ORNDORF-At his residence, 3849 South Dearborn-st., Friday morning, William H. Orndorff, aged 37 years. Services at his residence Saturday morning, July 2, at 10 o'clock. The body will be taken to Burlington, Ia. for interment. Burlington (Ia.) and Petersburg (Pa.) papers please copy.

I would also like to mention that a death notice appears in that same month for one of his daughters, Maggie. If you would like a transcription of that particular notice, the charge is \$3.00 plus SASE.

In order to do a death notice search on Richard B. Fletcher, I would need the exact date of death³⁻⁹⁰. You may be able to get this from the Cook County death index, which is available through the Mormon church branch libraries, and includes all persons for whom a death certificate was file in Cook County from late 1871 through the early 1930's. I don't search this particular source, but Kay Banks of Park Ridge, Illinois (ad in the Helper) does, and I can vouch for her work as she's done work on my family research in this area.

If you would like a search done of my indexes of Tribune death notices for this particular name, the charge is \$1.00 per year searched -- and the search covers only that particular first and last name. We do offer a surname search of those indexes, and rates are mentioned in our list of services and rates.

Thank you so much for remembering my interest in the Bonneauville church records. I am really glad to get them. As for the spelling variations (Orendorff and Orndorff), different lines did not necessarily spell it different ways, and they intermarried so that it is difficult to say. When I get all this information put on group sheets and sorted out, I will let you send you copies.

Since I have been working full time these past three years, I have not had enough time to do my genealogy as in the past. It is nice having the extra money. I now have the money to travel and do more research, but lack the time!

I would like to eventually cut back to a half time position. That would be just about right, I think.

I would also like to get a computer to do my genealogy on. We have a couple of Macintoshes in our office here. Perhaps I can get one also. Salt Lake is supposed to be coming out with a version of their genealogy program for the Macintosh. It was so kind of you to answer my request so promptly - the sign of the true devotee of research.

The material I have that you provided are copies of your letters of April 15 and January 27, 1982, and charts on the following families: Francis Orndorff who married Cora Welty and later Mary E. Kaas; James A. Orndorff married to Mary E. Orndorff; David Orndorff married to Appalonia Topper; Peter Orndorff married to Rosanna Pfeiffer; and Peter Orndorff married to Ann _____?.
to Sr. John Mary

I am planning to go to Emmitsburg in order to see what I ~~can~~ can find in the records of the Catholic Church there. I am not sure how far back there records are available but have never had anything from them. They do not have the staff to answer inquiries but I have heard that, upon proper identification, one may go personally and search their old records. I cannot go for a couple more weeks but will then try to learn what is available. If you have names in addition to Orndorff that might appear in those Catholic records, I will look for all the names and make notes.

The oldest records of Catholic families in that area are the Conewago ? Chapel records. Conewago Chapel was the first Catholic chapel outside of Philadelphia. It is located a few miles outside of Hanover, Pa. just a few miles from the Maryland border. Most of those records have been published in some fashion and are available from the historical sociteies. I do not find any Orndorffs in the records I have.

You mention that some of your ancestors migrated to the Lebanon area. I, too, find that members of my families -all Catholic - migrated to that area and I have not been able so far to find out the reason. It would be interesting to know.

I regret to say that I am not acquainted with a single living Eckenrode. My Eckenrode ancestor is a great-grandmother and apparently she died young as my father did not remember ever seeing or visiting her. If there are any of them still around, we have not found them.

Since you are working full-time, I know how limited your time will be. I started my research in the early 1950's. My husband passed away in 1960 and I worked full-time until 1974 and did little or no research in those years although I put in order and had printed the information already collected. I remarried in 1976 and we like to travel plus we live in Florida six months of the year so again there is little time for chasing ancestors.

My maternal grandmother was a McIntire. I learned when I returned to D.C. this spring that a David McIntire, 4752 Main St., Yorba Linda, Ca. had been in the Gettysburg area searching for ancestors. I have written him - no answer so far - but was intrigued that the address was Yorba Linda. Have you an active historical society or something similar?

Dear Ms. Baldwin:

I saw the listing of your ancestors Simeon and Eunice PRIOR in the GENEALOGICAL HELPER "Roots Cellar." They had a connection to Summit Co., OH.

I am enclosing a Family Group Sheet which you may keep, if you like, showing my ancestors, Amos and Eunice Fletcher. One of Eunice's daughters gave Eunice's maiden name as PRIOR. I have not been able to document this, however, I have noted other PRIOR families in the general vicinity of Summit County, OH. Medina County is adjacent to Summit Co., I believe.

