NOTE: There is positive identification of this Peter Orndorff in the German church as being the same man who immigrated. More detailed information was available on his brother Conrad who also immigrated at the same time, as did two other Orndorffs from the same parish, Philip Henrich of Burbach, and an Orndorff woman, wife of Joh. Gerlach Mutterspach. All information matches exactly.

 all of Frederick County aforesaid by their Petition to the Justices of our County Court held
 in and for our said County of Frederick on the third Tuesday of March instant have
 set forth that they are severally seized in Fee and possessed of different parts of a
 Tract of Land called Brothers Agreement lying in our said County of Frederick
 aforesaid, the Bounds whereof are old and likely to become precarious and uncertain
 And thereby have also prayed Commission to certify evidence to prove and perpetuate
 the Mensures of the Bounds aforesaid, agreeable to the Act of Assembly in such case
 made and provided. And whereas it hath been suggested to us that you are
 four substantial and capable Freeholders within our said County, and that you
 are not in any way related to the Petitioners nor interested in the said Land. There
 are therefore we authorize empower and require you, or any three or two of you upon
 taking the Oath directed by the said Act of Assembly to issue Summons for all such
 Evidence as shall be to you nominated by the Petitioners, or any other person or
 Persons interested to appear before you on certain day to be by you appointed on
 the said Land, and to examine all such Evidence upon their respective Oaths to be
 by you administered of their Knowledge concerning the several Boundaries as
 well of the said Land, as of any other Lands whereof the same depend or relate, and
 carefully to reduce what such Evidence shall declare into Writing in the presence of
 all the Parties concerned that shall be then present. Provided always that where
 all the Parties concerned live in the said County, or where they are not known, you
 do affix publick Notes at the parish Church where the Land lies three Sundays at
 the least before such your Meeting on the said Land, intimating such your intentions
 and the Time you shall appoint, and that you cause the like Notes to be put up at
 the most publick places in the County aforesaid twenty Days at the least before such
 your Meeting. And where all Persons interested are known and any of them
 live out of the said County that you cause Notice to be given by affixing a Notice
 to the Church Door of the parish or parishes where such Party or Parties reside

Now about the Connecticut question. The Pennsylvania Archives contain probably the best history of the Connecticut Boundary Dispute. They are contained in the following:

Colonial Records Volumes 5 through 9, and 12 through 16
First Series, Volumes 2, 4, 6, 9 and 11
Second Series, Volume 18
Fourth Series Volumes 2 through 4

Although there is mention in all of these volumes, the Colonial Records, and the Second Series Volume 18 specifically contains Documents relating to the Wyoming Controversy and Connecticut. The Wyoming disputed area is outlined in the map on pages 3 and 4 as disputed territory, and as such was included in the Susquehanna Company Purchase. There are maps in these archives. These books are available for rent from Hoenstine Rental Library, Box 208, Hollidaysburg PA 16648 for a fee, 75% of which is returnable if books are returned within 10 days. He will send you rates - or possibly you may find a library in California which has them. The PA Archives are 138 volumes of published historical/genealogical treasure about our state, in Nine Series, but you are presently only concerned with the above.

Connecticut's title to the whole northern half of the State, resulting in the long Pennamite WARS between Penna. and the Yankee Settlers all arose out of the confusion in descriptions included in early land grants, which in turn arose out of the general ~~know~~ ignorance of the grantors about the country they were giving away.

The Pennamite war is not well documented, especially in the Archives. Service (military) in this war would be included in the general listings of Militia and Ranging Companies serving on the frontier during this period. The Pennamite war was fought from:

1st War 1759 to 1772 2nd War - 1775 settled 1782 3rd War - 1784

Mathias Zyers

Begins for part of Bros. Agreement at a white oak marked on 4 sides standing on the northeast side of his land at the end of the first line is a stone set on this occasion

at the end of the 6th is a marked white oak and is a corner of Peter Orndorfs.

JOHANNES PETER OHRENDORFF

There were six different groups of Ohrendorffs who migrated to this country from Germany before 1776. The name Ohrendorff (or Ohrndorff, Orndorff, Orendorff, etc.) originated in the small region of Nassau-Siegen in what is now North-Rhine Westfalia. Several of the other Orndorff families have been traced to the parish of Freudenberg there. The origin of Johannes Peter Ohrendorff, or Peter Orndorff is unknown at this time, but there is much evidence that he knew well the Orndorff families in this country which had originated in Freudenberg and vicinity.

