RINEHART

RINEHART, I.S.S., miller; P.O. Ada, Hardin Co., Ohio. Jacob Rinehart, great-grandfather of I.S. Rinehart, came to this country about the year 1734; he attained to the great age of nearly 100 years; his son, Conrad Rinehart, was born in Maryland, A.D. 1785; he became a member of the Evangelical Association at an early age, and remained in active and zealous member of that branch of the Christian Church up to the time of his decease; he was married to Miss Eve Bealy, of his native State; he and his wife were among the original members of the Evangelical Association in this country; he officiated for some years in the capacity of a local preacher; he died Oct. 29, 1871; he left a widow, 12 children, 80 grandchildren, 124 great-grandchildren; and 2 great-great-grandchildren; he was aged 85 years 8 months and 15 days; his widow died in June, 1873, aged 88 years 9 months and 2 days.

At the request of John Crist the following deed was recorded. January 14th 1800. Town.

This Indenture made the third day of December seventeen hundred and ninety nine. Between Peter Piper and Judith his wife of York County and State of Pennsylvania of the one part, and John Crist of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Peter Piper and Judith his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred pounds, and five shillings current money to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, hath given, granted, bargained, sold, released, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents. Hath given, grant, bargain, sell, release, convey, and confirm unto the said John Crist his heirs and assigns forever, all that part of a tract of Land lying in Frederick County aforesaid called Earnest Choice lying on the North side of Little Pipe Creek. Beginning at the end of thirty five perches on the North course of said Earnest Choice and running thence South thirty seven degrees, East fifteen perches. North fifty nine degrees, East eleven perches North thirty seven degrees, West fifteen perches. then by a straight line to the Beginning containing one acre of land more or less. Together with all rights, profits, benefits and advantages to the same belonging; To have and To hold the said parcel of Land with the appurtenances unto the said John Crist his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Peter Piper and Judith his wife, for themselves their heirs executors and administrators. doth covenant, grant, promise and agree to and with the said John Crist and his assigns that they the said Peter Piper and Judith his wife, the aforesaid parcel of Land with the appurtenances, as well against the said Peter Piper and Judith his wife, as against all persons claiming by from or under them, unto the said John Crist his heirs and assigns, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. In Witness whereof, the said Peter Piper and Judith his wife hath here set their hands and seals the day and year aforesaid.

Frederick County to wit. On the third day of December 1799. Came Peter Piper and Judith his wife before the subscribers two Justices of the peace for said County, and acknowledged the above Instrument of writing to be their act and deed, and the Lands and premises therein mentioned to be the right and estate of the said John Crist his heirs and assigns forever. At the same time the said Judith being privately examined "Whether she doth make the above acknowledgment of her own free and voluntary consent, without being induced thereto by threats of ill usage by her said husband, or fear of his displeasure." Answered and acknowledged "that she did the same of her own free and voluntary consent, and that she was not induced thereto by threats of ill usage, by her said husband, or fear of incurring his displeasure."

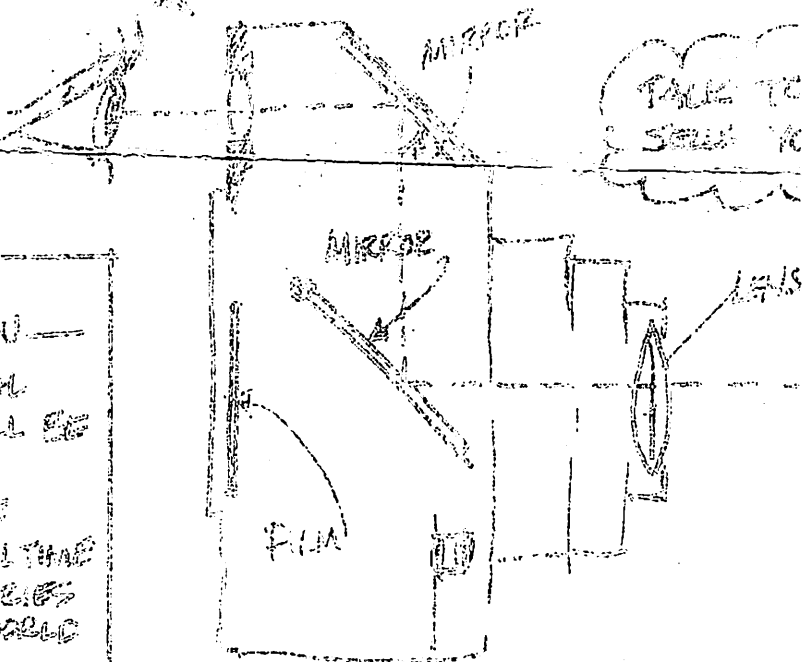

Dear Mrs. Berger:

This is in response to your letter of April 23, which I am going to answer instead of Mrs. Tangen simply because I have done a bit of work in that part of Franklin township in which Peter Piper lived.

You may already have the full information, but there are two deeds of record in York county (Book 2, L, pp. 121 and 123) of small tracts of land to the German Society to which you refer. On May 13, 1795 William Cross and wife deeded one acre of land in Franklin township to Nicholas Besaker, Henry Walter, and Jacob Shank, trustees and on the same day Peter Piper deeded 80 perches to the same trustees. The deeds recite that they are "Trustees for the time being, Appointed by the German Society of Franklin Township" and that they were taking possession of the land "for the purpose of a School-house and Burying Ground for the Use of said Society." It is my opinion that Flohr's church (which was Lutheran and Reformed) and possibly Mummasburg Mennonite church grew out of this "German Society." Evidently in 1795 their only immediate plans were for a school house and burying ground. There is no additional information about the "German Society" that I know about.

According to the Compiler for February 12, 1823, Peter Piper died on February 2, 1823, aged 87 years. We are sending you a copy of his estate papers.
