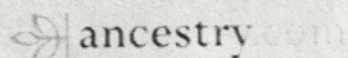

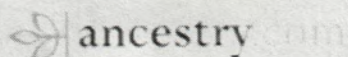


Dear Mrs. Borkenhagen:

Hi Anita: I knew Jewett City must be small but I didn't know it was that small. My first contact with it was in 1997 after I got grandfather Nicholas C. Murray's death record. He died in Cranston R.I., but the place of burial was listed as Jewett City CT. I wrote to the Jewett City Funeral Home, Voluntown Administration Department Attn: Town Clerk and the Griswold Historical Society. Both the Town Clerk and the Historical Society letters were returned as undeliverable, but I did hear from Thomas D. Leffher at the funeral home. He returned my letter with the following notation: "I checked with the Town Clerk and she has no record of a burial in Jewett City by the name of Nicholas C. Murray." I later learned that Jewett City is a hamlet within Griswold. As I wrote you earlier, it was the Catholic Cemeteries Assoc. of the Diocese of Hartford and then Norwich who directed me to St. Mary Church Cemetery.

You certainly have had an interesting life-living all over the world. You must have a wonderful collection of memories from those years. My mother's line is from Ireland, but my paternal ggrandfather was born in Wales and came to New Orleans in 1852. My grandfather was born there, but the family moved to San Francisco in 1859. My father was born there and so was I, as well as my paternal grandmother, but her background is French. It all makes for interesting history, doesn't it?

Be assured that you have been a tremendous help to me in actually finding grandfather Nicholas's grave. I don't know who Edward, Frank and Margaret are, unless they are children who died shortly after birth. I find no record of them as I track the family from Illinois, where John E. and Nicholas were born, to Rensselaer Co. NY, where Raymond W. and Dennis F. were born. The other children of Dennis and Eliza that I know of are William, who married Margaret Welch in Griswold in 1896, Sarah, who was Mrs. Edward Farrell of Wauregan CT according to John's probate papers, and Martin. Perhaps I'll locate them all, if I keep at it.

A tall narrow monument with four sides engraved as follows: Side one: Dennis Murray, Native of CO. Waterford, Ireland - 1848-1920, Eliza J. Connor, His Wife, Native of Queen Co..... Ireland, 1844-1906. Side two: (No dates) Nicholas C., Edward, Frank, Margaret. Children of Dennis & Eliza Murray. Side Three: Raymond W. 1887 - 1916. Side four: John E. 1867 - 1925, Denis F., 1877 - 1961. I also found another Murray grave - I took photos. BUT: It does not match the names on the grave that I found at that location. St. Marys records are not very good-many mistakes. Sharon did tell me that there are several Murray's in the cemetery, but they won't give me any information on the ones that do not have Perpetual Care paid. I am going to take some pictures and send them to you also a copy of the card, and will try to see what else I can get from the parish-also will go back to the cemetery and try and find the other Murray graves - It is a small cemetery and because the dates are so old I have a pretty good idea where to look. This is the information on the location on that card, but as you can see all names and dates are different. Hi Anita, It is good of you to make such an effort in my behalf in my search for my Murray ancestors. Dennis Murray [1843-1920] & Eliza Conner Murray {1844-1906} are my ggrandparents, their son Nicholas Murray, who died in 1900 in Cranston RI and is buried elsewhere in St. Mary Parish Cemetery, is my maternal grandfather. Raymond, John E. and Dennis F. are my grandfather's brothers. Who the children are in this plot are what I wonder about. I have contacted Sharon LePage in the cemetery office, but she was unable or unwilling to help me with this.

Yes, Murray is the only surname in Jewett City and I really don't know why they were buried there. Nicholas and his brother John were born in Harvard, McHenry Co., IL and the other brothers were born in Renssalaer Co. NY. There was also a brother William and a sister Sarah, but I haven't been able to track them, except for William's marriage to Margaret Welch in Griswold in 1896.

I located this plot by writing to the Catholic Cemeteries Association in North Haven CT. Mr. Marek there referred my request to Nicholas Mignone at the Norwich Diocesan Cemetery Corporation. klings streams, among which Wright Brook, Guilder's Brook, issuing from Guilder's Pond, a beautiful sheet of water of 53 acres, on the northern flank of Mount Everett, and Lee-pond Brook, are the most noticeable. The principal business of the people is lumbering, manufacturing charcoal, and raising cattle. The number of sheep in the place is 27; of horses, 41; of milch-cows, 126; and the amount of butter sold per annum is about 5,000 pounds. The town is noted for the growth of the whortleberry (*Gaylussacia vicinosa*); and one of the summer diversions of the people, old and young, is the gathering of this delicious berry.

Among the early settlers of this place were George Robinson, Joseph Graves, Thomas Wolcott, and John Dibble, who came here about the year 1753.

The town, originally called "Taconic Mountain," was incorporated June 21, 1779. It had in 1835 "no minister, no doctor, no lawyer, no post-office, and no tavern." It has now a post-office, two school-houses, and a church; and is, from a local point of view, the most elevated township in the Commonwealth.

