"Dutch Genealogical Research" by Charles M. Franklin, available from Genealogy Unlimited, 789 S. Buffalo Grove Road, Buffalo Grove, Ill. 60089 for \$12.50 postpaid, is an excellent guidebook for everyone with Dutch ancestry.

Its bibliography contains a wealth of sources to consult for your Colonial Dutch lines and an entire chapter is devoted to Dutch records in America. One of the most valuable sources for you is the lists of published church records, which date back to the 17th Century. These are widely available in libraries with genealogical collections.

Q: I've always wondered about my father's people, but I have so little to go on as he was orphaned at age 5. He remembers his father and mother's names and his brothers. Is it possible to locate his brothers or other living members of the family?

A: The Salvation Army operates a Missing Persons Locator Service. However, it has specific guidelines for this search and requires a \$5 non-refundable fee.

Contact the nearest Salvation Army office to secure information and/or a missing persons inquiry form.

If your father's parents were living in the United States at the time of the 1900 census, those records can be consulted. The 1900 census has been Soundexed (indexed by the sound of surnames for each state), so all you need to know is the name and the state in which they lived at that time.

These census records are available at all regional branches of the National Archives—the one nearest you is in Seattle—and on interlibrary loans through many public libraries and the LDS (Mormon) Family History branch libraries.

junkie from the Bronx.) Not a bad compliment for a straight white guy just trying to get inside his characters' heads.

"I've never been a homosexual and I've never had a lot of these experiences that I write about," Selby says. "But I understand alienation, I understand fear and I understand a lot of these things. I was just trying to write the best story I could."

Today, Selby says he is clean. Sober. And sane, if that word can be applied to someone who every day of his life wrestles with alienation that "makes you want to jump out of your skin" and fear that "gnaws at the marrow of your bones." And he is at peace in a way he couldn't even fathom in the days when anger was his main motivation for living.

He rises at 6 each morning, to sip hot tea and meditate. Then he spends several hours writing, on a portable electric typewriter at a desk near his neatly made single bed. There is time enough for that since his job as unit manager for a video production company ended late in December when his show folded. At 59 he is in poor health—he has asthma, has troubles with his one lung, is very weak and hypoglycemic.

So he putters around the 1950s style apartment building with his reading glasses dangling from a string, cooing to his two cockateels to "be cool." Selby has no TV, but keeps several bookshelves stocked

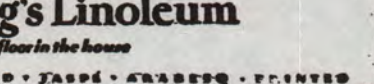
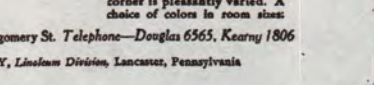
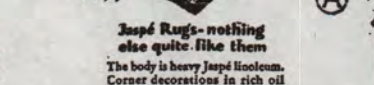

POLITICIANS, figuring on the next election, must reckon both with the vote at the primaries, to determine the nominees, and also with the vote at the final election, especially in those sections whose first preference is not nominated.

The clearest case is the arithmetic on Al Smith. The South is against him for the nomination. But if the South would nevertheless support him if nominated the computation need consider only what additional states he could carry in the North to make up the necessary sum. It is this assumption and this arithmetic that constitute Smith's chief claim to consideration, at the hands of the convention mathematicians.

A partially analogous situation may exist in the case of Herbert Hoover and the dissatisfied party of the corn belt. The important difference is that, while the South is against Smith, the corn belt is not against Hoover. It merely "for" London, as its preference and first choice, even though it might not favor him for the nomination.

