HENDRICK OHRENDORF

Rupp's Collection of Emigrants p 448 "Among the names of males Palentines above the age of 21 years in Livingston Manor N.Y. in the winter of 1710 and summer of 1711 is Johann Hendrick Orendorff."

The family traditional History is that Hendrick (Some say the name was originally spelled OHLENDORFF) married a Jewess lady, that he came from Wurtemberg, Germany with his three sons in 1710; that two sons went with their wives' people, one to Cuba, the other to Baltimore, Md and that Hendrick settled with his son, Frederick at Ft Herkimer on the Mohawk River.

his settling at Ft Herkimer and removal of the two sons South probably about the year 1723 from the fact that Hendrick is the only name given above the age of 21 years in Rupp's Collection in 1710 and 1711

From the foregoing we will suppose that Hendrick Orendorff was born in Germany as early as 1670. Married a Jewess lady about 1695 emigrated to America in 1710, settled near Geneseo, N.Y. midway between Buffalo and Rochester—two English hot-beds and was driven by them from pillow to post until two sons were married, became disgusted with the unsettled condition of that part of the country and moved South while Hendrick and his other son, Frederick moved out to Ft Herkimer a point quite distant from either Buffalo, Rochester or New Amsterdam, another center of contention between Dutch and English. This was probably near 1723 Ft Herkimer or Herkimer co. appears to have been Hendrick's last place of residence and Frederick's permanent home

John B. Orendorff was a native of Cassville, Oneida co. and there rec. his early education. April 13 1863 his life work began for on that day he became connected with the State Hosp. at Utica. Here he served ever since in various positions, for the past six years being asst sup. of the institution. In all his work at the hosp. Mr O showed himself most faithful. All with whom he was thrown, sick and well, agree as to the kindness and sympathy of his nature, his constant readiness to serve others and his exact fulfillment of every duty.

Mr. O was prominent in Masonic circles, having attained the 32nd degree. He was a member of Oriental Lodge F & A.M. of Oneida Chapter R.A.M Utica Commandery No 3. K.T. Utica Council, Royal and Select Masters and Ziyara Temple, Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. He was also connected with the Odd Fellows and held every position in the Central City Lodge. Was past Chief in Tri-Mount Encampment and a member of Canton, Utica Patriarchs Militant. He was likewise a member of Ft Schuyler, Royal Arcanum and of the Knights of Pythias Mr. O leaves a bro., George A. of Utica and two sisters, Mrs. R.W. Howard and Mrs. J.K. Harris of Illion.

The funeral service was held Wed from the Pres. Ch. at Illion; was largely attended. A pencil sketch is included in the ledger

HENRICH OHRENDORFF, 1709

It was noticed that the emigrant Palatine Henrich Ohrendorff ("Johan Henrig Arendorff and vrouw, one child") appeared in the sixth party of Palatine emigrants along with 1709ers largely from the Westerwald-Siegen region of Germany. Indeed, leading that sixth party of emigrants as the first name was the New York Palatines' first Reformed minister, Rev. Johann Friederich Hager. The region near Siegen, home of the Hagers, was combed thoroughly for references to Henrich Ohrendorff. Finally, at Oberfischbach near Siegen - which had once been a Pastorate of Rev. Hager's own father - the emigrant was found!

On 1 January, 1708 a proclamation for the marriage of "Johann Henrich Ohrndorff, son of the late Gerlach Ohrndorff from Bottenberg, with Anna Margaretha Peltzer, daughter of the late Joh: Jost Peltzer from Littfeld, Parish Krombacher" was entered in the Oberfischbach registers. This couple then had the one child listed on the Rotterdam lists born at Bottenberg and baptised at Oberfischbach: "Maria Catharin, baptised 13 May, 1708; sponsor was Maria Cath: the wife of Fried: Schwartz from Alchen." The father of the emigrant Henrich, one Gerlach Ohrndorff was buried at Oberfischbach 11 March, 1692 - having died at Bottenberg.