Murrayfield was "No. 9" of the ten townships sold at auction, by order of the General Court, on the 2d of June, 1762. It was incorporated Oct. 31, 1765; and the name changed to Chester (which see) Feb. 21, 1783.

Nahant, a noted watering-place, is a long and narrow peninsula, projecting from the city of Lynn southward into Massachusetts Bay, and forming the eastern side of Lynn Harbor. It was taken from Lynn and incorporated as a town March 29, 1853; and contains a post-office, three farms, 148 dwelling-houses, 144 voters, and 475 inhabitants. The valuation is \$6,611,202; and the rate of taxation, only \$0.35 per \$100. It has two public schools and two churches. Many elegant residences have been erected here by citizens of Boston and other places, who spend the summer at this delightful place. They are surrounded by ornamental trees and shrubbery, and command fine prospects of the ocean. The streets, fences, and gardens are kept in excellent order; and the whole place abounds in scenes of unusual attractiveness and beauty. In 1865 the town had two vessels engaged in the fisheries; and the value of cod and mackerel taken was \$4,200; and of lobsters, \$9,000.

Nahant, from the Indian word *Nahanteau*, signifying "twins," is in itself a natural curiosity. The principal rock is sienite. This lifts itself into a bold headland, or promontory, which rises at the southern point about 160 feet above the sea. The action of the water has cut this rock into many fantastic forms, several of which resemble, in their gigantic features, works of art. Castle Rock, with a little exercise of the imagination, is a feudal castle, with its buttresses and battlements in ruins. Pulpit Rock, at the south-eastern point of the outer promontory, stands as a huge black desk, the upper layers of stone resembling a vast pile of books. Irene's Grotto is a beautiful arcade which leads to a chamber among the jagged rocks. Another grotesque and romantic spot is called the "Spouting Horn." Through this, in storms, the

sea breaks with tremendous violence. The Swallows' Cave is a long, deep channel opening from the land into the sea. At low water the visitor may pass entirely through it, and climb up the cliffs on either side. It is 72 feet long, 10 feet wide, and 8 feet high. Pea Island, near it, is a vast rock, covered with a little soil, on which the beach-pea (*Lathyrus maritimus*) grows.

Nahant is accessible from Lynn by a long, hard, and beautiful beach; and from Boston by steamers, which ply between the places, carrying many visitors, in the summer season.

Nahant was discovered by Capt. John Smith in 1614, who named it on his map "the Fullerton Islands." The first dwelling-house was erected in 1673; and the second settler was James Mills, after whose beautiful daughter Dorothy Cove was named. In 1817 the Hon. Thomas H. Perkins erected a beautiful cottage here; and a little subsequent to this the Hon. Frederick Tudor, who opened the ice-trade in this country, came here to reside. He afterwards fitted up a romantic spot, and gave it the name of "Maolis" ("Siloam" transposed), which attracts many visitors. Neptune's Temple, in these gardens, is a beautiful retreat, shaded by balm-of-Gilead trees, and affording a fine view of Lynn, Swampscott, and Marblehead, together with the sea-beaten Egg Rock, its lighthouse, and the open sea. It is supported by eight pillars of unhewn stone. Underneath is the Witches' Cave, which, it is said, served as a shelter for several persons during the persecutions for witchcraft in Salem in 1692.

The numerous watering-places on our charmingly diversified seaboard have somewhat diverted the attention of the public from Nahant; yet there is no spot on the coast presenting natural scenes more beautiful, or breezes more refreshing.

Nantucket lies on the north side of the island of the same name, and has a harbor of about seven feet and a half of water at low tide. A long neck of land, called "Coatue," comes down from the eastern point of the island, and encloses the harbor on the north; and on the western point of the harbor there is a lighthouse. The town is in latitude 41° 16' 36" north, in longitude 70° 6' 6" west, and about 110 miles south of Boston, with which it has communication by steamers and the Old-Colony Railroad. It has been extensively engaged in the whaling-business, having had at one period as many as 90 whale-ships in service; but the discovery of petroleum, and the scarcity of whales, have so changed this branch of industry, that not a single whaling-vessel is now owned in this town. As a consequence, the population, which in 1840 was 9,012, is now only 4,123. Several schooners are, however, engaged in the cod and mackerel fishery; and many persons are employed in boat-fishing along the shore. In reprisal for the loss of the whaling-business, the citizens have wisely introduced of late some mechanical industries, which are now in a prosperous condition. Mitchell and Hayden's Boot and Shoe Manufactory, the machinery of which is driven by steam-power, employs about forty persons. A branch of the Foxborough Straw-hat Manufactory has been established here, and clothing is made to a considerable extent. The number of farms on the island is 111; of dwelling-houses,

Thanks Mary - I do live in the area and will take your advice. If St. Patrick's cemetery inscriptions are listed there, it'll save me from having to walk the cemetery.

I'm wondering if your informants meant "Hartland" rather than "Hartford." **Hartland township was indeed the heart of Irish settlement (very close to Harvard)** and the Irish settlement seemed to stretch to the north (as far as Alden) and south into Marengo. I've had a bit of information dropped off by the Deacon at St. Patrick's in Hartland; I see there is a Catherine Lynch, wife of John buried at their cemetery, who died 8/4/1851 at the age of 63. Don't know if it's in your family or not.