A straw vote at a recent picnic of Illinois farmers, at Moonshar, is a case in point. As might be expected, the overwhelming majority was for London, who is at once the corn farmer's candidate and the Illinois favorite son. Out of 777 Republicans, London had 500 votes, and Davies, with 111, had most of the rest. 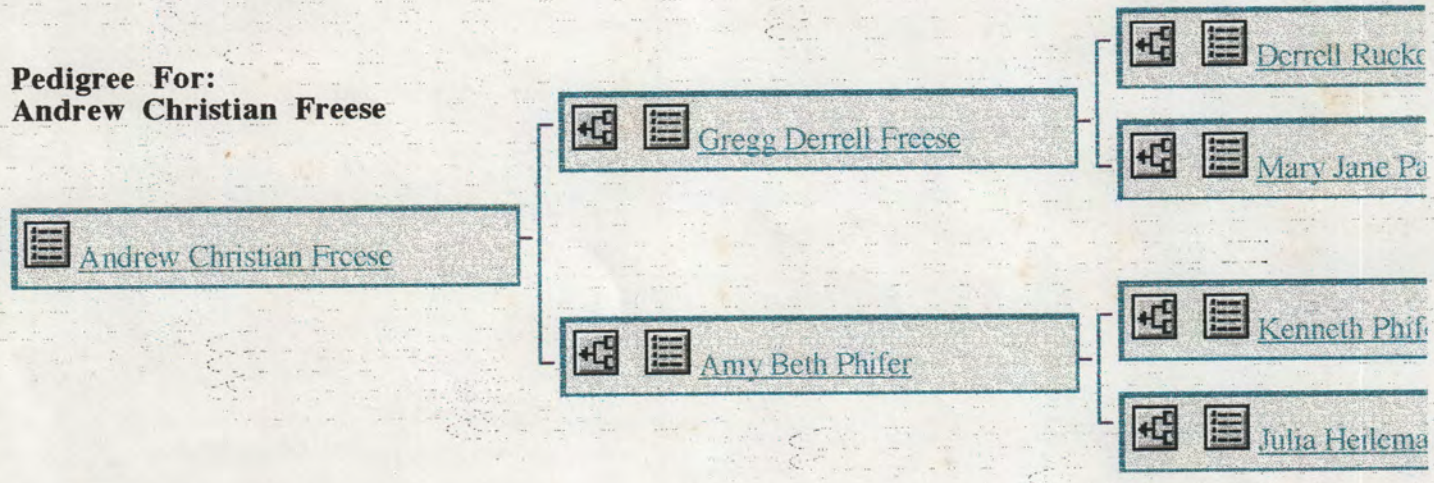

Hi Bob,

I was startled to get your e-mail re: Andrew C. Freese. Andrew Christian Freese was born in Denmark in 1833, naturalized in 1861 in San Francisco and died in 1905 in San Francisco and is buried in the Evans-Freese plot in Holy Cross Cemetery in Colma. My connection to him is that one of his several marriages was to my grandfather, William James Evans's sister, Catherine Evans. I note that Evans is one of the surnames you indicate an interest in. I have quite a bit of information on the San Francisco Evanses.

Although I am a third generation San Franciscan, I have lived in Huntington Beach CA since my marriage to Dave Borkenhagen in 1963. Living where I do, I have access to the Sherman Gardens & Library in Corona del Mar. They have many CA city directories including San Francisco 1886-1914. The LDS Family History Centers also have microfilm of many of these directories on loan from the LDS Family History Library in Salt Lake City.

The company that Andrew Freese was involved with, according to the S.F. City Directories was: 1867-A. C. Freese-Whitney (George) & Freese (A.C.) Stevedores, NW cor Stewart & Mission, dwn. Ws Main bet. Harrison & Folsom. LDS Film #1000841, San Francisco Directory 1861, '65, '67-'69.

According to the 1886 San Francisco City Directory A.C. Freese was captain of the tug "Transit". The 1896 San Francisco City Directory shows both Charles Freese and William F. Freese as deckhands on the tugboat "Transit".

In 1897 A.C. Freese was the Public Administrator for the City and County of San Francisco. The Maritime Library at Fort Mason has the DAILY ALTA CALIFORNIA on microfilm, but I have not been able to go there to look at it.

After the 1906 earthquake/fire, since the city hall burned to the ground and all the records with it over a period of four days, land records were recreated via the McEnerney Actions. Land owners were able to petition the court for title to their property. I located Andrew C. & Catherine E. Freese's court records dated 1914 [tho A.C. was long dead] which even included their mortgage papers with the German Savings and Loan Society for 832 Fell Street. These records are available on LDS Film #140506 & #1405607.

I guess the above doesn't really satisfy your questions concerning the company A.C. Freese had, but the above sources might lead you to that information. If you like, I can send you photocopies of all that I have on A. C. Freese, if you send me your address.

Can you tell me anything about Andrew Freese and his company. I do know, the company was in existence in 1881 and through at least 1910.

