which he paid \$500. Three months later, on March 4, 1839, he bought the 80 acres in Liberty Twp. which was to become his home for the next 16 years. This was exceptional land for which he paid \$1200. Nine months later, on Dec. 19, 1840, he bought another 80 acres in Harrison Twp. for \$250 bringing his holdings to 240 acres of prime land.

Solomon was one of the first in Henry County to build a large two story house. His Mother, Elizabeth, came to live with him and helped furnish the home with her furniture, which she left him in her will. His eye for good land and his ability and hard work paid off over the next few years as he became one of the most successful farmers in Henry County.

On Dec 30, 1855, Solomon sold his farm in Liberty Twp. ( He had sold the other two parcels earlier ) and moved to Fulton County, where he purchased, on Feb.. 11, 1856 over 400 acres of prime land for \$5000. This was in the same area where he had

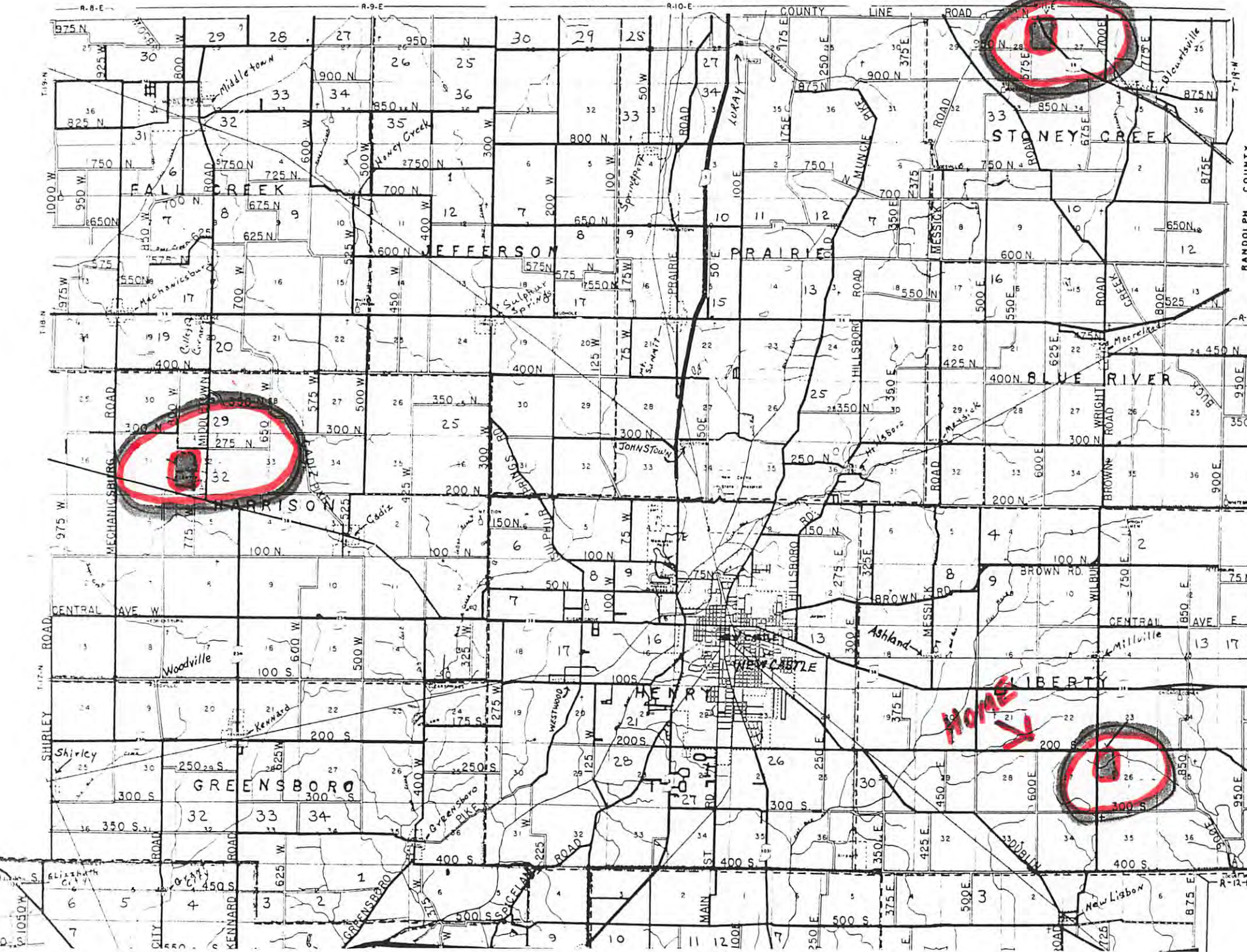
purchased over 300 acres on Oct. 7, 1852 and subsequently sold to his two sons, Thomas and William Henry on Jan. 26, 1854.\*( For one-third less than it cost him -- Ahem -- a secret to this day ! ) This was the beginning of much buying and selling of land in this area of Fulton County by the family. Much of it between family members and their kids resulting in extensive land holdings in Fulton Co. into the early 1900's.

