In compiling material for a publication on the Catholic ORNDORFF-ORENDORFF families of Frederick and Carroll Co., MD, I am in need of certain records which should be found in your parish registers.

Could you please check your baptismal, marriage, and burial records for any person by the surname of ORNDORFF/ARENDORFF, etc. from the beginning of your parish, which I believe was around 1800----up until the year 1830?

I am in particular need of a burial record of an ORENDORFF whose tombstone gives his death date as December 24, 1823. He was born September 17, 1804 so there might also be a baptismal record for him.

If you cannot check for all the information up to 1830, I would appreciate your checking for this above person's baptismal and burial. His tombstone gives only his initials and I need his first name.

Please include sponsors or witnesses to marriages in any records you send. I am enclosing a small sum as a donation in appreciation for your time, to be used for whatever purpose you wish.

In the event that these registers might have been microfilmed and might be available to me in some form, I will gladly have them searched elsewhere if this alternative is feasible. I know that these old records are difficult to read and often in poor shape. It is time-consuming to search them.

Thank you very much for any help you can give me. I find the history of these Catholic families so interesting, there are several religious in your area who were ORNDORFFS, and I am currently corresponding with a priest in Indiana who is descended from this branch (Rev. Alcuin Leipold). He too, is interested in our family and I have promised to send any information along to him, so that the work will not have to be duplicated. You might recall a Sister Bernard of your area who lived in the earlier part of this century. Many still remember her today.