The relatives who worked for Andrew Freese were, Lewis Traung and his son George. Lewis started as a Master Mariner and became the bookkeeper for the company. George started as a deck hand and became a Master Mariner.

Shaking Your Family Tree!

Getting a Line on a Seaman Ancestor

By MYRA VANDERPOOL GORMLEY

Question: I am trying to locate an ancestor (and his descendants) who was a seaman. He was still piloting ships from San Francisco during World War II. Are there any sailors' associations that kept biographical or genealogical records on seamen, harbor masters, pilots and captains?

Answer: Contact the local union's business agent or secretary at the Sailors Union of the Pacific, Seafarers' International Union of North America and the International Organization Masters—Mates & Pilots Offshore in San Francisco to determine which of them would have been your ancestor's labor union.

Many labor unions have preserved records that contain genealogical information, but it requires some good detective work to track them down. Local union officials are usually quite helpful.

Other sources to try are: San Francisco Maritime Museum, J. Porter Shaw Library, Foot of Polk, San Francisco, Calif. 94109; International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, Anne Rand Research Library, 1188 Franklin St., San Francisco, Calif. 94115; and consult Library of Congress' National Union Catalogue of Manuscript Collections and an article in *American Archivist* 25 (January, 1962): 39 by Paul Lewison and Morris Rieger entitled "Labor Union Records in the United States."

Q: I thought you might like to know about the *Swedish-American Genealogist*, a quarterly journal, which I edit and publish. I am also working on a translation and reprint of the names of more than 2,000 Swedes who were residing in Boston in 1881.

A: Your journal is excellent; several readers told me about it. I think Swedish researchers will find it helpful and engaging. Annual subscriptions are \$12.50 from Swedish-American Genealogist, Box 2186, Winter Park, Fla., 32790. Queries are accepted.

A reader in Blue Jay, Calif. reports there is a free 26-page booklet, "Tracing Your Swedish Ancestors," available from the Royal Swedish Embassy, Water-

gate 600, 600 New Hampshire Ave., N.W., Washington, D.C. 10037.

Q: Do you know anything about the name Crofoot or Crowfoot? Is it of Scottish, English or American Indian origin?

A: I can tell you it is English, but the authorities disagree on its origin and meaning. Elsdon C. Smith's "New Dictionary of American Family Names" says it probably is a variant of Crawford (one who came from crows' pass, in Lanarkshire or one who dwells near a river crossing where crows were seen).

However, P. H. Reaney in "The Origin of English Surnames" lists Crowfoot under nicknames from physical characteristics, and Charles Waring Bardsley's "Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames" says it "probably was derived from some peculiarity of gait on the part of the original bearer." Reaney also gives the spellings of Crowfort and Crofut.

Q: How do you find an ancestor when all you know is the state he came from, but not the county or town? My ancestor was born in Ohio in 1813 and went to Bloomington, Ill., in 1837. How do I locate him in Ohio records?

A: Check an index to grantees (land records) of McLean County, Ill. Often the first piece of land our ancestors purchased in a new area will mention the county from which they migrated. Next check the 1820 Ohio census index for your ancestor's surname. Jot down the names of counties where the name is found and search land, probate and marriage records in those counties until you locate your family.

Use the LDS (Mormon) Branch Genealogical Libraries' IGI (International Genealogy Index) and the AIS (Accelerated Indexing System) microfiches to help you locate your family in Illinois and Ohio.

Research Tip: When buying a book listing the names of current U.S. post offices and ZIP codes, get one that shows county names also. It can be a quick, handy reference. Stationery and business supply stores often carry these small, inexpensive postal directories.

that mean a lot to one collector

From his book collection, John Larroquette selects these as among his favorites:

"A Confederacy of Dunces" by John Kennedy Toole (Louisiana State University Press, 1980). Larroquette feels a kinship with the author of this posthumously published comic novel because: "It's about New Orleans, about a man who grew up where I did." Toole committed suicide in 1969 at age 32. Literary rumor has it that the book's rejection was a contributing factor.

"War All the Time" by Charles Bukowski. Black Sparrow Press put out only 26 of these in an "A-to-Z" printing. An oil painting by Bukowski contributes to the rarity of a book that Larroquette considers the best poetry written by Bukowski, Los Angeles' unofficial poet laureate, who sings of the city's meaner streets.