Solomon and Barbara had five daughters ( Katy, Sarah, Mary, Betsy, and Susan ) and two sons ( Thomas and William Henry ). They also raised a young boy by the name of Samual Wood.

Solomon died November 17, 1862. Barbara died June 4, 1881. They are buried in the same plot in the old Bauman Cemetery in Fulton County, Indiana.

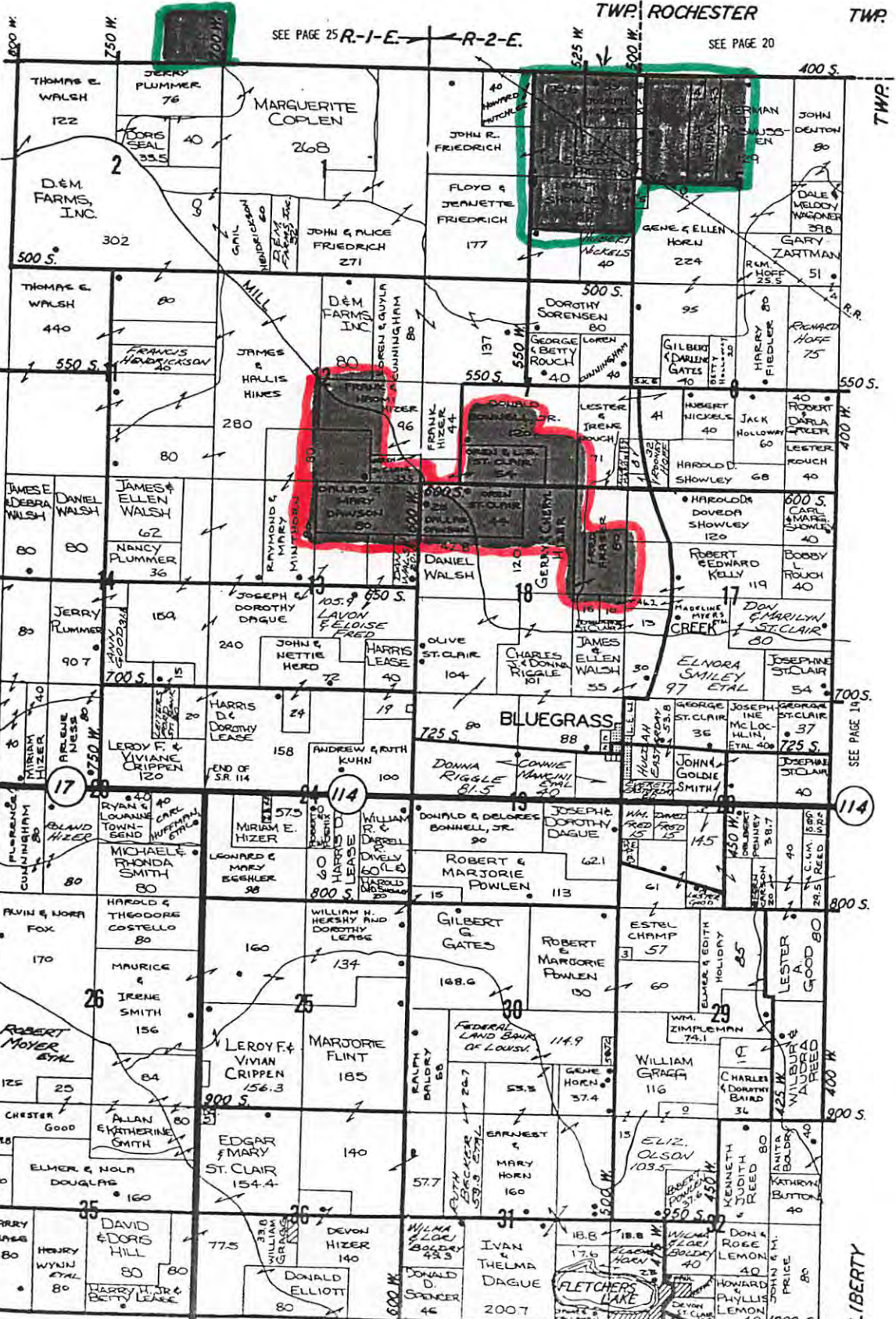

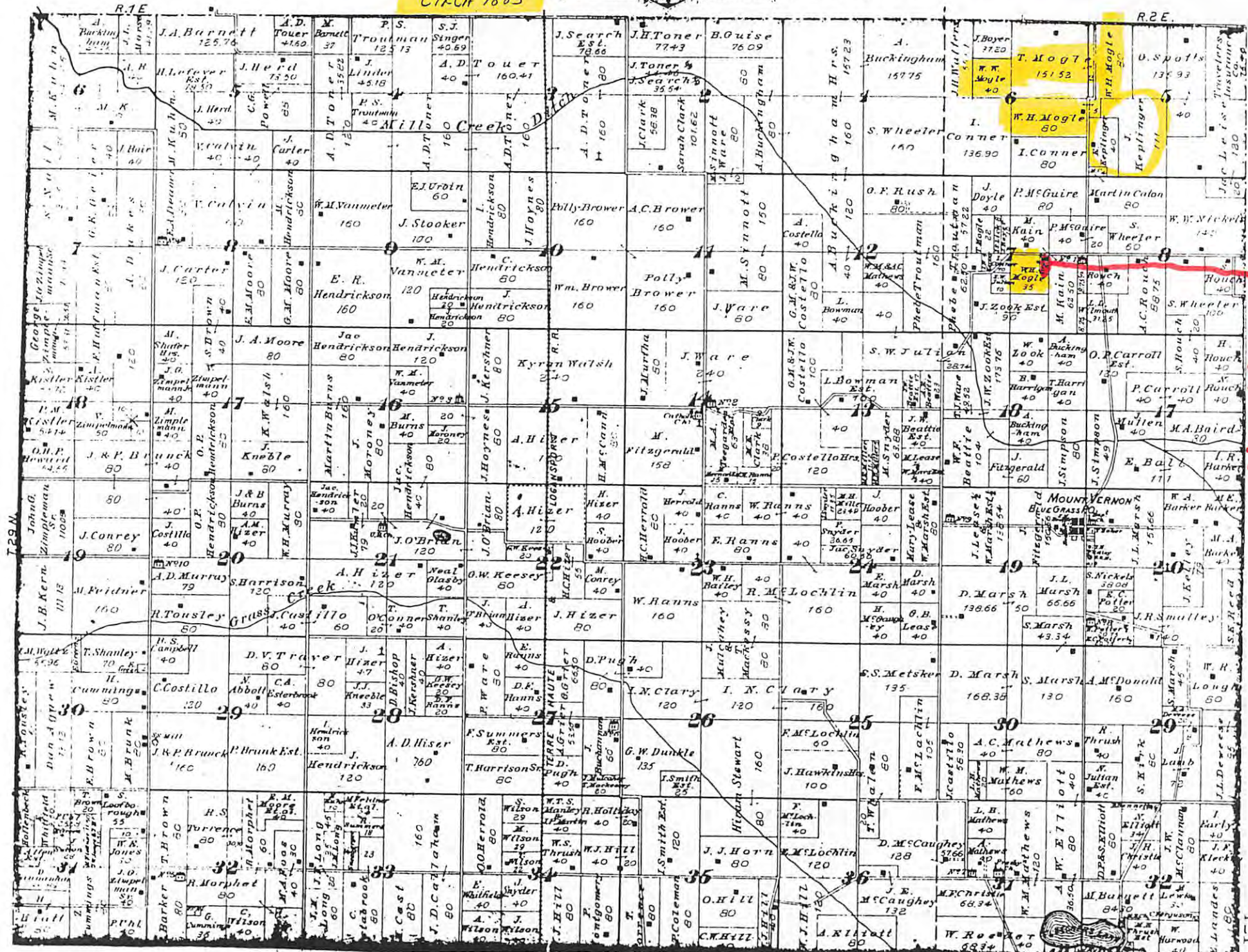


MAP OF

GENERATION IV

THOMAS MOGLE

Tom Mogle was born May 18, 1832 in Ashland County, Ohio. Shortly thereafter the family moved to Henry County, Indiana where he grew up. On Oct. 23, 1854, his father Solomon sold to he and his brother, William Henry, a little over 300 acres of land in Wayne Twp., Fulton County, Indiana.\* It was here that he met Mary Jane Sparks, daughter of the Rev. Jesse Sparks, and married on Oct. 27, 1857. They lived their entire married life on their farm in Fulton County, near Kewanna, where Tom, like his father, was a very successful farmer and continually added to his land holdings, including four lots in Kewanna. He was also very active in the Masonic Lodge in this town.

