NOTE: This Peter Orendorff is probably Peter Orendorff, Jr. whose children were batized in Lutheran churches in Carroll Co., Md. However, four of Peter's eleven children married into Catholic families: Orendorff, Addlesperger, Weibel and Topper/Tappert

Peter Orendorff also lived on the tract of land Resurvey on Brothers Agreement which was in the vicinity of Taneytown, Md. and stretched up to the state line approximately.

The inventory of the goods and chattels of General Mordecai Gist deceased was presented by his widow, Mary Gist, executrix and William Calhoun, executor, on March 26, 1793. It listed household furniture, a gold seal, one sword, pistols, a coach and phaeton with horses and harness, books and kitchen utensils, farm equipment, stock, field and carriage horses and 78 negroes. Value £3973/4/6. (Charleston Co. S.C. Inventories, Bk. C, pp. 18-19) On October 21, 1811, Mary Gist sold to William Twaits, lots, and the right in Charleston Theatre on Broad Street. (Charleston Co. S.C. Deeds E-8, p. 12)

On October 4, 1810, Mary Gist, Charleston, S.C., Gentlewoman, widow of Mordecai Gist, late of the state of Maryland, deceased, and States Gist of the same place, Gentleman, one of the sons of Mordecai Gist conveyed to Independent Gist of Frederick County, Maryland, his share of the estate of the late Mordecai Gist. (Balt. Co. Md. Deeds J.G. No. 7, p. 396) Mary Gist and States Gist appeared in Baltimore.

Mary Gist, widow of Mordecai Gist, died in 1812, intestate. States Gist was administrator of her estate.

261. INDEPENDENT⁵ GIST (Mordecai⁴, Thomas³, Richard², Christopher¹)
 b. Jan. 8, 1779, Baltimore County; d. Sept. 16, 1821, Frederick County, Maryland, m. Jan. 8, 1807, Frederick County, his cousin, Rachel Gist, b. Mar. 17, 1780; d. May 2, 1830, Baltimore County, daughter of Joshua and Sarah (Harvey) Gist. (See page 152) Both are buried in the Gist graveyard on Long Farm, near Westminster, Maryland.

Independent Gist's mother died when he was born, and he lived with his maternal grandparents, James and Mary Sterrett, while his father was serving in the army. When Mordecai Gist married again in Charleston, South Carolina, Independent Gist went to live in their home and remained there until the death of his father. Shortly after this he returned to his grandfather's home in Baltimore.

In 1792, Independent Gist was willed a portion of Sterrett's Folly and Raphoe by his grandfather, James Sterrett, Baltimore County. (Balt. Co. Md. Wills, Hall of Records, Annapolis) In 1793, he received part of his father's estate, and in 1810 and 1820, he inherited land from his uncle John Gist's estate. In 1810, he inherited the remainder of his share of his father's estate in Maryland and Kentucky. On April 1, 1811, he appointed Henry Clay and Rezin H. Gist of Kentucky as attorneys to receive monies ... due in Kentucky and to sell the lands he inherited from his father. (Court of Appeals, Frankfort, Ky. Deeds O., p. 65) In 1815, a tract of 307 acres called Retreat was patented to him, and on August 23, 1816, he sold 195 acres of land in Frederick County to William Grimes. Rachel Gist, his wife, signed the deed. (Patents I.B. No. D, p. 92, Land Office, Annapolis; Fred. Co. Md. Deeds J.S. No. 3., p. 378)

After Independent Gist finished school he entered the land office of his uncle, James Sterrett, Baltimore. Later he became ill and spent much of his time at Garrison Forest and Westminster. He was president of City Bank of Baltimore, a position he held at the time of his death.

He died intestate in 1821. The first account of his estate was made by Joshua C. Gist and George Washington Gist, administrators. The last account was filed August 19, 1831. (Fred. Co. Md. Accounts H.S. No. 7, p. 347; G.M.E. 7, p. 436)

The will of Rachel Gist, widow of Independent, made October 28, 1829 and proved January 15, 1831 left:

To only daughter Mary Sterrett Gist, portrait of General Mordecai Gist, her grandfather.. household goods
 To sons Joshua Gist, States Gist, Mordecai Gist, Independent Gist, George Washington Gist, and Richard Gist, balance of personal estate. (Balt. Co. Md. Wills 13, p. 504, Hall of Records, Annapolis)

To nephew Robert Gist, my bedstead and bedding with all the furniture in my room except the bookcase which I give to my nephew William Mordecai Gist. I give my books and family papers to nephews William Mordecai Gist and George Washington Gist, sons of Mordecai Gist. Residue of estate to three nephews, William Mordecai, George W., Robert Gist, to be divided equally (Carroll Co. Md. Wills G.M.P. 6, p. 365)

264. JOSHUA THOMAS⁶ GIST (Independent⁵, Mordecai⁴, Thomas³, Richard², Christopher¹)
 b. Sept. 15, 1810, Frederick County, Maryland; d. Feb. 28, 1891, Madison County, Ohio, m. April 12, 1837, Nancy Norris, b. Ohio; d. July 9, 1883, daughter of William Norris. Both buried in graveyard near home.

 b. Oct. 16, 1814, Frederick County, now Carroll County, Maryland; d. June 27, 1890, m. Nov. 7, 1848,

 Both buried in Gist graveyard on Long Farm. In 1864, Mordecai Gist inherited Long Farm from his aunt
 Harriet (Gist) Dorsey, who lived there until she died.

The will of Mordecai Gist proved July 28, 1890 left:

To wife Elizabeth Gist, the home farm, household furnishings, stock, farm implements etc. After her
 death property to be equally divided among children. Farm to remain in Gist family if possible
 To son Joseph I. Gist, the old bureau and old family bible
 To son Joshua Gist, old desk given to me by uncle Joshua C. Gist and old clock
 To daughter Harriet Gaitskill, portraits of my grandparents (General Mordecai Gist and wife), and at
 her death to be given to some member of the family, whom she thinks will prize and care for them
 To son William Mordecai Gist, silver watch
 To sons George W. Gist and Robert Gist, \$250. (Carroll Co. Md. Wills G.M.P. 6, p. 425)

 gave him Long Farm Annex, where he lived for a number of years. He sold this land to Ralph
 Reifsnider, and later moved to Florida