Larroquette also owns Bukowski's "extremely rare" "The Fire Station." Published in 1970 by Capricorn Press, only 200 books were printed and signed by the author.

Another rarity owned by Larroquette is Bukowski's "Horsemeat," published by Black Sparrow in 1982. This oversize book, with photographs by Michael Montfort, depicts a day at the track, where the bettors appear "worn, done, defeated." Signed by both poet and photographer,

published in 1931 by Chatto and Windus, is not part of the set.

"Gravity's Rainbow" by Thomas Pynchon (Viking, 1973). A critic described this book as "confronting a mysterious world without sure explanation." Larroquette finds it a "remarkable story and a difficult book to read—with powerful, recurring images."

"Naked Lunch" by William S. Burroughs. Larroquette has the first American edition published by Grove Press in 1953. It has a photo of the author "tipped in," lightly secured in the book, and signed. He also has the signed 25th-anniversary edition of this limited 500-press-run title.

Pacific Coast-Built Sailers 1850-1905

By JOHN LYMAN

INSTALLMENT No. 34

Wm. Nottingham, four-masted schooner of 1204 tons and 1300 M feet capacity, was built by Reed at Ballard in 1902, another unit of the fleet of the Globe Navigation Co. In October, 1911, she was dismantled out of Astoria for Callao; the crew was taken off by the schooner David Evans, and the wreck was towed to Astoria by the tug Wallula and repaired. She ran from Tientsin to Puget Sound in 32 days in 1904-5. The Wm. Nottingham brought \$60,000 from Norwegian owners in 1916, she having cost \$75,000 to build, and the entire Globe fleet of five vessels having gone for \$90,000 in 1914. In 1922 she was laid up at Port Townsend, and was converted to a barge a couple of years later. She is still afloat as a telephone cable repair barge on Puget Sound.

William Olsen, four-masted schooner of 523 tons and 700 M capacity, was built at Alameda in 1900 by Hay & Wright, and owned by M. H. Hickman, San Francisco. In 1918-9 she sailed from San Francisco to Auckland, N. Z., in 43 days, but on the return voyage was wrecked without loss of life on Nihau Island, Hawaii, April 21, 1919.

William Renton, three-masted schooner of 447 tons and 575 M lumber capacity, was built at Port Blakely in 1882 by Hall Bros., and was the largest schooner then built on this coast. She was managed at San Francisco by J. J. Smith. In 1911 she was owned by Morris Marcus, San Francisco, and subsequently seems to have gone under Mexican registry.

William F. Bowne, schooner, probably two-masted, of 136 tons, was built by John Kruse on the Umpqua, Ore., in 1864, costing \$16,000, and dropped from registry about 1880.

William F. Garms, four-masted schooner of 1094 tons and 1300 M capacity, was built at Everett, Wash., in 1901 by C. G. White. She was owned by Sanders & Kirchmann, and later by Olson & Mahony, San Francisco. In December 1913 she was dismantled off Flattery, bound to Santa Rosalia with lumber, but was picked up and towed to Seattle, and repaired under the ownership of the Rolph Navigation & Coal Co., and the new name Golden State. In 1920 she was sold to L. A. Scott, Mobile. The schooner Golden State was burned in 29° 29' N, 85° 50' W, on February 17, 1922, the crew being rescued.

Wm. F. Witzemann, four-masted schooner of 473 tons, was built at Fairhaven, Calif., in 1887, prob-

ably by Bendixsen, for James Madison, San Francisco. The schooner was later owned by L. Fjord, and was wrecked 4 miles north of Bolinas, Calif., February 5, 1907.

William G. Irwin, brigantine of 348 tons, was built by Turner at San Francisco in 1881 for J. D. Spreckels as a Hawaii packet, later being transferred to the Oceanic Steamship Co., which was largely owned by the Spreckels family. The brigantine appears several times in the list of fast passages, her best being from San Francisco to Kahului in 8 days, 17 hours in 1881. When sold out of the Island trade, she went to the Tacoma & Roche Harbor Lime Co., they selling her for \$28,000 to Capt. Alex Woodside in 1917 for the offshore copra trade. She was rigged as a three-masted schooner of 400 M capacity; was taken over a year or so later by the Bank of Italy; and was laid up at San Francisco in July, 1920, after arrival from Samoa. Two years later she was reported going to pieces rapidly, and was shortly thereafter sold to Famous-Players-Lasky and burned at Catalina, May 15, 1926.