After his arrival in 1710 in colonial New York, Henrich Ohrendorff was listed on the Hunter rolls 1710-12, was a volunteer in the Canadian expedition of 1711, and appeared on the Simmendinger Register with his wife Anna Margaretha and 3 children, 1717.

Dear Mr. Myers :

A great, great Uncle, Darius Orendorff of Hopedale, Illinois who lived to be active in searching for Orendorff Records until he was past 90. His youngest brother Solon, died in California at 96. Darius had Flour Mills and Woolen Mills on his Farm. He traveled to many states, interviewing many Orendorffs. On a Home Printing Press he made some Genealogical books. There were seven branches of the Orendorff Family. (ON BIRTH record of my Ancestor Christian Orendorf, Sr. who was born in Eichen, near Freudenberg, Germany Jan 11 / Aug. 20, 1693.

In Germany I hired two fine German Historians, Mr. Alfred Luck of Siegen and his friend, Emil Flender who made a Search in the 20 Parishes of old NASSAU*SIEGEN and found three Christian Orendorffs who paid Taxes in, near-by towns of Freudenberg area in 18th Century, 1724. etc. Grandfather, son, Nephew? We are still working to identify these and other Orendorffs listed in the Evangelical-Reformed Church Registers in 16th -18th Centuries.

Darius Orendorf who had Mills near Hopedale, Illinois established the First Orendorff Reunion at Bloomington, Illinois. A three Day session Oct. 12-14 1886 The Reunion has been held every year since in the Bloomington, Illinois Area.

My first Historical Book, FROM MILL WHEEL TO PLOWSHARE had many interesting Letters, old Wills, Land Records esp. on the Orendorffs who built Mills on the Antietam, near Sharpsburg, Md. before the American Revolution, on Christopher Orendorff who went to Ky. in 1805- He has hundreds of wonderful Descendants. Four of his sons were Pioneers in Illinois. A Cousin, Christopher Orendorff from Pa. to S.C. on to Ky. and Illinois had 12 Children and wealthy descendants, College, School Teachers, Executives, etc. I feature the Illinois Christopher in my Lincoln Book, FLAME O'DAWN.

This first book and the Lincoln book are sold out. But they do not have any records on Conrad Orendorf, as I could not locate a descendant who would send me vital records.

But I thought it would be interesting to locate the Home City or Province from which Frederick Orendorf came. He might not be closely related to the fine group of Orendorffs who owned Fidelity to some Baron, than to the Catholic Church. For Calvin's Ministers from Switzerland in the 16th Century came in boats and established the Reformed Churches along the Rhine and through Nassau-Siegen. Nassau-Siegen was divided into three parts in 1815. Some of the records are in the Netherlands and not available. But fortunately the Orendorffs lived for Centuries in the part now called SIEGERLAND. Mr. Flender gives his address as 475 Unna Parkstr. 19, West Deutschland.

I got a letter recently from your Historical Society in N.Y. That gave data on Conrad Orendorf, altho the firstman listed was FREDERICK Orendorf, Sr. who settled in the Mohawk Valley in 1723. He was the son of Hendrick "Orendorf" whose wife was a Jewess. What was her name? Darius reports that she lived across the border from Germany. Please send any Facts you have on her.

I am having difficulty in locating my 1st "lady of Nobility, Elizabeth von Mueller. My Revolutionary Grandfather, Major Christian Orendorff, Jr. born in Prussia Nov. 15, 1726 when he was 15. He told his Grandchildren about the lovely Countess, Elizabeth von Mueller these stories of the HOMELAND carried down in the Family. I used them in my Novel, RED GLORY, that Features my great, great Aunt, Leah Orendorff the "Greatest Huntress in Ky. after 1809. She married into the Famous Virginia Morgan Family and had many tall sons.

I have some copies left of that book. \$3.

What I am asking these fine German Historians to get Pictures of the Church in Freudenberg where the Orendorffs (German Spelling) were married and christened their children for years. Landscape View of their Land. When Major Christian Orendorf entered the Philadelphia Harbor on the SHIP ST. Sept. 1741 he brought 2 clocks, desk, cattle, etc.

