the following words were written by a man who had lost his wife
and son, in the year 1785. In his distress he wrote to Mr. C. W. Dallin,

John Dallin was a man of great talents, and it is a pity

He was a good scholar, and became a teacher in one of
the best schools in the country. After leaving school, he
studied law, and became a lawyer in Boston. He was a
man of great ability, and soon became a successful
attorney. He was a member of the Boston Bar, and
represented many prominent men in their trials. He
was a man of great energy and determination, and
was always ready to defend his clients with all his
power. He was a man of high character, and
was greatly beloved by his friends and associates.

- II. Michael Homan, Jr. (Michael²,) born 1779, date of death not now known. Michael married around the year 1812, Elizabeth Mokle, daughter of Nicholas Mokle. Elizabeth was born September 4, 1792, died October 27, 1835. She is buried in the Reformed Cemetery at Aaronsburg, Pa.

Michael, Jr. is not mentioned in Boyd Homan's records but he is definitely listed in the probate records for his father as "oldest son". The following children are listed in the early Penns Valley Church records as children of Michael and Elizabeth (Mokle) Homan:

1. Anna, born February 16, 1813.
2. David, born February 23, 1815.
3. John, born March 27, 1816.
4. Marianna, born December 11, 1817.
5. Sarah, born March 4, 1820.
6. Magdalena, born June 5, 1821.
7. Michael - not listed in Centre County church records but evidently born 1823.
8. Andrew, born June 6, 1825.

For sometime I had been unable to learn what happened to this Michael and his wife, Elizabeth, after the birth of Andrew in 1825. It is easy to confuse him with Michael, son of Jacob, Sr. One day I noticed that Nicholas Mokle had made a will in which he mentioned his wife, Elizabeth, and all his children including a daughter, Elizabeth, wife of Michael Homan. When I checked the probate file for Nicholas, I found a long and interesting estate record. From this I learned that Michael and his wife were still living in Centre County when Michael signed his "X" in right of his wife for funds from the estate of her father. Elizabeth died in 1835. Michael signed another receipt for his then deceased wife's father in the year 1836 which indicates he was then still living in Centre County.

On October 31, 1840, Michael and all his children were living in Montgomery township, Richland County, Ohio. Elizabeth Mokle, grandmother and widow of Nicholas, had died in Henry township, state of Indiana, between December 1839 when she wrote her will and April 1840 when the will was admitted to probate.

Michael, as guardian of his then two minor children (1840), and his adult children entered a letter in the court of Richland County, appointing John Homan, of the same township and county, as attorney to receive their share of the residue of the estate of Nicholas Mokle. A copy of this document, dated Oct. 31, 1840, was recorded in the Court House at Bellefonte. This names the children of Michael and Elizabeth as follows:

1. Ann, wife of Daniel Miller.
2. David Homan.
3. John - apparently the John Homan appointed attorney to collect the money.
4. Mary, wife of John Snook (Marianna).
5. Sarah, wife of Michael Ritter.
6. Magdalena - single (aged 19)
7. Michael - minor.
8. Andrew - minor (aged 15).

Interesting that a son of Michael Homan II migrated to the state of Ohio. I wonder if any in the Homan family have heard from this line of descent.