William H. Smith, four-masted

schooner of 566 tons and 750 M capacity, was built at Port Blakely by Hall Bros. for their own fleet in 1899. In July, 1917, she was sold to Burns-Philp Co., San Francisco, for \$70,000, and traded to the South Pacific until 1924. The following year she was bought by the Union Fish Co., and was operated until 1937. She has since been laid up for sale at San Francisco.

Wm. H. Stevens, two-masted schooner of 146 tons, was built at San Francisco in 1869 by and for James McDonald, dropping from registry about 10 years later.

William L. Beebe, three-masted schooner of 296 tons, was built at Port Ludlow by Hall Bros. in 1875. She was owned by J. J. Smith, San Francisco, and was commanded for a time by Capt. J. C. Eschen. In 1878 she ran from Honolulu to Port Townsend in 11 days, 18 hours. The schooner was wrecked three miles south of the Cliff House on December 10, 1894, bound to San Francisco from Port Blakely.

Willie R. Hume, four-masted barkentine of 665 tons, one of the first of her rig on the Pacific, was built at North Bend, Ore., in 1890 for G. W. Hume, San Francisco. She was wrecked at Point Santa Maria, near Topolobampo, Mexico, in February, 1911, with the loss of one man of her crew of 9.

BOARD DELIVERS 104 OUT OF 788

The latest ship construction progress report of the Maritime Commission's Construction Division, made public last week, reveals that out of a total of 788 new merchant and naval auxiliary ships ordered for all purposes and being built under the auspices of the commission, 104 ships have been completed up to September 1. The report also shows that 34 keels of the rapidly building "Liberty Fleet" were laid up to the same date. A summary of other data shown on the progress report indicates that 25 vessels are nearing completion. Of this number eight will be delivered during September.

EXPLORER GOING TO THE ISLANDS

For a season of work in Hawaiian waters, the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey's noted survey steamship Explorer will sail from Seattle for the Islands October 18, under the command of Comdr. F. B. T. Siems. Prior to her departure she will be given a complete overhaul. After making surveys of shoals to the westward of Hawaii, she will return to Seattle in December. The Explorer, built by the Lake Washington Shipyards in 1939, is famed as the world's most modern survey ship.

get bids above his, so that he could secure what was due him from the ship. An attempt will be made to settle the matter, and the vessel may be sold over again. (HT 11-16-1894)

SOLD AGAIN. The sale at auction of the condemned Peruvian bark *Adalguisa* was concluded by U. S. Marshal Farris in San Francisco Friday. This time the captain of the vessel did not bid and from \$250 the bids gradually advanced to \$715, when the old tub was finally knocked down to N. Bichard. (HT 11-20-1894)

PERILS OF THE SEA. The wrecking of the schooner *W. L. Beebe*, which went ashore on the ocean beach two miles south of the Cliff House, San Francisco, last Tuesday morning, was caused by the carrying away of her steering gear. While attempting to cross in over a rough bar a heavy sea came over her stern carrying away her wheel and rudder and washing over the vessel from stem to stern.

Second mate Bendixson and Third mate Olsen, who were standing by the wheel, were thrown with considerable violence against the mizzenmast and from there against the mainmast. Olsen was bruised about the legs and a big lump was raised on the side of his head while Bendixson was hurt about the head and internally injured. After he was taken from the schooner it was found necessary to send him to the hospital.

The schooner was worth probably \$12,000 and her cargo \$4,000 more. This was insured and probably all of it will be saved. The schooner is insured for \$5000 and will probably be entirely lost. She has a big hole in her bow and is buried up to her waterline in sand, which makes it impossible to float her. Within a week or two she will probably have sunk nearly out of sight. About the only use that can be made of her is for firewood.

The wreck was sold at the Merchants' Exchange, San Francisco, Tuesday, to Captain A. C. Freese for \$255. The Captain considered that he had made a very good purchase for the winches and anchors will bring more than that. He is of the opinion that he can wreck the vessel from the beach. The masts and booms will be saved intact and the rigging, with the exception of the mizzen shrouds, is all right.