This property was located on the southeast side of McHenry Road (now Avenue) near Olson Street and was annexed into the City of Woodstock in 1893. In 1947, the property included a building leased to Montgomery Ward & Company at 692 McHenry Avenue. The original Abstract had several sections, each beginning with page 1. For indexing purposes, the pages have been renumbered 1 through 71. The original Abstract of Title has been donated to the McHenry County Historical Society.

Julia MURRAY died circa 1885 and is buried in Huntley (McHenry) IL. Peter MURRAY died 6 Dec 1876 and is buried in Woodstock, IL. Lyman H. David died testate 16 Mar 1893 at Chicago (Cook) IL, will and inventory published in this abstract, and left surviving his daughters Eva M. BUELL, Sarah SLOCUM, and Kittie FELLOWS. Eva M. BUELL died testate 30 Sep 1893, will published in this abstract, and left surviving her husband Frank BUELL and daughter Bessie BUELL age 10. Albert J. OLSON owned the A.J. OLSON Co., which "is formed to own, maintain, and operate dairies, creameries, milk supply depots, to buy, sell and deal in milk, cream, butter and dairy and creamery supplies." Albert J. OLSON died testate 20 Oct 1916. Mayna Rae CLARK was a widow in 1929, remarried Sanford E. BLAMEY. Willis F. GETCHELL died 28 Feb 1937. Arthur H. SKINNER died 5 Oct 1953.


I have received your inquiry of February 3, 1997, and regret that I have been unable to find anything useful for you. Since Nicholas C. Murray was born so late in 1870, he would not appear in that year's census record. However, I have not even been able to find anyone in Harvard, Illinois, for that year who might have been his parents. There is one person named Thomas Murry living in Harvard that year. He was 19 years old and living with a blacksmith and his family. He appeared to be unmarried. A man named T. H. Murray was quite active in agricultural groups and activities in the early 1900s in the Harvard area and may be the same person as Thomas Murry. You did not show the names of Nicholas Murray's parents so I presume you do not know them. Since you have inquired about cemeteries, I assume that you think his parents or other relatives may be buried here. Since Murray is not an uncommon name, I would need first names to be of any help in that direction. I can tell you quite definitely however that there is no Nicholas C. Murray known to be buried in any of the cemeteries in the Harvard area and his name is not mentioned in any of the local histories.

I have no way of knowing what type of research you have done so far, but I will make some suggestions in hopes that one of them will be productive. The first thing to do would be to rent a microfilm copy of the 1880 McHenry County census and see if you can find Nicolas in the Harvard area. If so, that would give you his parents' names. Your local library can order these microfilms for you. If you find the parents' names, you can write me again and I will see if they are buried in this area and if there is any record of other children. If he is not there, you have to assume his family left the area while he was still quite young. It would probably be helpful to start working backwards also. Since you know when and where he died, it might be useful to look for a local obituary in the town where he died. Obituaries often list friends and relatives who attended the service and give details about where they came from and how everyone is related. They can be wonderful sources of information. To find an obituary at long distance you have to try various sources. In your local library look up the name and address of the newspaper and write to them. Look up and write to any genealogical or historical groups in the area since they may maintain obituary files. If there was a church service - which seems likely since I presume they were Irish Catholics - the church may have records to help you.

Since you know the date of birth, you may want to write to the McHenry County Government Center, 2200 N. Seminary Ave, Woodstock, IL 60098, to inquire if their birth records go back that far. That is out of my line of expertise so I do not know how early their birth records are. If your family was Catholic, you may also want to contact St. Joseph's Church, 206 E. Front St, Harvard, IL 60033, to see if they have a baptismal record for Nicolas which might show the names of his parents and other relatives. If all else fails, you may want to hire a professional to go up to the Harvard library and go through their microfilm copies of the old Harvard newspaper in search of some mention of your family.

I'm sorry I was not able to assist you but hope you will have better luck with some of the sources suggested above.

I was just delighted to get your letter and the copies of the 1875 New York State Census and the 1880 US Census in response to my query submitted to the Capital District Genealogical Society with my dues for 2003. Nicholas, one of the two sons of Dennis and Eliza Murray born in Illinois, is my maternal grandfather! Nicholas, age 40 in the 1875 census, and John, age 45 in 1875, are Dennis's brothers! I don't know how I should modify my query, but I'd love to know what brought Dennis and Eliza with sons John and Nicholas from Illinois to upstate New York. Since they were all common laborers, would work on the Eric Canal have been why they were there? I read in World Book that the canal was completed in 1825, but that between 1862 and 1895 improvements were made. Could that have been it?

On another subject, I noticed that your married name is McCann. I know this is a relatively common name, but my paternal great grandmother was Maria McCann. She was born in Boston MA on 28 May 1841 and died in San Francisco CA 18 Apr 1886. Does that match any of your McCann dates?

I also had contact with one of your members who was coming to Southern California on business and wanted information on obtaining birth or death certificates from Los Angeles County.