Mr Luck said that Elizabeth von Mueller lived in another Province, hard to get the Von Mueller line. But I wrote back that I would "NOT GO TO PRESS" until I had the Story of this Family. So Mr. Luck wrote around to different Towns and found that an old Couple Marburg had the only TREASURED Copy of THE GENEALOGICAL RECORDS for the Numerous Branches of the MUELLER FAMILY. They charge \$100 up for the Search. Mr. Luck wrote recently that he would "Take a Furlough and go over by train to find facts on the Mueller Family 16th and 17th Century. This will cost money, but it is the only opportunity after years of searching to get the History that our Revolutionary Grandfather told so fluently. The Church Register gives the Christian Ohrndorf who was born in Aug. 1693 as marrying first an Agnes, whose father had a large farm, paying tribute to the Lord and also paying taxes to the town govt., etc. So Further Search is needed to determine whether Christian, Sr. married a 2d time, if his 1st wife died. Or was Elizabeth von Mueller who the lad of 15 visited before he came to America - His Grandmother?

Hundreds of Ohrndorffs across America and in Canada who bought my first book over the years breathed the hope that I would continue my wide Research to Germany to locate the Chapel where our Orendorffs were married and christened their children.

The biggest handicap is that only one of the dozen letters received was in English. Mr. Luck wrote recently in English - the first letter he had written in English in 35 years! There are so few German Scholars. I have had 3 Luthern ministers in the area translate a Letter. But all busy ministers I rarely get a second letter translated.

→ In my next publication I would like to publish all Historical Facts on Orendorffs who came from Germany to the American Colonies before 1750. In all my books I feature the things - my sister Grace has taken pictures of Colonial Homes in New Jersey, Orendorff in the U.S. I have made a Special study of Land Patents. I had a friend in the Library of Congress with me during the last World War with me. Her Special Hobby was Land Patents. She secured in the Patent Office fine Land Patents for the Preacher who boarded Lincoln at New Salem. Rev. John M. Camron (Spelling on Patents)

→ If you would like to have your line my next Publication, please send me the date the Orendorffs arrived in New York or Philadelphia Harbor. Between now and June 1st see if you can secure any data on Frederick Ohlendorf? and his father Hendrick, who came from Wurthelberg, Germany in 1710) what do you have on the brother who went to Baltimore. Get all you can on him. See if the Md. Historical Society tells anything on when he or his father came from Germany.

On account of the delay in getting these Letters Translated I may not be able to go to Press before July 30th. People moved about in Germany, as the Pioneers did in the American Colonies. There was an old town Ohrndorff in Nassau Siegen before 1700, evidently founded by them in ancient times. But no Orendorffs there when Mr. Luck lawyer and historian searched there.

NARRATIVE

JOSEPH, JACOB, AND JOHN MOYER, three brothers together with three Clapsaddle Brothers left WURZBURG, GERMANY and came to America and settled in the MOHAWK VALLEY sometime before 1760. Joseph Moyer settled in what is now the town of MINDEN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY. Jacob Moyer took a farm south of what is now East Main Street, Ilion, N.Y., and embraced a part of the land now the Ilion, N.Y., Cemetery. JOSEPH MOYER JOINED the 4th., Regiment of the Tryon County Militia and served in the French and Indian War. He lost a limb in this war.

