WHEREAS BARBARA ARNDORFF doth still continue in her wicked ways, and hath of late acted very dirty actions; I think it proper to forewarn the public, a second time, from lending or trusting the said Barbara any thing on my account, as I am determined never to pay any debts of her contracting.

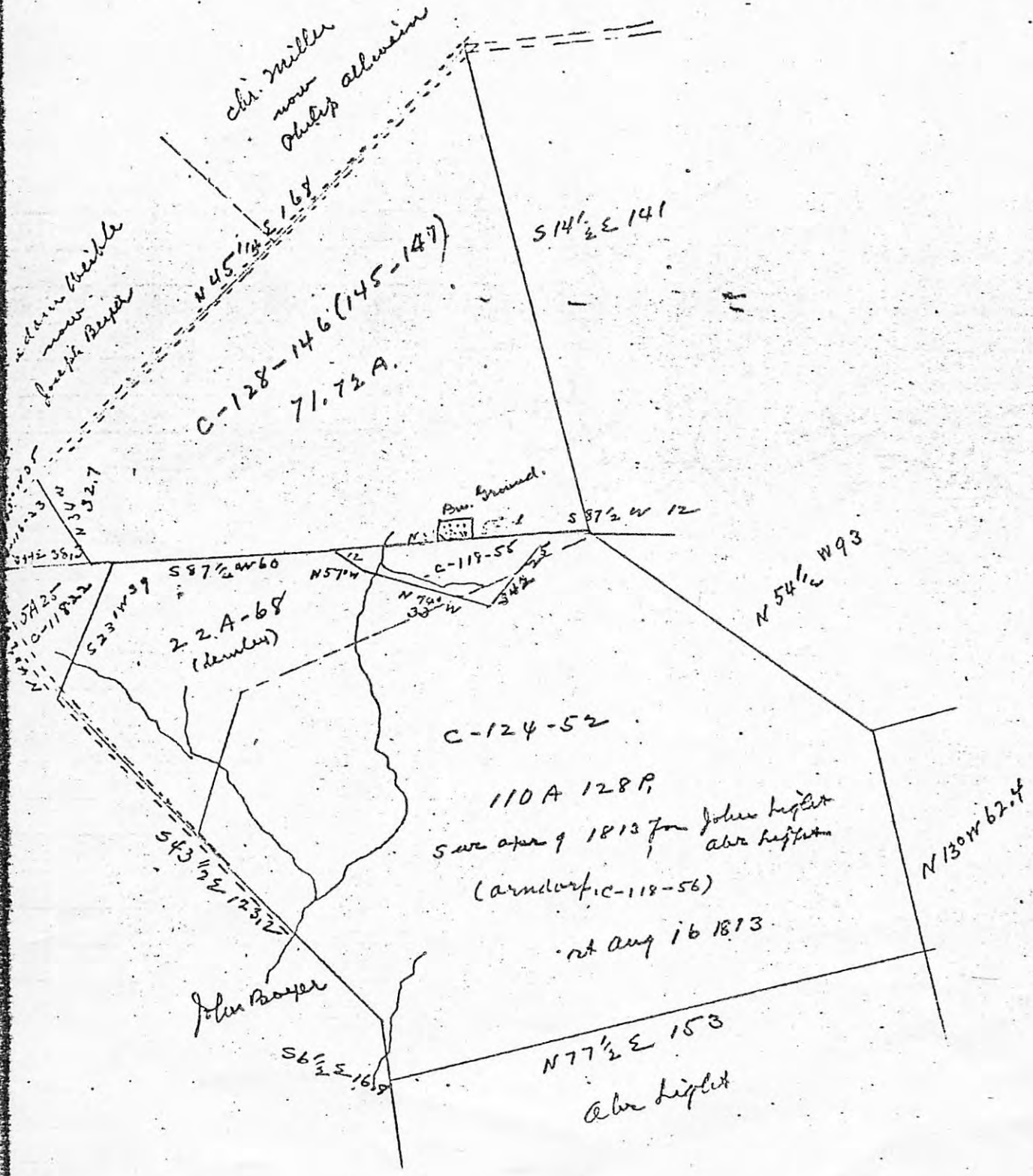
THIRTY POUNDS Reward.

