Dear Kathryn,

Please accept my apologies for not having communicated with you before now. We have had a rather busy summer here, and there was not time earlier to adequately research your request. We found that Rock Chapel Cemetery was the best source of dates, but the gravestones for your ancestors were not fully legible without at least some perfunctory cleaning, which delayed things further. I hope you find the wait was worthwhile.

William Sadler, Sr. was indeed instrumental in founding Rock Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church. We were visited in September by a contemporary heir, Sarah Sadler Parker from South Dakota, who did some research at the Adams County Historical Society while she was here. She mentioned that she came across a letter from William Sadler, Sr. to the King of England, pleading for the sending of Anglican missionaries to Pennsylvania. I don't know any more about the letter, but I will be doing my own research on it soon. At any rate, it was because of Mr. Sadler's dissatisfaction with Anglican/Episcopalian attentions to the spiritual needs of Adams County that he invited and supported the establishment of a Methodist preaching house in Huntington Township, sometime near the end of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. But now, to the heart of your request.

William Sadler, Sr., according the date inscribed upon his gravestone, was born October 1, 1771, not 1777, as per your previous record. Mr. Sadler died July 8, 1848. According to the dates upon her gravestone, Lydia Leas Sadler died July 9, 1864, not July 31, 1857, as per your previous record. Lydia's gravestone notes that she was aged 79 years, 10 months, 19 days at the time of her death. This indeed puts her birth sometime in 1784 (I'll let you do the math to calculate an exact birth date). Future research I have planned concerning Rock Chapel should bring me into further contact with William Sadler, Sr. and Lydia Leas Sadler. As I find out more, I'll be sure to contact you.

With regards to Thomas and Eliza Sadler McCleary, I have the following to share with you. Thomas McCleary was born March 13, 1803 and died March 22, 1851. Eliza Sadler McCleary died July 31, 1856, aged 50 years, 6 months, and 29 days. This is all the information available on the McClearys. It was garnered from their gravestones in Rock Chapel Cemetery. Both stones are clearly legible, although Eliza's has been damaged on the top. Lydia Leas Sadler's gravestone is in very good condition. The gravestone of William Sadler, Sr., is deteriorating, but the dates remain reasonably legible. Thomas and Eliza are buried right beside Eliza's parents.

I found it interesting to discover that there must have been some tradition with regard to how gravestones were marked differently with the dates for males and females. Married women were always identified as "the wife of" someone, but more interestingly their birth dates are never inscribed. Instead, their exact age to the day is inscribed under the date of death. Men, on the other hand, are identified by name with the date of birth and the date of death being given; sometimes, as in Thomas McCleary's case, exact age for a man is also inscribed.

I have included some photographs of the gravestones, which I thought you might find helpful.