JOSEPH MOYER married Catherine Clapsaddle sister of Dennis Clapsaddle, and they had the following children, JOHN, ANDREW, EVE, JACOB, ELIZABETH, JOSEPH, JOHN, GERTRUDE AND DOROTHY. In 1790 they lived about a mile from Fort Plank which was located near what is Hallsville now. Joseph having lost a limb could not do usual fighting in the REVOLUTIONARY WAR but did serve by making ammunition (Bullets) at Fort Plank. On Aug. 2nd. 1780, was the time the name was changed from MOYER to MYERS. It was at this same date that JOSEPH left home as usual and went to the Fort, leaving his wife and three children, John age 11, Eve age 5, and Jacob age 3 years old. The younger boy had been kicked in the head by a horse. The mother desired the two older children to go to the home of Mrs. John Rother, who was named the Doctress because of her skill in healing, for some salve for the younger child's head. The older boy took the younger one on his back and with his sister started for the salve. When they were nearly half way there and in sight of Rother's house they heard a gun fired, and looking saw Indians about the house. They turned to run for home, but the Indians had discovered them and soon several had overtaken them. One tried to pull the little boy from the back of the other, but they held fast to each other and cried. The next instant another Indian ran a bayonet through them pinning both bodies to the ground in the death struggle. The older was quickly scalped, the girl was snatched up by another Indian and away they ran. Several of the party were soon at the Myers house, but fortunately when the children left the house the mother went to pull flax and hearing the gun at Rother's and divining its import she laid down in the flax and escaped notice. EVE did not cry, on which account she supposed she escaped the TOMAHAWK. The house was plundered and burned and EVE and other prisoners were soon on the way to Canada. Too young to travel with the party she was born on the back of an Indian most of the long tiresome journey. She spoke German and when captured and taken among the Indians she forgot her German, but she was so young they finally delivered her at Montreal for a bounty. Here in turn she soon forgot the Indian and learned to speak English. She was a long time in Canada before it was known whose child she was, as she unfortunately had forgotten her name. But Peter Olendorf who was captured at the same invasion readily guessed her parentage when she said her father had a wooden leg, and lived not far from the Fort.

Mrs. Bartlett Pickard, having a nursing baby, was captured in the vicinity of Myers, who with the other female prisoners were liberated by Brant and returned home. She told the enemy that little Eve was her daughter, but the pretense was of no avail. Mrs. Pickard arrived at Fort Plank three days after her capture almost famished, and then Mrs. Myers first learned the fate of her daughter. Mrs. Platts made a prisoner on the same day in Freybush, came back when EVE did, taking a motherly care of her for which she and her parents were ever grateful. After the Revolutionary War Joseph Myers and family together with eight other families left the Mohawk Valley and settled at a place they called Conradstown, later known as Orendorf Corners, in the town of Columbia, Herkimer County, N.Y. This group of people were prosperpous and formed a settlement which grew as the years past. In 1798 they organized the Dutch Reformed Church, and built in 1808 the church which now stands there.

Andrew Myers on Nov. 15-1793 married Katherine Shaver, and they had the following children, Peter, Nancy, Absalom, Christopher, Joseph, Margaret, Katharine and Jeremiah.

*Jeremiah Myers on Oct. 20-1836 married Sophronia Getman and they lived near Warrens Tannery which is now Spinnerville. They had the following children, Newburn, Jacob, Cordelia, Jeremiah, Clara, Frank J., and Sophronia.

Our street is one sheet of ice . Snow since first of Dec. They ran out of salt & sand And I fell and cracked my coccyx now back in bed for a few more weeks.

I know very little about Henrick & Anna Margaretha . I have now what you sent me. I am sending you all I have on the rest of the family.

The records in the N.Y. library are very good. But it cost \$5.00 A day to park. I go to the Fonda Archives as much as I can it's only 45 miles and two stop lights, can make it in less than an hr. And the books are in both- old German or Latin also English.

I would like to take up Mr. Hall's offer but I have to many 1709's on my fathers line. To name A few Ohrendorf, Demuth, Fulmer, Foltz, Dederich, Starrin g, Herkimer, Bellinger, Petrie, Weaver, Fox, Helmer, Barckey, Von Ringk, Hitschke, Ruehl, Raum, Getman, Bierman, Hess, Casler, Scheffer, Zimmerman.

I would have to have my hand in Me. Careys pocket to pay for all of them. I sure could be helped. I would appreciate any and all the help you could give me. On the Ohrendorfs By the looks of things I won't be able to get to Fonda for a while. The snow just keeps snowing Had a big one today about 6 more "

I have, however, checked hurriedly in my files and have failed to find a tie-in between the people mentioned in your letter and Mrs. Elder's (she is the Orendorff in the family) line. This seems to be a very short line for the time covered but it, straggly enough, is because the ancestor in each generation was the youngest, or nearly the youngest, of large families and were born late in the marriage of their parents.