Peter Orndorff emigrated to America on the ship "Edinburg" with two other Orndorffs, Johann Conrad and a Philip Heinrich Arndorff. They signed the lists Oct. 2, 1753.

We know that by the 1760's Philip Heinrich was living in Chester Co., Pa. After his death his children moved to Virginia.

Conrad seems to have been more closely associated with Peter Orndorff. We find no trace of either Conrad or Peter until Conrad is listed as sponsor for a baptism in Lebanon Twp. Lancaster Co. (now Lebanon Co.), Pa. in 1762. A Peter Orndorff appears in the 1771 tax list of this same county, but they apparently didn't own land.

By 1771 Conrad Orndorff had bought property in Frederick County, Maryland (now Carroll Co.). A Conrad Orndorff is also listed in church records there. Peter Orndorff purchased his farm in Carroll County, Md. on May 1, 1776. It is difficult to say exactly where he had been between 1753 and 1776 except for his listing on the 1771 tax list in Pa. *and 1769 tax list also*

Although Conrad Orndorff was listed as a sponsor for baptisms in Reformed Church records we have not found any of his own children's baptismal records. Likewise Peter Orndorff has not been found in any church records of any kind. Either the records are no longer in existence or they belonged to some sect which did not keep any records.

Where was Peter Orndorff during the first 18 years before he appeared on the 1771 tax list????? There is a clue in the 1880 census. His grandson David Orndorff said that his father (Peter, Jr.) was born in "Ct" (Connecticut). During the 18th century Connecticut had laid claim to a large portion of northern Pennsylvania and it is possible that this is where Peter, Jr., born probably in the 1750's, was born.

Although Peter Orndorff never appeared in any church records, his two sons, Peter, Jr. and Abraham married Lutherans and some of their children were baptized at Taneytown and Silver Run. Although their wives were members of these churches, Peter, Jr. and Abraham are never so listed.

However, there is some information which suggests that some of these Orndorffs may have been members of a Dunker group on Pipe Creek. In about 1810 there is a deed from John Garber (a well known Dunker name) to Peter Orndorff, Jr. and others deeding land for the purpose of a "school of literature".

Additionally, some of the neighbors on surrounding farms were Dunker names...Smith, Eicher, Wolf, Engel, Bear, Bishop, ~~Zyger~~,

Peter, Jr.'s son John Orndorff married Rebecca Garber, probably a daughter of Christian Garber. They moved west and settled in Indiana where they were members of the Baugo Congregation (Brethern or Dunker).

The Orndorff farm, purchased from Henry Smith, remained intact until the death of Peter, Sr. There is a small graveyard there yet containing fieldstones, barely legible, and some illegible. One of them says "P.O. 1786" This is thought to be the grave of Peter Orndorff, Sr. who died Sept. 2, 1786. There is also a stone marked "A.O.". Perhaps Abraham.

After Peter's death, a portion of the land was sold to Matthew Galt. The remaining land was divided between Abraham and Peter, Jr. It appears that Peter, Jr. kept the part which had had the original log structure built over a spring house. Abraham probably then built another log house found on his section of the property when he married around 1790. Peter, Jr. later repurchased the part of the property which he had sold to Matthew Galt. This is the section bordering Pipe Creek. In 1828 Peter Orndorff, Jr. died and directed that his wife Rosanna be allowed to live on his land until she passed away, then it was to be sold and the money divided amongst their children. She was listed as living in a "stone house" (this would be the one now found on the part of the land originally sold to Matthew Galt.

After Rosanna Orndorff died in 184² the land was sold to Jacob Harnish. Then he sold it to Paul Kaes (Kase, Case) in 1852. It was then sold to the Spangler family. On the 1878 landowner atlas J. Haifley was shown to reside at the point where the stone house would be.

Abraham Orndorff held his land until about 1826 when he sold to Sterling Galt his 129 3/4 acres. We know little of Abraham after this.

The Orndorff farm is now owned by several persons, but most of it is now the Senft farm and the Xmas tree farm (Mr. Kirby.

It was originally on a tract of land called "Brothers' Agreement" and it bordered another tract called "Ross's Range" or later Runnymede. In 1785 there was a resurvey and it became known as "Resurvey on Brothers' Agreement. Peter's neighbors on the original tract were Christopher Wolf, Joseph Eicher, Samuel Newcomer, Matthias Zyger, Thomas Barr (Bear), Isaac Barr & Peter Marks.