Reineland emigrants such as Tom's great grandfather, Valentine, did not believe in slavery so it stands to reason that Tom would grow up with this same philosophy. Prior to the Civil War, Tom and Mary Jane turned their home into an Underground Railroad Station, hiding escaped slaves who were making their way north to freedom. This was done in an upstairs attic room, the door of which was papered over and had no woodwork or molding. ( I remember playing hide and seek in this room when I was about six years old. We called it the " Secret Room " but did not know the history of it. Aunt Molly, My Dad's aunt was living in the house at the time and we had family reunions there. )

Tom and Mary Jane had five children; William Walter, Molly, Alva, Orpha, and Ralph who died in infancy. All at one time or another purchased and lived on Mogle family land, as was the tradition. In his later years, Tom became somewhat reclusive, preferring to meditate alone with his religion, often out in a field or pasture. He was an excellent carpenter who made most of his own furniture. In 1859 he completed a Grandfather Clock which kept perfect time. The day he died, on May 14, 1896, the clock stopped and no one was ever able to fix it.

Tom is buried in the old Shaffer Cemetery east of Kewanna. Mary Jane died on Jan. 3, 1913 and is buried in the same plot.

*Valentin Mochel moved from the Rhine River Country of Western Germany to Alsace. Later he emigrated to America from the seaport of Rotterdam (Netherlands) and qualified in the Port of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania August 28, 1750. He appears on the list of 339 passengers imported on the sailing ship "Phoenix", John Mason, Master. Record is in the Pennsylvania Archives, 2nd Series, Volume 17, page 319h*

*Valentin Mochel first settled and took up land in a place known as Penns Valley in Perry County, Pa. and also Millheim in Centre County. He found the Indians troublesome and moved to land north of Belleman's Church, Berks County, in 1752. One son of Valentin Mochel, John Adam Mochel, moved back to Penns Valley.*

*Valentine Mogle (name spelling now changed by the English) took the oath of naturalization to become a subject of the Kingdom of Great Britain, April 10, 1761. Oaths are signed by Edward Shippen, or "Prothunotary of the Supreme Court of the Province of Pennsylvania".*

*Valentin Mochel served in the Continental Army.*

*Valentin Mochel's son that remained in Berks County was Valentin Mochel, 2<sup>nd</sup>, born January 22, 1758. He is buried in Belleman's Old Cemetery.*

Dear Mr. Mogel:

I am a great-great-great-great-grandson of Casper Mogle, who was born in Northumberland County (in what may now be part of Centre County), Pennsylvania, sometime before 1765. He then moved to Indiana County where he died about 1822.

I have been doing research work on the Mogel/Mogle family and earlier this summer spent a day in Berks County and talked briefly on the telephone with Stanley Mogel. I also had a chance to visit Belleman's Church and the cemetery there. As I continued my vacation in Pennsylvania I was able to learn more information about the family, but so far cannot definitively ascertain who Casper's ancestors were.

Enclosed is a summary of the information I have gathered so far. It would be most helpful if you or perhaps some other members of your family could look this over and compare it with information that you have and see if there is any additional family information you could provide me. Any clues as to Casper's ancestors would certainly be appreciated.

## THE MOGEL/MOGLE FAMILY

Casper Mogle was born in Northumberland County -- in what is now probably a part of Centre County -- Pennsylvania. According to J.A. Caldwell's History of Indiana County (1880), Casper died in Mahoning Township, Indiana County, in 1819 at about sixty years of age, meaning he was born about 1759.

Casper married Margaret Troutner. We have no definitive information on her parents. However, Snyder County Pioneers reports George Troutner, Sr. was an early settler in Penn Township ... held the office of constable in 1774 ... and in 1784 was assessed with 300 acres of land and personal property. George Troutner, Jr. was assessed in Penn Township in 1781 and designated a single freeman. In 1790 he lived in what is now Centre County [we assume the Penn Township references also are to what is now Centre County], and his family consisted of two males over the age of 16, and one female. It is believed his father lived with him at that time. Also, the 1790 census reports that Nicholas Magle lived next to him.

On November 17, 1794, Casper Mogle was deeded a 121-acre parcel of land in Morris Township in Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania. The property was purchased from George and Rebekah Montgomery for 151 pounds, 17 shillings, and six pence.