Johannes Peter, who Anglicized his name to John, landed in Philadelphia on the good ship Edinburgh 2, Oct 1753 coming from England by way of Rotterdam. He accompanied two cousins, Johann Conrad, age 30, and Philip Lenrich Orendorff, age 38. Johann Conrad dropped his first name and became known as Conrad Orendorff and Philip Lenrich changed his name to Lewis. Johann Peter was 19 years of age at the time. Hope there are some clues in this for you that will be helpful. Thanks again for writing.

 the Black River which passed their home at Runyons Landing. She was a woman of
 fine Christian Character, fortitude and courage. Considering the early demise of
 her mother which was a great loss at her young age, she lived a good wholesome
 and constructive life. Her spirit of independence was one of self reliance. She
 lived to the good age of Ninety One, and mentally alert to the end.

HENRY WALKER MYERS - Born in London, England, whose parents were the Rev. and Mrs.
 Henry Alfred Myers, D.D., (nee Lydia Walker). He did considerable traveling hav-
 ing been to Australia, when the Gold Diggings opened up, thence up thru the bush
 with herds of sheep for his Uncle there, then to South Africa. In India he spent
 some time with cousins there. He went back to England to see his mother. He went
 Canada, had experience in the lumber camps, came to the U.S.A., where he settled
 down. They lived in Boston after leaving Mt. MacGregor, N.Y., and from there to Hob-

Thank you for your nice letter of 20 July. I too enjoyed our phone conversation the other evening. As I explained on the phone, I have a full-time researcher in Germany who does nothing but look for the 800 families who arrived in colonial N.Y. in 1710; she goes literally village-to-village in her investigations in the various theorized regions.

Before I had even seen the literature pinpointing the origins of later Ohrendorff arrivals near Siegen, I had theorized that Henrich of 1709 had originated in that lovely area. This was due to his close association on various Palatine mss. with others from this region - such as Pastor Hager, the first Reformed minister to the 1709ers in NY.

At any rate, after a considerable search in the region, we finally found Henrich and Anna Margaretha. The data is meager but choice. As of this writing, I can give you:

- 1) The proclamation of the marriage of Henrich and Anna Margaretha Ohrendorff in Germany.
- 2) Data on her maiden name - including her father and ancestral village (different from Henrich's).
- 3) The burial of Henrich's father and his residence.
- 4) The baptism of Henrich and Anna Margaretha's one child in Germany prior to emigration in 1709 (the one entered on the Rotterdam 6th party list of 1709).
- 5) The sponsor to that baptism.
- 6) Detailed map of the region of origin; copy of a picture of his actual ancestral village.

My fee for this documented data, considering my expenses, would be \$32.50. If interested, kindly sign the two enclosed "agreements" returning one to me and keeping one for your own files. I look forward to hearing from you. Good hunting!



Thank you for your letter of the sixth offering your assistance in my research on the Orendorff family line. I do appreciate your kindness.

Due to the serious illness of Mrs. Elder and the fact that I, myself, have just spent nine days in the hospital because of an accidental fall, my genealogy has had to suffer and, I am afraid, will have to continue to do so, at least until our situation gets a little better. I have, however, checked hurriedly in my files and have failed to find a tie-in between the people mentioned in your letter and Mrs. Elder's (she is the Orendorff in the family) line. I am keeping your letter in my file and possibly I will be bothering you some of these days for help.

The following is Mrs. Elder's direct line as we know it, for your information. Maybe you can find the tie-in which is quite possible since the times and the places are pretty close together.

This seems to be a very short line for the time covered but it, straggly enough, is because the ancestor in each generation was the youngest, or nearly the youngest, of large families and were born late in the marriage of their parents.

