 That the following described tract of Land Whereas the Honourable Thomas Penn & Richard Penn Esq.  
 were & absolute proprietaries of the province aforesaid by their Patent under the great Seal of the said  
 Province bearing date at Philadelphia the 24<sup>th</sup> day of June 1748, for the consideration & under the