Casper Mogle is shown on the 1796 Huntingdon County list of taxables in Morris and Catharine Townships, and is shown as having 118 acres. [Also appearing on that list is George Mogle with 150 acres.] Casper appears on the Morris Township tax list for 1812, this time with 112 acres. Jacob Mogle (probably Casper's eldest son) also appears on the 1812 list, but does not appear to own land. In 1815 Casper served as one of the township's two road commissioners.

Casper Mogle appears in the 1800 census for Huntingdon County in Morris Twp. The household contained one male under 10; one male 10 to 16; one male 26 to 45 [Casper]; four females under 10; one female 10 to 16; and one female 16 to 26 [Margaret].

In 1810 in Morris Twp. the J. Mogle household had two males between 16 and 26; one male over 45 [Casper]; two females under 10; two females from 10 to 16; one female from 16 to 26; and one female over 26 [Margaret]. Consequently, Casper would have been born sometime before 1765, and Margaret not before 1774. Their eldest son and daughter would have been born between 1784 and 1790.

According to Caldwell, Casper and Margaret had ten children: Jacob (married Elizabeth Kuntz); Margaret (married David Shrock); Adam (married Catharine Neff); Catharine (married Adam Stauffer); Eve (married William Riddle); Mary (married Peter Riddle); Susan (married Henry Aul); Esther (married Daniel Shirtle); George (born 1810, married Mary Jordan); and Sarah (married Joshua Brink). The family generally were Lutherans.



According to Caldwell, Casper moved to a farm in Mahoning Twp. in Indiana County, Pennsylvania, in 1814 (although it probably was later as he was a road commissioner in Huntingdon County in 1815). Casper received a Deed for 103 acres from Benjamin B. Cooper on May 2, 1817; for which he paid \$181.35. Caldwell also reports that Casper was a veteran of the War of 1812.

Caldwell indicates Casper died in 1819. However, his estate was not opened until August 10, 1822, when his son Jacob was appointed administrator. Margaret, according to Caldwell, died in 1838 about 79 years of age [but, as we have seen, she probably was not that old].

Adam Mogle was the son of Casper and Margaret ... and was born in Huntingdon County sometime between 1790 and 1800. He probably moved with his parents to Indiana County between 1815 and 1817. His will is dated March 24, 1845, and was admitted to probate on April 28, 1845. Consequently, he died between these dates in Mahoning Twp. in Indiana County.

Adam married Catherine Neff, the daughter of Abram and Mary Neff. Abram was born in Maryland in about 1735, and died in 1833 in Indiana County. Catherine's estate was admitted to probate in Indiana County on April 22, 1859.

The 1820 census for Mahoning Twp. indicates Adam's household contained: one male under 10; one male between 26 and 45; and two females 16 to 26 [the second probably was someone's sister].

The children of Adam and Catherine were: Jacob (born about 1820, married Matilda ---, two of his children were Catharine and Margaret); Michael (born 1821, married Esther Russel); Susan (married --- Roush); Mary (married --- Kerr); Margaret (born about 1825, married --- Calkett); and Levi (born about 1830, and died between 1860 and 1865, unmarried).

Michael Mogel was born in Indiana County on August 13, 1821. He married Esther Russel, who was born on January 14, 1824. Nothing is known of her parents. In 1857, they moved to Lee County, Iowa.

Their children were: Mary A. (born about 1844); George W. (born June 17, 1846, and died January 21, 1933); Elizabeth Alice (born May 4, 1847, and died May 16, 1927); and Hezekiah (born January 7, 1849, and died August 22, 1940).

Michael died December 19, 1867; and Esther died on November 19, 1894. They are buried in the Dover Cemetery in Lee County, Iowa.

George W. Mogel married Mary Ann Wright (1852-1933) ... they were the parents of Nina Mogel (1897-1969) who married Frank F. Moyle (1890-1958). They were the parents of Meta F. Moyle (b. 1917) who married Rex R. Brown (b. 1917). They are the parents of Ralph R. (b. 1944); Gary W. (b. 1949); and Mary Ann (b. 1958).

WHAT ABOUT OTHER FAMILY CONNECTIONS?

Who were Casper's ancestors?

Valentin Mochel immigrated in 1750

The family name has been spelled Mochel, Mockel, Mockle, Mogel, Mogle, Magle, Mocel, Mokel, Mokle, and Mogul.

Valentin Mochel arried on August 28, 1750, in Philadelphia aboard the ship "Phoenix" which had sailed from Rotterdam. Valentin apparently came from the Rhine River provinces in the Western Provinces of the German Empire. He took the oath of citizenship in 1761.