RUN away from his wife and family of small children, in the night of the 9th inst. JOHN ORNDUFF, a country born Dutchman, talks good English, wore his uniform brown coat, faced with blue, a knot on his shoulder, white jacket and breeches, about 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, fresh complexion, light brown curled hair, took a girl with him named HANNAH MUCKLEWEE; it is thought they will try to pass for man and wife; they were seen in Lancaster the day after they ran off, on their way over Susquehanna; they took a half silk gown from his wife, a new chintz ditto, a lawn apron and handkerchief, a white silk bonnet; he rode a young black mare, and the girl a grey mare, with a new hunting saddle with silver gilt round the edge. Whoever takes up and confines them in any goal, so that they may be brought to justice, shall have the above reward, and reasonable charges, and if the man only, Twenty-seven Pounds, and charges, paid by BARBARA ORNDUFF

Both of the above items also appeared in the May 21, 1777 issue, Numb. 2517. Because of the war, this newspaper was only published from Feb. 5 through Sept. 10 during the year 1777. The Sept. 3 and 10 issues are missing from the Library of Congress. It was not published during December of 1776 or during 1778. A search of the 1775, 1776 and 1777 issues has not produced John Orndorff's first warning notice.

In the name of God, Amen; The Seventeenth Day of
February in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven Hundred and Seven
-ly Seven: I Philip Arndoff of the Township of Vincent in the County
of Chester the State of Pennsylvania Taylor: Being very Sick and weak
in Body but of sound and perfect mind and Memory, Calling to mind the
Mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die, Do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that
is to say principally and first of all I Commit my Soul to God who gave it
and my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like Decent manner
and as to my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
I Give, devise, and Dispose of the same in form and manner following.
I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth one third of her
Impremis I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth one third of her
own Choice, and my Bed and Bedding together with one third third part of my
Clear Estate after my Funeral Charges and Just Debts are paid, whom I make
ordain and constitute one of the Executors of this my last Will and
Testament; But if in case my said wife Elizabeth shall Marry, then she is
to Return two parts out of three of her part to be Equally Divided between my
children and to be no longer an Executor of this my last Will and Testament
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved son John Arndoff the Sum of fifteen
pounds ^{five shillings} current money of Pennsylvania together with the sixth part of
the Remainder of my Clear Estate after my wifes part is taken out, the said
fifteen pounds and five shillings to be paid to him in five years from my decease.
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved son Lewis Arndoff whom I make
ordain and constitute the other Executor of this my last Will and Testament
the Sum of fifteen pounds together with ^{the} sixth part of my Clear Estate.
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved son Philip Arndoff the Sum of fif-
teen pounds current money aforesaid together with the sixth part of my
Clear Estate and be it known that it is my will that the above forty five
pounds and five shillings bequeathed to my three Sons be allowed to them
as an overplus above what I bequeath to my Daughters the said fifteen pounds
to be paid to him in six years from my decease, he may go to trade at 16 years old
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary Married to Cronomus Saylor
one sixth part of my Clear Estate to be paid to her in seven years from my decease.
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Margret the other sixth
part of my Clear Estate to be paid to her in eight years from my decease.
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Susannah the other sixth
part of my Clear Estate to be paid to her in Ten years from my decease
and as a Distinction is necessary to be made between the above mentioned
Sums of Money bequeath to my Sons and the Equal parts of the Remainder
of my Estate divided between my six children, it is my will that my son John
shall have his ^{part} Exclusive of his fifteen pounds five shillings in six years

from my Decease, and my Son Lewis to have his Equal part
 Exclusive of his fifteen pounds in Nine years from my Decease, and my
 Son Philip to have his Equal part Exclusive of his fifteen pounds in
 Eleven years from my Decease. and I do further give and bequeath to
 my said Daughter Susannah a Bed and Bedding to be reserved to her before
 a Dividend is made of my Estate as above. And I do hereby utterly
 Disallow, Revoke and Disannul all other Wills and Testaments by me
 heretofore Named or made and bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming this
 and no other to be my last Will and Testament: In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day and Year above written.