Amos & Eunice came to Ohio about 1820 from Vermont. I believe they came probably from Burlington, but they had been in Burlington only a short time. Amos's family was from Grand Isle County, Vermont on Lake Champlain. I have not found any record of PRIOR's in that county. In the Revolutionary War record of one of Amos's brothers, the brother was married in New York, perhaps New York City. I have the name of the minister. So possibly the Fletcher's were in New York around 1800 or so. It was only across the lake from Vermont. One of the Fletcher brothers was around Seneca Co., NY at one time.

I can trace the Fletcher family back quite a ways. Amos's father Cotton, apparently was one of the Green Mountain boys (Ethan Allen fame). But I have not found Eunice's family. Another census report indicates she may have been from Delaware.

I was intrigued by your Eunice Prior. Although she was obviously too young to have been my ancestor, she could have been named after my Eunice Prior Fletcher.

Do you know any more about Simeon Prior? I would be glad to look up my Prior notes and exchange info with you.

Here are copies of the title page and a couple of other pages from a book NAMES IN STONE - 75,000 Cemetery Inscriptions from Frederick County, Maryland, by Jacob Mehrling Holdcraft, which I happened on in the public library. I realize you may already have this information but, in case you don't, knew you would be interested in the Emmitsburg-Taneytown area. I suspect the Orndorffs in the Brunswick-Knoxville section are related to my family. Brunswick has been a junction point, with extensive yards and shops, on the B&O Railroad and I expect some of our Orndorffs gravitated down there from farther up the Potomac Valley.

The other enclosure is a letter dated 19.1.1984, from Herr Schmeck, which I think is very interesting, and is in answer to one that I wrote him on 12.1.1984. (Note that my letter was mailed on the 12th and I received his reply on the 23rd). This exchange came about because he had remarked, when we talked at Siegen in August, that Huppert Ohrndorf, my apparent ancestor, was a son of the Hen (Henne, Henrich zu Ohrndorf) as he had indicated in his report of September 5, 1982 to you. So I asked him to tell me what his books show to substantiate that statement. Although he makes a very interesting case, it seems to me that it is largely "iffy" and I'll offer it with appropriate caution signs.

Thank you for filling the INSIDE IRELAND Genealogy Questionnaire. We apologise for not having replied sooner but during the redecoration of our office last year we mislaid a box of correspondence which has only just come to light.

Unfortunately all the names of your great grandparents are prolific in Ireland. According to a survey completed in the late 19th century there were at least 514 families bearing the name Doyle in Ireland, being represented in nearly every County in the Country but chiefly in the Counties Dublin, Wexford, Wicklow, Carlow, Kerry and Cork. There were at least ~~51~~ 357 families bearing the name Burke mainly in the Counties Galway, Dublin, Mayo, Tipperary and Waterford. It would be almost impossible to trace your particular ancestors without more detailed information of their geographical origins. The sort of information required you may be able to obtain on your side of the Atlantic. Immigration, Naturalization and Census return documents might provide more exact details such as, the Townland, Parish or Barony and County of birth. If you are able to obtain this sort of information we should be happy to re-evaluate the possibilities of successful research on your ancestors.



Koppenheffer, of Emporium, Pa. Evidently I was overwhelmed by the amount of material and did not have time to study it out. So here goes: (Since you might find it inconvenient to find some of this material, I'll photocopy it and enclose it.)

Evidently Herman Orndorff was married at least 2 times--first to Ann Margretha, and later to Catherine. He evidently had most of his children by Catherine.

Mr. Koppenheffer's second paragraph has data on my Christian I new to me.

At this point I interrupted the typing of this letter to type one to Mr. Koppenheffer, suggesting that he check the record in the Christ Lutheran Church of Myerstown, Pa. Probably I will enclose a copy of that letter.

At present it certainly looks as tho Elizabeth Ann Hoffman's mother was Elizabeth Hoffman before she was Elizabeth Copher. Therefore it lookssas tho Elizabeth Ann, who married Christian Orndorff II, had Hoffman as her maiden name. I was hoping that her maiden name was Miller, or Mueller, and that she was a widow Hoffman when she married Christian II.

Dear Miss Drake:

I have always been curious as to which Hoffman family the wife of Christian Orndorff II belonged, even though I have no ancestry in that area. I like to know about all the families the ORNDORFFS of Pa. were associated with. Therefore I wrote to a Mr. Koppenheffer inquiring about Elizabeth's mother "widow Copenhaver".