Valentin first settled in Penn's Valley at Millheim (now situated in the northeast corner of Penn Township in Centre County, Pennsylvania). He took up land, but after being there for sometime found the Indians becoming troublesome, so fearing for his family's [this must mean he had a family by this time] safety, he migrated to near Centreport (Berks County, Pennsylvania), in the vicinity of Belleman's Church, where he took up a tract of land in 1752. This land has remained in the family to the present time, the owner now being Valentin's great-great-great-great-great grandson Stanley Mogel.

According the Daniel Schumacher's baptismal record (Evangelical Lutheran) four-week old Johann Nicolaus Mockell was baptized in Bern Township, Berks County, on August 15, 1756. He was the son of Valentin Mockell, and his wife Anna Eva. Another son Valentine was born on January 22, 1758. According to Berks County Biographical Sketches (1898) a third son, John Adams Mogel, was sent back to Penn's Valley to occupy and cultivate the abandoned land and protect it against the Indians.

Valentin Mochel is listed in the Bern Township tax records (some of the references may be to his son, Valentine) as follows:

Also, the following appear on the Bern Twp. tax lists: 1767, Felty Mogle; and 1768, Felte Mogel. Perhaps these really are references to Valentin.

Note, however, Valentine Mogle appears on the federal supply tax 1st for 1782 in Penn Township, Northumberland [now Centre] County with 100 acres of land. Did Valentin, Sr. return to Penn's Valley for a short time?

Valentine Moqul is listed in the 1790 census for Bern Twp. The household contains three males over 16, two males under 16, and two females. Perhaps Valentine the son is the head of the house, and the elder Valentin is living with his son ... as well as a brother or in-law?

According to the records of Berks County, Valentine Mochel was appointed administrator of the estate of his father, Valentine Mochel, on April 28, 1795. His mother, Eve, had declined to serve.

Valentine, the son, married Maria Barbara Moyer (born January 9, 1759), but she died prior to 1797. Valentine then married her sister Catharine Moyer (born August 19, 1767). Catharine died August 1, 1826; Valentine on April 23, 1830. Valentine's children were: (1) Valentine, 1788-1848, unmarried; (2) Henry, 1792-1867, married Susanna Weirich; (3) Peter, married Catharine; (4) Sallie, 1796-1895, unmarried; (5) Daniel, 1798-1880, married Anna Maria Machamer; (6) Samuel, 1805-1858, married Sarah Bagenstose; (7) daughter, married --- Bagenstose; (8) daughter, married --- Phillips; and (9) daughter, married --- Hoffman.

\* \* \* \* \*

Nicholas Moqul appears on the Bern Twp. tax list in 1779 and 1780; Nickolas Mokle in Penn Twp. in 1783 and 1784; and Nicholas Moqul in Penn Twp. in 1785. Further, Nicholas Magle is listed in the 1790 census of Northumberland County [which then contained Penn Twp.], with the following household: one male over 16, three males under 16, and three females. [As noted earlier, he lived next to George Troutner.

This must be the son of Valentin, Johann Nicolaus, who was born in 1756, and who must have returned to Penn's Valley and started a family. What about the son John Adams ... or was it Adam? See more later.

Nicholas does not appear in the 1800 census. However, Adam Mokol is listed in Miles Twp. in Northumberland County [either Penn Twp. was a part of Miles or near it] with the following household: one male under 10, one male between 26 and 45, and one female 16 to 26.

In 1810 Nicholas Mogle is listed in the census of Haines Twp. in Centre County: one male under 10, one male 10 to 16, two males 16 to 26, and one male over 45. Also, one female under 10, one female 16 to 26, and one female over 45. (George Troutner still lives next to him; George and one female are over age 45.)

Also in the same township are listed Nicholas' son Michael (age 16 to 26); daughter Eva Hetinger (age 26 to 45); and daughter Katharine Nedigh (age 25 to 45).



In the 1820 census of Haines Twp. the Nicholas Mogle household is enumerated as: one male under 10; one male 16-18; one male 18-26; and one male over 45. Also, one female 10-16; one female 16-18; and one female over 45. Two persons are engaged in agriculture.

Also listed in Haines Twp. are son Valentine (age 26-45); daughter Eva (over 45); daughter Katharine (over 45); and in Potter Twp. son Michael (26 to 45).

On September 30, 1825, the will of Nicholas Mokle, of Haines Twp., was probated in Centre County. The will was dated August 26, 1825 -- so he died between those dates. His wife was Elizabeth and his children were: Michael; Valentine; Solomon; Frederick; Daniel; Katharine (married John Nidigh); Eva (married Jacob Hettinger); Elizabeth (married Michael Howman); and Sarah (married --- Stover). His wife Elizabeth died between December 14, 1839, and April 27, 1840, in Henry County, Indiana. Her estate also was probated in Center County.