Johannes Peter, who Anglicized his name to John, landed in Philadelphia on the good ship Edinburgh 2, Oct 1753 coming from England by way of Rotterdam. He accompanied two cousins, Johann Conrad, age 30, and Philip Lenrich Orendorff, age 38. Johann Conrad dropped his first name and became known as Conrad Orendorff and Philip Lenrich changed his name to Lewis. Johann Peter was 19 years of age at the time. Hope there are some clues in this for you that will be helpful. Thanks again for writing.

Dear Eileen,

Since sending my letter of 14 January, I've discovered that I provided incomplete information. This is an effort to correct that error.

We do have an index to the 1810 census for New York (in fact, I think I've used it before to provide you with information!) so I checked it for Nathan Wests. There were three (one each in Rensselaer, Ontario and Essex Counties) plus a Nathaniel West in Washington County, but I think the one of interest to you was the one in Rensselaer Co.--specifically in Grafton. His household consisted of:

Males: 3 0-10, 1 10-16, and 1 26-45
Females: 2 0-10, 1 26-45, and 1 45+

The foregoing, probably "your" Nathan West, suggests that he and his wife were probably born between 1765 and 1784, that an older female (perhaps his mother) was living with them, and that they had three boys in the household all born between 1800 and 1810. It seems likely that this was the same Nathan West who was born in RI about 1776 (he was 74 in the 1850 census) and that one of the three boys was Nathan West, Jr. who was born in NY ca 1802 (he was 48 in the 1850 census).

The other items that I failed to include in my earlier letter were two quotes from published articles. In "Landmarks of Rensselaer County" by G. B. Anderson (D. Mason & Co., Syracuse, 1897), on pages 145-6 of the Family Sketches section, is the following:

William West, with two brothers Nathan and Laton, came from Rhode Island and settled in Grafton, New York in a very early day, being among the first settlers of the town. William and Nathan lived and died in Grafton and reared large families.

The article then goes on to trace Joseph J. West (born 1828), son of Francis West and grandson of William West. The other published item is in the New England Historical and Genealogical Register (Vol. 60, 1906, pp 142+); it describes the descendants of Francis West of Duxbury, Mass. Among them are several



Nathan Wests--including two father-son pairs born in the mid-1700's. Regrettably, the article doesn't indicate whether they relocated to Rhode Island (much less to Grafton!) so there is no reason to think they are connected with your Nathan Wests--except for the fact that they too seemed to "hand down" the given name Nathan.

Sorry I forgot to include this information with my earlier letter. I'll be interested to hear if all this is helpful.




HENRICH OHRENDORFF, 1709

It was noticed that the emigrant Palatine Henrich Ohrendorff ("Johan Henrig Arendorff and vrouw, one child") appeared in the sixth party of Palatine emigrants along with 1709ers largely from the Westerwald-Siegen region of Germany. Indeed, leading that sixth party of emigrants as the first name was the New York Palatines' first Reformed minister, Rev. Johann Friederich Hager. The region near Siegen, home of the Hagers, was combed thoroughly for references to Henrich Ohrendorff. Finally, at Oberfischbach near Siegen - which had once been a Pastorate of Rev. Hager's own father - the emigrant was found!

On 1 January, 1708 a proclamation for the marriage of "Johann Henrich Ohrndorff, son of the late Gerlach Ohrndorff from Bottenberg, with Anna Margaretha Peltzer, daughter of the late Joh: Jost Peltzer from Littfeld, Parish Krombacher" was entered in the Oberfischbach registers. This couple then had the one child listed on the Rotterdam lists born at Bottenberg and baptised at Oberfischbach: "Maria Catharin, baptised 13 May, 1708; sponsor was Maria Cath: the wife of Fried: Schwartz from Alchen." The father of the emigrant Henrich, one Gerlach Ohrndorff was buried at Oberfischbach 11 March, 1692 - having died at Bottenberg.

After his arrival in 1710 in colonial New York, Henrich Ohrendorff was listed on the Hunter rolls 1710-12, was a volunteer in the Canadian expedition of 1711, and appeared on the Simmendinger Register with his wife Anna Margaretha and 3 children, 1717.