He sent me a sheet of information which I am sending on to you. It helps to fill out the picture. I might add that in the records of Christ Lutheran Church the entry in the transcription that I saw read:

1749 Jan. 24 Thomas Koppenhefer, widower, & Elizabeth Holzman, just arrived from Germany (or words to that effect) "just off the ship"

I wondered at the time if the name could have been Hoffman instead of Holzman. You might want to check with Mr. Koppenheffer to see if he verified this in the original records. He lives not too far from this church and he might have checked the originals.

Judging by the date of marriage and the fact that Elizabeth had just arrived from Germany, she probably came in the fall of 1748. There was only one ship listed in PA. GERMAN PIONEERS which had Hoffmans on it (no Holzman's at all).

Johannes Michgel (sic) Hoffman
Jacob Hoffman

Also on this ship was Jacob Hiltzheimer, a prominent elder of the Reformed Church in Philadelphia. EXTRACTS FROM THE DIARY OF JACOB HILTZH EIMER were published in Philadelphia in 1893 by his great-grandson Jacob Cox Parsons.

Another person aboard this ship, Johann Philip Lorentz came from Niederhausen, Meisenheim. There was also a Lenhard Oehler on this ship, a name which I recognize in the Elizabethtown area in the same township as the man we call John Orndorff, doctor (the father of my Mathias, the Herman of Gap, Pa. in DWO records, and of several other Orndorffs). There is also a Reinhart Daub. There are only a very few DAUB names listed in PA. GERM. PIONEERS and one of them was found at Schaefferstown, Lebanon Co., Pa. and Conrad Orndorff was a sponsor for one of his children. There are also some Muellers--but Muellers are a dime a dozen on these lists. Also a Pfeiffer name--all of the early Orndorffs of N.Y., Lebanon, Carroll Co., MD have connections to a Pfeiffer family.

We have made a lot of progress in the last few years on the early ORNDORFF families. I guess Margaret has written to you.

We know a great deal more on the Orndorffs who went over to Adams Co., these are the descendants of Herman of Lebanon and also of John Orndorff, doctor, who married Margaret, a daughter of Daniel and Mary Clark.

I just noticed on the next ship List 118A Ship Hampshire, Capt. Thomas Cheesman Sept. 7, 1748 there is a Jacob Holtz ae 45, but no Holtzman.

I am currently investigating the possibility that the marriage record listed in the appendix of FROM MILL WHEEL... Henry Ohrendorf-Maria Elisabeth Albert 24 De 1784 might have been an error when these church documents were transcribed. A deed of a Jacob Albert and his will show that his daughter Margaret married Henry Orndorff of Washington Co., MD. Sometimes these old church records are very hard to read and it might have originally read Margaret or Marg. Elizabeth as this man did have a daughter by that name. Otherwise I have to find some other place for this couple in the ORNDORFF lines.

? I can't find it there.

The John who married Elisabeth Oxenreiter in 1792 later went over to near Berrysburg, Mifflin Twp. Dauphin Co., Pa. and left descendants in that area. He is probably a son of John Doctor, but not sure.

That is all I have for you. Oh, yes, I wanted to tell you, last year I went to Carroll Co., MD and found the grave of Peter Orndorff, Sr. on the farm where he had lived. It is still farm or ranch land, unsubdivided and very rural and pretty. Three elderly single people own this land and have lived there all their lives. Their family has owned it since the 19th century. They were very kind.

There is a stone house on the land (on Pipe Creek, MD.) which is probably about 200 years old. Peter, Jr. probably lived there. The graves are up on a hill in a cow pasture. They are just rough field stones with initials on them.

The Beginning of the Ohrendorff Family in the United States

Hermanus Ohrendorff and Anna Margaretha Ohrendorff came on the ship Charming Nancy, Charles Stedman Master, from Rotterdam but last from Plymouth, England. He took the Oath of Allegiance 8 October 1737, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He settled in Lebanon township, Lancaster county, Pa., where he was taxed fifteen shillings for 50 acres of land. He died in 1777, and his widow Catharine Orendorff was appointed sole administratrix by the Register's Office of Lancaster county, Pa., 2 April 1778, when the appraiser's report was filed for 161 pounds, two shillings and four pence. No heirs are named. Dated 2-27-1777 and filed 4-2-1778, at the Lancaster county Courthouse at Lancaster, Pa.

Christian Ohrendorff and Johann Christian Ohrendorff, came off the ship ~~Charming Nancy~~ St. Mark, Captain William Wilson Master, from Rotterdam and last from Cowes, England, 26 September 1741, when they took the Oath of Allegiance, at Philadelphia, Pa. He settled in Heidelberg twp., now Jackson twp., Lebanon county, Pa., near Myerstown, Pa., on fifty acres of land for which he paid eight shillings tax in 1758. He died 16 April 1772; aged eighty years of age; buried at the Moravian Church cemetery of Bethel, now Hanover twp., Lebanon county, Pa.