The will of George Moore of Haines Twp. was probated in Centre County on November 5, 1817. He mentions his daughter Molly, married to Valentine Mogel.

Harriett Mogel, the wife of Frederick, died in Rock Grove, Illinois, on March 15, 1884. She was born in 1807 in Winsor Twp. in Berks County, Pennsylvania, and married Frederick in Millheim, Pennsylvania [in Penn Twp.] in 1831. They moved to Illinois in 1846.

In 1827 Valentine Mogel appears on the Gregg Twp. -- west of Penn -- tax list; in 1836 Daniel Mokle on the Harris Twp. -- three townships west of Penn -- tax list; and in 1845 Frederick Mochel on the Penn Twp. tax list.

\* \* \* \* \*

In 1798 citizens of Haines Twp. Northumberland County [now Centre] -- which borders Penn on east -- signed a petition to the United State Congress. Among the signers in German were Adam Mockel and Michael Mockel. On the third Sunday after Trinity in 1794, one of the 127 communicants at the Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haines Twp. was Frederick Mokle. In 1803 Adam Mogle is on the Miles Twp. tax list ... it was noted earlier he was in the 1800 census.

In the 1810 census of Frankstown Twp. in Huntingdon County is listed the H. Mogle household: one male under 10; one male 10-16; one male over 45; four females under 10; and one female 26-45.

Also, in 1810 in Hopewell Twp. in Bedford County appears the Adam Mogle household: one male 10-16; two males 16 to 26; one male over 45; and one female over 45.

In the 1820 census of Frankstown Twp. in Huntingdon County the Adam Mogul family is listed: one male under 10; one male 10-16; one male 16-18; one male 18-26; one male 26-45; one female 10-16; three females 16-26; and one female 26-45. Two persons are engaged in agriculture.

Also in 1820 Adam Magle is listed in Hopewell Twp. in Bedford County again: two males under 10; two males 16 to 18; two males 18 to 26; two males 26 to 45; one male over 45; and one female over 45. Six persons are engaged in agriculture. No listing is shown in Hopewell Twp. in 1830.

\* \* \* \* \*

Another Valentine Mogel is shown as being born in Berks County in 1783 [to whom?]. He married Catherine Kline, who also was born in Berks County, in 1786. In 1830 they moved to Perry County, Pennsylvania, where they engaged in farming. Their children were: (1) Catherine; (2) David; (3) Mary Ann, married Wilson Sauseman; (4) Lucetta; (5) Margaret, married John Wagner; (6) Esther, married Daniel Meyers; (8) Jacob, born 1826, married Mary Ann Clouser; and (9) Valentine, who moved to Iowa.

The will of Jacob Hazall of Frankstown Twp. was probated in Huntingdon County on January 25, 1825. The will mentioned his sister Elizabeth (who married Adam Mogal); Henry Mogal; and Catherien Mogal (who married Adam Finderman).

Finally, the tax records for Rockhill Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, list:

Stophel/Christopher is shown as having 160 acres of land. Also in the township for each of the tax years are two single men by the same family surname: Adam and George.

Who were the parents of Casper Mogle? It appears it was not Nicholas ... or else Casper would have been mentioned in his will, although Casper died before it was written. It seems that Casper and Nicholas were contemporaries. Were they brothers? Were they the son of John Adams [Adam?] Mochel? Is he the same one in the 1800 census?