The cargo, which was not insured, belongs to Renton, Holmes & Co., who are salving it, and the stipula-

tion was that the buyer of the hull should give the owners of the cargo free access to what remains in the hold of the vessel. (HT 12-14-1884) 1894

BARKS TO SAIL AGAIN. The old barks *Vidette*, built in 1864; *Northwest* in 1868, and *Tidal Wave* in 1869, and which have been laid up on the Sound for several years, will once more visit San Francisco. All three will be laden with lumber, which, with the vessels will be sold on arrival. The vessels will then in all probability be broken up or used to build the new seawall where Senator Fair is reclaiming land at North Beach. (HT 12-14-1894)

ANOTHER COASTER WRECKED. Portland, Dec. 19 — News has reached here that the schooner *Mary Gilbert*, Captain Dodge, went ashore on the night of the 15th inst., just inside the entrance to Alzia Bay, and will probably be a total loss.

(The *Mary Gilbert* sailed from San Francisco November 28th for Waldsport, Benton County, Oregon. She is a vessel of 88 tons register, built at Albion, California in 1887 and is valued at about \$10,000. Her managing owner is H. Wetherbee, at San Francisco. She took a cargo from this port in November, 1892. — Ed.) (HT 12-20-1894)

DEATH OF AN OLD SEA CAPTAIN. Captain William E. Plummer, one of the oldest Captains in the employ of the Pacific Coast Steamship Company, died suddenly at his home in Alameda on Thursday. Captain Plummer was for many years in command of the steamer *Gipsy*, running between San Francisco and Monterey, and as he only stayed a few hours in either port, was known among seafaring men as "Perpetual Motion Plummer."

Captain Plummer was well known in Humboldt, having been in command of the steamer *Mary D. Hume* when she ran into Eel River. Deceased was a native of Virginia, aged 65 years. (HT 12-25-1894)

A THRILLING EXPERIENCE. The *Fort Bragg Advocate* of December 12th gives the following account of the departure of the steamer *Noyo* from that port December 9th. This was the first trip of the *Noyo* as a passenger steamer from Fort Bragg to San Francisco direct.

"The time set for the sailing of the steamer *Noyo* Sunday was 5 o'clock in the afternoon, and as the wind shifted around to the northwest, the sea got

Howdy Eleanor,

I spent about 3 hours at the J.Porter Shaw Maritime Library at Fort Mason in the City on Saturday afternoon looking for information on the tug Transit and Andrew C. Freese. A lot of the time was spent just getting my bearing about which resources I should pursue the search with.

So far this is what I've come up with. Looking at the general catalog of materials under the subject of 'Tugs' there were two references to the tug Transit. One was a copy of a Masters and Pilots License dated 1882 to operate the tugs "Kate" and "Transit" issued to Captain John Carlson by the U. S. Inspectors Office that is in the library's Historical Document Collection (HSC).

The second reference is in the pamphlet collection of the HSC that is an written account of an oral history obtain in 1961 by a Jack McNairn entitled, "Commercial Tug Boat companies of San Francisco Bay 1913" cataloged in HDC 648 Box 004 Folder 061. On page 10 is listed:

Andrew C. Freese 3 Mission St. San Francisco Operated 1884 - 1886 the tugs Kate and Transit.

A steamer A. C. Freese was operated by the California Navigation and Imp. Company.

(El, off hand I don't know what 'Imp.' could stand for, do you?)

On the next paragraph statement:

J.C. Freese Co. 215 Market St. San Francisco Operated oil barges on Bay and the Sacramento River.

Carried Molasses between Crockett to the American Distillery at Sausalito. Affiliated with S. F. Towing Co.

I shall have to follow up on what the ' S. F. Towing Co. ' was about.

I haven't yet been able to find info on Andrew Christian Freese Sr. or Jr. yet but I'd be surprised if I found much more based on information and impressions gained from this class that tell that the waterfront and maritime businesses operating during the 40 years following the Gold Rush were very transient. People, licenses and businesses changed constantly. The rough and tumble nature of control and competition among larger outfits sliced into the smaller outfits by force of fist and/or under cut prices of lesser concerns.

Feed me any other information that might help me in my search.