Thank you for your letter of 12 March, 1978 regarding the connection between the Orndorff and Albert families of Pennsylvania and Maryland.

I have not run into a Maria Elizabeth Albert who would fit the person who married Henry Orndorff, December 28, 1784. This may be because most of the Berks County Alberts that I have researched have been members of the Reformed Church, although a few have had Lutheran connections. The only Maria Elizabeth Albert shown in my records was the daughter of William Albert and his wife, Katherine Kantner. This Maria Albert was born April 20, 1780, baptized May 15, 1780 and the record is found in Hosts Church, Tulpehochen Region, Berks County, Pennsylvania. She is obviously too young for your Maria Elizabeth. Nor do I have a Henry Orndorff, Margaret Albert marriage some time before July 10, 1792. These Albert people were undoubtedly distant relatives of mine but they are not close enough to have shown up in most of my research. However, I do find that one of my relatives, Michael Albert had a brother named William and a brother named Conrad. His will is on file in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania (Will B-1-64) dated March 6, 1754. This will makes Jacob, his cousin his executor. Could this Jacob be the man you are looking for? He did, at various times, oh somewhat later patent land in Berks County, Pennsylvania.

I have also run into another Jacob Albert who was a revolutionary war soldier from Maryland and is found in Maryland census records. I am not sure whether this is the same Jacob Albert who previously lived in Pennsylvania or not. I have tried to see whether I could make a connection but so far I have had not success.

John Sr. may have been the son of a brother of Christian Orendorff, of Sharpsburg, Maryland. In the lack of information, the statement is made that neither party (Dixon or Ispock) knows whether the brother of Christian Orendorff of Sharpsburg Md. ever left A. E. Pennsylvania or not.

If John Sr. was the son of a brother of Christian he could have settled with his mother

and father at first in Dauphin County Pa, as did his brother, Lawrence who died in 1820.

The information above came from notes taken at the Orendorff Re-union held at Bloomington, Illinois, in October 1886. At this meeting a Re-union Association was formed. We know nothing more since 1886.

ADAMS COUNTY, PA
HISTORICAL TITLE SEARCH PROGRAM

The Adams County Historical Society offers to make an effort to determine the exact location of eighteenth and nineteenth century properties which are located within the present limits of the county. Assuming that it is possible to find an early survey or deed description of the property in question, the society uses land, tax, estate, and other records, including aerial maps, in its effort to compile a chain of title, beginning with the original warrant which either the Penn proprietors or, after the American Revolution, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania issued and ending with the current owner.

Although in almost every instance the previous efforts to provide this service have been successful, the society can offer no guarantee other than to make a determined effort to check all of the available sources and, if necessary, to recheck them. In every case, early surveys and deeds must be found (a name on a tax list is not enough) and more recent deeds must be available and in good order. And, the property must be located within the present limits of Adams county.

Among the materials furnished in the report made, if they are available, are a copy of the original survey, abstracts of deeds and similar pertinent information, a summary of any assessments which describe buildings on the property, and copies of several maps (a connected survey blueprint, a topographical map showing the exact location of the property, and pertinent sections of aerial and current tax maps).

The cost of this service is \$50 for each investigation. Persons wishing to use it should send a check or money order along with their request to the Adams County Historical Society, Drawer A, Gettysburg, Penna. 17325, together with as much information about the property as is known to them. Since the investigation is a time-consuming and often tedious one, at the very least one month is required to complete it.

A less extensive search can sometimes be made in order to answer the inquirer's questions about a particular property. Persons interested in it should consult the society.

Peter Orndorff, Sr. had three children that we know of. He listed in his will my only sons Peter, Jr. and Abraham, and mentioned that Peter was the elder. He also listed a daughter Maria, but we don't know if she was the only daughter.

Peter, Jr. was born about 175?, probably in Pennsylvania somewhere. He married Rosanna Pfeiffer or Piper about 1785 and they had 11 children. Peter died in Adams Co., Pa. March 17, 1828.

Abraham married Barbara Finfrock. They had five children, but apparently Barbara died young as she is not mentioned in her parent's wills although her children are.

Maria is supposed to have married a Jacob Smith and had children John, Jacob, Moses, Maria.

There is no listing of Peter Orndorff, Sr. in the military records of the Revolutionary troops. But there is a Wheat Certificate No. 206 showing that he donated 31 bushels of wheat dated May 16, 1782. Perhaps as a Dunker he shunned military duty yet supported the Revolutionary cause. This is, of course, just speculation.

Research is still continuing on this Peter Orndorff family and hopefully more information will be learned.