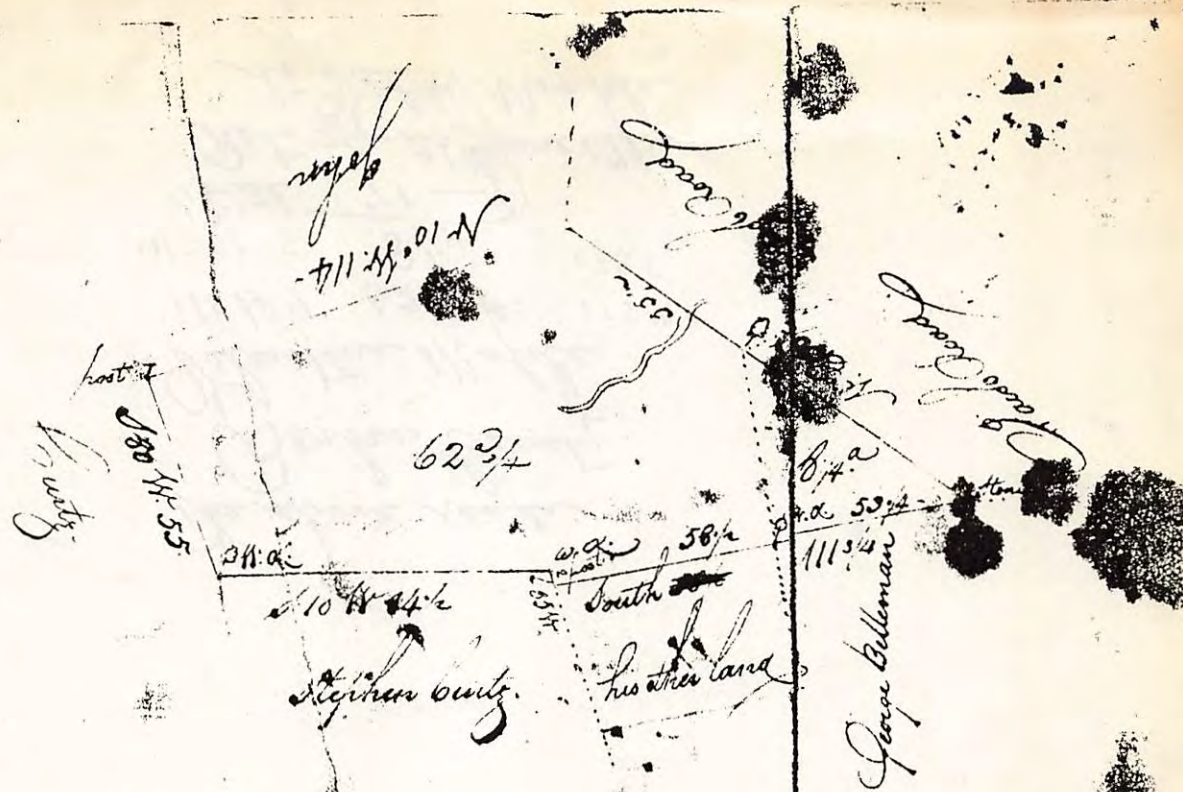

Obituary of Levi S. Mochel:

The Woodburn (Oregon) Independent - Vol. 54, No. 16, Thursday, March 19, 1942:

Rev. Levi Schade Mochel died at 8 o'clock Wednesday evening, March 11, in his 82nd year. He was the elder of two sons of Amandon Mochel and Louisa Schade Mochel - born at Bernville, Berks County, Pennsylvania, where he spent his boyhood and youth. He prepared at Keystone State Normal School at Kutztown, Pa. and taught for several years; entered Lafayette University in 1888 and the next year transferred to the Sophomore class at Princeton, where he received his AB degree in 1891 and his AM in 1892. He then entered Princeton Theological Seminary and received his degree and was ordained in 1895. He devoted his life to the Home Missionary field of the Presbyterian church, USA. Turning west he accepted pastorates in Iowa at Delmar, and then at Farley. In 1899 he came to the coast, first as missionary and then pastor at Toledo, Washington and Chehalis until 1905. Thence, coming to Oregon, he spent two years in home missions in eastern Oregon, with headquarters at Summerville. In 1907 he was called to minister to the woodburn Presbyterian church. On June 20th, 1908 he was married to Maud E. McKinney, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John McKinney of this city. Their oldest son, John McKinney Mochel, was born here. From June 1910 to June 1914 Mr. Mochel was pastor of Grace Presbyterian church of Albany, Oregon and in Oregon a second son, Matthew Schade Mochel, and a daughter Margaret Elizabeth were born. In 1914 he was called to the pastorate of the Gervais Presbyterian church, where he continued for over 4 years, ministering also to Aurora and Donald. He returned to Woodburn in late 1918 where he has since resided. He is survived by his widow Maud M. Mochel, a son John of Cambridge, Ma, a son Matthew with the US medical corps in CA, a daughter Mrs. George L. Dukek of Fossil, Oregon and two grandchildren, the son and daughter of John Mochel and two nephews, Dr. John Vincent Mochel of Reading, Pa. and Paul Mochel of New York City., the sons of his only brother, who preceded him in death. He was a devoted husband and father, a kindly neighbor and a Christian gentleman. Funeral services were held from the Ringo chapel Saturday afternoon, interment being in Belle Passi cemetery. Rev. R. W. Achor of Oregon City, and old friend, neighbor and fellow pastor, officiated. Music was by Mrs. Hal Chapman. Pallbearers were Lester Gilbert, Howard Butterfield, Ivan Beers, Albert VanCleave, Rodney Alden and E. J. Allen.
